() CSNY 425, of known reliability, made available to the New York Office, evidence concerning the above-captioned subject, obtained from the building located at 80 Fifth Avenue, New York City. This building is occupied by National Headquarters of the IWO.

(x) CSNY 426, of known reliability, made available to the New York Office information concerning the above-captioned subject, obtained from 35 E. 12th St., N.Y.C. This building is occupied by the following organizations, which are all under the control of the Communist Party: Publishers New Press, Inc. ("Worker" and "Daily Worker"); Morning Freiheit Association ("Morning Freiheit" and "Jewish Life"); Workers' Bookshop; F & D Printing Co.; 12th - 13th Realty Corporation. Prior to September, 1951, the National State and N. Y. County offices of the Communist Party also occupied these premises.

Strict care must be exercised so that the existence of this important source of evidence will not become known to any outside agency. It is also to be noted that because of the nature of this source of information it will be impossible to recontact the source regarding information furnished.

SHOULD THE ROSENBERGS BE EXECUTED WHEN WAR-TIME TRAITORS ARE GIVEN LIGHT PRISON TERMS?

DURING THE WAR, "Axis Sally" (Rita Louise Zucca), deserted to the Nazis, broadcast daily to our soldiers in Italy, to demoralize them, to cause them to desert to the Nazis. At the end of the war, tried for TREASON IN TIME OF WAR, she was convicted, sentenced Sept. 28, 1945 to 4 years, 5 months in prison.

"Tokyo Rose" (I. T. D'Aquino), deserted to the Japanese, broadcast to our soldiers in Japan, to cause them to desert to the Japanese. She was tried for TREASON IN TIME OF WAR, convicted, sentenced Oct. 6, 1949 to 10 years in prison.

SHOULD THE ROSENBERGS DIE WHEN THOSE CONFESSING TO THE SAME CHARGES GET LIGHT SENTENCES?

Dr. Allan Nunn May, high ranking nuclear physicist, was in 1946 charged with atomic espionage for Russia. HE CONFESSED to a British court, was sentenced on May 1, 1946 to 10 years in prison.

NOTE: The New York Times, September 10, 1952, reports: "Dr. Allan Nunn May . . . will be released about the end of this year, having served his MINIMUM TERM OF NEARLY SEVEN YEARS."

Dr. Klaus Emil Fuchs, a highly placed British scientist, charged with atomic espionage for Russia, CONFESSED to a British court, was sentenced on March 1, 1950 to 14 years in prison.

FOR THE FIRST TIME AMERICANS HAVE BEEN SENTENCED TO DEATH ON SUCH A CHARGE!



Ethel and Julius Rosenberg were indicted in 1950, charged with giving atomic information to Russia in 1944, when she was our wartime ally. With their co-defendant, Morton Sobell, they protest their innocence to this day. They were convicted. On April 5, 1951 Morton Sobell was sentenced to 30 years in prison, and Ethel and Julius Rosenberg to the electric chair.

WHY? Why the excessive and brutal sentences?

HUNDREDS of THOUSANDS OF AMERICANS ARE APPEALING FOR CLEMENCY.

THE CHURCHMAN (Protestant Episcopalian), in an editorial on November 1, 1952: "The Churchman feels that the death sentence, in the light of the far milder treatment of more serious offenders than the Rosenbergs, is both excessive and cruel. We believe that the execution of these two individuals will only hurt the name of the United States. . . ."

...in "Hostile Atmosphere"

The New York Herald Tribune on October 11, 1952, had this headline:

COURT SETS ASIDE CONVICTION OF EX-TAX OFFICIAL.

Rules Delaney Was Tried in 'Hostile Atmosphere' Engendered by Publicity.

The story reported that the U.S. Court of Appeals in Boston reversed the conviction of Denis W. Delaney, an ousted Internal Revenue Collector. The Court held that Delaney was forced to stand trial in "the hostile atmosphere engendered by all the pre-trial publicity."

This is our American concept of a fair trial.

Does not that concept hold for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, and Morton Sobell?

Were they not tried in a headline atmosphere a thousand times more hostile than that faced by Delaney? Was not all the "pre-trial publicity" about the Rosenbergs a thousand times more hostile and prejudicial?

"We are innocent,"

say Ethel and Julius Rosenberg and Morton Sobell.

The National Committee to Secure Justice for the Rosenbergs believes there is definitely grave and reasonable doubt about their conviction.

But NOW, with the United States Supreme Court having turned down their request for a review of their conviction, the immediate issue is not their guilt or innocence, or the vindication that time may bring.

THE ISSUE NOW is to SAVE THE ROSENBERGS from the unjust, un-American, unequal sentence of DEATH.

WHY 4 years and 5 months, 10 years, 14 years for Axis Sally, Tokyo Rose, Dr. May and Dr. Fuchs and DEATH for the ROSENBERGS?

Is not the unprecedented death sentence a product of "the hostile atmosphere"?

DOROTHY THOMPSON, The Washington Star, April 12, 1951: "The death sentence . . . depresses me . . . in 1944, we were not at war with the Soviet Union. . . . Indeed, it is unlikely that had they been tried in 1944 they would have received any such sentence."

MAX LERNER, New York Post, June 19, 1952: "I agree that the death sentence was unprecedented and harsh."

THE VERY REV. C. W. CHANDLER, Dean of Waikato, Hamilton, New Zealand, October 27, 1952: "Assuming that Julius and Ethel Rosenberg are guilty, it must be borne in mind that it was during World War II, when Russia was an ally, that these persons committed their offense. As heinous as the offense may be, it does not merit a death sentence, and I cannot believe that in this instance the president of your republic will allow this sentence to stand."

JEWISH DAILY FORWARD, article by editor Hillel Rogoff, October 16, 1952: "When Judge Irving Kaufman passed the death sentence on the Rosenbergs, the Jewish Daily Forward

wrote that the sentence was too horrible. We have not changed our minds. . . . We express our hope that the president will save the Rosenbergs from the electric chair."

THE NATION, article by Arthur Garfield Hays, November 8, 1952: ". . . We may try, but we cannot forget the two young Rosenberg children. . . . It is the damnable death penalty that causes the uneasiness."

JEWISH MORNING JOURNAL, column by Jacob Glatstein, October 29, 1952: "One can readily see that America can very well agree not to snuff out the lives of the Rosenberg couple and not to give them the maximum penalty, which our country has never before given anyone in time of peace, and which was not given even to Dr. Klaus Fuchs, who much more directly, scientifically and consciously betrayed his country."

JEWISH DAY, editorial, October 16, 1952: ". . . believing in our democratic system of justice and in the just application of our laws, we feel that we are entitled to appeal to the President that he should commute the death sentence. . . ."

DEAR MR. PRESIDENT:

In the New York Herald Tribune of October 19, 1952, it was noted that the government declared that the Rosenbergs "were part of the spy ring in which Dr. Klaus Fuchs, the British atomic scientist, was the key man."

Mr. President, if Dr. Fuchs, "THE KEY MAN," is sentenced to 14 years, why are the Rosenbergs sentenced to DEATH?

Our Constitution gives you, Mr. President, the constitutional right, and lays upon you the constitutional duty, to render EQUAL justice by commuting the death sentences.

