


## Latest Reports From Local User Groups

Sierra Nevada: The Sierra Pick Information Exchange (SPIE) is a newly formed group that hosted twenty-one Pick users at its recent inaugural meeting and which now includes fifteen paid members, a count estimated to be one-fourth of the total Pick users in their area. SPIE sessions are held the second Tuesday of each month at the Capitol Plaza Holiday Inn in Sacramento. The July meeting featured a presentation by Lisa Levsen of Cornnuts, who discussed preventive maintenance that can be done by the user (versus the responsibilities of the customer engineer). The August meeting included a demonstration of word processing software by John Treankler of Jet Software, using a Zebra 2500 loaned to the group by Lee Eschen. Membership is \$35 and dinner meetings are then \$15 each. 

discussing the advanced use of English, along with a technical session by Rick Bawcum of BayData Concepts demonstrating the Cosmos Revelation package using both a floppy-based machine and a hard disk system. 

# Need To Unload Your Old Microdata?




