("Worker" and "Daily Worker"); Morning Freiheit Association ("Morning Freiheit" and "Jewish Life"); Workers' Bookshop; F & D Printing Co.; 12th - 13th Realty Corporation. Prior to September, 1951, the National State and N. Y. County offices of the Communist Party also occupied these premises.

Strict care must be exercised so that the existence of this important source of evidence will not become known to any outside agency. It is also to be noted that because of the nature of this source of information it will be impossible to recontact the source regarding information furnished.

BRITISH GOVERNMENT INTERVENES
ON BEHALF OF M.P. EXCLUDED UNDER
McCARRAN ACT FROM CLEMENCY SPEECH

NEW YORK, N.Y.—The British Government has made representations to the U.S. State Department on behalf of the Hon. Sydney Silverman, British Labor M.P. who was this week refused a visa to enter the U.S. to speak at the Clemency Dinner for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.

This was learned from the British Embassy in Washington, D. C. by the Rosenberg Clemency Committee, sponsors of the dinner, slated for Wednesday, March 18th, at the Hotel Capitol in this city.

Mr. Silverman was quoted in the London Telegraph of March 11th, as saying that the provision of the McCarran Law under which he was excluded "refers to anarchists, atheists, Communists, totalitarians and a variety of other people, none of whom could apply to me."

A member of the world executive of the World Jewish Congress, Mr. Silverman also stated that the American Jewish Congress was "much perturbed" by the U.S. Government's action.

It was learned here that the Congress had protested the visa refusal as had a number of other U.S. organizations in opposition to the McCarran Law.

A Reuters dispatch from Washington quoted State Department spokesman Joseph Reap as denying that the visa refusal had anything to do with Mr. Silverman's connection with the Rosenberg Case. In any case, Reap reportedly said, "he would still be ineligible to enter the country."

The Rosenberg Clemency Dinner Committee, wired this protest to both the State Department and the Department of Justice:

"Since a great number of Americans of the most splendid reputation and unquestioned loyalty are urging such clemency...it seems unwarranted interference with freedom of discussion and an inexcusable affront to a legislator of a friendly nation... Will you please review the situation personally and approve the issuance of the necessary visa."

In the event that Mr. Silverman is finally refused entry to this country, plans are being made for him to address the dinner, which one thousand are expected to attend, by transatlantic telephone.

SETTING IT STRAIGHT

Editor, Bergen Evening Record.

Dear Sir: I am deeply concerned over an advertisement entitled "We Beg To Differ -- Mr. President", which appeared in the Bergen Evening Record on Mar. 2, 1953. This advertisement was sponsored by the New Jersey Committee for Clemency for the Rosenbergs, 572 Prospect Street, Maplewood, N. J. Particular reference is made to an allegation in this advertisement which reads, "The F. B. I. Agent, John Harrington, admitted on Dec. 1, 1952, that he helped an important witness in the case to lie under oath."

While I appreciate the policy of newspapers with reference to advertising, I could not let the opportunity pass without bringing to your attention the fact that the allegation concerning Special Agent Harrington is entirely without foundation in fact.

I have, of course, no way of knowing what initial inquiries were made by your paper concerning the accuracy of this particular advertisement, but I do want to apprise you fully of the pertinent data concerning the unfounded allegation against Special Agent Harrington.

The facts simply are these: On Mar. 26, 1951, Special Agent Harrington, pursuant to a request from the United States Attorney, took a potential witness, Ben Schneider, into the courtroom in the Southern District of New York, where Julius Rosenberg was being tried. The purpose of bringing the potential witness into the courtroom was to determine whether he could identify Julius Rosenberg as the individual who had had passport photographs taken in the shop of the potential witness. Schneider testified the following day against Julius Rosenberg and on direct examination was asked, referring to the date June 1950, the following question, to which he made the following response: "Q.—And is that the last time you saw him (Rosenberg) before today? A.—That's right."

