## FAN FINED 1000 POUNDS FOR TUNING TO A PIRATE STATION!

A driver has been fined 1000 pounds after he was caught with a receiver tuned to a pirate station – even though it was not switched on.

In what is thought to be one of the first cases of its kind in the country Colin Clark, 45, was driving along Honeypot Lane, in Stanmore, when he was stopped on Easter Sunday by Britain's top pirate radio investigator.

He could not believe his ears when he was told he faced unlimited fines and confiscation of his car because a receiver in its boot was tuned to Stanmore-based airwave pirates Laser Hot Hits.

Clark, of Garston, near Watford, admitted breaking two sections of a little-known law from 1949. Harrow magistrates fined him a total of 1000 pounds for listening and intending to listen to an illegal radio station. He was also told to pay 500 pounds investigation and prosecution costs.

"I could not believe it was illegal to listen to a pirate radio station", said Clark after paying his fine and costs on the spot. "Millions of people of all ages have done the same thing at some time."

He was caught as police and experts from the Radio Investigation Service (RIS) met in Honeypot Lane on April 3 to raid the Laser Hot Hits' studio in Pear Wood, off Brockley Hill.

Broadcasts stopped in mid-record after messages setting up the raid were broadcast on police radio. The RIS's expert, John Garlick, believed the messages were being illegaly listened to. Minutes later Clark and two friends drove slowly past the RIS base three times and were stopped. Clark admitted listening to Laser Hot Hits and told the investigators: "We listen to pirate radio stations and track them down like you do."

The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) prosecution solicitor said it was not illegal to own a scanner, sold in many high street shops, but it was against the law to tune in to any pirate station.

Electronic engineer Clark, who has worked for some of Britain's top musicians, including **The Who** and **Kim Wilde**, has been a pirate radio listener since 1964.

"I tuned in to Radio Caroline on its first day and was hooked from then", he recalled. "The sound is fresh. You can tell there are no managing directors and accountants in the background."

Radio Action made a surprising appearance on Christmas Day on 6205 kHz. To the day 6 years ago, the station had its first shortwave transmission (we believe), but the operator has been around in pirate business since 1978. The programme contained mostly techno music and announcements. The new address is Box 94, 7038 ZH Zeddam, Holland. FRS SPZ

A new station via Radio Mariquita is <u>Radio Alpen-Adria</u>. The address for this station is c/o G.A.M.T., Box 3, Succursale 10, 31100 Treviso, Italy. See also the news on Mariquita below.

<u>Basel DX</u> is a new weekly A4-bulletin issued by Yves of International Music Radio. It contains Yves's personal logs for the latest weekend. Contact Yves, Box 1951, 79554 Weil/Rhein, Germany.



Coast FM International is a new Irish station on shortwave. The name reveals activity on FM, which has been going since a few years back. The operator is Simon who can be contacted at 25 Pinewood (not 30!), Ballybrack, County Dubllin, Ireland.

<u>Devil AM</u> is a new German tape pirate who could be heard via the facilities of **Radio Baltic International** on Christmas Day. This was the station's second broadcast. The first one went out on October

30th via Radio Royal on 6281 kHz. About 20 reception reports were received for that occasion. The programmes are professional with lots of different effects and music mixes according to Lars. New QSL-cards are printed for each new broadcast. Not bad eh? I guess no other pirate can offer that? A T-shirt is also available for the price of 30 DM. As many other pirates, Devil is contactable via the Wuppertal maildrop.