You exercised this right on July 25, 1952, when you commuted the death sentence of Oscar Collazo, who had been sentenced to death for an alleged attempt to assassinate you.

You can and should exercise this right again to save the lives of the Rosenbergs.

What Can You, American Men and Women, Do?

- 1.** Send a letter, telegram, or postal card to the President, The White House, Washington, D. C., respectfully urging him to commute the death sentence for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.
- 2.** Send a similar letter, telegram, or postal card to your own Congressman and to your two U.S. Senators, respectfully urging them to speak up for a commutation of sentence for the Rosenbergs.
- 3.** Ask your organization—church, union, synagogue, veterans' group, women's auxiliary, social club, bridge club—to send similar letters to the President and other officials.
- 4.** Write to your local newspaper, and visit the editors with a delegation, asking them editorially to speak up for equal American justice for the Rosenbergs.
- 5.** Send a contribution—whatever you can afford—to the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case to help us carry on this work. Checks may be made out to Joseph Brainin, Chairman, 1050 Sixth Avenue, New York 18, N. Y. Tell us what else you think should be done.

On 12/13/52 at 3:00 pm while the writer and Sp Robert M. Powell were conducting a surveillance on another matter in the vicinity of 24th St and 36th Ave., Long Island City, a car caravan, in connection with the Rosenberg defense, was observed. 

ANALYSIS, URGES CLEMENCY FOR ROSENBERGS

8,000 British Distributive Workers,

Garment workers branch appeal to President

After studying an analysis of the Rosenberg case by D.N. PRITT, eminent British attorney, the Executive Board of Local 1, Bakery and Confectionery Workers Union, A.F.L., has wired President Truman urging he grant executive clemency to Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.

The A.F.L. local's telegram, a copy of which was forwarded to the Labor Committee for Clemency for the Rosenbergs, said that the Executive Board had unanimously gone on record urging clemency. It added, "Examination of the facts in the Rosenberg trial, as studied by the eminent British attorney, D.N. Pritt, without doubt reveals that proper justice would not be served in this case in carrying out the death sentence!"

Abe Weisburd, secretary of the Labor Committee, also reported receipt copies of a cable to President Truman sent on behalf of 8,000 members of the Manchester Federation of the Union of the Shop, Distributive, and Allied Workers calling for "quashing of the death sentence and urging a retrial!"

The No. 3 branch of the National Union of Tailors and Garment Workers in England has also protested against the Rosenbergs' death sentence as "based on the uncorroborated evidence of one person!"

Earlier this week, the General Council of Ford Local 800, United Auto Workers, C.I.O., the largest union local in the world, representing 57,000 workers, passed a resolution putting the local's 218-man governing council on record in favor of clemency for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.

Mr. B. Z. Goldberg, eminent Jewish Journalist, will speak in Detroit on "The Truth About the Rosenberg Case", on Saturday, Dec. 20th, 1952 at 9 P.M., at the Mayfair Hall, 13305 Dexter Blvd.

Mr. Goldberg, syndicated columnist for the JEWISH DAY, is one of America's most widely quoted writers on topics of Jewish interest. An international sponsor of the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, Mr. Goldberg has appeared in several cities to urge clemency for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg. The Rosenbergs are now under the death sentence for "conspiracy to commit espionage", with the execution date set for the week of January 12, 1953.

The Rosenbergs have steadfastly maintained their innocence and an international movement is under way to halt the extreme sentence, the first in American peacetime history. Protests against the death sentence, obtained solely on the testimony of two admitted traitors, have come from 50,000 persons in the United States, together with thousands of Europeans.

In Israel, twenty Jerusalem Rabbis have urged President Truman to stay the execution. The London Trades Council, representing 600,000 British workers, last week picketed the American embassy with the sign "We Demand a Fair Trial for the Rosenbergs. In Trieste, 10,000 workers signed petitions urging clemency for the Rosenbergs, and leading figures in France, Italy, New Zealand, and other countries have protested the cruelty of the sentence.

The Rosenbergs are now awaiting the results of their petition to invalidate the conviction on the grounds that they did not receive a fair trial because of the climate of hysteria in which it was held. Their petition, filed with the Federal Court, also charged that the

F.B.I. AGENT ADMITS GOVERNMENT WITNESS IN ROSENBERG CASE COMMITTED PERJURY

F.B.I. agent John A. Harrington admitted in an affidavit submitted today in U.S. District Court by the U.S. Attorney that Ben Schneider a government witness against Julius and Ethel Rosenberg had committed perjury in his testimony.

This admission came as a result of a defense charge that the prosecution knowingly permitted their witness to testify falsely, that the first time he saw the Rosenbergs since they allegedly ordered passport photographs from him, was the day he testified in court. (The alleged photographs were never produced in court.)

This charge, by defense counsel, was made in a petition submitted before U.S. District Judge Sylvester Ryan in the course of defense motions to set aside the verdict and order a new trial.

The defense also charged that David Greenglass, key witness against the Rosenbergs had given perjured testimony.

Joe Brainin, Chairman of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case said, "This admission of perjury on the part of a witness, was very significant in judging the credibility of the government's witnesses. Especially since the government admitted to this only after the defense offered information that Schneider was secretly brought to court by the F.B.I. the day before he testified, to familiarize himself with the Rosenbergs."

Philadelphia, Pa. — Pointing to the "tragic miscarriage of justice" in the Sacco-Vanzetti case, the Independent Voters' League of Germantown and Chestnut, which represents "citizens of all political parties united to secure good government", has appealed to President Truman to grant clemency to the Rosenbergs, it was learned today by the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case.

The Voters' League, which is headed by Dorothy N. Wolff, includes Rabbi Elias Charry, Rev. J. Quinton Jackson and the Rev. Kenneth R. Forbes on its Executive Board.

In its clemency plea to President Truman, the Voters' League said, "Our organization is dedicated to preserving the protections guaranteed to our citizens by the American system of jurisprudence". The group called the Rosenbergs' death sentence "a totally unprecedented situation and one which is considered cruel and excessive by increasing numbers of people all over the world."

"Let us not be misled in a period of tension to cancel our hard-fought-for and cherished tradition of fair dealings with all" the plea added.

"Some of our members and their relatives", the Voters' League continued, "remember and participated in the effort to see justice done in the case of Sacco and Vanzetti who never swerved from their professions of innocence."

The National Committee to Secure Justice for the Rosenbergs, has urged all Americans who agree that the Rosenbergs' death sentences are too harsh to communicate their pleas for clemency to President Truman at the White House in Washington and to call any of their elected representatives to take similar actions.

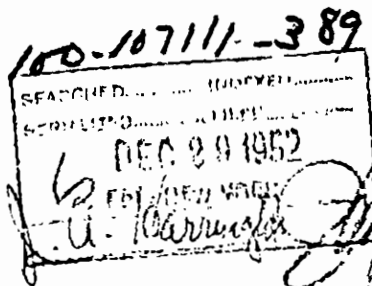

This admission came as a result of a defense charge that the prosecution knowingly permitted their witness to testify falsely, that the first time he saw the Rosenbergs since they allegedly ordered passport photographs from him, was the day he testified in court. (The alleged photographs were never produced in court.)