The counsel for the Rosenbergs have alleged that the foregoing statement was false, and filed a motion in District Court which resulted in the Government's filing an affidavit by Special Agent Harrington on Dec. 2, 1952, which recounted the above facts. Judge Sylvester Ryan on Dec. 10, 1952, in denying the defendants' motion said, "There was no motive for falsehood on the part of Schneider, and there is not the slightest evidence that Schneider's testimony on this was intentionally false."

At no time did Special Agent Harrington counsel the witness Schneider to withhold the fact that he had been brought into the courtroom on the day previous to his testimony for the purpose of identifying Julius Rosenberg. Special Agent Harrington merely performed the simplest type of investigative function in this matter to determine whether a potential witness could identify the defendant, Julius Rosenberg.

I have always felt that the press has served as a great and forceful medium for the presentation of the truth in a succinct and clear manner. It is certainly regrettable that the Bergen Evening Record with its thousands of readers has been used by the New Jersey Committee for Clemency for the Rosenbergs to present in the form of a distorted advertisement a statement which can only be described as a clear-cut prostitution of the truth.

I have taken the liberty of discussing this matter in some detail as I know you will appreciate how all of us in the F. B. I. are deeply concerned by this vicious attack upon the integrity of a Special Agent in your service.

On February 26, 1953, [redacted] orally furnished the following information to the writer. During the interview handwritten notes were taken by the writer and they will be maintained in [redacted] **B7D**

As of February 23, 1953, the captioned organization continued to maintain office space at the Inspiration House. The most active individual working out of this office was Reverend HAROLD S. WILLIAMSON of New York who was scheduled to return to New York on February 27, 1953.

The Informant had learned that Reverend WILLIAMSON claimed that there had been 2,000 people in Washington taking part in the picket line at the White House on February 22, 1953.

[redacted] was of the opinion that there were only about 1,500 people taking part in the picket line on that date. **B7D**

The Informant is of the opinion that, unless some favorable action is taken by President EISENHOWER or by the Supreme Court toward the ROSENBERGS, another picket line will be initiated during the last week prior to the scheduled execution of the ROSENBERGS.

NEW YORK, N.Y. --- (ROUNDUP) --- Since President Eisenhower's denial of clemency to Ethel & Julius Rosenberg, public sentiment for commutation of the death sentences has increased, it was reported today by the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg case.

In the Christian Science Monitor of Feb. 27th, Joseph C. Harsch writes: "There is room for a question, however, whether execution (of the Rosenbergs) will best serve the long-term interests of the United States...."

Under the headline "Why Kill Them," the Buffalo News asks: "Will the taking of their lives accomplish any good purpose?...killing them won't solve any problems."

Discussing the Pope's appeal to Pres. Eisenhower to spare the Rosenbergs' lives, the Des Moines Register suggests that "it might be a good stroke...if a popular move to abolish the death penalty got going...." In another editorial the Register points out that "there is certainly unequal justice in electrocuting the Rosenbergs and letting Klaus Fuchs...off so easily."

The University of Minnesota Daily calls a denial of clemency "another blow against the unity America is trying to achieve in Europe."

Alarmed at red-baiting attacks on those who seek clemency for the Rosenbergs, the Mitchell, B.D. Republic demands that "Americans must continue to stand up for what they think is right..."

In like vein, Rabbi A.H. Blumenthal of Mt. Vernon, N.Y., in a letter to the Argus there charges that "it is the height of irresponsibility to label all who are opposed to the death sentence as 'Commies or Pinkos.'"

Only one who is ignorant of the magnificent contributions of liberalism to American civilization will condone this."

Commenting on Pres. Eisenhower's refusal to grant clemency, the Worcester Independent said: "Thousands of decent Americans honestly hoped that the President would grant clemency..."

The McKeesport News, calling the Rosenbergs typical Americans like "the folks across the street," says that their death sentence "haunts our consciences. Should they be killed...? There arises the vision of a father and mother and two young boys."

Feeling that the U.S. "will come out badly" in the Rosenberg case, the University of Toronto Varsity finds "there are grounds for debate on the punishment."

Message to Israel, a Protestant missionary publication, reports that it has "written to the President appealing...that he commute this death sentence."