Radio East Coast Holland, Voice of The Netherlands and Radio Scotland made the a joint broadcast on New Year's Eve in accordance with the tradition. At first, the operator of Radio Scotland, Albert, was not in the studio. The reason he later went to the studio is actually because of me. The story is as follows: It was announced that listeners could phone the number of VOTN's and have a chat with the operators. So I did, but I had the wrong number since Gerrit of VOTN moved house a while ago. I then phoned Albert to ask him about the new phone number and at the same time I wondered why he didn't participate this time? He simply said that they had not asked him this time and he didn't even know that they were broadcasting when I called! Gerrit however, told me that they had sent Albert a postcard with an invitation to the broadcast. Anyway, just a short moments later, Albert was heard over the air. I guess he had jumped into his black BMW immediately and driven away at full throttle... The broadcast? Well, it lasted several hours with lots of great music, but it wasn't as fun this time as it usually is when these guys are on the

Flying Dutchman Radio (Vliegende Hollander) is a new appearance from the northern part of Holland and have been

heard many times on 48 metres the last two months. Frequencies used are especially 6240 and 6273 kHz. The station was. as far as I know, first heard on January 22nd on 6240 kHz when a test was carried out and a QSO with Radio Brigitte followed. There has been a few "Flying Dutchmans" around through the years. From what I can remember, there was one on shortwave in the mid 80's with the same name in Zwÿndrecht, but it's not clear if this is the same station. There was also one medium wave station in Westerbork with Box 58. Recently, on March 26th, the station was heard again with a lengthy test with nonstop music on 6272 kHz. A few annoncements were made, but no address was announced this time either. DT LAY SPZ

Radio Francis Drake recently celebrated 4 years as a tape Free Radio station and say they will now be relayed by Radio Baltic International. The strange thing is that the operator of Baltic has not had any contact whatsoever with Francis Drake, so this information is uncertain. Maybe the operator has intended to ask Baltic for relays of the station, so we will see what the future brings. New equipment has been bought, including a mixer which hopefully will increase the quality level of the programmes. Photo-QSLs and stickers are available and for QSLhunters, there is a special certificate for those who sends in 5 reports. Address: Wuppertal. LAY

Free Radio Info had a special transmission via IRRS (7125 kHz) on February 11th with a summing-up of the pirate activities in 1994. A sample copy of the FRI magazine is available for 5 DM and is ordered from c/o FRI, Box 520112, 44207 Dortmund in Germany.

Free Radio Service Holland hope to be on the air via the SWR-Switzerland service on 7125 kHz late April or May. FRSH also plan a 4 hour broadcast in May and a special EDXC night-transmission on June 3rd. Unfortunately, **Peter Verbruggen** will probably not take part in the EDXC event as previously thought. FRS SPZ

Radio Jackle Revival was an interesting appearance on February 5th on 6290 kHz. Heard with fair signals in UK. Some fans of Radio Jackle must of course be behind this one-off (?) project. Address unknown.

KIWI Radio from New Zealand has made a series of very succesful tests to Europe on January 7th, January 21st, January 28th and February 18th on 7445 kHz USBI With "only" 380 W, Kiwi reached several DX-ers all over Europe and so far over 200 reception reports have been received!!! The transmissions will continue occasionally early Saturdays between 7.00-8.30 UTC. There are also plans to increase power to 1 kW, so listen out!

Radio Laser Music Network was heard with their maiden broadcast on Christmas Day with a very lengthy programme on 3910 kHz. The transmitter is a Rhode&Schwarz with EF83, EL84 and PL519 tubes. The address for this station is Box 40185, 6504 AD Nÿmegen, The Netherlands.

Level 1 International is a joint venture between the indefatigable German stations Radio Benelux and Crazy Wave Radio. So far, brief tests have been carried out on 48 metres. Reports can probably be sent to either Benelux or CWR.





Radlo Marabu was heard via the Honduras based station Radio Copan International on Friday March 24th on 15675 kHz. The power is 1 kW and there is a rather good chance to hear this in Europe. Try listen out from 21 UTC on Friday evenings.

Radio Mariquita is a new Italian station who has been noted on 3924 kHz the recent time. Last time it was noted on Saturday night March 11th with a fair signal. DJ is **Pedrito el Drito** and he uses a home-made transmitter with a half-wave dipole. Address: c/o GAMT, Box 3, Succursale 10, 31100 Treviso, Italy. BP RB

Radio Metal FM is a new Swiss pirate that can be heard via the International Music Radio transmitter on a monthly basis. The station is run by a young boy who has previously hosted programmes with DJ Yves of IMR. The station has QSL-cards and info sheets which are available from the Weil-am-Rhein address.

