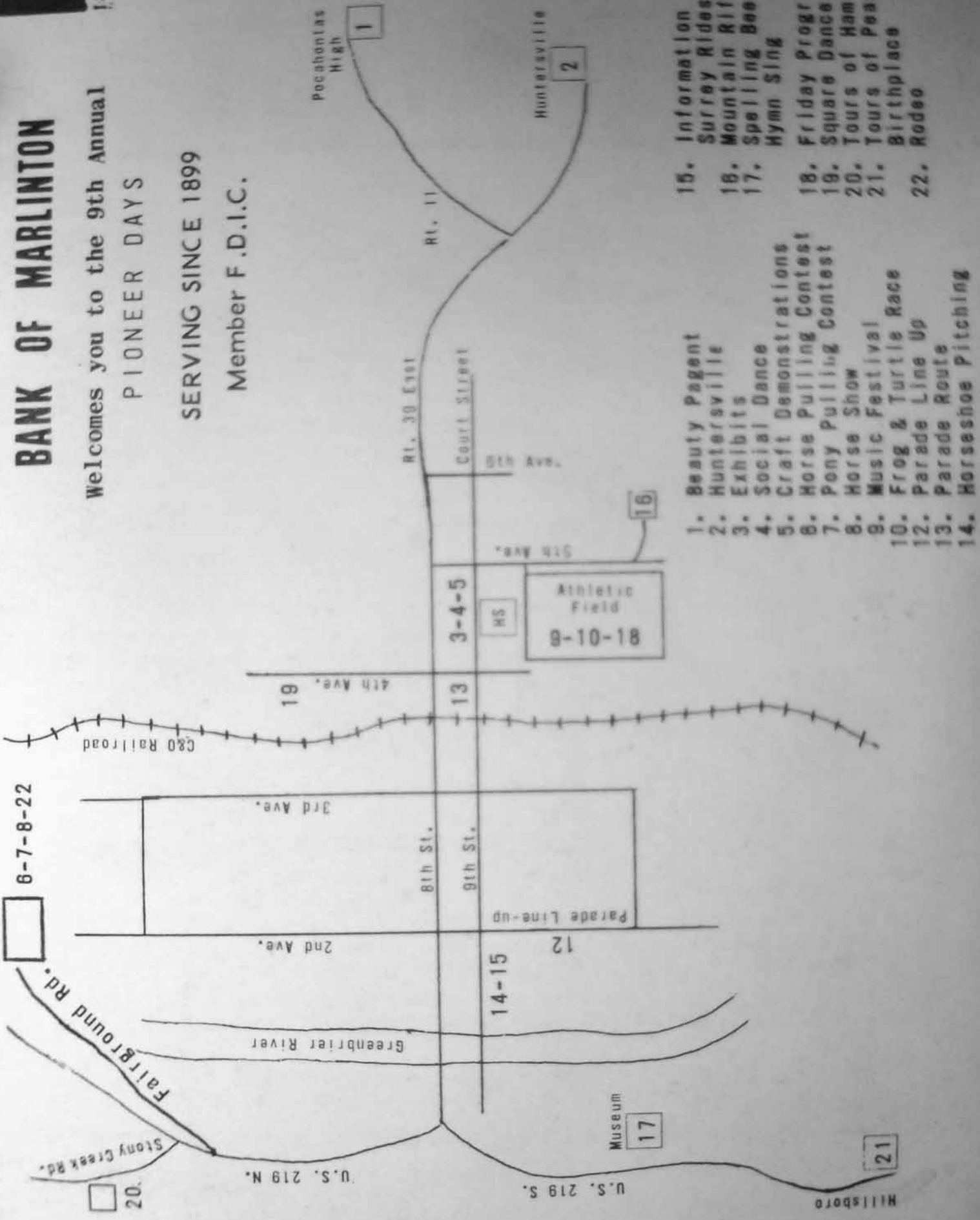

## The Museum



The Pocahontas County Historical Society was re-organized in 1961, and in 1962 it acquired its headquarters and museum building from the late Mrs. Frank Hunter. The house was built in 1904 by the Hunters when he was the first cashier of the Bank of Marlinton.

The grounds around the museum consist of approximately two acres lying between US Route 219 (Seneca Trail) and the Greenbrier River. On the right of the Museum are the graves of about forty Confederate soldiers. To the left are the graves of several of the early members of the Price family. An early Pocahontas County log cabin is also located on the grounds.

The Museum was dedicated in 1963 by Pearl Buck, world renowned author who was born in Hillsboro, and the then Governor of West Virginia, W. W. Barron. The library room in the Museum is named in Miss Buck's honor.

The Pioneer Days celebration was begun by the Historical Society in 1967 and has become an annual event. It is intended to be a time for people to honor the pioneers who first settled in this beautiful land that is our heritage, a time to take stock of the good things of life, to be grateful for them, and to enjoy them.

The Pocahontas County Historical Museum is owned by public spirited citizens throughout the county, state, and nation. Inquire at the Museum Shop if interested in membership in the Pocahontas County Historical Society.

