(X) CSNY 426, of known reliability, made available to the New York Office information concerning the above-captioned subject, obtained from 35 E. 12th St., N.Y.C. This building is occupied by the following organizations, which are all under the control of the Communist Party: Publishers New Press, Inc. ("Worker" and "Daily Worker"); Morning Freiheit Association ("Morning Freiheit" and "Jewish Life"); Workers' Bookshop; F & D Printing Co.; 12th - 13th Realty Corporation. Prior to September, 1951, the National State and N. Y. County offices of the Communist Party also occupied these premises.

Strict care must be exercised so that the existence of this important source of evidence will not become known to any outside agency. It is also to be noted that because of the nature of this source of information it will be impossible to recontact the source regarding information furnished.

The National Labor Committee for Clemency for the Rosenbergs today released the following letter received from Harold E. Ward, prominent Mid-west Negro union leader in Local 108 F.E., United Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers of America, Chicago.

"Dear Brothers and Sisters:

My family and I do not want to see Ethel and Julius Rosenberg die in the electric chair.

We know what hours of torture this family must have endured in this past year, for, last December I faced the electric chair myself. Had I been put to death, my children would be fatherless, my wife a widow.

I was charged with murdering a scab during a strike at the Chicago International Harvester Plant. I was innocent, but that made no difference to the newspaper, the radio and television experts. They really went "gunning" for me. I was labeled a "red," a "subversive," a "murderer!" This is what the newspapers did to the Rosenbergs before their trial.

When the jurors were picked, I knew they had read the papers, listened to the radio and seen the stories on television. I knew it would be difficult to get a fair trial in such an atmosphere. But, I was fortunate in having my union behind me. They knew that I was innocent and rallied to my defense, raising sufficient funds to guarantee the best possible legal defense and to make public the true facts of my case.

I was found "Not Guilty."

It did not happen this way with the Rosenbergs. They had no one to back them up. There was no challenge to what the newspapers and radio said. The jury got a one-sided picture. One of the witnesses against the Rosenbergs was proven to be a liar recently -- in a sworn affidavit by the F.B.I. How would the jury have voted if they knew then that this witness had lied?

The Rosenbergs say they are innocent. I believe them - you may or you may not. But, in any event, the death penalty is a penalty far too severe. The Rosenbergs will never have a chance of proving their innocence unless they remain alive.

I want to urge all people, irrespective of religious, social or political beliefs to join the appeal for Clemency for the Rosenbergs. I know by my own experience how easy it is to put human life in jeopardy. Please help.

A printed letter headed "National Labor Committee for Clemency for the Rosenbergs, 1050 Sixth Avenue, New York 18, New York, telephone BRyant 9-9683 dated January 21, 1953 and signed Sincerely and Fraternaly ABE WEISBURD, Secretary." The letter enclosed some reprints of newspaper articles by Professors ALBERT EINSTEIN and HAROLD C. UREY, as well as an analysis of the ROSENBERG case by D. N. PRITT, World famous British lawyer.

The letter also enclosed an article from the Nation magazine of January 10, 1953 entitled "Mercy for the ROSENBERGS" by FREDA KIRCHWEY.

BRITISH M.P. DENOUNCES FAKE NEWS STORY ON ROSENBERGS

The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case today made public a letter from the Honorable Sidney Silverman, Laborite Member of the British Parliament and one of the leaders of the world Jewish Congress vehemently denying that he has in anyway changed his support of clemency for Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, as implied in a New York Post story on January 7.

In a letter to Emanuel Bloch on January 13, Mr. Silverman denounced as "shameful" and "dishonest" the Post's story which was angled to imply that he had, before a World Jewish Congress forum in London, supported the trial of and the death sentences against the Rosenbergs.

Mr. Silverman's letter underscored his opinion that the death penalty against the Rosenbergs for alleged conspiracy to commit espionage was "hysterically extravagant..." and that to "carry out the capital penalty would be to indict not the Rosenbergs but the United States Government."

The text of Mr. Silverman's letter was as follows:

C O P Y

13th January 1953

Dear Mr. Bloch,

I am shocked and distressed beyond words by your letter and enclosure of the 8th instant, which has reached me only this morning. It reveals about as shameful a bit of dishonest reporting as I have come across for a long time.