A 129-year-old newspaper, the Penn Yan, N.Y. Chronicle-Express, "wonders why this inconspicuous couple is tried and threatened with death...Could it be that the Rosenbergs are being made scapegoats?"

Rev. Ralph Walker of New York's Madison Avenue Baptist Church led a prayer, reported in the New York Times of February 23rd, for the U.S. Supreme Court and Pres. Eisenhower "that they may combine justice and mercy," in the Rosenberg case.

Two Canadian newspapers, one Catholic and one Jewish, have also spoken out, The Pilot asks: "Is it not possible that something may be said in favor of clemency?" The Israelite Press regrets "most deeply that Pres. Eisenhower did not display generosity by using executive clemency...we feel that the death sentence is too cruel and ought not to have been imposed..."

NEW APPEALS FROM EUROPE
AND ASIA URGE CLEMENCY

New York, N.Y., March 13, 1953 --- A clemency petition addressed to the U.S. government is being signed by hundreds of people in France, urging that the Rosenbergs be returned to their two small boys.

In Paris, the nationally prominent attorney Paul Villard is circulating the Rosenberg's clemency petition among his colleagues, as Italian lawyers are also planning to do.

"People of all creeds and political opinions in France," Villard reports, "pray for the salvation of the two innocents, Julius and Ethel Rosenberg. Millions of people have their name and picture in their hearts."

At the memorial tablet erected in Genoa, Italy to murdered partisan fighters, a wreath has just been placed with a placard asking: "Let us give back the Rosenbergs to their sons."

The Democratic Women's Organization of Israel has petitioned the president to "commute the murderous death sentence and ... prevent the assassination of innocent people. We Jewish women regard this brutal sentence ... (as) injuring the honor of every honest person."

A number of outstanding French Catholics have appealed for clemency, including Father Martin Berger; Louis Martin Chauffier, co-manager of Figaro; Albert Beguin, executive editor of Esprit, and senators, deputies and professionals.

The Independent Labor Party of England adds "our voice to others and appeal (s) to the President of the U.S.A. that the Rosenbergs should be allowed to live."

In both East and West zones of Germany, attorneys, pastors, artists and trade unionists have joined in asking clemency. These include Stuttgart and Stockstadt victims of the Nazi Regime, 150 citizens of Muhlheim, all employees of an Oschersleben candy factory, the Hamburg Tenant's Association, the former Attorney-general of Ludwigshafen and many others.

Belgian senators and congressmen of many political beliefs have joined Henri Rolin, head of the senate, directors of hospitals and other public services, attorneys and journalists in urging President Eisenhower to grant the Rosenbergs clemency.

In Peking, Shen Chun-ju, Vice President of the International Association of Lawyers, stated: "I fully support the American people's struggle for ... the release of the innocent Rosenbergs." Dr. Mei Ju-ao, former judge of the Far East International Military Tribunal, termed the death sentence a "most brutal insult to human justice."

Lutheran, Congregationalist and ministers of other denominations held a public prayer meeting in Peking for the Rosenbergs, followed by an appeal from 18 Chinese Christian churches and societies, including YIM's calling on U.S. Christians to work for clemency for the Rosenbergs.

NEW YORK, N.Y.--Four leading legal, political and military figures of France have urged clemency for Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, who face death on charges of conspiracy to commit espionage, it was announced today by the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case.

Statements were made by Andre Mornet, Chief Government Attorney of France; Gilbert de Chambrun, deputy to the National Assembly, a descendant of Lafayette, and an honorary citizen of the United States; General Le Petit, a leader of the French Forces of Resistance at the time of Liberation, and General Le Corguille.

"I have a very painful impression, a lingering doubt, about the testimony in the Rosenberg case," said Mornet, who presided at the trial of Marshall Petain. "The inequality of the treatment of the defendants in this case disturbs me greatly because it seems that a brother confessed and sent his sister to the death house in order to escape with a light sentence.

"This is a drama that transcends all frontiers. It is taking place in a country whose influence is so important to our history, and whose love for the rights of man is akin to our own."