### FOR YOUR INFORMATION

The Pioneer Days Souvenir Badge, cost \$1.00, is required for persons six years of age and older. It entitles holder to all events except the Rodeo, Horse Show, Horse Pulling Contest, Pony Pulling Contest, and Miss Pocahontas Pageant. The badge or \$1.00 will be required for admission to the Friday night program and the Music Contest. There is a charge for the surrey, but the wagon rides are free. The wagons will stop at the Museum, in front of the Presbyterian Church on Main Street, and at the Elementary School. On Saturday the wagons will stop at the Rifle Shooting Contest.

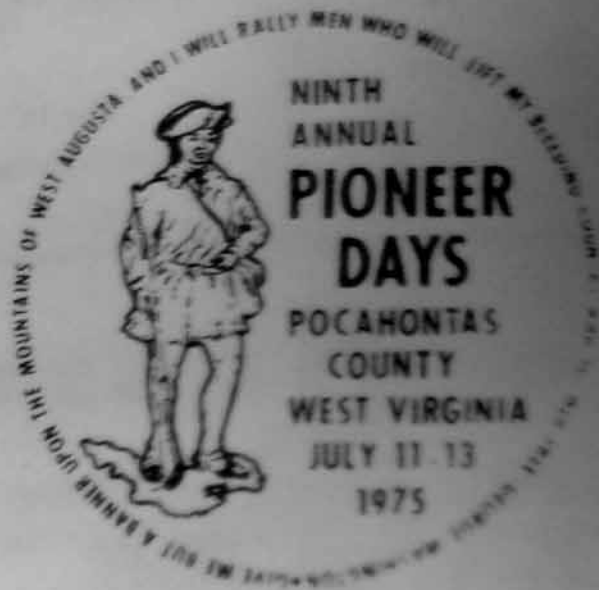

The 1975 Ninth Annual Pioneer Days Badge honors our pioneer great-great-grandfathers of two hundred years ago who served the cause of freedom as Indian scouts and Revolutionary soldiers.

George Washington said, "Give me but a banner and let me place it upon the mountains of West Augusta, and I will rally around me men who will lift my bleeding country from the dust, and set her free." Pocahontas was part of Augusta County at that time.

As scouts they had helped protect the frontier against Indian attacks and secured the western line so the Revolutionary War could be fought in the East without diversion, then they went on as soldiers to raise the flag of freedom over their new country.

"They wore fringed hunting shirts, dyed yellow, brown, white and even red; quaintly carved shot-bags and powder-horns hung from their broad ornamented belts; they had fur caps or soft hats, moccasins, and coarse woolen leggings reaching half-way up the thigh. Each carried his flint-lock, his tomahawk, and scalping-knife."

# Part Of The 1975

## Pioneer Days Experience

Since the Pearl S. Buck Birthplace officially opened May 4, 1974, over 7,000 persons have toured this beautifully restored house honoring America's best known woman author, Pearl S. Buck. Visitors from about 35 states and eight foreign countries have come to Hillsboro, in scenic Pocahontas County, to see the museum restored to the "Gay Nineties" period.

Miss Buck was born here June 26, 1892, the daughter of Absalom Sydenstricker and Caroline Stulting Sydenstricker. Originally from Holland, the Stultings emigrated to Hillsboro in about 1850 and built the house which has now been restored as the author's birthplace museum. Several of the Sydenstrickers, her father's family, served as ministers in Pocahontas and Greenbrier counties. Absalom, her father, spread the Gospel to distant China where Miss Buck spent much of her life. Those experiences in China provided the subject matter for many of her novels, notably "The Good Earth", which won her the Pulitzer Prize in 1932. After winning the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1938, this native daughter of West Virginia became the only woman to have won both of these illustrious awards.

Today, the Buck Museum displays antique furniture belonging to both families plus a wide variety of period pieces added since last year. Among the most unusual pieces are a trundle bed, an original rope bed, the authentic family organ, watchmaker's tools, and carpenter's lathe. An architect's dream built by skillful Dutch craftsmen, the Stulting house has delicate woodwork on the interior as well as bay windows on the exterior.

Opened this season, the original barn displays many antique farm implements such as a horse-drawn corn planter and assorted carpentry tools. Young and old alike will enjoy exploring this replica of that "Golden Age" when farming was the number one occupation. Local farmers will also exhibit several rare tools and machines of the past in the barn.

Taking pride in the development of this historic and culturally enriching project, many Pocahontas Countians have led the way to advance its programs. The Foundation wishes to thank the following contributors: Miss Julia Louise Price, Mr. and Mrs. John D. Rockefeller IV, Bank of Marlinton, First National Bank in Marlinton, and the Marlinton Woman's Club.

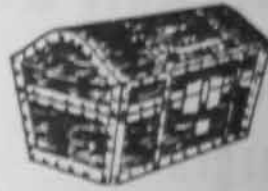

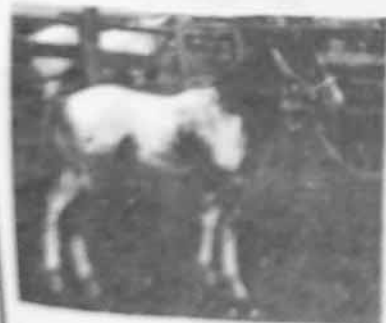