Radio Paradise was heard on March 19th with what it's thought to have been a

one-off operation. The station is German and said to be using 300 W of power. A phone number (5119008550642) was open for calls and one of the callers (the only one?) was our crew member Jonny Augustsson who told about his original 40 metre coil antenna wired up on a broomstick!! The address for this station is Box 669, 7900 AR Hoogeveen, The Netherlands.

Radio Partyline is a new German station who was heard with a QSO on Boxing Day on 6271 kHz. Address is not known at present time.

LAY RB SPZ

Several readers have asked me what has happened to Pirate Chat. Well, this nice mag from England will probably not see the light no more. Several times, the editor of the mag has promised that it was about to being published, but so far nothing has happened. When I spoke to the editor last time, in mid-December, he promised the mag to come out in January. The main reason for the nonappearance of Pirate Chat is that the editor is studying journalism at university and his time for the mag is very limited. Besides, he writes the mag all by himself which certainly doesn't improve the present deadlock.

The address used by most <u>russian pirates</u>, Box 29 in Moscow, is closed. The reason for this is that the operator Artiom didn't pay the money in time for the box and the post office left the box someone else. In case you hear any of the Russian pirates, the address to write to now is Artiom's private address which is Artiom Prochorov, Tashkentskaya 19-1-181, 109444 Moscow, Russia.

Radio Scandinavia International was a new appearance on March 18th on 3910 kHz via International Music Radio. The station is indeed Scandinavian and featured oldies and Free Radio information. The address is the Weil am Rhein address in Germany. SPZ SRS

Shortwave Rock is the name of a new British station who was heard for the first time on Christmas Day. The frequency used was 6271 kHz and an address of 9 Andrew Close, Hainault, Ilford, Essex 1G6 2UG, England was announced. JAL RB SRS

Speedwing Radio is a brandnew German station who carried out a test on Saturday March 18th on 6260 kHz with a huge signal. The address is not known at present.

A new station via Radio Europe on 7294 kHz (LSB) is Radio Super Antenna. The address is Via Sirtori 15, 20052 Monza (MI), Italy. Phone: 039323060.

Radio Torenvalk is now also on 3910 kHz according to a recent letter from operator Hans. A test was carried out on Saturday February 25th and was heard with good signals in Germany. In addition to 76 metres, Torenvalk continues on 6275 kHz where they have been heard several times the last couple of months. Torenvalk offers new stickers in sparkling red colour with an RCD official (personified as a pig) smashing a transmitter with a hammer.

Radio UNID International is in fact the name of a new German station and

should not be confused with all the UNID (unidentified) stations in the log lists! The station has been heard several times with QSOs recently, both on 41 & 48 metres. Lars heard the station on February 19th on 6212 kHz. The programme consisted of popmusic and DX-tips. The address is Box 411131, 55068 Mainz in Germany, We wonder if this is another CWR operation?

WNKR are now on a regular 2nd Sunday of the month schedule and are heard with good signal strengths throughout Scandinavia. The programmes are very well-produced and listen out for Andy Walker's "Free Radio Show" which is aired around 9.30 UTC. Unfortunately, the relays of Angel International have been ceased, the reason is that Angel is too busy with their FM broadcasts. WNKR has also changed their mailing address after 4 years use of the Wuppertal maildrop. The new address reads Box 99, 19 Station Road, London SE25 5AH, England. SPZ

Wrekin Radio International are heard most Sundays on 12265 kHz and have a tremendous signal here in the southern part of Sweden. The programmes are intense and very worthwhile to listen to. Wrekin are now also thinking of broadcasting Saturday nights on the same frequency, so don't forget to tune in this odd frequency once in a while. SPZ

Hello and welcome to a new round-up of information from the Dutch MW scene. First of all, I wonder if there's someone else out there who is willing to take over this column as I feel I've lost some interest in this field of pirate radio. If noone is willing to do it, this column may be closed down. I certainly don't want this to happen, so write in today if you feel you are the right person for this job.