In his plea for clemency, General Le Corguille said: "It is with very great sadness that we are shown once again that a great friendly nation for which we have always had a loyal understanding and high esteem, finds itself today, by a mistake of its government, enmeshed in a great miscarriage of justice of the most inhuman kind."

On January 2, 1953, the French Association Of Rabbis addressed a plea to President Eisenhower for clemency for Ethel & Julius Rosenberg.

Like news of Pope Pius XII intervention, the action of the French Rabbis was, so far as the Committee has been able to learn, kept from the President.

Following is the text of the plea made by the French Rabbis:

"Mr. President:

"The Rabbinate of France, profoundly moved by the death sentence pronounced on Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, but wishing to avoid any exploitation of this plea for political purposes, respectfully appeals directly to you to implore you to use your prerogative of clemency in their behalf.

"Troubled in conscience by certain indications, and convinced together with an important section of public opinion of the extreme severity of the sentence handed down by Judge Irving Kaufman, the common ideal of justice and of generosity which we derive from the Bible.

"With confidence in the spirit of equity and humanity to which your life bears testimony, the French Rabbinate hopes, Mr. President, that you will not allow to be carried out this punishment which is without precedent in the West and which, in addition to the persons of the Rosenberg couple, will affect two young children."

[redacted] furnished SA THOMAS F. INGRAM on 3/17/53 with a leaflet he had received. [redacted] captioned "We Beg to Differ, Mr. President," published by the N. J. Committee for Clemency for the Rosenbergs, 572 Prospect St., Maplewood, N. J. This leaflet solicited funds "to help publicize this appeal" and contained the statement that the FBI Agent, JOHN HARRINGTON, admitted on December 1, 1952, that he helped an important witness in the case to lie under oath. **B7D**

The leaflet in content and appearance is similar to the two N. J. Committee advertisements with the same allegations that are mentioned in the referenced Newark letter. The leaflet may also be identical to that sent by Mr. SILOW to the Bureau, as mentioned in the referenced Bulet to SILOW.

A photostatic copy of instant leaflet is enclosed with the New York copy of this letter for their information.

[redacted] was contacted by SA WILLIAM J. REED, 3/24/53. [redacted] insisted that his identity be kept confidential and is unwilling to testify. He furnished an envelope [redacted]

[redacted] containing a mimeographed letter from LEONARD RUBIN, Chairman, N. J. Committee for Clemency for the Rosenbergs, 572 Prospect St., Maplewood, N. J. (an SI subject of the Newark Office) dated 3/17/53, addressed to "Dear Sirs (or Madam)". The letter stated there was enclosed a fact sheet based on the court record and other available material and a legal analysis of the case by an eminent attorney. The two items enclosed with this letter, [redacted] were a 16-page pamphlet captioned "The Rosenberg Case, An Analysis By D. R. Pritt, World-Famous British Lawyer", issued by the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, 1050 6th Ave., New York 18, N. On a page of the above leaflet, under the caption, "New Appeal", and under the statement, "The present appeal to the Supreme Court is based on the following chief grounds:", is a paragraph designated "(2)", which reads as follows:

"That the prosecuting authorities knowingly used false testimony to bring about their conviction. In December 1952 an F.B.I. agent, John A. Harrington, admitted in a sworn affidavit that a government witness had committed perjury in court with the knowledge of the F.B.I."

One photostatic copy of this leaflet is being enclosed herewith for the Bureau and New York.

It is requested the New York Office and the Bureau advise if they desire Newark to continue furnishing new literature bearing the above or similar allegations as they become available.