On 8th January I took part in a public Forum in London about the Prague trials. I said that they were certainly not anti-Semitic; that they were certainly anti-Zionist; that they might therefore lead to unintended anti-Semitic results. In passing, I said, that it would be as wrong to infer anti-Semitism merely from the fact that many defendants were Jews and were described as Jews as it would be to infer anti-Semitism in the Rosenberg case merely because the Judge, both counsel, both defendants, and the chief prosecuting witness were all Jews whereas there was not a single Jew on the Jury.

So far from intending to imply any support for the hysterically extravagant sentence on the Rosenbergs (even if guilty, which seems to me very doubtful) I had only the previous evening been the principal speaker at a large and very crowded public protest meeting which apparently the United States press did not report at all! In the course of my speech I said that I did not think a conviction on the evidence could have been obtained or held on appeal in the United Kingdom and that to carry out the capital penalty would be to indict not the Rosenbergs but the United States Government.

I remain of that opinion and you may make such use of this letter as you wish.

SEVEN HUNDRED AT LABOR RALLY URGE CLEMENCY FOR ROSENBERGS

More than 700 people at the first labor sponsored rally for clemency for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg unanimously adopted a resolution urging President Eisenhower to grant executive clemency to Ethel and Julius Rosenberg. The meeting sponsored by the Labor Committee for Clemency for the Rosenbergs was held February 6th, at Palm Garden in New York City, a historic spot of labor gatherings.

The resolution among other things declared, "throughout the world people are watching to see if the principles of mercy, humanity, and equal justice will prevail in the United States. As members of labor unions which seek to maintain and extend American democracy and liberty, we too urge that these principles prevail, and that you, therefore, commute the death sentence of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg.

(Chaired by Leon Straus, executive secretary of the Furrier Joint Board, the meeting heard some legal aspects of the case from Victor Rabinowitz, labor lawyer; Dr. John Codrington, research scientist, and executive board member of the New York Branch of the American Association of Scientific Workers; Leon Beverly, President of Local 247, United Packinghouse Workers, Chicago; Mrs. Helen Sobell, wife of Morton Sobell who was convicted and sentenced to 30 years in Alcatraz at the same time the Rosenbergs were sentenced to death; and Abe Weisburd, secretary of the Labor Committee.

Early in the meeting, Mrs. Ethel Rosenberg, mother of Julius was given a standing ovation as she was escorted to the platform.

(The most moving part of the night was the short remarks of Mrs. Sobell who declared "I have 30 years to work day and night for the freedom of my husband, but there is so little time to save Julius and Ethel.")

Straus warned the unionists that the same conditions that convicted and doomed the Rosenbergs to death were also aimed at undermining the ability of the unions to carry out the will of the working people.

Rabinowitz recalled the trial and execution of Sacco and Vanzetti a generation ago under conditions of hysteria similar to those surrounding the Rosenbergs. He noted the statement of Dr. Harold C. Urey that the obstinacy of the Rosenbergs was "more believable" than that of David Greenglass, Mrs. Rosenberg's brother who confessed spying and implicated his sister and her husband thereby winning himself a comparatively mild sentence. The noted attorney compared the reactionary newspaper demands that the Rosenbergs "confess" to the last scene of the current Broadway play "The Crucible" when during the New England witch trial the judge demands that the character John Proctor confess and sign a statement that he's a witch.

Urging the audience to get into the fight as individuals and seeks appeal from their unions and friends, Rabinowitz, declared "let it not be said that because you failed to write a letter or send a wire, the Rosenbergs died."

Dr. Codington, discussing some of the scientific aspects pointed out the Greenglass who "failed all science courses at Brooklyn Polytechnic and in view of his background accomplished quite a bit" when he, according to his testimony that convicted the Rosenbergs remembered enough details about the atomic bomb to pass on information to the Rosenbergs. Codington pointed out that "the information alleged to have been passed on was neither secret nor of much aid to a foreign nation..." and quoted the Smythe Report that "the principles used were well known..."

"Scientists" Codington declared, "have a duty to speak out as they are in a position to evaluate the facts of this case."