First off is some really sad news. Gerrit of VOTN called me just a few days back, telling me that the operator of <u>Radio Holland International</u>, Jan Hagen, died after falling of his bike on February 5th. Hi folks and welcome to another roundup of pirate activity from North America.

The big news this time around is the FCC enforcement activities against certain alleged pirates on the 18th and 19th of January! On January 19th, the home of John Cruzan was invaded by the FCC and had all his receivers and transmitters confiscated. This equipment was valued at over \$2000.00. The next day, a friend of his was subjected to an official amateur radio station inspection. The FCC folks accused him of being a pirate, but took no equipment. A third suspect was paid a visit by the FCC but he was not home and his mother would not allow the FCC folks entrance because they had no search warrant. News of these actions travelled fast via the arapevine and many pirates hid their equipment in case they were paid a visit. We know of no further visits, even though the FFC folks at the Cruzan "bust" said that there would be many more. Well, despite all this, we have information on over 40 pirates to report on.

Captain Eddy of the <u>Radio Airplane</u> was heard flying the free skies of North America on January 28th at 0015 on 6957USB, and also on February 12th on 6955 USB at 0011 UTC. It featured program 23 with the farm report and a James Brown Emergency Test.

Anarchy 1 was heard on January 8th on 6955 USB at 1600 with rock music, a talk on comedy by Will Rogers and political speeches.

William T. Hurt, the op of <u>Altered States</u> <u>Radio</u> was heard on Christmas day around 2102 on 7375 kHz. Programming included the theme from the 'Outer Limits' TV show and music by Bob Rivers from his 'Twisted Christmas' album.

Radio Beaver was heard on December 24th at 2145 until 2152 on 7375 AM. As usual it was hosted by Bucky Beaver and included the "Spirit Of R." by Rush and talk by Bucky!

Radio BLANDEX was heard at 2050 until 2126 on 7376 AM on December 26th with Ralph Jensen with ads for World Band Listlogging, DX condoms, and claimed they were broadcasting from Sable Island, Nova Scotia.

Black Rider Radio, which appears to be a spin off of KDED was heard quite a few times over the past several months. They were heard on 7470L at 2350 on December 3rd, and then again on December 16th at 2300 also on 7470U. On December 31st at 0030 they were noted on 7470U. On February 9th they were heard on 6965U at 0000. They feature unusual music by such groups as the Bonzo Dog 'DoDah' Band and the Captain Beefheart and the Magic Band. A very attractive QSL was recently received from the station.


Bullfrog Radio is another new station, which was heard a couple of times. First noted on December 26th at 2200 on 6955U and later heard on December 31st at 2220 on 6956U. Music from the 60s was played by such groups as Canned Heat, Door, Animals and The Stones was played. A QSL sheet just received shows bullfrogs and babies jumping around.

**Pirate Rambo** and <u>CSIC</u> was quite active over the Christmas and New Year's holiday period. They were noted with

their own programming as well as doing relays for other stations. One funny show was heard on Christmas Day with Rambo pretending to be **He Man** of **He Man Radio!** CSIC was also on the air on January 1st at 1700 on 7413 AM, featuring a "Strange But True" segment, the "Black Magic Marker" song and ads for Tree Frog Beer. The Top 10 pirate predictions for 1995 were given.

CUMM/The Masturbation Station, is another new entry. They were heard on December 10th at 2328 on 6955 USB with the song 'Turning Japanese' by The Vapors. The male announcer said 'cocaine is OK, but masturbation will get you fired'. CUMM was also heard on December 17th at 2300 on 6955U with similar type programming.

