Harry Wanless, of Cass is 91 years old Today! He was born on Back Mountain, near Cass, in sight of the house where he now resides, on June 18, 1896. He is the son of the late Charles Wanless and Hannah Cassell Wanless.

In 1922 he married a school teacher from Hillsboro, Mary Hill. Harry and Mary Wanless never had children of their own but raised seven foster children. There was no payment for foster children care in those days.

Mr. Wanless spent most of his life farming. He contributes his long life and good health to the outdoors and hard work; as he said, "Farming for a living is hard work and long hours." He did work on public works and for the Cass sawmill for three years before retirement. He was a helper building camp cars, and he also served in World War I.

Mr. Wanless hears very well without the aid of a hearing aid, and, ^{until} just a year ago could read well without glasses. He says he does have trouble reading now - but still reads some without glasses.

Four years ago he was in an automobile accident, from which, he says, he has never fully recovered. Before that he drove anywhere he wanted to go. Since the accident he limits his driving to the four miles from his home on Back Mountain down to Cass and back home. He makes good use of the Senior Citizens bus to take him

elsewhere. He drives himself to Cass every Sunday to attend church at the Cass United Methodist Church. In the summer months he often drives to Cass to sit with the fellows in front of the Country Store to watch the trains go out, and see the many tourists who visit Cass every year.

Mr. Wanless says he couldn't get along without his next door neighbors, Mr. and Mrs. Gerald Cassell, and the Senior Citizen bus.

His wife of fifty-six years died nine years ago, leaving him alone. Mr. Wanless ended our interview with these words, "It's really tough living alone."

We hope to talk with him again on his 100th birthday

Mrs. Pritchard was born October 22, 1885, at Onota, the daughter of the late George and Margaret Cassell Pritchard.

In 1920 she was married to Fred Pritchard, who died in 1947.

She was a member of the Bafter Presbyterian Church and a Sunday School teacher for many years, and a member of the Cass Chapter No. 124, Order of the Eastern Star.

Surviving her are a son, Fred C. Pritchard, Jr., of St. Albans, four grandchildren, one great-grandchild, and one sister, Mrs. E. C. (Mabel) Smith, of Greensburg, Pennsylvania.

Funeral services will be held Thursday afternoon in the Bafter Presbyterian Church by the Rev. Thomas Henderson.

2/16/1911 Pocahontas Times a memorial tribute

No living person seems to remember a time when deeply pathetic and much lamented family in our county (this the closing months of 1910.

Among those passing or leaving a name embalmed with all that the hearts of her children and numerous acquaintances can give "their praise and their tears" was Mrs. Mary Frances, relict of the late Col. Stephen Cornelius Pritchard of Dunmore, Pocahontas County, W. Va., the subject of this memorial tribute.

Mrs. Pritchard was born September 20, 1837 in Greenbrier County, W. Va. Her parents the late Alexander and Mrs. Mary Susan McAllister were at that time residents of that county. Afterward they moved to Alleghany County and located near Covington where they reared their family of 11 children, whose births occurred in the following order; Mary Frances, James Renick, John A., Bettie A., Phoebe A., Susan J., Andrew K., Louisa C., Frank W., Riley M. and Samuel H. of these, 3 are living, James Renick, Phoebe A., and Louisa C. Much to their credit be it remembered that Mrs. Pritchard's parents desired their children to be well educated and sent their daughter to the Covington schools and to Ivy Cliff near Warm Springs, where Miss Maria

Richards accomplished so much good. Her marriage to Col. Pritchard occurred February 5, 1856, at the Alleghany home near Covington, West. James M. Price is believed to have officiated, after their marriage the parties settled at Columbia Furnace, Shenandoah County, Va., where they lived for 4 years, when Col. Pritchard sold his interest in the Columbia Furnace and located at Powell's Fort in the same county and built a furnace there, very soon after operations began at Powell's Fort furnace, the late war began and the property was raided by the Federals and the buildings burnt, whereupon the family came back to the old Alleghany home, and remained there until peace was declared. When Col. Pritchard took his family to Frederick County, the old Pritchard home, and remained there about 2 years. The prospects of making a living were so discouraging that the Col. returned to Bath, lived 2 or 3 years the Dean farm about 5 miles west of the Warm Springs, and then in 1873 came to Dunmore.

She became a member of the Baptist Presbyterian Church at Dunmore June 20, 1874. The Church for the time being, not having a pastor, the Rev. M. D. Dunlop, of Academy, was present, preached and moderated the session upon that memorable occasion.

Some years later Col. Pritchard became a member of the same Church whose much lamented

death occurred June 1, 1899.

They were the parents of 11 children born in the following order: Charles Edward, James Franklin, Mary Susan, Robert Martin, Margaret Elizabeth, John William, Anna Virginia, Ella, Cornelia Frances, Stephen Archibald, Samuel Reece, and Frederic Carter. 2 of the daughters, Mary & Margaret + 2 of the sons, Robert & Stephen are dead. The survivors are all residents of Dunmore and vicinity.

The writer of this memorial tribute cherishes special affection for her memory as that of a friend when friends were needed. yet he deems it expedient to specify the reason therefor. During the 25 years of our acquaintance, the writer has been reminded of so much that appears in the character of Mrs. Pritchard. Among the traits of a model woman that chapter says "she openeth her mouth with wisdom and on her tongue is the law of kindness; she looketh well to the ways of her household and eateth not the bread of idleness. Favour is deceitful and beauty is vain but a woman that feareth the Lord she shall be praised." Proverbs 31: 25-31.