Leon Beverly who traveled from Chicago to address the rally urged all unionists to appeal for clemency because "the Rosenbergs are victims of the same kind of hysteria which is always used against the unions." A veteran of many labor struggles Beverly cited the case of Harold Ward, Negro unionist recently freed of murder charges in Chicago, and declared "it was the unity of labor and working people that won Ward's freedom and the same things hold true in the Rosenberg case. The unions have got to get together and fight for the Rosenbergs."

"This case is important to the Negro people", Beverly declared, "and I urge them to get in this case and help save the Rosenbergs."

Weisburd announced that on February 16, a national delegation of trade union leaders will go to Washington D. C. and visit the White House and the Department of Justice carrying appeals for clemency.

COMMITTEE REPLIES TO REQUESTS THAT IT TAKE POSITION ON MATTERS OTHER THAN ROSENBERG CASE

The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg case has from time to time received requests that it take a position on matters other than the Rosenberg case.

In the year and a half of its existence this committee has steadfastly declined to comment on matters other than those connected directly with the Rosenberg case. The wisdom of this policy is proved by the fact that the men and women who compose this committee have never felt constrained to agree on matters outside the Rosenberg case. They have always been of one mind in respect to this case, even though they differ in their political, social, and economic creeds.

In this connection Mr. Joseph Brainin, the chairman of our National Committee, has asked that it be made clear that his reply to a request for comment on a Russian case involving Solomon Mikhoels was made as an individual and was not made in the name of the committee.

We have always respected the right of committee officers to speak their minds on any issue other than the Rosenberg case providing that they did so as individuals and not in the name of the committee nor in their capacity as officers of the committee.

Mr. Brainin made this clear in his statement of January 28th.

Mr. Brainin urged renewed efforts by the many thousands of Americans who have so far kept the Rosenbergs from execution by their unprecedented campaign for executive clemency. Mr. Brainin further urged that the spirit of common interest and aim around the issue of clemency, which united so many persons of diverse beliefs and positions, continue to prevail.

The Negro Elks have asked President Eisenhower to commute the death sentence of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg. It was announced today. The plea was made by W.C. Hueston, Grand Secretary of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the World in a letter to the President, dated Jan. 23, from Washington, D. C.

"I am not going into the guilt or innocence of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg but I am joining in with the petition to commute this sentence to life imprisonment or a lesser term," wrote Mr. Hueston.

"It seems to me", the fraternal leader continued, "that the United States of America could lessen the harshness of their sentence in keeping with the punishment dealt out by other countries for similar crimes."

The Elks organization numbers among its leaders many of the most influential Negro Republicans of the nation, including Mr. Hueston. The late J. Finlay Wilson, Grand Exalted Ruler was prominent in Republican politics for a quarter of century before his recent death.

The Elks support for clemency, follows the recent appeal of Mrs. Mary Church Terrell, noted and venerable Negro woman leader and educator.

Mrs. Terrell's plea was made to former President Truman, and she declared, "I do not know whether they are guilty or not. I am not an expert on atomic science, but I do know that many persons whose knowledge and devotion to this country I respect deeply do believe there is some doubt about their guilt. Many more devoted American", think that even if they are guilty, death in the electric chair is a punishment too severe...As one who has lived richly in America, who loves America and respects America, I plead with you Mr. President, to stay the executioner and let the Rosenbergs live."

While the Elks plea for clemency was the most recent and influential from the Negro people, it is recalled that the Baptist Minister's Conference of Washington, D. C. urged the former President to "temper justice with mercy, in the case of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg. Since no one has ever paid with life for the crime of which they stand guilty, it is our prayer that these two be spared the supreme penalty."

The Negro Baptist Minister's organizations of Newark, New Jersey and San Francisco have also made pleas for executive clemency.

While in New York the Rev. James H. Robinson of the Church of the Master, and the Rev. O. Clay Maxwell, of Mount Olivet Baptist Church, joined with 1,500 other Protestant clergymen in appealing for clemency. The Rev. Charles L. Carrington of Queens, New York, and the Rev. Mother Lena Stokes of Harlem have urged clemency.

Earlier the Boston Chronicle, Nov. 29, 1952 declared editorially, "those of us recall the relatively light sentences meted out to Tokio Rose and Axis Sally for their treasonable activities during World War II cannot help from considering the death sentence of the Rosenbergs as "cruel and unusual punishment."