This charge, by defense counsel, was made in a petition submitted before U.S. District Judge Sylvester Ryan in the course of defense motions to set aside the verdict and order a new trial.

The defense also charged that David Greenglass, key witness against the Rosenbergs had given perjured testimony.

Joe Brainin, Chairman of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case said, "This admission of perjury on the part of a witness, was very significant in judging the credibility of the government's witnesses. Especially since the government admitted to this only after the defense offered information that Schneider was secretly brought to court by the F.B.I. the day before he testified, to familiarize himself with the Rosenbergs."

Mr. B. Z. Goldberg, eminent Jewish Journalist, will speak in Detroit on "The Truth About the Rosenberg Case", on Saturday, Dec. 20th, 1952 at 9 P.M., at the Mayfair Hall, 13305 Dexter Blvd.

Mr. Goldberg, syndicated columnist for the JEWISH DAY, is one of America's most widely quoted writers on topics of Jewish interest. A national sponsor of the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, Mr. Goldberg has appeared in several cities to urge clemency for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg. The Rosenbergs are now under the death sentence for "conspiracy to commit espionage", with the execution date set for the week of January 12, 1953.

The Rosenbergs have steadfastly maintained their innocence and an international movement is under way to halt the extreme sentence, the first in American peacetime history. Protests against the death sentence, obtained solely on the testimony of two admitted traitors, have come from 50,000 persons in the United States, together with thousands of Europeans.

In Israel, twenty Jerusalem Rabbis have urged President Truman to stay the execution. The London Trades Council, representing 600,000 British workers, last week picketed the American embassy with the sign "We Demand a Fair Trial for the Rosenbergs." In Trieste, 10,000 workers signed petitions urging clemency for the Rosenbergs, and leading figures in France, Italy, New Zealand, and other countries have protested the cruelty of the sentence.

The Rosenbergs are now awaiting the result of their petition to invalidate the conviction on the grounds that they did not receive a fair trial because of the climate of hysteria in which it was held. Their petition, filed with the Federal Court, also charges that the

Garment workers branch appeal to President

After studying an analysis of the Rosenberg case by D.N. PRITT, eminent British attorney, the Executive Board of Local 1, Bakery and Confectionery Workers Union, A.F.L., has wired President Truman urging he grant executive clemency to Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.

The A.F.L. local's telegram, a copy of which was forwarded to the Labor Committee for Clemency for the Rosenbergs, said that the Executive Board had unanimously gone on record urging clemency. It added, "Examination of the facts in the Rosenberg trial, as studied by the eminent British attorney, D.N. Pritt, without doubt reveals that proper justice would not be served in this case in carrying out the death sentence!"

Abe Weisburd, secretary of the Labor Committee, also reported receipt copies of a cable to President Truman sent on behalf of 8,000 members of the Manchester Federation of the Union of the Shop, Distributive, and Allied Workers calling for quashing of the death sentence and urging a retrial!

The No. 3 branch of the National Union of Tailors and Garment Workers in England has also protested against the Rosenbergs' death sentence as "based on the uncorroborated evidence of one person!"

Earlier this week, the General Council of Ford Local 800, United Auto Workers, C.I.O., the largest union local in the world, representing 57,000 workers, passed a resolution putting the local's 216-man governing council on record in favor of clemency for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.



The instructions contained herein apply equally to all the above offices.

For your general background information, the Department has advised that in the event the Subversive Activities Control Board rules that the CP, USA, is a Communist-action organization, petitions in Communist front organization cases, the titles and offices of origin of which are set forth hereafter, will be filed before the Board immediately following such ruling. To implement this program, the Department has requested prosecutive summary reports on these organizations. In addition, the Bureau has selected six additional organizations on which prosecutive summary reports must be prepared. The titles and offices of origin of these latter organizations are also set forth below.

Inasmuch as the Bureau will not expose any active live informants for proceedings before the Subversive Activities Control Board, it is incumbent upon each office receiving this communication that maximum utilization be afforded each witness who has been or will be exposed during the Smith Act proceedings.

Upon the receipt of information obtained as a result of the foregoing, the office of origin should promptly incorporate such information in a supplemental prosecutive summary report in accordance with existing Bureau instructions.

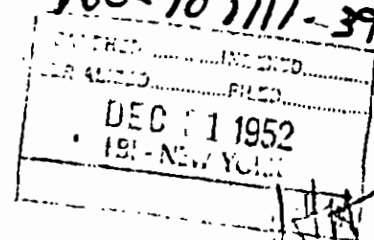

**The Rosenbergs' execution is set for the week of January 12th!
Write President Truman: COMMUTE THE DEATH SENTENCES!**

On April 5, 1951, Julius Rosenberg and his wife Ethel were sentenced to die in the electric chair, and Morton Sobell was sentenced to 30 years imprisonment, having been convicted on a charge of conspiracy to spy on behalf of the Soviet Union.

The Rosenbergs and Sobell have unswervingly maintained their innocence from the day of their arrest.

On February 25, 1952, the U. S. Circuit Court of Appeals upheld the verdict and the sentences in a shocking decision that held, among other things, that persons could be considered disposed to commit espionage by virtue of their political or social views.

Thousands of people, among them many eminent public figures, do not believe the Rosenbergs and Sobell guilty or that their trial was a fair one. Thousands more, who have grave doubts of their guilt, are horrified at the death sentence.

THE ROSENBERGS

Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, until their arrest, led the life of every-day people, struggling for a livelihood and education, and hoping that their two young sons, aged nine and four, would be spared the hardships familiar to the parents.

Since their marriage they lived solely on Julius' \$70-a-week income as a government engineer, except for the past few years when they managed a meager living from the profits of a small machine shop business. Julius was an active member of his trade union. Ethel did volunteer work in community and civilian defense organizations.

THE PROSECUTION'S CASE

Before the trial the prosecutor announced that he would call 118 witnesses, among them top scientists Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer, Dr. Harold C. Urey; Gen. Leslie R. Groves, head of the atom bomb project during the war; agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation; alleged associates of the Rosenbergs and Sobell in the "conspiracy"; and two "star" witnesses.

Of these 118, the prosecutor called only 20, among them none of the above named scientists or FBI agents. One witness, Max Elitcher, admitted that he faced a five year prison sentence for perjury, that he had been threatened by FBI agents with prosecution for espionage, and that he "hoped for the best" as a result of his uncorroborated testimony. He is free today, never having been tried. The two chief witnesses, David and Ruth Greenglass, were both, according to the prosecutor, and their own statements, involved in the alleged conspiracy, but as a result of their testimony, Ruth was never brought to trial, and her husband got off with a 15-year sentence.

The government's entire case is based on the Greenglasses' uncorroborated testimony, a fact conceded by the Court of Appeals, which in upholding the convictions declared that without the testimony of the Greenglasses, "the conviction could not stand." The prosecutor produced 32 exhibits as "documentary evidence." Not one of these documents, by the prosecutor's own admission, connected the Rosenbergs with a conspiracy to commit espionage.

THE STAR WITNESSES

David Greenglass, brother of Ethel Rosenberg, and his wife Ruth, were the star witnesses against the Rosenbergs. Both admitted that they had committed espionage for which they received money and for which both could be given the death penalty.