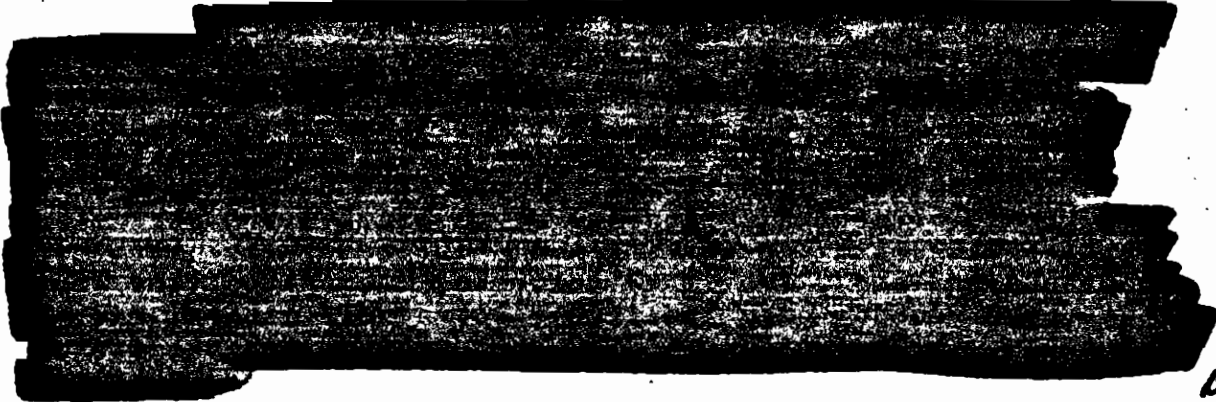

Dear Mr. Boyd:

On February 18, 1959, the Daily News News printed an advertisement which has caused some considerable concern. This advertisement was sponsored by the New Jersey Committee for Clemency for the Rosenbergs, and I would like to make particular reference to an allegation in this advertisement which reads, "The FBI Agent, John Harrington, admitted on December 1, 1952, that he helped an important witness in the case to hide under a bush."

Although I certainly appreciate the policy of newspapers with regard to advertising, I did want to inform you that there is no factual foundation for this allegation concerning Special Agent Harrington. Naturally, I do not know what action your paper took to determine the accuracy of this particular advertisement, but I do want to acquaint you with the facts concerning this unfounded allegation.

These are the facts: Pursuant to a request from the United States Attorney, Special Agent Harrington, on March 26, 1951, took a potential witness named Ben Schneider into the courtroom in the Southern District of New York where Julius Rosenberg was being tried. The purpose of this action was to determine whether Schneider could identify Julius Rosenberg as the individual who had had passport photographs taken in Schneider's shop. During Schneider's testimony against Julius Rosenberg the following day, Schneider was asked on direct examination referring to the date June, 1950, the following question, to which he made the following response: "Q. And is that the best time you saw him (Rosenberg) before today? A. That's right."

Alleging that the foregoing statement was false, the counsel for the Rosenbergs filed a motion in District Court, and the Government then filed an affidavit by Special Agent Harrington on December 2, 1952, which recounted the above facts. In denying the defendant's motion on December 10, 1952, Judge Sylvester Ryan said, "There was no motive for falsehood on the part of Schneider, and there is not the slightest evidence that Schneider's testimony on this was intentionally false."

Special Agent Harrington did not connive Schneider at any time to withhold the fact that he had been brought into the courtroom on the day previous to his testimony for the purpose of identifying Julius Rosenberg. This was merely a simple investigative technique to determine whether a potential witness could identify the defendant, Julius Rosenberg.

Under the Code, it has been my personal feeling that the newspapers of this nation render great service in presenting the truth in such manner as to keep the public properly informed. With regard to this advertisement, however, I deeply regret that the Daily News News, with its many readers, has permitted itself to be used by the New Jersey Committee for Censorship for the Rosenbergs to present a statement which is a complete distortion of the truth.

I realize I have gone into considerable detail in explaining this matter to you, but I did not have to know that this reprehensible attack upon the integrity of one of our Special Agents caused all of us in the FBI to be deeply concerned.

The letter is addressed to "Dear Friends" and begins as follows:

"American labor has always been opposed to unfair verdicts and to excessive punishments. And for good reason. Labor itself has been the greatest victim of inflamed and prejudiced newspapers and courts.

"For such reasons labor and other organizations and individuals of prominence throughout the world have joined in the plea to spare the lives of the Rosenbergs."

Four paragraphs were devoted to individuals in organizations who have "spoken out on this issue." These are paragraphs alleging support from labor, foreign sources, scientists, and the clergy.