And finally, Dr. W. E. B. DuBois addressed an outdoor rally at Straus Square, on New York's Lower Eastside on Jan. 8th in behalf of the Rosenbergs. He also signed a brief amicus curiae in their behalf which among other things declared, "we firmly believe, as the moral sense of mankind has agreed for centuries that it would be far better than ten guilty persons escaped punishment than that one couple, if innocent, should be any legal mischance, be sent to their deaths."

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Dr. Zachariah Chafee, Jr., noted authority on constitutional law and a professor at Harvard University, has supported clemency for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case announced today. Dr. Chafee's appeal was made during a lecture on "Freedom of Speech" at Memorial Hall, University of North Carolina, during the week of January 18.

"There is some doubt of their guilt; they should live. Other people have committed worse offenses and have been allowed to live," declared Dr. Chafee.

The noted legal expert also declared that Federal Judge Irving Kaufman's statement that the Rosenbergs were responsible for the death of U.S. soldiers in Korea was questionable.

Meanwhile, the January 6th Daily Republic of Mitchell, South Dakota, takes issue with "a committee of prominent Protestants, Catholics and Jews..." who charge the Daily Republic "in an all-embracing manner, saying that anyone who has joined in organized campaigns for clemency for the Rosenbergs has 'knowingly or unwittingly given assistance to Communist propaganda.'"

The Daily Republic concludes that "Americans must continue to stand up for what they think is right..."

In the midwest, the January 15th University of Minnesota Daily calls for commutation of the death sentence to "life imprisonment..."

The Christian Century for January 14th declared that ten years from now "we think that by that time the sentence of death will be deplored as needlessly severe, particularly when contrasted with the sentences imposed on men who had far more to do with passing along atomic secrets to the Russians."

The New Religious Frontier of December 11th, issued by The Church of the People, Seattle, Washington, declared that "to put the Rosenbergs to death for their crime puts a very considerable strain on our conscience. We are troubled and will be more troubled if the sentence is carried out."

Finally the Jewish News Letter for January 18th, notes that "several petitions urging clemency for reasons of justice and humanitarianism, signed by prominent American personalities including Albert Einstein, Nobel-prize winner Harold C. Urey, Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, and many other voices were heard urging the same measure for entirely different reasons." The News Letter notes that "well-known conservatives..." and other such quarters in France have cautioned against the execution of the Rosenbergs and concludes, "in other words, from the point of view of the Western camp in the cold war, political expediency in this case seems to coincide with the requirements of humanity and mercy."

[REDACTED] on 2/3/53, orally advised SA ROBERT E. FARRELLY regarding the following:

On 2/1/53 [REDACTED] attended a meeting of the LACSJRC. At this meeting, a representative from New York (DAVID ALMAN) announced that to date, \$140,000 had been spent for the Rosenbergs and that the Los Angeles Committee's quota for the future was \$5,000.

A man who identified himself as the representative from the Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case in Tucson, Arizona, announced the difficulty he and friends had in attempting to hold a meeting in Tucson one week previously. This group had attempted to obtain a hall and finally were able to obtain the Baptist Church but the VFW commander had warned the pastor that he, the pastor, would no longer be welcome in Tucson if the meeting was held in his hall. The group, after wandering around Tucson, were finally allowed the use of a "friend's" restaurant, where, after all the diners had left, a meeting was held. He announced that he was asking for three volunteers to go to Tucson with him within a few weeks to set up a committee there.

b7d [REDACTED] advised that the LACSJRC was in charge of the area which included Southern California and Arizona. He advised that the representatives at the meeting are never identified other than a full name and locality and are never referred to as a delegate from any particular organization in that the committee is supposedly set up for the express purpose to aid the Rosenbergs and allegedly has no affiliation with other organizations.

[REDACTED] advised that the committee has been forced to vacate their meeting room at the Park Manor and their headquarters on South Main Street and are presently attempting to secure new quarters.

[REDACTED] advised that a regular report reflecting the names of those present and any other additional information will be submitted.

T-3, of known reliability, advised that at this meeting HARRIAN LESUEUR, a member of the Minneapolis Committee, was the principal speaker and advised those present that the ROSENBERG trial was a frame-up and was just one of many struggles of the people against the American "storm troopers." At this meeting there were about 35 individuals present, a number of which were identified by the informant as Communist Party members. T-4, of known reliability, identified HARRIAN LESUEUR as an individual who follows [REDACTED] leadership.

