

## WORLD MUSIC RADIO

#### INDEPENDENT RADIO IN EUROPE

On Sunday August 19th 1973 at 1058 CMT the Dutch GPO entered the house from where WMR was operating and stopped its activity after 10 years of broadcasting. This was in the middle of the John c'Hill Show which this particular day, according to inform ations, was presented by Theo Verstracten then Mr. o'Will was on holiday. When the people from the GPO arrived they demanded the operator to close the transmitter, which was done with the following message to the listeners: "... Meanwhile, the management and broadcasting staff of World Music Radio to thank its many thousands of listeners, correspondents and supporters for their generous support in the past, and for playing their part in making WHR's ten years of broadcasting an achievment unique in the history of Econocciting. WH HOPE TO DE PLOY ONE DAY!! Goodbye, and thank you! 73!" In this way World Music Radio left the airwaves, without any honour, but proudly.

But what caused the raiding of WHR? It all started with an express telegram from the "British Broadcasting Corporation" to the Dutch GPO saying that an illegal radio station called World Music Radio was on the air and that their location was The Netherlands. This telegram did not come from the British GPO or any other similiar institution, but from the BBC, a radio station

that has NOTHING to do in this business: We can not possibly express how vulgar this act was, and we do not hesitate a second to call it betrayel. A betrayel against a young pioneer of Free Radio: We know for sure that the BBC acting theway they did lost many of its listeners and fans here in EUrope, and I personally want to add that I have not listened to BBC at all after it was known what they have done to WMR — a station that all Free Radio fans loved very much. The Dutch GPO was practically forced to take legal action since they for a long time had been very patient with WMR.

Another main question is why the BBC acted the way they did. To this we can find only one answer: They looked at WMR as a dangerous compatitor which had to be destroyed. The big BBC against the young pioneer WMR:: No comments are necessary:

Now for a brief look at the station's history:

World Music Radio started its operations in 1963 on MW using the name Hadio Free Nederland (the station that now is using this name and which also is a member of FRL has nothing to do with former WMR). Later they switched to SW and did also use the name Radio Carolien, and in April 68 they started broadcasting in the 49 m band as Radio Euro-Weekend. Four months later the name was changed to World Misic Radio and after some frequency changes (6067 kHz was an often used fq.) they broadcasted on the final 6250 kHz from September 1972.

The transmissions was aired on Sundays before noon, and in the beginning of July 73 WAR even added an evening show to their pro-

### NEWS IN BRIEF

#### ON THE PIRATE RADIO SCENE

According to newspapers the Butch government has signithe "Strasbourg Treaty" which means that the offshore stations have to close soon.

Radio POLAR (International) can now be heard on Sundays and Saturdays on 6225 kHz at 1000 GLT. Sorry we can't keep our promice from "Supporter" no 1 to return to R. Polar in more details thes time.

UFO-Radio, which belongs to the Free Radio Hetwork of R. Polar can be heard on weekends and maybe on other days on 6225 kHz at 2335- GMT.

Radio CAROLINE HOLLAND had to close down after 5 minutes on the first test transmissions. They were using an old amateur transmitter which exploded and burned totaly. Hew starts are planed for winter 74/75.(TR) As you see it's dangerous to be a pirate station operator. (Red.)

UNITED RADIO EUROPE is a new mobile station transmitting in the German language, but QTH is told not to be Germany. They are asking for 2 IRC's for a QSL reply, and the QSL is only a very bad letter. (TR)

Radio SWING-IN is a rather new Swedish FM pirate which is transmitting with a power of 5 watts. The first broadcast was aired on November 29th 1973. To confuse the GPO they are using transmitters from different location and are constantly changing transmitter. Interfering with Radio Sweden the fre-

quency was changed from 95,5 MHz to 98 MHz.

Still in Sweden - the result of the trial against RADIO 88, on which we had an article in last issue, is now known. The three people involved were found guilty in breaking the radio determinations and they all were fined: The troubadour: 300 Swedish Kr, the youngster: 250 Sw.Kr and the woman: 50 Sw. Kr.

The European Radio Association has recently been formed in England with a view to give some form of unity to the whole free radio movement in Europe, which at the present is rather disjoined and ineffectual. In this way it is hoped that our views will stand a better chance of being beard by the governments of Europe. The ERA will be a federation of existing movements.

Test transmission. This issue has been a Livere deleyed ?-cause we have waited for informations from Radio ATTANTA WEST whish dates, times and frequencies the test transmissions were going to take place. We have so far got no infos from the operator, but as far as we understand the first of these tests have allready been aired. These tests are carried out in co-operation with the FRE in order to improve reception in the Scandinavian countries, since the stati ion has plans for regular programmes will give tests on QRG's around 49 m well as around 41 m. #### RADIO GEMINI = SPECIAL AUNOUNCEMENT

After twelve months of successful and trouble free broadcasting. Radio Gemini suffered its first raid by post office officials on December 9th 1973. The resulting loss of equipment and other material has fored Radio Gemini to temporary close down.

The raid, at an alleged Gemini transmitting site, was attended by Messr. Gotts and Frisby of notable post office fame, along with several others including two policemen and two trainee thugs (probably from the newly formed post office from thug departemment). Our official photographer was at the scene, and it is hoped to publish such action pictures as "If he doesn't admit operating the equipment - give him a bunch of fives"...

Economies in taxpayers money and petrol were evident, through the use of three post office vehicles and a police car. They arrived some thirty minutes or more after the end of transmission - complete with search warrant. Entry could not therefore be refused and although evidence was purely sircumstantial, a considerable amount of equipment was confiscated as well as a large amount of paper work.

The closing of Radio Gemini is very bad for us, and we hope our absence will be noticed. A special thank you to our many listeners who have supported us during the past year, and hopefully it will not be too long before we can be heard again on 6230 kHs in the 49 metre band. (Radio Gemini.)

The Radio Genini court case is coming up in about a months time and we hope to return to R.G. then and give you more informations please turn to page 12

#### RADIO 2525

Radio 2525 is today only a project, but the first test transmission will start soon (in summer) on 48 metres.

The staff has a total of 4, one BJ, one engineer, one for the studio technic and one for external relations. All aged between 24 and 40 years.

The transmitter is home made and the output will be around 40 watts. Antenna: halfwave dipole (23 metres) 12 metres above the ground. Transmitter site: somewhere in Europe.

Transmissions will be on the air irregularly on Sundays/Saturdays for maximum of 30 minutes each transmission. The language will be English. The programmes will include music (old and new), records from the pirate scene some years ago, music requests and mail bag.

All reception reports will be verified 100% by a QSL card and information sheet. Questions will be answered during the programme. Reception reports are most welcome, ditto comments on programme and on technical quality. If you want to receive a QSL, please anclose 2 IRG's and a self addressed envelope.

Radio 2525 do not want any mail before the first tests have been on the air, so we'll wait to give you their address.
