- 3. Objective: T-2 Covert Action (Assets of Political Influence)
- 4. Operational Data:

a. Operational Assignments and Clearances: PDDYNAMIC is a FNRADIUS Activity that provides support to an anti-Soviet Ukrainian emigre organization, the ZP/UHVR (Foreign Representation of the Ukrainian Supreme Liberation Committee), headquarters in New York with a publishing branch in Munich, Germany. The activities of this group include the publication of books and a journal in Ukrainian for distribution into the Soviet Union. In addition, legal travel operations are mounted for infiltration of proscribed literature and for contact with Ukrainian dissidents and exfiltration of samizdat and information on abuses of human rights in the Ukraine. Purpose is to influence and encourage citizens who favor and seek liberalization of their country's internal policies. All witting agents have received operational clearances.

- 5. Accomplishments and Plans:

Accomplishments: During the reporting period, an estimated total of 23,500 items of PDDYNAMIC-produced literature were infiltrated into the Soviet Union, including 8,000 copies of the journal Suchasnist, 5,500 issues of the letter-sized Information Bulletin and some 8,000 copies of books, as well as assorted pamphlets published by Prolog. In the course of the year, over 80 PDDYNAMICvetted legal travelers visited the Ukraine, infiltrating proscribed literature and exfiltrating news of dissident activity, violations of human rights, and samizdat material and protests and appeals from Ukrainians in Soviet prison camps. Prolog also published and reprinted a total of 12 books during this period, covering

a broad range of topics, including poetry, biography, novels, essays, and political and historical works, both by Ukrainian authors unable to publish their works internally and by Ukrainian emigres and dissidents living abroad. Recently, Prolog provided some 150 new <u>samizdat</u> documents which were made available to Radio Liberty and other interested groups. Finally, the PDDYNAMICS developed several new programs during the reporting period. In addition to establishing four new contacts and channels of distribution within Poland, the organization initiated a new "Islamic Project" aimed at developing contacts and channels of distribution into Soviet Central Asia. For this purpose, they have hired a Crimean Tatar emigre researcher tasked with initiating a book distribution and traveller program into the Soviet Central Asian region. Arrangements were also made during this period for the delivery of PDDYNAMIC-produced publications to various academic and political institutes in the PRC concerned with the Soviet nationality question.

6. Plans: In response to recent events in Poland, Prolog plans to produce some 500 pocket-sized editions of their special issue of <u>Suchasnist</u> dealing with the issue of workers' rights in Soviet Ukraine and is preparing some 3,000 copies of a special "Polish Pamphlet" for distribution inside the USSR. In addition, the organization plans to significantly expand its publication program to include works by Russian and East European authors.