Radio Doomsday with station op Nemesis, which you recall was recently brought back from the dead, was heard on December 19th from 0058 to 0121 sign off. Letters were read and a relay of the pirate station WLIS on 6955 USB. Doomsday was also heard on December 27th with another relay of WLIS from 0000-0014 on 6955U. Radio Doomsday was heard in AM on 7415 at 0146 until 0213 on January 17th. Word has it the Nemesis has decided to call it quits because of the FCC actions against pirates. If this is true, goodbye old friend!



Fake Radio USA, Fake Fake Radio USA and Radio Is Not Radio all fall into the same category. The original Fake Radio USA tried to pass itself off as Radio USA.

Recently these two other "clowns", the Fake Fake Radio USA and Radio Is Not Radio have come into existence. Both have very little in the way of programming and are best forgotten. The Radio is not Radio guy uses a computer generated voice for his IDs. The original Fake Radio USA was heard on December 25th on 7375 kHz at 2140 to 2220 with their Nazi Christmas Program featuring German songs from the 1930s. This was repeated on January 1st on 7415 around 0345 QRMing WLIS.

The Ghetto Black Rapper station, <u>Fusion Radio</u> has reappeared after months of inactivity. They were noted on February 4th at 1700 on 7417 AM playing rap music with a lot of "motherfuckers" in the lyrics plus some of the New Jerky Boys' material. They now have a maildrop which is Box 28413, Providence, RI 02908.

Radio Garbanzo, featuring 'Fearless Fred' is one of the older still active pirates. His station was noted on 6955U at 2350 until 0020 on December 10-11. Programming included ads for Douche Beer, Harris Transmitters and Jeffrey Dahmer's BBQ Sauce along with tunes by Judas Priest.


The <u>Great Southland</u> is a station from Australia which was relayed recently by **CSIC** on 7376 AM at 1900 until 1945. Announcer John Quigley entertained us with Aussie mx and various ads from Down Under, including "Bruces", "Quantas", and "Black Douglas Whiskey" on December 31st. QSL sheets for their November 1993 broadcast were recently received!

Happy Hanukkah, the seasonal Jewish pirate was back again this year. They were heard at 2100 on December 3rd on 7375 AM. Programming consisted of the usual traditional music, lighting of the Menorah and music from "Fiddler on the Roof".

He Man Radio, the machismo pirate, was heard with their Christmas Show on

December 28th at 2200 on 7415USB, the manly mode. Besides plugging his T-shirts, Christmas parody mx like "White Christmas" and "I Must Go Nuts At Christmas" were heard. Another short program was heard at 2200 on February 4th on 6955U plugging T-shirts only. I'll have to buy mine soon!

High Times Radio, that steamy pirate featuring the sexy Samantha Jones being wooed by Captain Ganja was heard on December 3rd at 2150 on 7375 AM and again on 7490 at 2000 on December 17th. Ganja and Samantha talking about taking jello baths, going shopping and going QRT for S.E.X. Rumor has it that this couple has now broken up. What a shame.



KDED is the station that plays music by the Grateful Dead. They were heard on February 4th at 0110 on 6955U. The DJ said he'd appreciate a joint to be sent along with reception reports!

<u>KICK</u>, the heavy metal rock and roll pirate was heard with their mid-winter meltown show on February 19th at 1800 on 7415 AM. Nice audio with rock music and AD parodies. The DJ **Pete Moss** will

not send QSLs to pirate operators who do not QSL their listeners.

K-2000, the best DX parody/comedy pirate on the air these days was heard on January 1st at 0400 on 7415U. Programming included a bust of K2000 by Dick Smith, FCC Sweepstakes, a Pat Murphy parody and others. Another show heard on February 26th at 0110 on 6955U called "Scrotum" was a parody of the WWCR "Spectrum" show with strong homosexual overtones! What will these boys think of next?

The <u>Mad Daddy</u> was a new station noted on 7422 at 2030 on January 29th. Programming featured Jazz and oldies music. The announcer gave the Huntsville, AL maildrop for reports.

