A Message from Martin Luther

Where eternal life and salvation are concerned, St. Peter and all godly men dismiss all other doctrines and know of none but that of this one Man Christ, of whom St. Peter declares: "You have the words of eternal life." Those words will satisfy me. This is beautifully spoken. He [Peter] will . . . cling to His [Christ's] words. And to them we, too, will

adhere; for these words impart eternal life. St. Peter hits the nail on the head. (LW 23:194)

Source of Doctrine

The LCMS bases its doctrine on the inerrant Word of God found in the Scriptures and, as an exposition of the Scriptures, the Lutheran Confessions found in the Book of Concord.

Role of Christ/Way of Salvation

Salvation is a free gift given by grace through faith in Christ Jesus. Even faith is a free gift of God that humankind plays no role in. We simply receive the free gift of faith through the Word and in our Baptism. Salvation is found in Christ alone.

Sacraments

Baptism bestows forgiveness, rescue from death and the devil, and the gift of faith to eternal salvation. In Holy Communion, the communicant receives the true body and blood of Christ in, with, and under the bread and the wine for forgiveness and strengthening of faith.