Meeting Held on December 19, 1952,
at Friends Quaker Church, South Minneapolis

According to the "Minneapolis Morning Tribune" dated December 20, 1952, this meeting was addressed by STEPHEN LOVE, Professor of Law at Northwestern University, who advised those present that he had the gravest doubt as to the guilt of the ROSENBERGS and considered Judge IRVING R. KAUFMAN as being prejudiced. In his talk LOVE stated that he considered capital punishment wholly unjustified and suggested new evidence may be uncovered later or that BRENNAN-GLASS might change his testimony at a later date. T-3, of known reliability, who was present at this meeting, advised that there were about 100 individuals in attendance, many of whom were known to the informant as CP members or sympathizers.

Meeting Held on January 28, 1953,
at Volunteers of America Hall,
St. Paul, Minnesota

According to T-5, of known reliability, STEPHEN LOVE, Professor of Law, Northwestern University, was again introduced as the principal speaker. LOVE'S remarks were almost identical to those made at the meeting held at Friends Quaker Church on December 19, 1952. LOVE pointed out that after reading 1750 pages of the ROSENBERG trial, he believes an act of injustice was perpetrated by the Government. LOVE again reiterated that he had the gravest doubt as to the ROSENBERG'S guilt and claimed that Judge IRVING K. KAUFMAN indicated on numerous occasions during the trial that he believed the ROSENBERGS to be guilty. LOVE pointed out that there was not one Jewish juror on the trial jury.

The Clemency Vigil at the White House on behalf of commutation for Julius and Ethel Rosenberg is now entering its 144th Consecutive hour, it was announced today by the National Committee To Secure Justice In The Rosenberg Case. The Vigil began on Saturday, Dec. 27th.

The number of persons participating in the Vigil, at one time or another, from all sections of the country has now grown to more than 200. It is estimated that over a 1000 persons will have participated by the end of next week.

Delegations from California east to Chicago and New England have already begun to arrive in the nations' capital for a series of visits on Jan. 5 with Senators, Congressmen and government officials.

In a reply to attempts in some quarters to pin a political label on the nationwide sentiment for clemency, the Committee declared: "It is an insult to the American people - and particularly to its ministers of all faiths - to insinuate that their sentiments for mercy for the Rosenbergs arise from any political source. Only an unregenerate Scrooge would be shocked to discover that mercy has no selfish end - or that it exists at all. The nationwide sentiment for Clemency for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg exists independently of the will of any group or party, and arises out of the normal doubts and humaneness with which our fellow Americans are, with a few exceptions, endowed."

CLEMENCY VIGIL AT WHITE HOUSE GROWS TO 1500 IN ITS 240th
CONSECUTIVE HOUR

The White House Clemency Vigil on behalf of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, which began on December 27th, went into its 240th hour today with over 1500 persons participating during the early afternoon hours.

The Clemency Vigil, which until today had been kept to half a dozen persons on an around-the-clock basis, was opened to permit the participation of thousands of persons who had travelled from points as far west as Los Angeles and Portland.

Ministers, labor leaders, and professional men and women of all faiths and creeds were on the Vigil at one time or another.

The Clemency Vigil is scheduled to continue through the week of January 12.

RABBI SHARFF HEADS CLEMENCY DELEGATION TO WHITE HOUSE PARDON ATTORNEY

Rabbi Dr. Meyer Sharff headed today a delegation which brought to Daniel Lyons, White House Pardon Attorney, the sentiments of thousands of persons asking that the pardon attorney, who works under the Department of Justice, convey these clemency sentiments to the President.

Reverend Nolan Mills, officially representing the Baptist Ministers' Union of San Francisco, and Joseph Brainin, chairman of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, accompanied Rabbi Sharff on the delegation.

The delegation requested that the Department of Justice consent to an appeal for executive clemency, which will shortly be brought before the President.

Participants in the Mercy Vigil, one of the largest before the White
House in recent years, came by car and train from New York, Baltimore,
Boston, Philadelphia, Washington, Newark, Chicago and Ohio, in response
to an appeal by the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case
issued only 48 hours before. Because of the size of the vigil, five
hundred of the participants were asked by police to march in an overflow
line on East Executive Avenue, while two thousand walked directly
before the White House.