The bad news first! Richard T. Pistek of the NAPRS has told us that the station has ceased operations due to the FCC, who apparently have been looking for him. We will miss the many Europirate relays he has done. In a more recent note received with a QSL, he said he could still forward tapes sent to him by others for relay in the US. This is good news! One Voice Radio, is a reactivated station, run by a guy named Joe. His most recent broadcast was heard on February 4th at 1900 on 6955L. Medical news about kidney stones, cancer and drug abuse were noted.

H.V. Short of <u>RFM</u> started the New Year right by being heard on 6955U at 0545 until 0621 with a test transmission. IDs in English and French, along with mx by Don Henley, The C&C Mx Factory were heard on January 1st.



Solid Rock Radio continued to be very active throughout the period. They were heard on Dec. 11th at 7415U at 1400 with sock mx. Also heard on Dec. 18th at 7415U at 1450 with church choir mx. Dr. Love also relayed a Laser Hot Hits show at 1630 on 7415U on December 25th. More Laser Hot Hits shows were relayed on January 2nd on 7415U at 0110 and on January 7th at 0122 on 7415U. SRR was noted with their own programming on January 22nd at 1445 on 7415U. Mx by B.B. King, Ray Charles with talks about Dick Smith, Beverly Baker and the busted anti-Castro clandestine.

<u>Tangerine Radio</u> was heard with their anti-religion program on 7375 on December 24th at 2100. This was a **CSIC** relay.

Owlsey, the operator of <u>Up Against The Wall Radio</u> was quite active. They were heard on January 8th at 0200 on 6957U. Music by Mott The Hoople, REM, Golden Earring and others were noted. Also noted on Jan. 7th at 2220 with similar programming. UATWR was also noted on February 11th at 2300 with music from the 50's. An ad for Connie Chung's "Eye for an Eye" program on 6957U.

Radio USA was heard on 6956U on New Year's Day. Mr. Blue Sky hosted the program of punk rock, a radio drama and talk about a new T-shirt. The program was repeated at 0000 on January 2nd on 6955U.



The <u>Voice of Laryngitis</u>, another long timer, was heard at 1750 on December 11th on 7415 kHz. It featured their 10th anniversary program with clips of the old programs. Great show! They were also heard on New Years' Day at 0127 and 0205 on 6955U.

Also noted on Dec. 26th at 1600 on 6955U with their 1995 Orange Bowl Special. WLIS was heard on Feb. 4th at 2130 on 6956 with the pirate IS program.

WPMS, the anti-He Man station was heard on December 31st at 2053 on a frequency of 7375L. Music by Hall and Oates, Pretenders, Boston and others. The op, calling herself 'she-woman' made funny comments about He Man. Has He Man met his match? Only time will tell!

<u>WRDM</u>, the station run by **Roy D. Mercer** made its first appearance since the summer. They were heard on December 17th at 2200 on 6955U. Fake phone calls

by Mercer and mx by Aretha Franklin was heard.

WREC/Radio Free East Coast, the station featuring P.J. Sparx was heard on December 25th at 1530 on 7411 with his Christmas program including lots of material from Bob Rivers 'Twisted Christmas'. They were also heard on January 1st relaying Microdot Radio and Laser Hot Hits on 7415 from 0236 to 0300. Signals were very strong here!

<u>WTWP</u>, another new station was heard on January 29th from 1633 until 1651 with music parodies of TNT, AC/DC and fake ads for Tonya Harding's breakaway laces and 1-900-HEY-POPE. Let's hope we hear more! They use the Wellsville maildrop.



**Z Radio**, another new station featured programming from the National Lampoon Radio Hour. They were heard at 1730 on 7418U on Feb. 19th. Several funny AD parodies were also heard.

## Radio Baltic International raided! The Telecom finally hit back

On Saturday March 18th, the Swedish Post- and Telecom Administration (Post-& Telestyrelsen, PTS) carried out the raid they had planned for a long time on Radio Baltic International. The time was 10.15 UTC and operator Bengt was relaying Radio Nord. All equipment that was used for the transmissions, including the 400 W transmitter, were confiscated. The raid may imply the end of more than 30 years' piracy by Bengt.