The Greenglasses' uncorroborated testimony was the only evidence presented that the Rosenbergs had conspired to steal the atom-bomb secret. Their testimony in respect to the Rosenbergs was solely oral, and no documents or other proofs linking the Rosenbergs to espionage were introduced. No witnesses were called to substantiate any conversations on espionage that allegedly took place between the Greenglasses and the Rosenbergs. David Greenglass testified that, relying solely on his memory of snatches of overheard conversation at the atom-bomb project at Los Alamos, and his remembrance of details of blueprints which had been shown to him as part of his work as a machinist, he had drawn up an elaborate sketch of the atom bomb, together with twelve pages of written material, which he allegedly conveyed as a description of the bomb to Rosenberg.

The following are Greenglass' actual qualifications for this impressive feat:

- 1) experience as an ordinary machinist in both army and civilian life;
- 2) a high school education, plus 8 technical courses at Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute, in all 8 of which he admitted he was graded "failure";
- 3) an admission that he was ignorant of the formulae governing component parts of the atom bomb, and that he had never taken courses or read books on such essential subjects as elementary, differential or advanced calculus, thermodynamics, quantum mechanics, nuclear or atomic physics.

Not a single atomic scientist was called to support David Greenglass' testimony concerning the atom bomb or to confirm the authenticity of the "sketch" of the atom bomb he made for the trial.

Responsible periodicals—science editors, commented as follows on Greenglass' testimony:

TIME MAGAZINE: "Some of his testimony made little scientific sense."

LIFE MAGAZINE'S Science Editor: "Greenglass' implosion bomb appears illogical, if not downright unworkable."

SCIENTIFIC AMERICAN: "History's most elaborately guarded secret—how to make an atomic bomb—was casually let out of the bag in a courtroom last month. Or was it?"

POLITICS INSTEAD OF EVIDENCE

The prosecutor set out to show that the Rosenbergs were Communists and that Communists are spies. This had nothing to do with either the indictment or proof that the Rosenbergs had conspired to commit espionage. But he did not establish that the Rosenbergs were Communists. Instead, he showed:

- 1) the Rosenbergs had a Spanish Refugee appeal *can* in their home;
- 2) Ethel Rosenberg was one of 50,000 New York citizens who had signed a nominating petition in 1941 for Peter V. Cacchione, successful Communist Party candidate for New York City Councilman;
- 3) the Rosenbergs carried sick and death benefit insurance with the International Workers Order, a multi-national, inter-racial fraternal insurance society with 160,000 members in 18 states;
- 4) the Rosenbergs were both active members of their trade unions; Ethel in Local 65 of the Wholesale, Retail and Warehouse Workers Union; Julius in the Federation of Architects, Engineers and Technicians;
- 5) the Rosenbergs occasionally read the *Daily Worker*;
- 6) the Rosenbergs believed that the Soviet Union had borne the brunt of the war against Nazi Germany, and that it had *done its share in wiping out the murderers of 6 million Jews*;
- 7) the Rosenbergs had been pleased and lauded the United States and Great Britain for opening up a second front;
- 8) Julius Rosenberg had once been accused of being a Communist, for which he had been fired from the Signal Corps, although he had sworn that he was not a Communist.

JEWISH ASPECTS

The Rosenberg and Sobell trial, in a city whose population is one-third Jewish, proceeded without a single Jewish juror.

Here are comments from the Jewish press:

THE DAY: "The death sentence imposed by Judge Kaufman left the feeling that precisely because he is a Jew did he go to an extreme and deal judgment with a heavy hand... that Judge Kaufman is a Jew has perhaps unconsciously motivated him to issue a sentence which, in the opinion of many, is considered to be unjust and brutal."

DAILY FORWARD: "Too horrible... every Jew feels the same way."

CHICAGO SENTINEL, an Anglo-Jewish paper; in a column on Feb. 7, 1952 by Rabbi G. George Fox, one of the most widely known Rabbis in the Mid-West, an eminent scholar and author: "I am certain that Judge Kaufman's decision will be found unjust, if not illegal."

THE DEATH SENTENCE

In imposing the death sentence against Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, Judge Irving Kaufman said that they had "altered the course of history to the disadvantage of our country... we have evidence of your treachery around us every day... I believe your conduct has already caused, in my opinion, the Communist aggression in Korea, with resultant casualties exceeding 50,000 and who knows but that millions more of innocent people may pay the price of your treason."

From the Judge's comments, it appears that he sentenced the Rosenbergs to death for crimes with which they were not at all charged. They were neither accused of treason nor was any evidence brought in linking them in any way to the instigation of any wars, past, present, or future.

It is unthinkable that the same verdict and the same sentence would have been given had these accusations formed the basis of a "case" during the war years (when the USSR was our ally), when the alleged conspiracy was supposed to have taken place, or even in the first years following the end of the war.

Further, we can compare the sentences given to confessed or convicted traitors and saboteurs such as Axis Sally and Tokyo Rose, who got ten years each, and the famous Molzahn case in which four men who gave vital secrets to Germany in the Fall of 1941 were let off with 5 to 15 year sentences.

Finally, this is the first time in the history of our country that a civil court has imposed the death sentence for a charge of espionage. No person committing treason, the gravest of all crimes, has ever been executed.

CONCLUSIONS

- 1) The Rosenbergs and Sobell were convicted on unsubstantial and incredible evidence.
- 2) The prosecution prejudiced and inflamed the jury by bringing in extraneous issues in every phase of the trial.
- 3) The suspicion of anti-Semitism taints the entire trial.

FOR JUSTICE

WRITE to President Truman and ask that the government consent to a reversal of the Rosenberg-Sobell conviction, thus permitting a new trial or discontinuance of their prosecution.

The following are the final plans for the Clemency Gathering and Vigil in Washington D.C.

1) The National Clemency Gathering for Jan. 4th has been cancelled. Not a single hall large enough to hold a prayer meeting could be gotten. Rather than bring 3 or 4 thousand people to Washington to stand out in the cold for 2 hours, we are proposing other steps.

2) The Gathering for Jan. 5th will go on as scheduled. The days activities will be taken up mostly with visits to White House, Congressmen, Senators, other government officials. Every effort must be made to head these delegations up with clergymen and other local figures. Send us estimate of number and composition at once.

3) On Jan. 4th we will hold a National Conference in Washington D.C. composed of leaders of Rosenberg Committees throughout the country and whatever other representatives of local groups (churches, professional, labor, etc.) you can bring. Let us know at once who and how many will attend. (This is not a conference intended for large numbers of people.) A plan for final week of activity will be discussed. Local committee meetings should be organized for the day or evening of your return.)

4) The 24 hour Clemency Vigil at the White House begins on Dec. 31st and will continue through the week of Jan. 12th. Persons for the Vigil are urgently needed. The Washington office must have immediate figures, dates, and where possible, names. Send this information to Washington Rosenberg Committee, 1967 Kalorama Rd., Wash. D. C. Try to space these people going to the Vigil, so that the time will have, for the largest possible period, persons representing various sections of the country. In an earlier letter we suggested that before leaving and on returning, the participants visit their local newspaper and radio and TV stations. When they arrive in Washington they should see their local press representatives at the National Press Building.

