On Friday, Aug. 17, 1894, Rev. J.M. Sloan, Evangelist of Greenbrier Presbytery organized the Driftwood Presbyterian Church, assisted by Rev. Edgar Floyd Alexander. RECOMMENDATIONS

This initial survey of Pocahontas County uncovered a number of sites that are considered to be of potential historic significance. These sites are located throughout the county and pertain to a number of the themes identified. Recommendations for further action on these sites are presented below. A number of recommendations apply to all of the sites in general or to activities of the Historic Landmark Commission. These are presented first.

The first recommendation is that the Landmark Commission continue the work begun by this survey. This was only designed as a very general overview of the possible resources that exist in the county. As that, this project has succeeded. There are though a number of areas that need additional research as well as some themes. These areas include those that were not covered under this project due to time or other constraints. The Little Levels area is one where a large potential exists but was barely scratched by this survey. The Slaty Fork area is another where more research is necessary. The area in the south west of the county requires more inventory, as well as that to the north west. All of these areas should be surveyed as were the areas completed this summer.

Another recommendation is the listing of some of the sites identified on a county Historic Landmark Register. This is important as it provides the county a method of recognizing sites that are significant to the county or specific localities in the county, but may not be significant enough to warrant listing on the National Register. It is also a method of short cutting the National Register since formal listing may sometimes take up to 9 months. Projects that need immediate recognition can be listed on a County Register until such time is available for further listing. The county register can also recognize periods or areas of significance that may not meet federal criteria such as the minimum age level, 50 years.

In creating a County Register, a logical and standardized nomination process and criteria for evaluation must be established. Normally, beginning with the National Criteria and modifying it is adequate. One modification may be lowering the age limit to 40 or 30 years if a large number of sites that are significant to the county fall into that period. Another is to recognize specific themes that are particularly significant to the the county. These may be Railroads; Chemical Industry; Oil and gas; River transportation; etc.

The nomination process can be simple to make it accessible to the public. For example, one county requires the completion of a State Inventory Form as the documentation for a nomination. This is submitted to the Historic Landmark Commission at one of the regularly scheduled meetings or mailed in time to be reviewed at

meeting. At the following meeting the Commission votes on whether to accept it for listing after discussion or receipt of any additional information it may have requested. This meeting delay on voting allows the preparer or anyone interested to comment on the nomination. A process such as this, or any that meets the requirements of the county can be employed. The important thing is to have a regular logical process for listing.

Recommendations that refer to the particular sites reviewed in this project are presented below. They are divided into a number of major categories. The first is sites that the survey team recognizes as having major historical or architectural significance and recommends for National Register listing as individual sites. The second is sites that appears to have some significance but may not be eligible for National Register Listing. These should be considered as local landmarks and listed on a local register. During this listing process, additional information can be provided that would aid in the decision on National listing. In other words, additional research may be necessary on these sites. The third category is sites that should be investigated as potential Historic Districts. To do this, intensive level surveys of these sites should be accomplished. The fourth category is that of potential thematic nominations. Again the sites in these themes or the themes themselves will need to be investigated on a more intensive level.

CATEGORY ONE

The sites in this category were determined to have such major significance that they were recognized immediately as eligible for National Register Listing. These are sites that are of primary importance to the county or history of the state or nation. A list and brief discussion of these sites follows. Please refer to the appropriate inventory form as indicated by the Survey number in parentheses. More in depth research will need to be done on these sites to complete nomination forms.

1. A004 Traveller's Repose. This is a very significant site in the transportation theme of the county as a stop or inn on the Turnpike. It is also the site of a Civil War battle and is identified on the map accompanying the report in the Official Record's.
2. A006 Rothkugel Plantation. This site is significant as the beginning of forrest management in the timber industry.
3. A0027 Isaac Moore Farm. This is a significant farm in the county and an intact architectural site.
4. A0044 Dr. Moomau House. This is a very intact and significant piece of architecture for the county with the complex of buildings that relate to the practise of Dr. Moomau.
5. A0049 Isaac Moore Jr. House.
