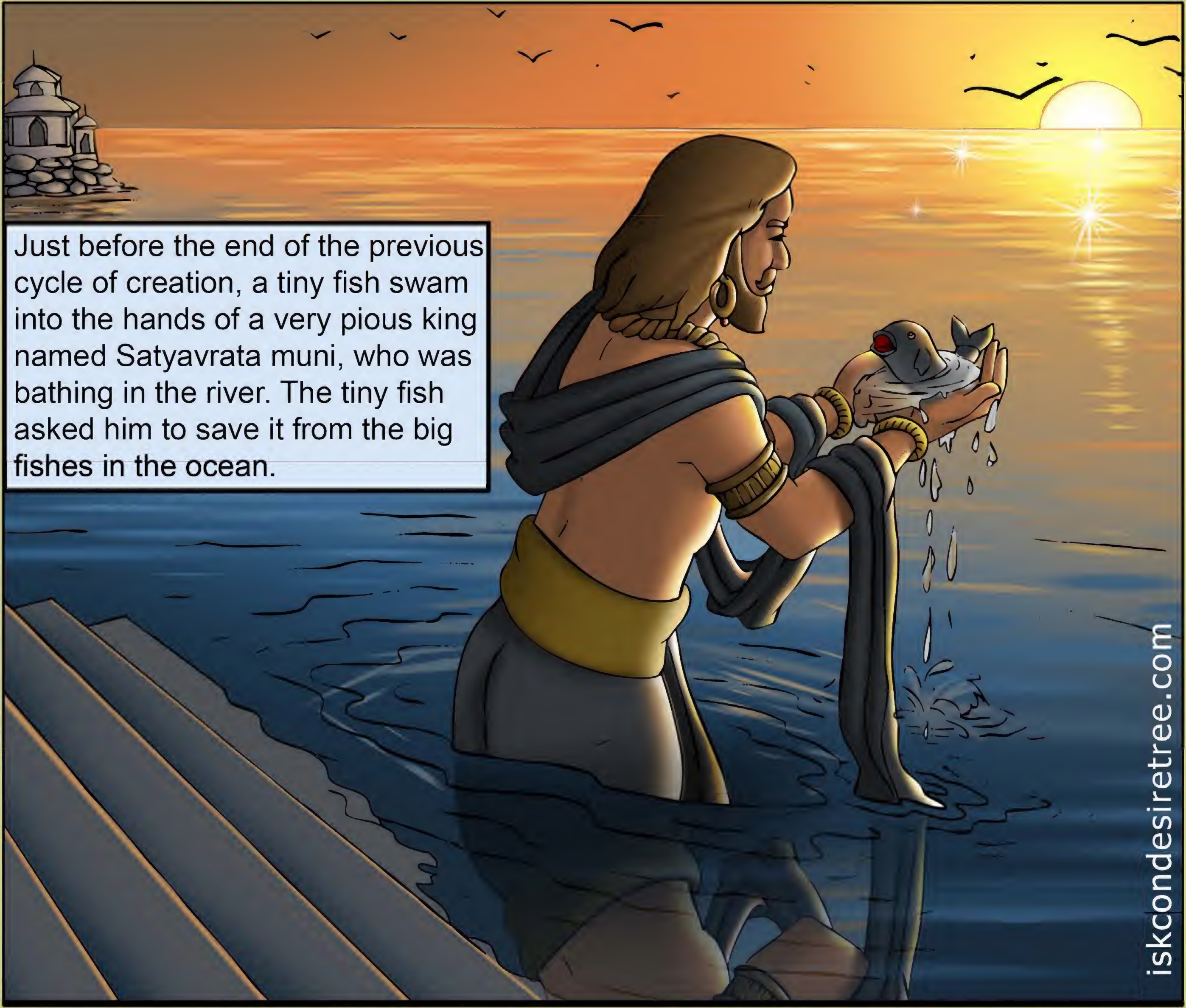
The Fish Incarnation

Matsya Avatar is the 1st amongst the Dashavatara of Lord Vishnu.