5) We have a superb and brilliant recording (long playing - 28 minutes) written and acted by San Francisco cultural workers. It is the finest piece so far written on the case and has received acclaim by all audiences. It is suitable for small house gatherings as well as larger meetings. The records sell for \$4.00. Please place order now.

6) Our finances have declined considerably since our right letter. On the virtual eve of the threatened execution, we are financially unable to operate. Please help us.

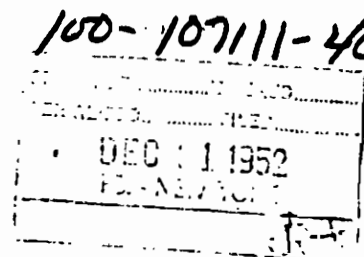

The Labor Committee to Secure Clemency for the Rosenbergs announced today that it had been informed that six hundred shop chairmen, representing the entire membership of the locals affiliated to the Furriers Joint Council of New York unanimously adopted a resolution urging President Truman to extend executive clemency to Julius and Ethel Rosenberg.

This action followed the action taken a few days before by the Executive of the Joint Council which passed the following resolution:

The death sentence given to Ethel and Julius Rosenberg on the charge of transmitting military secrets to another country is the first sentence on such a charge in the peace-time history of the United States. Sentences to the others in similar cases have been much less severe.

The Rosenbergs are the parents of two small children and in the past have had a blameless and unquestionable record.

Religious and labor leaders, professional men and women and public figures of all shades of opinion, both in this country and abroad, as well as many sections of the press have asked the President to commute the Rosenberg death sentence.

Therefore, the Furriers Joint Council of New York consisting of 15,000 members in affiliated locals respectively urges the President to use his executive powers to grant clemency through commuting the death sentence in this case.

The Labor Committee also announced that it had received a copy of a letter asking for clemency from Clinton E. Jencks, International Representative of the International Union of Mine, Mill and Smelter Workers, which said in part:

I have studied carefully several documents on the case of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, sentenced to death for having allegedly conspired to commit espionage.

My study of the records has convinced me and many of my friends, that these persons are being victimized for their political and social views.

It appears certain that there is very grave doubt as to their guilt.

It is a fact that never before in our history has a Civil Court imposed a death sentence for espionage, either in peace or wartime.

PHILADELPHIA VOTERS LEAGUE ASKS CLEMENCY FOR ROSENBERGS

Philadelphia, Pa. — Pointing to the "tragic miscarriage of justice" in the Sacco-Vanzetti case, the Independent Voters' League of Germantown and Chestnut, which represents "citizens of all political parties united to secure good government", has appealed to President Truman to grant clemency to the Rosenbergs, it was learned today by the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case.

The Voters' League, which is headed by Dorothy M. Wolff, includes Rabbi Elias Charry, Rev. J. Quinton Jackson and the Rev. Kenneth R. Forbes on its Executive Board.

In its Clemency plea to President Truman, the Voters' League said, "Our organization is dedicated to preserving the protections guaranteed to our citizens by the American system of jurisprudence". The group called the Rosenbergs' death sentence "a totally unprecedented situation and one which is considered cruel and excessive by increasing numbers of people all over the world."

"But us not be misled in a period of tension to cancel our hard-fought-for and cherished tradition of fair dealings with all" the plea added.

"Some of our members and their relatives", the Voters' League continued, "remember and participated in the effort to see justice done in the case of Sacco and Vanzetti who never swerved from their professions of innocence."

The National Committee to Secure Justice for the Rosenbergs, has urged all Americans who agree that the Rosenbergs' death sentences are too harsh to communicate their pleas for clemency to President Truman at the White House in Washington and to call any of their elected representatives to take similar actions.

An emergency appeal to the American people for \$50,000 to continue the legal and investigative work as well as the public campaign to win clemency for the Rosenbergs was announced yesterday by the National Committee to Secure Justice for the Rosenbergs.

The committee reported that the response to its fourteen-month campaign has been "unprecedented in American history for its size, its geographic and political scope." But, the committee said, "in the last few weeks, tremendous sums have been expended in research, legal work and in reaching millions of Americans who have been given only one version of this case."

It called on all "who have rendered financial support, as well as those tens of thousands who have been moved to act for clemency in the last few weeks, to wire and mail as substantial a contribution as possible" to its national headquarters at 1050 Avenue of the Americas, New York.

In addition to investigative and research work, the committee listed the following as "must" projects in the next three weeks.

1 - Legal and last minute investigative efforts. (Recently, proof of perjury by a government witness was attested to by an FBI affidavit.)

2 - The printing of two and a half million pieces of literature urging letters to Pres. Truman for Executive Clemency.

3 - A day and night Clemency Vigil in Washington beginning on December 27th.

4 - A National Clemency Gathering and Prayer in Washington on Jan. 4th and 5th which will bring thousands of Americans from all over the country to the nation's capital.

5 - Radio, TV and newspaper advertising, wherever it can be purchased, both in the country's metropolitan centers as well as in grass roots areas.

6 - Financial aid to the families of the Rosenbergs and Anita Sobell.

The National Clemency Gathering on behalf of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, scheduled for Sunday, Jan. 4th, has been cancelled, it was announced today by the NCRS-JRC. New emphasis will therefore be placed on the Monday, Jan. 5th Gathering, which will visit the President, Senators, Congressmen and other government officials.

"Fully 5000 persons, from every section of the country and representing every religious faith and political creed, were prepared to attend the Clemency Gathering on Sunday, Jan. 4th", the National Committee statement said. An afternoon prayer meeting and an evening public meeting were among the events scheduled for that day. Unfortunately, every hall meeting that many persons refused rental for the Prayer meeting and the public meeting. The Washington D.C. National Guard Armory refused to honor a signed contract and let it be known that its doors would be closed to those wishing to join a non-sectarian prayer for clemency. The Pennsylvania Railroad, for the first time in its history, refused to give the usual reduced rates to those seeking to participate in the prayer meeting.

"The placing of such obstacles in the way of a prayer meeting seeking to save the lives of two young parents from a punishment never before inflicted on Americans charged with their offense is inhuman, un-American, and thoroughly reprehensible.

"We are therefore cancelling the Sunday, Jan. 4th date, and

are so informing the many church, synagogue, professional and labor groups who have signified participation.

"Instead we are emphasizing the Monday, Jan. 5th Clemency Gathering, which will occupy itself with visits to the President, Senators, Congressmen and other government officials.

"Secondly, in view of the many commitments made for Sunday, Jan. 4th, a National Conference of several hundred persons will be held that day in Washington, comprising leaders of Rosenberg Committees throughout the country, and religious, professional and labor leaders active in the Clemency movement.

"We are recommending to the thousands who would have participated in the Jan. 4th Prayer meeting that they utilize the weekend of Jan. 3 and 4th to secure many new scores of thousands of communications to the President. Finally, the date for the beginning of the 24 hour prayer vigil at the White House has been set for Dec. 27th. The Prayer Vigil will continue 24 hours a day through the week of Jan. 12th.