A Clemency Rally for Sunday, 4/26/53, was announced, to be held at the Triborough Stadium on Randall's Island.

DOUBT No. 1: Was the prosecution sincerely seeking Justice?

They heralded the calling of 113 government witnesses, but dared summon only 23, of whom 19 were incidental "padding". Omitted were all scientists of repute such as Dr. Harold C. Urey who has since come out in defense of the Rosenbergs.

No checks, no photographs, no dictaphone recordings, no documents, no micro-film, no letters, no independent witnesses, nothing at all could be produced linking the Rosenbergs with espionage.

DOUBT No. 3: Were the Principle Witnesses at all Believable?

All four (Elitcher, the Greenglasses and Gold) were self-confessed perjurers, all standing to gain by playing along with the prosecution.

Max Elitcher: Self-accused, but let off free.

(Transcript pp. 295-296.)

Harry Gold: Self-proclaimed spy, sentenced to 30 years, but out in 10 on parole.

See Gold's own testimony in U.S. vs. Brothman trial transcript.

David Greenglass: Pleaded guilty, — but only got 15 years (out in 5 on parole).

(See Transcript pp. 679-680.)

Ruth Greenglass: Confessed guilt, but never even indicted and completely free!

(See Transcript pp. 727-728.)

DOUBT No. 4: Did Their "Cloak-and-Dagger" Tale Make Sense?

Bristling with unbelievable contradictions, these four perjurers' story contained such things as:

a. Elitcher's claim that Rosenberg had enlisted him as a Soviet spy *in 30 minutes flat*. This feat all on the basis of a mere acquaintanceship of four years earlier!

b. Gold's claim to be the most thoroughly—trained and cautious spy — yet registering in an Albuquerque hotel to meet Greenglass, *under his own name*.

(See Transcript pp. 815-824.)

c. David Greenglass' claim he could remember 12 pages of scientific data after a 6-year lapse, yet admitting he flunked "8 courses out of 8" elementary science in the 1½ year terms of high school he attended.

(See Transcript pp. 611-612.)

d. Ruth Greenglass' claim that although her husband balked at becoming a spy when she first delivered the Rosenbergs' alleged invitation to him, yet *the very next morning* he spouted secret information he conveniently had right on tap.

(See Transcript pp. 682-684.)

DOUBT No. 5: Was there Really an Atomic Bomb Secret?

This myth has been exploded by every reputable American Scientist and expert on nuclear fission as follows:

a. **Dr. Urey**: "That it would be easier for the Soviet Union to develop the atom bomb by themselves than to depend on spies, who would have to be accomplished scientists to comprehend any part of it at all."

b. **James R. Newman** (Counsel—Atomic Energy Commission) stated that: "the general principles underlying all processes are likely to be widely known" . . . (pp. 30-31 — petition for clemency.)

c. **Dr. Robert Oppenheimer**: "That there was no basic secret concerning atomic weapons nor the 'knowhow'." (Note: see p. 30 — petition for clemency.)

d. **Time Magazine**, 3-19-51: "Some of his (Greenglass) testimony made little scientific sense."

e. **Scientific American**, May, 1951: "The Greenglass bomb is not much of a secret."

DOUBT No. 6: Was the Jury Influenced by Spy and War Hysteria?

The Prosecution has been condemned by the Court of Appeals for conduct regarded as "wholly reprehensible" in prejudicing the jury with inflammatory

press releases and statements to such an extent that, according to the upper court, it was impossible for any jury to be impartial. When the upper court attempted to sidestep the issue, on 2-18-53, Judge Learned Hand supported the defense appeal to the Supreme Court (now pending) as follows:

"People don't dispose of lives just because an attorney didn't make a point . . . You can't undo a death sentence. There are some Justices on the Supreme Court on whom the conduct of the prosecuting attorney might make an impression." (See N.Y. Times, 2-18-53.)

Incited by press, radio and prosecution releases the jury forgot the fundamental American tradition of the "presumption of innocence" of the accused—and condemned the Rosenbergs as guilty long before hearing the evidence.

DOUBT No. 7: Was Judge Kaufman Fair and Impartial?

