One of the best-known breeds of dogs, Terriers have great stamina and persistence. They are intelligent and very obedient.




Fox Terriers make excellent pets. One of the most famous, was "Igloo", a dog that belonged to Lt. Commander Richard Byrd.

Igloo accompanied the famous explorer to the North Pole. On the dog's gravestone, Byrd had inscribed "More than a friend."












They maintain nature's balance by becoming food for larger, more valuable fish. They also are favored by fishermen as bait.




The Minnow family includes Shiners, Daces, and Chubs. The Sacramento Chub is abundant in rivers of the California valley.