EXCERPTS FROM COMMUNICATIONS RECEIVED BY ATTORNEY EMANUEL H. BLOCH

(These are taken at random from the numerous correspondence the attorney has received from prominent persons in this country and abroad)

Sydney Silverman, Member of Parliament, England:

"... I have no hesitation at all in saying that I contemplate with horror the possibility that the death sentence could be carried out in such a case by any civilized country; least of all the United States upon whom history has placed in our time so heavy a responsibility for the wise leadership of so many nations in the onward march of civilization.... To exact the extreme penalty from those two unfortunates in these circumstances is to make the Rosenbergs personally responsible for all the errors of the statesmen of the world which since the end of the war have so tragically lost the peace for which we all hoped. That may, as many think, be the sole responsibility of the U.S.S.A.; it surely is not that of the Rosenbergs."

The Very Rev. C.W. Chondler, Dean of Waikato, New Zealand:

"Assuming that Julius and Ethel Rosenberg are guilty, it must be borne in mind that it was during World War II, when Russia was an ally, that these persons committed these offenses. As heinous as the offense may be, it does not merit a death sentence, and I cannot believe that in this instance the President of your Republic will allow this sentence to stand. It would be cruel, inhuman and barbaric in the extreme and would raise a storm of protest throughout the world if, one of the chief partners in the world's Democratic States, countenanced the infliction of a death penalty, where even a medium of doubt existed as to the guilt of the persons concerned."

Prof. Anatol Rapoport, University of Chicago:

"Mr. President, I strongly urge you to exercise executive clemency in the Rosenberg Case. No one except the vengeful-minded and the potty-minded will blame you for this. In the vast majority, to those who have faith in the greatness of our heritage, your act will be an indication of your stature as a man and a leader."

Dr. Roland H. Brinton, Yale Divinity School, Conn:

"I was shocked when I read that the death sentence had been imposed upon Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, and I am glad to have the opportunity of saying a word which might have some influence in delaying the sentence.... I feel that the sentence is too severe because it is not commensurate with that meted out to others guilty of the same offense... We should by no means allow ourselves to determine life and death in terms of emotions engendered by a succession of disillusionments."

"Thank you for sending me the affidavit by Professor ~~Arnold~~ in connection with the Rosenberg Case. I have read it with great interest. It confirmed my earlier belief that the Court has greatly overstated the importance of the scientific information contained in the sketches of implosion lenses by David Greenglass, or of any accompanying details which a man with his very limited theoretical background was able to furnish. For this reason I feel that the severity of the sentence is out of proportion to the actual damage which could possibly have been done."

An Open Letter to President Truman on the Rosenberg case

Nov. 23, 1952

Dear Mr. President:

As you prepare to step down from the high office that you have filled with such selfless dedication to our beloved land, we take the liberty of urging upon you earnest consideration of the plea for clemency for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.

It is not our province to judge the Rosenbergs innocent or guilty. As long as a judicial question was involved we refused to intervene. Only now, for the first time, do we speak out — because now the issue is life or death. And only you, Mr. President, can give the answer.

The Rosenbergs have two little boys, Mr. President. Only your act of mercy can help these unfortunate children.

We well remember that Axis Sally and Tokyo Rose, traitors to our country during wartime, got 10 year sentences. That Nazi murderers of American war prisoners, of six million Jews and of countless others, have had their sentences commuted. Never before in the history of the United States was anyone ever sentenced to death by a civil court for espionage.

The eyes of the world are on us. Death to the Rosenbergs would strike a chill of horror into the hearts of our friends everywhere.

The Prophet Micah has told what the Lord requires of man: "Only to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God."

In the spirit of these words, Mr. President, we respectfully petition for clemency to the Rosenbergs.

Dear Sir:

In accordance with your request on 11 December 1952, I am enclosing one of several pieces of literature, a copy of their telegram and a list of the speakers at a meeting held in the Sanford Hotel, Flushing, NY, on 19 November 1952. Everything written in ink are my comments. I understand that my American Legion Post Commander has already sent to your office copies of additional literature, which was distributed to those present.

No one that I know, caught the name of the chairlady for the evening. She may have been called by two different names one of which was something like Blots. She was colored and stocky.

At the meeting they stated that \$22,000.00 had been raised in 10 days in order to get transcripts of the case, etc. They also stated that \$172.00 was contributed at this meeting. I know that the man sitting next to me gave a \$10.00 bill. The normal donation for the telegram was 25¢.

The meeting was called together by handbills, distributed in the neighborhood apartment houses. It was stated at the meeting that they had been looking for a hall since last March, and this was the first one they were able to secure.

One of the active men in the room (but not on the dias) helped circulate the telegram for signatures & quarters, helped in the general collection, and supervised the literature. He was a well dressed, slender built man who wore an earphone, and told me (by name) to take some of the literature as I went out of the room.

Circulated in at least my section of the audience, was one one page circular (for the Jefferson School, Sixth Ave & 16 St, Manhattan) from which had been clipped coupons for 50¢ and \$1.00 donations. This circular claimed it was for the only school teaching Marxism to negroes & Porto Ricans.

As I recall now, Mrs Peggy Segal of Bayside called the meeting to order and turned the chair over to a colored woman whose name was Mrs Blots or something far different. Mrs Emily Alman, from Knickerbocher Village and a neighbor of the Rosenbergs, was the first speaker. As a speaker she gave an excellent delivery. Mrs Bessie Mitchell (colored) told of drinking in the courtroom and the jury going to the races during her brother's trial and that a bottle used as evidence was manufactured after the date of the murder. Once she said the communists were afraid to help. In another statement she said the communists helped a great deal. Mrs Segal then told of the difficulty in getting a hall, announced the four street corner meetings on the following Saturday, and asked for the big collection. Mrs Alman then made more remarks, and admitted that the communists were helping in the race persecution and Mrs Alman's Jewish persecution. Ideas seemed to me intended to make the members of those two groups think that they were persecuted for those reasons.

WOMEN'S INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE CALLS FOR CLEMENCY FOR ROSENBERGS

The Women's International League for Peace and Freedom, in a newsletter to affiliates, has called upon its membership to "urge President Truman to grant clemency to the Rosenbergs," the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case announced it had just learned.

Newsletter No. 24, sent from the Organization's Washington headquarters, 1734 F Street, N.W., on December 12, devotes half of pages 8 and 9 to comment on the Rosenberg Case and answers to the question, "What Can We do?"

Noting that many communications had come to the Policy Committee from branches, individuals, members and friends asking what the League was going to do about the case, The Bulletin observed that "after very serious and searching study and consideration it seems right to make certain points."

"There appears to be substantial evidence of guilt," The Bulletin remarks, but notes that able lawyers have pointed out that "the trial was unfair and there were certain improprieties in the proceedings."

Through its Bulletin, the League passed on four recommendations for action to its membership.

"1. We can reaffirm that we are unalterably and irrevocably opposed to capital punishment, no matter what the crime or degree of guilt.

"2. We can point out that we believe this sentence, unprecedented in our history, is excessive and should be commuted and reconsidered.

"3. We must work to create a climate of opinion free of fear in which we insist on equal justice under the law and protest against the kind of prejudicial treatment which gives the death sentence to some and a lighter sentence to those who, though indicted as co-conspirators, turned informers for the State."

"4. Urge President Truman to grant clemency to the Rosenbergs. This is the least we can do. This much we must do.

"Above all," the passage concludes, "let us not be paralyzed by the fear that our intentions will be misunderstood. May the day never come when the WILPF refuses or fails to state openly and for all to hear its fundamental support of freedom and civil liberties."