Leaders of the Mercy Vigil, in a letter to President Eisenhower
accepted at the White House gate, wrote the President: "The distressing
fact that the appeal for mercy for the Rosenbergs by Pope Pius X
was not brought to your attention raises serious fears that many
of the appeals for mercy..."

They added, "It is our hope, if for any reason whatsoever of
expressions for mercy... from the information upon
which you must make a profound decision. We respectfully urge that
in the light of these circumstances, which have arisen through no
fault of the Chief Executive, you give renewed consideration to the
appeals for commutation of the death sentences."

In a public plea to the American people issued at the Vigil, heads
of city and state delegations said: "We fervently believe that the
pleas of our fellow citizens for clemency can still help in averting
this unprecedented execution. We beseech our fellow Americans to
continue writing and wiring the White House urging re-consideration
of the Rosenberg clemency appeal."

Delegations of trade unionists, professionals, ministers and
"groups in all walks of life and of all faiths" will be coming to
Washington on various days during the coming week to join the Vigil, the
Committee reported.

PROMINENT DETROIT ATTORNEY HEADS CLEMENCY DELEGATION TO DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE

Mr. Isadore Starr, a prominent attorney and Jewish leader of Detroit, was spokesman for a delegation to Mr. James R. Browning, executive assistant to Attorney General McGranery. Others on the delegation were Mr. John Wexley, prominent writer, best known for the Theater Guild success "They Shall Not Die", a play about the Scottsboro Case with which Mr. Wexley was intimately connected, and Mr. William Esterman, a prominent Los Angeles attorney and officer of a California bar organization.

The delegation requested that the Department of Justice, by taking cognizance of the grave doubts of guilt shared by many Americans, consent to any motions which may be made to the courts or to the President, which would reopen the trial or, at the very least, commute the death sentence.

Thousands of citizens have been called to a round-the-clock Vigil at the White House, Saturday afternoon, February 14, to urge that President Eisenhower reconsider his hasty death decree for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.

The call was issued by an emergency meeting in New York at the headquarters of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case. Those attending came from New York and neighboring cities along the Eastern Seaboard following the President's action late Wednesday afternoon.

The Vigil and the actions the Committee called for were symbolic of the profound shock felt throughout the country after the President's action.

At the same time, the Committee urged spokesmen for the millions of union members, church-goers, and community groups who have urged clemency for the Rosenbergs to phone, telegraph and write the President to reconsider his decision.

"It is clear that life or death for the Rosenbergs is now in the hands of the American people," the Committee declared. "The President must immediately be told by the people that his death decree is in disregard of their expressed wishes."

COMMITTEE STATEMENT ON CLEMENCY DECISION

The following statement was issued at an enlarged executive meeting of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case:

"Within a matter of hours after receiving the petition for clemency from the Attorney General's office, President Eisenhower announced a decision which completely disregards the expressed and unmistakable sentiment for clemency of millions of our fellow citizens.

"Patriotism and mercy motivate the nationwide appeal for clemency. Neither in our eyes nor in the eyes of the peoples of the world do we want our government to stand bereft of fairness. But the President's decision, if unchanged, will permit the execution of two Americans for allegedly aiding a nation that played a major role in destroying our common enemy during World War II; it will put to death two Americans about whose very guilt eminent lawyers and jurists have raised grave doubts.

"Such a decision will seriously damage the good will which our government seeks to gain in its relations with the rest of the world

"A few weeks ago, the Rosenbergs were hours away from death.

Attached is a communication from the "Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case". It was addressed to me back in November shortly after the date given in the form letter.

I send it along to you merely because I felt the list of "sponsors" given along the margin of the stationery of the form letter, would be something which you should have along with your list of Communists, subversives, and such characters. You no doubt already have many or all of them from other sources, but as a loyal American I felt there just might be some of them which you do not have.

The fact that I received this communication thru the mail, along with thousands of these sent out by this "Committee", is an illustration of how these Communist and Front organizations constantly canvas the people of the theatre -- because unfortunately, there are so many Communists, fellow-travelers and sympathizers in the theatre, radio television, and motion pictures; in fact, in every medium which can be used for propaganda wherever their sympathizers are able to weave their propaganda into manuscripts for broadcasting or production on Broadway, or wherever.