According to the renowned Catholic layman, Professor Stephen Love, who as the Chairman of the Grievance Committee—Chicago Bar Assn., and Chairman of Character and Fitness Com. of Illinois Supreme Court, said, in speaking to Harvard Law students, "There were *over 100 instances* when the presiding Judge . . . interjected himself into the proceedings, and even helped out a government witness and made small of a defense witness. Judge Kaufman was not clarifying things. He was, I could say, putting things in the witness' mouth."

When the jury commenced deliberations and requested "the testimony of Ruth Greenglass" — Judge Kaufman arbitrarily refused to include in this request the cross-examination of the Defense but had read to them only the Prosecution's version of her testimony.

DOUBT No. 8: Was the Charge Actually Treason?

The U. S. Constitution expressly protects all Americans from wild charges of "treason" by requiring 2 independent witnesses. The Prosecution did not even have ONE honest independent witness, therefore resorted to the loose device of charging the Rosenbergs, not with treason, not with espionage — but with only *conspiracy to commit espionage*.

This is a far cry from the criminally irresponsible charges of "Traitorous Americans" and "Treasonable Acts" by the prosecution. (P. 183-184. Rosenberg transcript.)

Although the Espionage Statute includes the important phrase: "to the injury of the U.S." — this portion of the statute was completely omitted from the indictment against the Rosenbergs.

Despite these facts virtually the entire press, the Prosecution and even high public officials have cultivated the deception in the minds of the American public—the damning idea that the Rosenbergs had been tried and convicted for Treason!

The composer, Juan Luka Bulegovic, sent copies of the songs to the Rosenbergs accompanied by a letter, which said in part:

"My heart is joined with your hearts that fight for goodness and human lives.

"Music is a universal language that attempts to unite men, signifies friendship and solidarity. It is aesthetic and expresses love. Always it battles against the vices that would convert honor among men.

"The ties that bind us, although we have never met, show that men of all opinions join in justice."

CUBAN UNIONS, ARGENTINE NOTABLES

URGE ROSENBERG CLEMENCY

NEW YORK, N.Y., APRIL 8 -- Leading trade unions of Cuba and prominent individuals and organizations in Argentina have urged President Eisenhower to grant clemency to Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, it was learned today by the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case.

Cablegrams were sent to the President by Cuba's Union of Textile Workers; Union of Weavers; Metal Workers Union; Barbers Union; Auto Workers; Laundry Workers; Furniture Workers; Hospital Workers; Liquor Workers; Transport Workers; Telephone Workers; and Graphic Arts Workers.

An appeal to Eisenhower was also sent by the Havana section of the Democratic Federation of Women.

In Argentina, those sending cables, messages and petitions to President Eisenhower included: the Argentinian Organization of Women; the Argentinian League for the Rights of Man; Jose Marial, dramatic critic, playwright and leader of the Independent Theater Movement; Horacio Klapencach, poet; Roberto Canda, journalist of the Institute of Economics; Maria Rosa Oliver, writer; Dr. Benson Drucaroff, scientist; and Augustin Cuzzani, attorney.

The Young Intellectuals of the Argentinian

House of Culture sent the following telegram to Eisenhower:

"We reject the injustice against the Rosenbergs. We believe that such an extreme penalty is contrary to the fundamental rights of man. The lack of evidence in the Rosenberg case moves us to repudiate most strongly this horrible sentence and we express our warmest solidarity with the victims."

On 3/22/53, [REDACTED] turned over to SA FRANCIS X. JAHN an envelope post-marked Washington, D.C. 3/14/53. The same contained a "Clemency News Letter", which is in printed form on yellow paper and issued by the Washington Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, 920 F St., N.W., Room 519, 3/12/53. This "News Letter" comments on the granting of a stay of execution by the Court of Appeals, and quotes part of the opinion of Judge LEONARD HAND and Judge JEROME FRANK. It also comments on the interest of Attorney JOHN FINERTY, a member of the American Civil Liberties Union, who has been associated years ago with the Sacco-Vanzetti and Mooney cases, and who has now decided to enter into the defense of the ROSENBERGS.