This memorial tribute will be closed by extracts from a letter written by one of her most attached friends ever since her coming to Dunmore. a testimonial more appropriate

is rarely attainable for a purpose such as the one in view:

"It was Christmas morning, I had gone to church with my niece and while they were in Sabbath school I went to spend the hour with my old friend. As always she had a welcome for me. She sat by an open fire holding on her lap a little grand-daughter, in reply to my inquiry she said she was as well as usual. She has always been a frail looking woman and after suffering many attacks of illness, she of course grew more fragile; but this morning I thought she looked as well as usual, but later, after several of the absent members of her family had come in and she ^{had} greeted them in her gentle kindly way I noticed she grew very quiet; a tiny crimson spot burned on each cheek and she sat looking in the fire seemingly unconscious of the chatter around her till I arose to bid her goodbye. That evening she seemed to grow so weak she had to be almost carried to her bed, requiring repeated doses of a stimulant to keep up the least action. She seemed to grow steadily weaker and in spite of the tenderest care of her children and the most careful efforts of her physician, she quietly "fell or sleep" Wednesday afternoon, December 28, 1910. She was conscious until the end whilst she left no testimony at the last,

there is no one who can doubt her entrance into the heavenly home. She had lived the life of one who followed Christ, accepting him as her Savior, and there was no need of words to assure us that all was well in the end. She was faithful, consciously so, to every duty in life, as wife, mother, neighbor and friend; charitable toward the faults of others, she was loved by all who knew her. I have never heard anyone speak an unkind word of her. She was a Christian in the truest sense of the name."

James L. Batten has come into the family Bible of his grandfather, the late Squire William Batten, of Stony Creek. The book was published in 1847 by the American Bible Society, instituted in the year 1816. On a fly leaf is the notation "Bought of William T. Price, May the 3rd, 1850. William Batten was the eldest son of Col. John Batten, Sheriff, representative and general all around prominent citizen in the formative time of Pocahontas County. His mother was Mary Moore Batten, sister of Joseph Moore. William was their eldest son, being born November 23, 1808. His mother and three of her sons, Joseph, John and George moved to Braxton County. The daughters are Mrs. John Moore of Marlinton, Mrs. Henry Duncan of Stony Creek and Mrs. William Duncan, of Edray. William married Elizabeth Barlow on June 6, 1833. She was born May 5, 1814, daughter of John Barlow and Martha Waddell Barlow. William Batten died September 17, 1881 and his wife less than two months later, November 13, 1881.

The names of the children put down in the old book are Martha Jane May 27, 1834; Miriam, October 8, 1836; John, September 7, 1840; George, February 26, 1843; Mary Ann, December 29, 1846; Andrew, April 14, 1848; William Henry, August 17, 1849; Margaret Elizabeth, January 23, 1853; Samuel C., July 28, 1855; all are dead; the last to pass away being Mary Ann Batten Moore, wife of John R. Moore who died at her home in Marlinton last Wednesday, March 16, 1932. Margaret Elizabeth, Andrew, Miriam and John died while yet young.

Martha became the wife of Henry Poage and her son Henry Poage of Millpoint. Her second husband was Sheriff Sam Day and their son, Amos Day, of Red Lick.

George Baxter was a man prominent in the affairs of Buchanan County, serving for years as County surveyor. His first wife was Sarah Poage. Their children, J. Willis Baxter, Mrs. H. A. Slear, Adam O. Baxter, the late J. H. Patterson and Mrs. Georgia Hayes. His 2nd wife was Margaret Cassell, who survives. Their children are Mrs. Elmer Duncen, Frank Baxter, Mrs. E. C. Smith, Mrs. Fred Pritchard and Mrs. Harry Knox.

Mary Ann Baxter became the wife of John R. Moore. She died March 16, 1932. Their children are Mrs. Calvin May, Mrs. John May, Adam & Alva E. Moore.

William H. Baxter married Martha Gay. Their children are Mrs. W. L. King, Mrs. E. J. Shennahan and G. Prestor Baxter.

Samuel C. Baxter married Mary McClure. Their children are Mrs. Lloyd Van Keenan, Charles, J. L. Elmer, Levi, and A. Neal Baxter and Mrs. W. A. Grogg.

Colonel John Baxter had a large and select library for his day and his son William inherited and developed a great fondness for reading. At an early age he began teaching and became an efficient and popular instructor. He served for many years as a Magistrate and a member of the County Court. He was a ready writer, and did a great deal of work for his neighbors in framing business papers, as agreements, conveyances, deeds and wills. He exerted a great influence for good frequently.

Mrs Tallman was born at the old Cassell home on the Greenbrier River above Cass, July 19, 1851, before the days of the Civil War.

Some years later her father and family moved upon Back Mountain to the farm now owned by Willis Cassell where Mr. Cassell and his family and later Mrs Tallman and her husband Cyrus Tallman and sons claimed homes from the then vast forest.

Great and varied were the experiences of this pioneer lady. She learned lessons not from books but from the great wide open spaces, lessons that nature and The Book of books can teach.

Mrs Tallman was never willing to sit idle and contented when one was in distress or needed assistance but always willing to lend a helping hand.

Mrs Tallman was a life long member of the Methodist Church and the mother of ^{five} children, ^{two} of whom survive, Mrs Frank Arbogast of Millpoint and John Tallman of Cass, also numerous grand and great grand children and a host of friends

and other relatives.

The funeral was conducted from the Wanless Church by Rev. J. J. Pharr of the Cass Presbyterian Church. Interment in the Wanless Cemetery.