Among the first founders of the League, which was organized more than half a century ago, were Carrie Chapman Catt, famed suffragette, and Jan Addams, internationally-renowned woman pacifist leader.

In conjunction with the Clemency Vigil and the Clemency Gathering for Jan. 4th and 5th in Wash. D.C., we should like to recommend that a number of parallel activities take place in the various cities, in addition to sending people to Washington.

(a) City Vigils. Is there a place in your city at which a 24-hour, day by day vigil can be organized simultaneous with the one in Washington? If there is, the vigil should be conducted on the same basis as the Washington one. It should take up only one issue - Clemency for the Rosenbergs. It should avoid, in slogans and acts, conflict or hostility with President Truman or any other government official or agency. It should attempt to involve clergymen and other community figures.

(b) Whether or not such a vigil is possible in your city, can a "perpetual prayer" activity be organized? This too would be a 24 hour, day by day activity in which prayer for clemency would be continuously made. It is possible, if a clergyman is willing, to conduct it in a single church or synagogue. It is also possible and possibly even more desirable, to "relay" it among a number of churches, temples and synagogues.

(c) Both these activities can help develop the national vigil and the National Clemency gathering. Secondly, the fullest publicity should be given to them and all other activities. New York newspapers (World Telegram, Post, and others) now state their information indicates that the clemency appeal has the support of millions. The World Telegram, for example, states that no other case in decades has aroused so much support. This news must reach your newspaper, it must be printed.

One other thing. The newspaper admissions that millions support the clemency appeal means that there are many thousands in your city who support this appeal thousands whom you may have never heard of. Newspaper advertisements can help reach them. Large scale mailings in New York, Chicago and elsewhere have gotten unprecedented returns.

There can be no doubt now that the American people favor clemency. We hope that the above suggestions, and previously made suggestions, will help you organize this favorable attitude.

Even Dr. Klaus Fuchs, regarded as the key man in this atomic espionage "ring," was sentenced only to 14 years.

Learned men and women, eminent lawyers and judges among them, have studied the Rosenberg-Sobell trial. They have expressed the fear that the Rosenbergs and Sobell may have been unjustly convicted because of the tragic political and social passions that are so widespread today.

All these are appalled at these death sentences because never before in our country's history—in peace or war—has a civilian court sentenced anyone to death on such a charge. They ask: What example to the world will these death sentences set? What problems will we solve by taking the lives of this young couple? They are moved by the terrible blight these death sentences, if carried out, will cast upon the two orphaned Rosenberg children.

THEY APPEAL FOR EXECUTIVE CLEMENCY.

They appeal to the President of the United States, who this very June granted Executive Clemency to a man sentenced to death, to spare the lives of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.

To the end that the President and Congress may see how great are the numbers of the American people who are for clemency for the Rosenbergs and Sobell, a National Clemency Gathering has been called for January 4th and 5th (Sunday and Monday), in Washington, D. STATEMENT TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT

From the Delegation of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the
Rosenberg Case

For The Honorable Dean Acheson, Secretary of State

The State Department cannot but be cognizant of the increasingly undesirable reaction to the Rosenberg's death sentence abroad, which grows from hour to hour.

Surely it must recall the irreparable injury to this nation following the execution of Sacco and Vanzetti, as velced by millions in all countries of the world, shocked at the execution of immigrants, persecuted for their political ideas in another time of hysteria.

The moral prestige of the United States, its reputation for justice and mercy is being impaired by the presence of the Rosenbergs in the death house. Viewed from afar it cannot but seem to possess all the overtones of an hysteria which Europeans find difficult to comprehend. Such opinions are held not only by labor and liberal groups abroad, but by the largest mass of conservative opinion as well, reflected recently in the statement of the Paris "Le Monde", the "Paris Presse", and the Reverend Charles H. Dixon, Chaplain to the Queen of England.

The carrying out of the death sentence cannot but make very difficult cooperation between ourselves and our allies. It is indisputable that the nations that suffered the most, Great Britain, Norway, France, Belgium, Denmark, Holland and Italy, are aghast at the spectacle of the United States government extending leniency and freedom to the most field marshals and the Kise Nochs, while putting to death two American Navy citizens accused of having aided an ally.

We therefore urge that you advise the President of the United States of the danger to American prestige consequent upon the execution of the death sentence in this case, and that you urge him to extend clemency to the Rosenbergs.

INFORMATION AND SUGGESTIONS ON MEETING YOUR CONGRESSMEN

1. Our reason for seeing Congressmen is to ask two things of them:
 - a. To use their influence upon the President directly to grant clemency.
 - b. To issue a public statement urging Clemency for the Rosenbergs.
2. Members of the House of Representatives each have an office in either the New House Office Building or the Old House Office Building, both of which are opposite the Capitol. Senators can be seen in the Senate Office Building opposite the Capitol.
3. Each Congressman has an Executive Assistant in his office. Although it would be good to see the assistant as a last resort, every effort should be made to see the Congressman himself. The best time to see your Congressman is between 10 - 12 in the morning and 2:30 - 5 in the afternoon.
4. Our approach should be to present the facts of the case for clemency without discussing any other issue with the Congressmen. The statements made by Dr. Harold C. Urey and Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver can be cited in appealing for clemency.
5. Regardless of our personal opinions about any Congressman, we should at all times be friendly and courteous.
6. If you are unable to see your Representative or Senator in his office, you can try to call him off the floor of the House or Senate in the Capitol building, by sending a note in to him through the Page Boy who is just outside the floor of the Senate or House.
7. There should be one spokesman in each delegation, but every member of the delegation should be prepared to speak. If possible, the spokesman should be a resident of the district which the Congressman represents. Another member of the delegation should take notes on the interview and the results should be recorded on the Report-Back Form included in this envelope.
8. Above all, we must impress Congressmen with the urgency of the case—the Rosenbergs have a week to live, and every Congressman should be pressed politely but firmly to take a stand in favor of clemency.

In ruling that a new trial in the Rosenberg case should have been granted many months ago, and yet declining to grant one today, the U.S. Appeals Court has avoided the central question, the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case declared today.

The Appeals Court, with Chief Judge Thomas Swan writing the opinion, ruled on December 31 that:

"We may assume that in this case ^{unfavorable} pre-trial and during-trial publicity a cautionary instruction would not suffice, and that if the defendants had moved for a new trial it should have been granted. But they did not so move."

The Committee declared:

"Where human life hangs in the balance, it would seem obligatory that the higher courts bend over backwards to insure utter fairness. To say that the Rosenbergs were entitled to a new trial many months ago, and yet to decline to grant them a new trial now is incredible. Should the Rosenbergs die simply because they expected, as they had a right to, that the verdict would not be influenced by unfavorable and misleading publicity? Should they be executed because of their faith in the courts? If a new trial, in the words of the Appeals Court, 'should have been granted' at that time, should the Rosenbergs die because they did not, at that time, move for one? To admit that there are grounds for calling the trial 'unfair' and then to refuse to correct the wrong can only injure the reputation of our courts in the eyes of the American people and the world.

