David Little Ruckman came to Pocahontas County in 1832, purchased this farm and served as constable of Pocahontas. His son, Col. John W. Ruckman, was commander of the Pocahontas County Militia. Mattheus Ruckman, son of Col. John, was elder in Oak Grove Presbyterian Church. His son Fred W. was a graduate of Richmond School of Law. Fred's son Wilmer, a staff sergeant in Air Force in WWII was later principal in Cass and Hillsboro Elementary Schools. Fred W. was also a county commissioner.

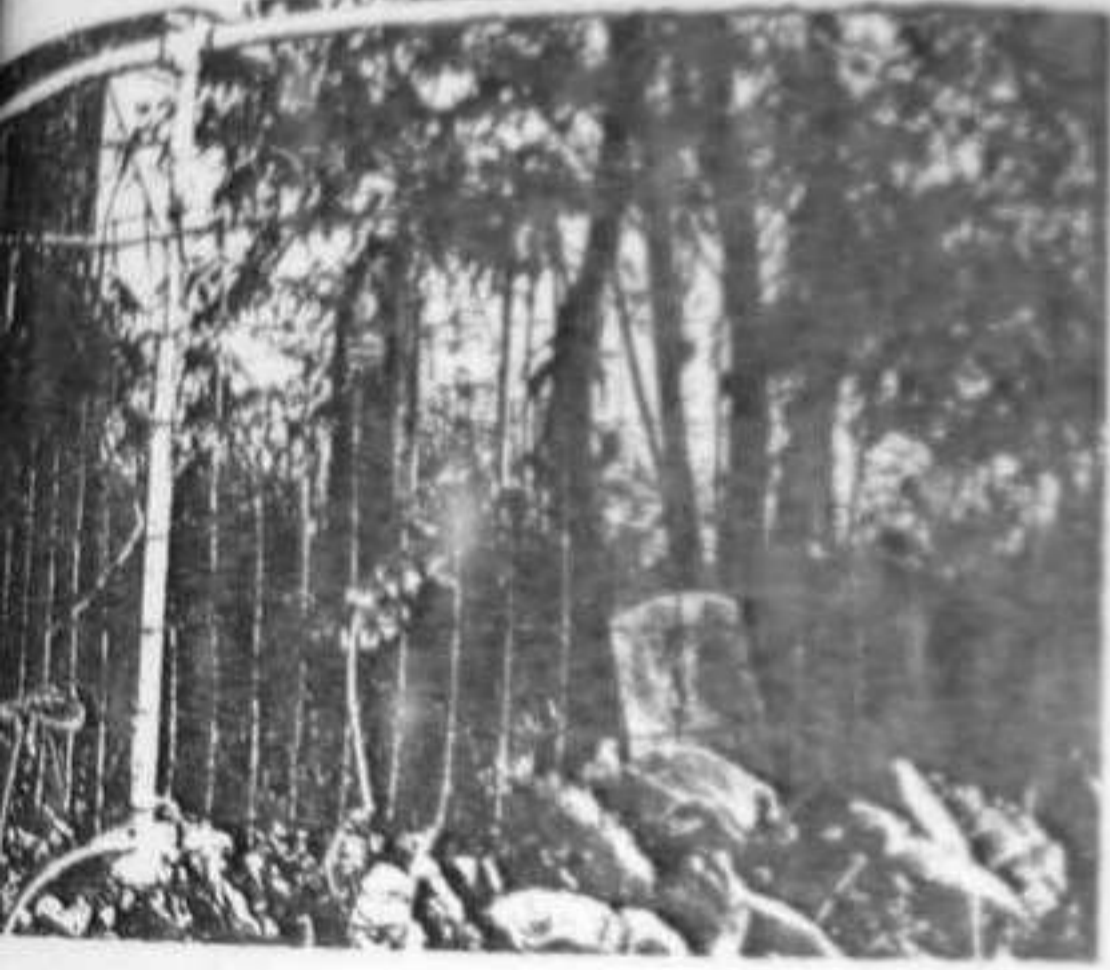
