Willie Cassell was down from Back Alleghany last Saturday. He told me that the loss of sheep from bears from the Cassell farm down through the years, directly and indirectly would run into the thousands of dollars, if there was any way to compute the loss. The direct loss was in sheep actually killed by bears; the indirect loss was in not keeping as many sheep as the farm would graze on account of the risk to run from bears killing them. Not until recent years, once the Jacy brothers have gone into bear hunting as a profession, has it been safe for the Cassells to graze sheep on their lands west of the Back Mountain Road. The big Chest wilderness is a bear haven, but in the last few years the Back Alleghany people have been able by systematically hunting them down, the sheep killing bears have not had long careers.
