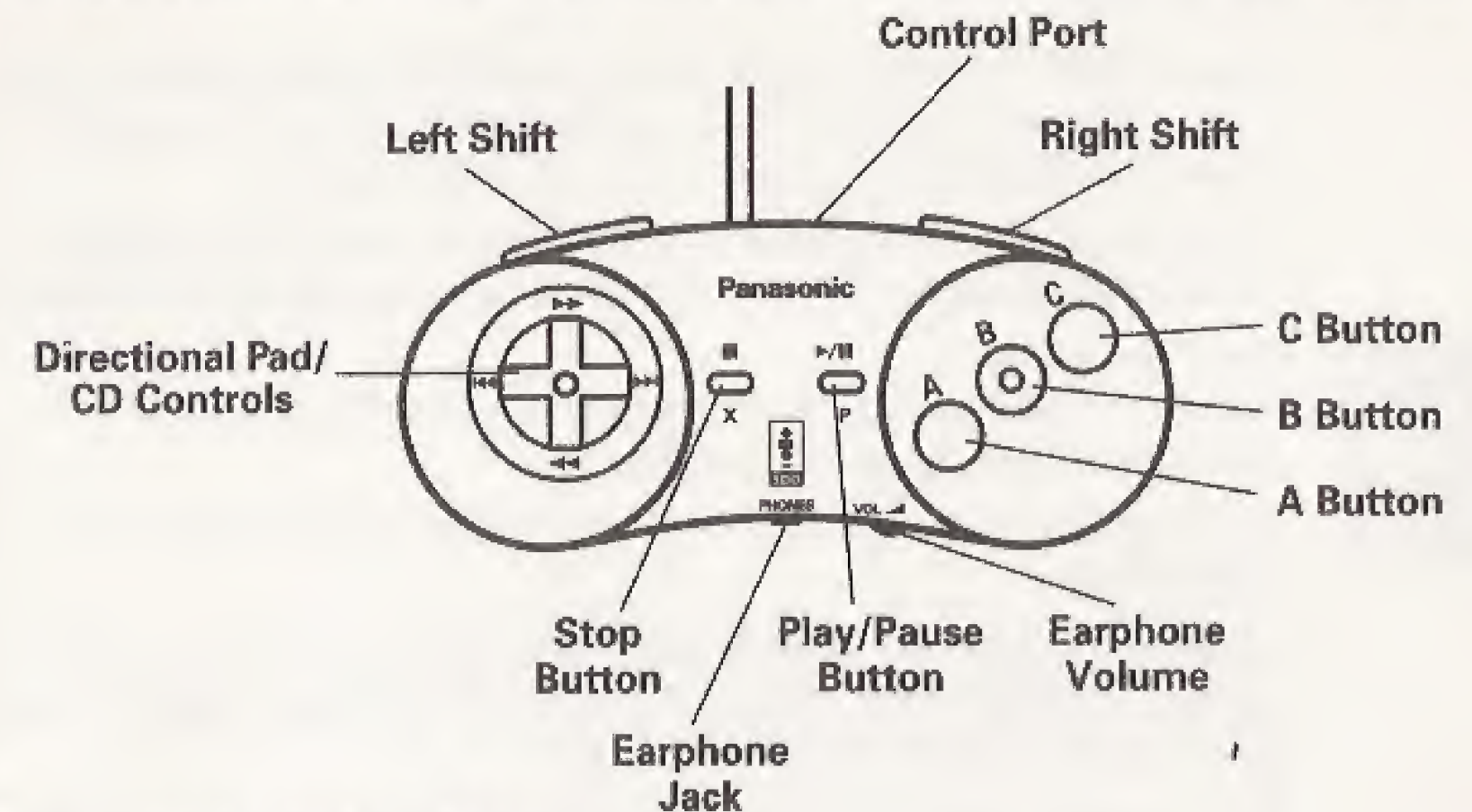

3DO™ QUICK START CARD

GAME CONTROLS

Use the Game Controller to time travel through the 20th Century



DIRECTIONAL PAD

Move the onscreen cursor arrow up, down, left, and right.

BUTTONS

- A** The action button. Use the Control Pad to point to an onscreen feature, such as an image, then press **A**. You can also press **A** to close certain information boxes, and interrupt audio or motion presentations.
- C** Position the cursor over an image and press **C** to learn about its function.

STARTING 20TH CENTURY VIDEO ALMANAC

1. Turn on your 3DO™ Interactive Multiplayer™ System.
2. Press **OPEN/CLOSE** to extend the disc tray.
3. Place your **20th Century Video Almanac** disc in the tray, label side up.
4. Press **OPEN/CLOSE** to retract the disc tray. After a few moments, the **Main Screen** appears.

USING 20TH CENTURY VIDEO ALMANAC

The **Main Screen** offers all the features of the program as command buttons.

Use the Directional Pad on the 3DO Control Pad to move your cursor around the screen. When you select an active command button, a pop-up description appears. Press **A** to choose that command.

COMMAND BUTTONS

The following six command buttons appear at the right and left of the Main Screen.



TIMELINE

Open the **Timeline** screen. Select any picture on the horizontal scroll bar, using the large **Scroll Backward** or **Scroll Forward** command buttons (bottom left and right screen), then press **A**. When a picture is selected, point the cursor to it to view a pop-up title.

Choose **View Article** (upper left) to read the accompanying text. Choose the curled corner of the page to turn to the next page or choose the **Previous Article** or **Next Article** button.

From either **Timeline** screen, you can also return to the **Main Screen**, **Go Back** to the last screen you used, or go to the **Library**.



ON THIS DAY...

Open the **Date** screen. To choose another month, click the previous or next month's calendar.

To choose another day, click the "curl" at the bottom right of the calendar.

Select any picture on the left and press **A** to see a blow up of it and the related article. (You can choose **Next Page** at the bottom of the picture list to see more choices).

In an article, choose the curled corner of the page to turn to the next page or choose the **Previous Article** or **Next Article** button.

From either **Date** screen, you can also return to the **Main Screen**, **Go Back** to the last screen you used, or go to the **Library**.



WHERE IN THE WORLD?

Open the **Where in the World?** map screen. Select a continent and press **A**. Select a country from the list and press **A**.

Select any picture on the left and press **A** to see a blow up of it and the related article. (You can choose **Next Page** to see more choices.)

In an article, choose the curled corner of the page to turn to the next page or choose the **Previous Article** or **Next Article** button.

From either **Where in the World?** screen, you can also return to the **Main Screen**, **Go Back** to the last screen you used, or go to the **Library**.



EXIT

Quit **20th Century Video Almanac**. When you remove the disc, store it in the jewel case.



GO BACK

Return to the last screen you used.



LIBRARY

Opens the **Library** screen, where you can choose either of two folders. Choose **View by Category** to open an index of photos and articles organized by category. Choose a command button on the left to choose from the five categories, including **Politics**, **War & Disasters**, **Sports**, **People**, **Science & Technology**, and **Grab Bag**. Within a category photos and articles are organized in chronological order.

Choose **Video Index** to open an index of videotapes and articles organized in chronological order. Choose a picture or turn the page to see more choices. When you select a picture, the video runs; you may also read the associated article.

In an article, choose the curled corner of the page to turn to the next page or choose the **Previous Article** or **Next Article** button.

From any **Library** screen, you can also return to the **Main Screen**, **Go Back** to the last screen you used, or go to the first **Library** screen.