The raid was carried out by two officials from PTS, one local policeman, a couple of inspectors plus a police-dog! The PTS had previously warned Bengt for the illegal transmissions and Bengt now faces legal proceedings and risks either fines or up to 6 months in jail.

The transmissions by Radio Baltic International was carried out for almost a year on 6206.5 kHz. **Sven Modin**, the chief prosecutor in this case, claims in a recent interview by **Eva Bofride** in **Gotlands Tidningar**:

- The crime is considered seriously if anyone interferes with commercial traffic. You can make comparisons to the Estonia disaster, where there might have been jamming stations.

#### He continues:

- No doubt there is good reasons for this action and the confiscation of some of the equipment used during the transmitting occasion. There has also been complaints from abroad about the illegal transmissions.

Sven Modin's accusations are sensational. His claim that 6206.5 kHz should be used for sea traffic, seems to be naive considering the fact that the frequency is used **HCJB** in Ecuador and a few other legal stations as well. His parallel to the

Estonia disaster is a serious attack on Bengt which has no substance whatso-ever. As usually happens with proceedings against radio pirates, the prosecutors know nothing about neither shortwave broadcasting or commerical radio. Sven's statements only reinforce this pattern.



Operating since 1963, Bengt is probably the longest-running pirate in Sweden.

The PTS say the have got complaints about Radio Baltic International from the

Telecom administrations in Great Britain and Holland. However, the PTS don't tell what these complaints say. Besides, if they have made complaints, they should also complain to the other stations using 6206.5 kHz. As the other stations are more powerful, Baltic is the one who makes less harm.

When I called Bengt and talked about the raid, he was rather calm:

- I've waited for this. I want this case to be tried in front of a court and I want publicity. I'm very upset about the charges of my interfering during the Estonia disaster. I've written letters to the PTS but they have not replied. I've been around for 32 years now and I won't give just like that. If they want to play games, that's fine with me!

#### **GOING BACK TO HIS ROOTS**

#### - JORGE R. GARCIA OF PIRAÑA LEAVES EUROPE

One of my best friends in the Free Radio hobby is Jorge R. Garcia of Radio Piraña International, I guess most of you have tuned in to his irresistable Latin American sound of music and Spanish announcements. Very sadly, he is now going back to South America in June or July. He and his South American wife has been offered jobs for a period of at least 2 years, and they may not ever return to Europe. This means that European Free Radio will lose one of its most original and innovating pirate stations during the 90's. With this story, I would like to wish my dear friend Jorge and his family the best luck and happiness in South America.

#### From South America to Europe

Jorge was born in a country in South America. He grew up in a house only 50 metres away from a local radio station. transmitting on mediumwave with 5 kW. At an age of 12 years, he started to help with odds and ends in the studio, working at the mixing board and fetching records from the record files. At this time, he also began listening to shortwave radio stations with Spanish programmes. His favourites were Voice of America, BBC and Radio Sweden International. In 1979, at the age of 17, he moved to Europe with his parents. After finishing the school, he continued to study media at a university. In 1981, Jorge went back to South America for a few months. He then met his South American girl-friend who became his wife the following summer when they got married. She left her family in South America and moved to Europe to live with Jorge.

#### The birth of Piraña

Shortly after his arrival to Europe, Jorge read about pirate radio in a few DX-magazines. He knew nothing about this be-

fore and so he decided to try himself on Sunday mornings. From this time he remembers Radio East Coast Commercial, Free Radio Service Holland, Radio Delmare, The Sound of Sweden and Radio Dublin, to mention a few. Jorge got excited about all these stations and carried out a few tests himself. The station name? Right, Radio Piraña International!