I have spent a good part of my adult life in the professional theatre, radio, television, etc. So, therefore, I have constantly received this type of communication, -- and invitations to attend all sorts of meetings of organizations obviously Communist front set-ups, and to join them -- for years.

LEE SOLOMON is supposed to get this material from the Central Office of the Rosenberg Committee, as it comes from New York once each week. GUY ENDORE has been assigned to assist her also. (u)

GUY ENDORE returned from Tucson and Phoenix, Arizona, on February 2, 1953, and gave his report before this meeting as to the trouble they were having in these cities with red-baiting in connection with the Rosenberg Committees. He was sent to Arizona as a scout for the Los Angeles Rosenberg Committee. SOL ROSENTHAL stated that \$66 from the Rosenberg Committee Fund was allowed to ENDORE for this trip. (u)

SOPHIE DAVIDSON stated that she knew how they in Arizona felt since she felt lost until New York sent directives to get her started in connection with the Rosenberg Committee in Los Angeles. (u)

On 12/8/52 [redacted] Island Park, N.Y. Post Office contacted writer and advised that Mrs Katherine Goldstein of Island Park had been in the Post Office this date and asked questions relative to sending mail to Long Beach and the cost of Special Delivery letters. [redacted] stated that later in the day Mrs Goldstein had mailed about 1500 letters 1st class to residents in Long Beach, N.Y. and that the letters bore the return address of "Room 2, 1050 6th Ave. at 40th Street, New York, 18, N.Y. To the members of the Prayer for Clemency Delegation, January 5, 1953:

Welcome to this great action for mercy and clemency for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg! In the few hours that you are in Washington, we must work with the utmost possible efficiency and clarity.

Our purpose is simple: to help persuade the President to commute the sentence of the Rosenbergs. No other issue, no other cause is involved.

We who are here represent not only ourselves, but the millions who have thus far spoken up for clemency. We must represent them well and accurately.

The issue today is not whether the Rosenbergs are guilty or not. If we achieve our single aim of saving them from the electric chair, we shall have time enough to argue that later.

Today the issue is clemency, and clemency only.

The fact is that most of the newspapers and individuals who have appealed for clemency have done so despite the fact that they believe the Rosenbergs guilty. Such organs and persons ask for the clemency on the ground that the sentence is excessive, unprecedented and harsh.

Many others have spoken up for clemency because they have doubts about the fairness of trial conducted in a heated atmosphere. Still others believe the Rosenbergs are innocent.

Today in Washington, and during the next week in whatever home communities we come from, it is important to keep in mind that it is necessary to address our broadest appeal to those millions of Americans who believe or assume the guilt of the Rosenbergs but who are not ready to accept the death sentence. If these Americans will in additional hundreds of thousands let the President know that they will support a commutation of sentence, victory is possible.

You will be on a delegation to a Congressman, Senator, or other public official. There may be attempts to change the subject, to bring in side issues (such as guilt of the Rosenbergs, the trials in Prague, communism, etc.). Every delegate will have to see to it that the issue is kept simple; clemency for the Rosenbergs and the commutation of the unprecedented and harsh sentence.

After all, in England, Dr. Allan Munn May was released from prison on December 30, 1952, after serving less than seven years of a ten year sentence on the same charge as the Rosenbergs. Furthermore, May pleaded guilty; the Rosenbergs still protest their innocence. None of these side issues changed the action in England. We should not allow ourselves to be diverted from the main point here.

CLEMENCY VIGIL FOR ROSENBERGS TO END IN MASS PRAYER TODAY

The Clemency Vigil in front of the White House on behalf of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg will end in a mass prayer at 4:45 P.M. today (Monday, Feb. 23rd) participated in by a large delegation representing thousands of people throughout the United States.

In closing the Clemency Vigil the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case stated, "Now that the clemency sentiment of millions of people here and throughout the world has been registered in the Court of Appeals decision granting a stay of execution to Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, the Committee is bringing its Clemency Vigil to a close after 243 unbroken hours of picketing in front of the White House."