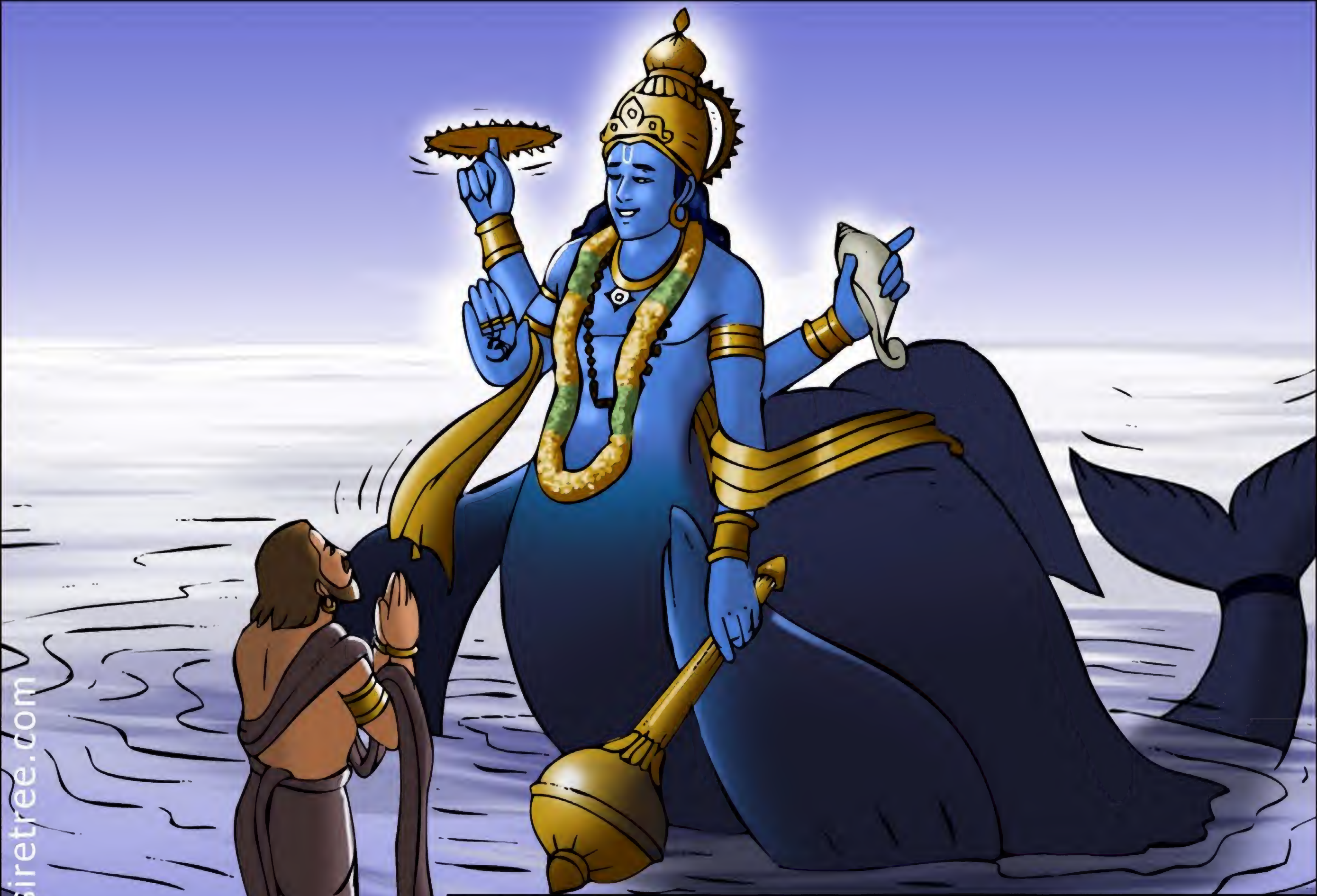

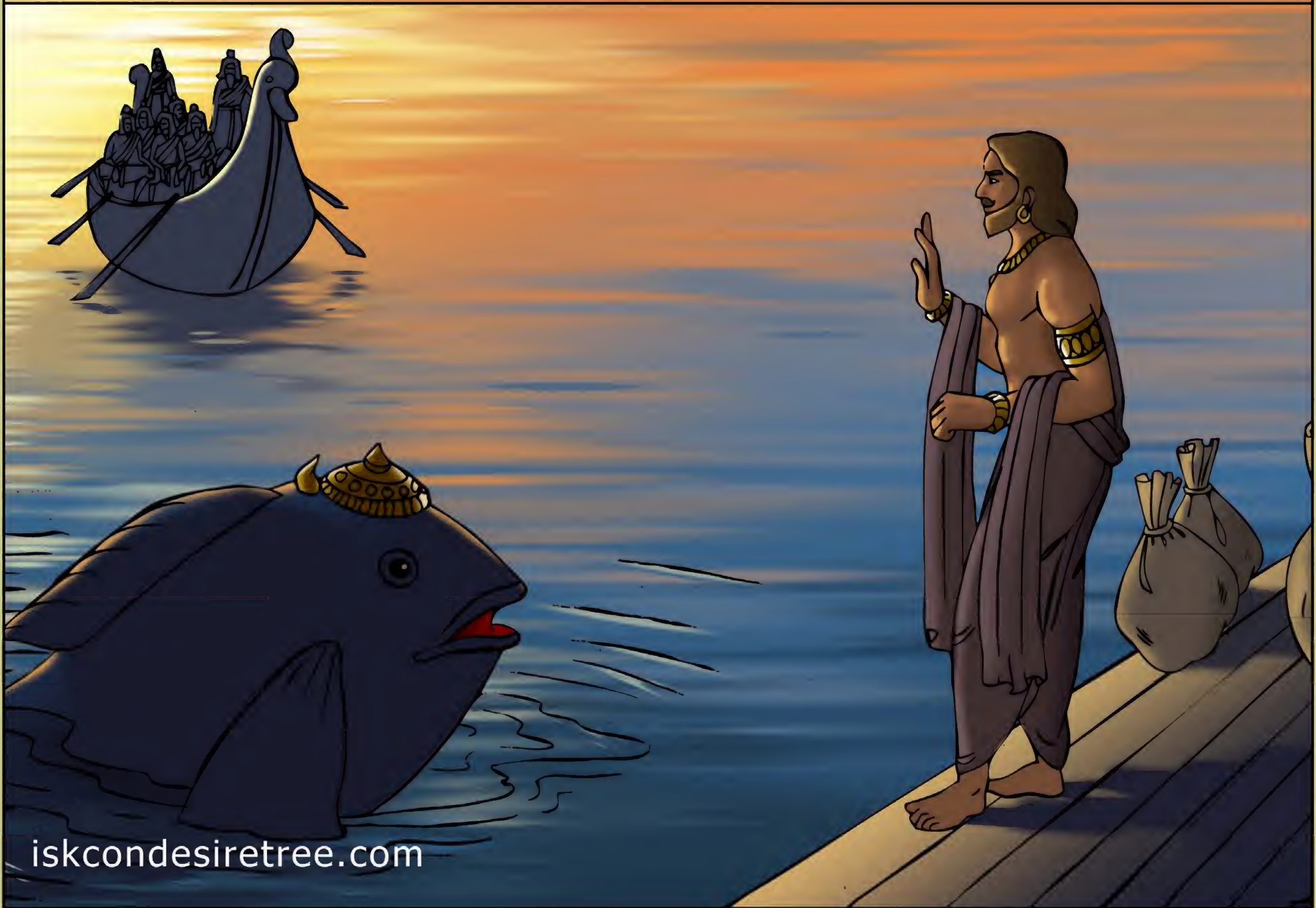

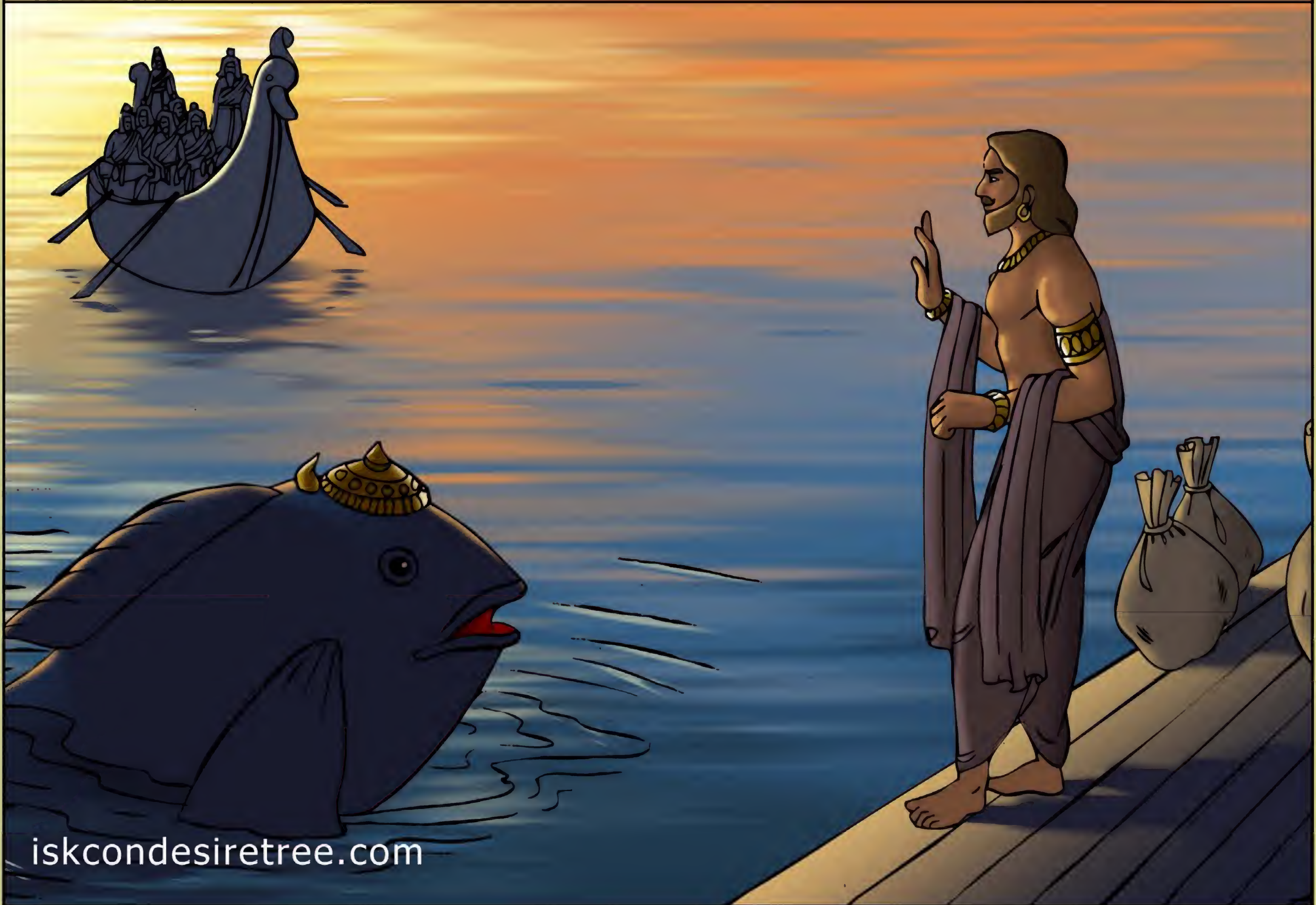

When the deluge was taking place, a demon named Hayagriva stole all the Vedas and took refuge in a conch-shell under the ocean. Lord Matsya saved the Vedas by killing the demon.

Lord Matsya then returns the Vedas to Lord Brahma, for the purpose of creation.
