Enclosed is a clipping from the Saturday, May 1st,  
issue of the Winnipeg Free Press.

On 2 May 64 this Headquarters received a telephone  
call from one [REDACTED], Winnipeg, who  
advised that he had some interesting information concerning the  
events covered by the Free Press in their article. I might mention  
here that [REDACTED] is a Social Worker presently employed by the Family  
Bureau of Greater Winnipeg.

Upon interviewing [REDACTED], it was learned that he had  
observed an insertion in the Classified Section of the Free Press,  
which he felt should be drawn to the attention of the authorities  
conducting the investigation mentioned in the Free Press' article.

A search was made through recent issues of the  
Winnipeg Free Press, with the following observation:

The following appeared in the 'Personal' section of the Classified  
Advertisements in the issues of the 7th, 8th and 9th of April, 1964.

INT. AIRPORT, LOUNGE. FEB. 13, 1964.  
GENTLEMEN INTERESTED IN TEXTILES KAN.  
CY. APPLY TO BOX 400, FREE PRESS.

All issues from 1 Feb 64 to 4 May 64 were checked, but only the  
three issues mentioned carried this insertion.

With a view to minimizing publicity, no enquiries  
were made of the Free Press concerning the source of this ad.  
It was felt here that this information should be directed to  
you for whatever action you deem necessary. This office would  
be glad to lend any assistance to you in furthering this aspect  
of your investigation.