I guess many of you have believed that Piraña is only 5 years old, it's in fact 14 year old! Anyway, these early tests were not logged in any of the DX-magazines that Jorge read, so he lost interest in doing any further broadcasts. Instead, he started an FM-station together with two friends of his. They were very active at weekends, usually for 4-5 hours both Saturdays and Sundays.


#### Years of silence

In 1984, Jorge got a full-time job at a local radio station. He was very busy and because of the unsuccesful tests in 1981, he didn't care to have a new try. It wasn't until 1990 when new air came into Jorge's lungs. He sent a fax to **Radio Netherlands** about a few test transmissions which were carried out on in April and May 1990 on 41 metres. Also 21483 kHz was used on one occasion. Radio Netherlands announced the tests

in **Media Network**, but again Jorge saw no logs whatsoever in the DX-magazines. A few years later, Jorge got reports from a few DX-ers who heard his tests, but at this time he was unfortunate to know nothing about this. So Jorge paused with his sporadic tests again.

#### Third time lucky!

In the beginning of 1992, Jorge tuned in to **Radio Fax** on 3910 and 12255 kHz and was amazed over the good signal strengths from this English station. He then decided to carry out more tests. One evening he unexpectedly called to me and wanted me to listen out for his signal.

He had come across my name in a DXmagazine and from an announcement of my name over mediumwaver Radio Barones from Holland, Unfortunately, I heard nothing. Jorge said he would try again with me when conditions were more favourable. He called a few days later, but the result was the same. It wasn't until the fourth or fifth call I finally managed to hear his signal! I had lots of atmospherics in my radio and said to Jorge that I didn't think it would work. Luckily, Jorge insisted and there he was in my radio, on 3915 kHz if I remember rightly. Jorge was very happy about the good reception and after this succesful test, Radio Piraña International became one of shortwave's most active pirate stations. His Latin American style of presenting music broke the ordinary pattern of other Europirates and he got

many enthusiastic listeners. Jorge says there was no use to for him to compete with the other pirate with pop music format. Instead, he wanted to bring a different and orignal format, almost like a Latin American staiton. He admits that he likes pop music and the last one or two years, he has in fact mixed his Latin American records with ordinary pop music and oldies. It has been a case of keeping everybody happy, especially for reporters who don't know the titles of his songs sung in Spanish.

#### An active period

After some persuasion, I finally got him to use my home address in Lund as his official station address. He had great doubts about this though, mainly because he wanted to maintain his anonymity. However, I think he has never regretted that he broke a bit of his anonymity. At last, DX-ers were able to contact Jorge and after a while, letters to Piraña started pouring in to my address. From this time until now, Jorge was one of the most active pirate stations on shortwave, even if he took a fe breaks once in a while. To date, Jorge has received well over 300 letters and reception reports from most corners of the world. Most people who wrote in said they found his shows very original and enjoyable. Only a few have expressed their dislike of the music style.

#### A blunder at work

When Jorge was as most active, he once made a great blunder at work. During one of his shows at the local radio stations he worked for, he announced "This is Radio Piraña International" for thousands of bewildering listeners! However, noone ever commented about this incident. Jorge hopes people listened with a deaf ear at this particular moment.

#### My visit to Jorge 1992

The summer of 1992, I visited Jorge's family on two occasions. We had a great time and especially we had great fun at

Jorge's work, that is in the radio studio. Remember Jorge worked as a DJ on a local radio station. My best memory was that Saturday night in mid-July when we were at the studio, waiting for a couple of women from the local sewing circle to finish their one hour programme. After they had left and we were alone in the studio, we hi-jacked it and switched on three shortwave transmitters Jorge hid in the studio! We were on 76, 41 and 19 metres in parallel and had a live phonein show. We used my phone number which I had forward-connected to the number at the studio! What a great night that was Jorge, remember?!

#### The return to South America

This summer, Jorge and his family has decided to move back to South America. He and his wife have been offered jobs as children minders for two years. Jorge is very happy about moving back to his family and friends in South America, but at the same time he says that he will