Prayers will be led by the Rev. Harold S. Williamson and Cantor Jacob Kaminsky. Following the prayer a committee will present the following plea to the White House urging President Eisenhower to reconsider his denial of clemency:

"Mr. President, a tremendous wave of doubt exists in this country and the rest of the world that the trial of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg was conducted entirely within those limits prescribed by law to protect accused Americans.

"Judge Jerome Frank, of the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, after hearing the arguments of the Rosenbergs' counsel, took note of this when he said: 'There is substance to this argument, and for my part, I believe the Supreme Court should hear it'.

"The guarantee that all accused persons shall have the utmost of protection from their Government until they are proved guilty beyond a shadow of a doubt, has been one of our greatest pillars of freedom since our country was founded under the leadership of George Washington. To doubly safeguard this pillar the framers of the United States Constitution granted the President the right to review and commute sentences and to grant pardons.

"Mr. President, because we believe our country is too great to permit a miscarriage of justice, because we want our country to be synonymous throughout the world with the word 'Justice', we respectfully suggest that you instruct the Attorney-General to consent to a new trial for the Rosenbergs.

"Mr. President, because recent developments have shown that not all the pertinent information concerning this case, which involves the good name of our country throughout the world, was given to you before you made your decision, we urge you to reconsider, review the case again and grant clemency to Ethel and Julius Rosenberg."

A committee of trade unionists representing the Labor Committee to Secure Justice for the Rosenbergs, today issued the following report on their one-day trip to Washington:

"Our committee telegraphed the White House on February 5, requesting an appointment with the President, and on February 11 another telegram was dispatched to confirm our arrival at the White House at 2 p.m. today, February 16. We were met at the White House gate by a Mr. Young, who described his function as "sloughing off groups like this, and expressing the President's regrets". The trade unionists pointed out that they represented over 200,000 workers and objected to being summarily dismissed on the sidewalk. We gave Mr. Young our message to the President, requesting that he reconsider his denial of the Rosenbergs' appeal for clemency.

"Determined to see an official closer to the President, we walked in unannounced to the White House annex and met with a Mr. Blackley, in charge of Public Information under Harold Stassen. He told us that American Justice was on trial before the world, that the recent statements by Pope Pius XII were an accurate reflection of the concern by workers all over the world that clemency be granted.

"The delegation then went to the office of the Attorney-General and met with his official representative, Mr. Daniel Lyons. Mr. Lyons is the Pardon Attorney who reviewed the case before President Eisenhower made his decision last week. We asked that the Department of Justice not oppose Defense Counsel Bloch's motion in any court seeking a postponement of the execution date pending his appeal to the Supreme Court. After a thirty-minute discussion, we asked Mr. Lyons what his recommendation to the President had been. He refused to answer.

"The delegates went to Capitol Hill to see their Congressmen and completed their day by joining the round-the-clock Clemency Vigil in front of the White House.

The delegation included members of C.I.O., A.F.L. and Independent unions. Spokesman for the group was Mr. Carl Wise, Trustee of Local 140, United Furniture Workers, CIO. Mr. Wise pointed out that the Labor Committee had received messages of support from the membership and leaders of unions representing hundreds of thousands of workers. Before leaving Washington, the trade unionists issued an appeal to their fellow workers throughout the United States to send messages to President Eisenhower requesting reconsideration and further appealed to trade unionists to join the vigil in front of the White House.

Dear Mr. Hoover,

I am writing to you to ask you for some material on the Rosenberg case-- that is if you have any mimeographed papers for the public. It doesn't matter if they are technical or not-- It's okay if they are a part of your speech or one of your G-men's speeches-- just anything.

It all began when I got hot under the collar upon reading an article in "The Churchman" (Episcopal) magazine about how some clergymen--and some of ours among them-- had written to the president asking for clemency. That burned me up and I wrote to the magazine's "Open Forum" and said in so many words

1. about how distressed I was that so many of our ministers had made asses of themselves in coming into a case of which they knew nothing,
2. and that they were dopes,
3. and that the comics were just making suckers out of them,
4. and that some ministers were suckers for a little "God All Mighty".
5. Also spoke of the infamy of their crime which was worse than murder-- traitors to their country, etc.
6. Also said that some ministers would be faster off if they would mind their P's & Q's.