"When one adds to this admission by the Appeals Court the sworn confession by FBI agent John A. Harrington that he abetted one of the witnesses in committing perjury against the Rosenbergs, it becomes utterly unthinkable that the Rosenbergs be sent to their deaths, beyond the hope of ever clearly establishing the truth of the charges on which they were tried."

PARENTS AND GRANDPARENTS WILL BRING YOUNGSTERS TO STRAUS SQUARE MEETING
Whole families of New Yorkers from all five of the city's boroughs will gather at historic Straus Square, in the heart of Manhattan's Lower East Side, on Thursday, January 8, from 5 to 7 P.M., to appeal for Presidential clemency for Julius and Ethel Rosenberg. The meeting is being sponsored by the New York Committee for Clemency for the Rosenbergs. The small hands of children, in their brightly-colored mittens, will feel a squeeze from the bigger hands of their parents and grandparents when speakers mention the two Rosenberg children — Alvin, age 9, and Sophie, age 11. For the children know as well as their elders that four lives are at stake in the case.

"My two children know all about the case," said one Bronx mother whose son and daughter are 11 and 8 respectively. "I explained it to them the first Saturday I left them with their grandparents—my own mother and father—so that I could gather signatures from the housewives doing their Saturday shopping. When I called for them later in the day, my own parents, who are in their seventies, were angry with me. They wanted to know why I hadn't asked them to sign my petition. The children had told them all about the Rosenberg case.

"We're not too old to help," they said. "We can't get out much, but lots of our friends come to see us. We'll get them to sign."

"I handed my father the petition," the Bronx mother continued, "and showed him the line to sign. His hand trembled a little, because he's not used to writing in English—he writes mostly in Yiddish—but he put his name down on the petition in big clear letters. Then my mother said she wanted to sign.

"But you can't write English," he said. "I'll sign for you."

"No," she objected, "I want to do something for these people. I want to make an 'X' at least."

But he shook his head. "No, Babe," he said. "To save two human lives—such a holy thing—an 'X' is not enough. I'll sign your name for you."

And she let him sign her name.

"Both of my parents," said the young housewife, "and the two children—will with my husband and myself at Straus Square on Thursday."

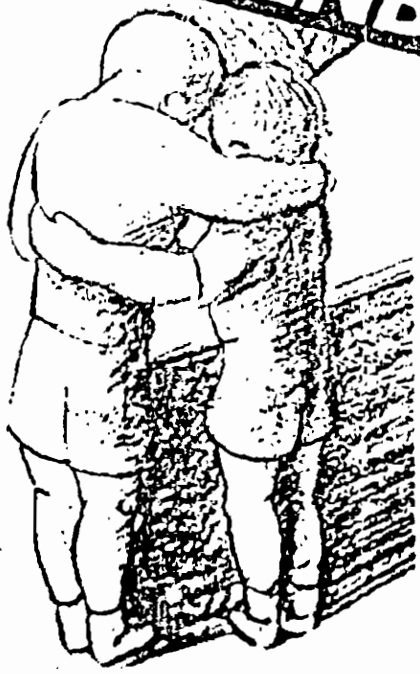

CLEMENCY VIGIL AT WHITE HOUSE IN 144th HOUR

THOUSANDS TO PETITION LAWMAKERS AND PRESIDENT FOR CLEMENCY ON
JANUARY 5th

Washington, DC -- The round-the-clock Clemency Vigil for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, which began at the White House at 4 pm on Saturday, December 27, 1952, is now in its 144th consecutive hour. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case announced today that, through icy rains and freezing snow, the Vigil continued, with the participation of persons from half a dozen states. The participants included Negro and white professionals, students, housewives, businessmen and trade unionists, representing all religious affiliations.

During the ten days that remain until the scheduled date of execution of the Rosenbergs, the Clemency Vigil will include participants from throughout the midwest and as far west as California as well as the Eastern and Southern states, which have been heavily represented since the Vigil began.

Clemency Vigil participants reported telegrams of encouragement, offers of coffee and good wishes, especially from the New Year's eve crowds.

In conjunction with the Vigil, thousands of persons, from every part of the country, are expected in Washington on January 5th, when they will form delegations to visit the President and their congressional representatives to petition executive clemency to save the lives of the young Rosenberg parents - the only Americans ever sentenced to death on a charge of "conspiracy to commit espionage."

LOCAL RELIGIOUS GROUPS ASK CLEMENCY FOR ROSENBERGS

"Time is growing very short" to save the lives of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg was the plea of the Astoria Center of Israel Bulletin for Dec. 26, it was learned today by the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg case. "Please act at once," declared an editorial urging the congregation to write President Truman "asking him to commute their sentence" of death in the Sing Sing electric chair during the week of January 12, 1953.

The Bulletin declared it was convinced of the "disloyalty" of the Rosenbergs and of the "fairness" of their trial on charges of alleged passing of publicly known information to Soviet Russia.

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"However the death sentence which was imposed upon them is undoubtedly much too severe in view of the time when the act was committed..."

The plea of the Bulletin was among thousands flowing toward Washington D C. on the eve of the Clemency and Prayer Gathering there on January 5.

Undoubtedly considering the children of the condemned mother and father, the Bulletin urged people to write "in the name of mercy and kindness...a post card or brief letter is all that is necessary to express your thoughts on the matter."

"The ultimate decision is now in his hands," declared the Bulletin of President Truman, "but he will be guided by public opinion and response."

Meanwhile Rabbi Adolph Klein of Brooklyn declared in a message to President Truman:

"While there is a doubt of the wisdom of the sentences, the executions should not be carried out.

"In the name of my Congregation Ans he Emmeth of Coney Island (N.Y.City) and myself I am appealing for mercy..." declared Rabbi Klein in his message to the President concerning the looming electric chair execution of the father and mother of two children for alleged espionage.

"We all feel that the sentence is shocking and unjust... Why were others implicated in the plot treated less severely? In our opinion it is not certain from the court records that the accused were as crucially important in the spy network as they were made out to be," continued Rabbi Klein.

Further asserting that "God alone knows the truth in this tragic case," Rabbi Klein urged that "for the sake of their two young children, grant them their life."

"Our allies will surely be disturbed and confused for they look upon our country as the land of justice and humanity."

WHITE HOUSE CLEMENCY VIGIL NOW IN THIRD DAY

The Clemency Vigil at the White House, Washington, DC, is now coming into its 72nd consecutive hour, the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case announced today.

The Vigil, asking President Truman to grant Executive Clemency to Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, will continue 24 hours, day and night, to the week of January 12th, the date set for the execution of the Rosenbergs.

Walking in temperatures that fell as low as 24 degrees in the early morning hours, the participants reported many offers of coffee and relief from sightseers and other passersby.

The Vigil, which has received nationwide radio, television and newspaper coverage, is one of a series of actions undertaken by numerous groups throughout the country. Appeals for clemency are being made by hundreds of thousands who assume the Rosenbergs are guilty but who object to the excessive and unprecedented sentence. Hundreds of thousands of others ask for clemency because they have doubts about the guilt of the Rosenbergs, while still others are convinced of their innocence, which the Rosenbergs continue to affirm in the very shadow of the electric chair.

On January 5th, thousands of persons from all over the country are expected in Washington, where they will form delegations to Senators, Congressmen, the White House, Department of Justice, and other government agencies.