The "News Letter" points out that help is needed to insure new trial and urges the recipient to: (1) write to President EISENHOWER, urging reconsideration of the clemency issue; (2) Write to Attorney General BROWNELL, urging the Justice Department not to oppose the petition to the Supreme Court; (3) Sign and get others to sign the enclosed copy of the Amicus Brief to the Supreme Court - hundreds of thousands of signatures must be collected quickly; (4) Return the completed Amicus Brief to Room 519, 930 F St., N.W.

The "News Letter" then under the caption "More Legal Opinions", makes reference to a statement by Dr. ZACHARIAH CHAFFEE, Professor of Constitutional Law at Harvard University, as having said in a lecture "There is some doubt of their guilt. They should live...."

It is also stated that on 2/6/53 in a letter to the President from Honorable JAMES WOLFE, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Utah, Judge WOLFE said in part - "From the standpoint of justice, I think the conviction rests on too shaky a foundation".

Under the topic heading "Mystery of the French Rabbis Appeal", it is stated that the French ROSENBERG Committee reported that the Rabbinate of France appealed to President TRUMAN as far back as January 2 to grant clemency on religious and humane grounds. They never received an acknowledgment. When a delegation from the National Rosenberg Committee questioned Justice Department officials about this, they were told "It would take too long to discover whether the Department had ever received the appeal"

NEW YORK, N.Y.— Swedish artists, trade union leaders and women's organizations have sent delegations to the U. S. Embassy in Stockholm to demand clemency for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, it was learned today by the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case.

One delegation consisted of 73 of the nation's leading artists. Another group of 37 trade union officials visited the Embassy. Protests against the death sentence were also voiced to American representatives by a delegation from Swedish women's organizations.

"There has seldom been such a great campaign for individual personalities in this country," according to Dr. John Takman, one of the leaders in the Rosenberg clemency movement in Sweden.

"In all of Sweden meetings are being held. The Rosenberg case has become the concern of the rank and file of especially the trade unions, the workers' organizations and the women's clubs. Protests are voted, telegrams are sent, individual aerograms are written, and deputations to the Embassy are elected."

On March 15th a public meeting was held in Stockholm with the Rev. Sven Hector, chairman of the Swedish Rosenberg Committee, as one of the speakers.

In cities throughout the country men and women are going through their neighborhoods getting people to send appeals to President Eisenhower.

On 3/27/53 the Philadelphia Branch of captioned organization held a meeting at the Essex Hotel, Philadelphia, Pa. Speaker for the event was one AARON SCHNEIDER who was introduced as the National Executive Secretary of the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case. SCHNEIDER, in his speech, described a dinner recently held by captioned organization in New York City, and discussed at some length the various speeches made at this dinner. SCHNEIDER described the affair in New York City as successful.

SCHNEIDER stated that the Rosenberg Committee was planning to hold an affair at Triborough Stadium in New York City, at which time 24,000 persons are expected to be present. He advised other affairs are planned to raise money, as money running into six figures was needed to pay for private investigations being conducted to uncover new information in the case. SCHNEIDER did not further describe this new information. SCHNEIDER stated in his speech that he travelled all around the country, and the national response of this liberal movement is very good. He described the two best cities as Chicago and San Francisco. The informant advised he understood SCHNEIDER to state that San Francisco had 250 local groups of captioned organization. The informant was unable to further explain this statement by SCHNEIDER.

In connection with literature, SCHNEIDER stated the collected letters of the ROSENBERGS will be put on sale shortly with the proceeds to go to the ROSENBERG children; also a trial record will be published and sold for \$10.00, and further that another book concerning the ROSENBERGS was to be published shortly.

CUBAN UNIONS, ARGENTINE NOTABLES

URGE ROSENBERG CLEMENCY

NEW YORK, N.Y., APRIL 6 -- Leading trade unions of Cuba and prominent individuals and organizations in Argentina have urged President Eisenhower to grant clemency to Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, it was learned today by the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case.

Cablegrams were sent to the President by Cuba's Union of Textile Workers; Union of Weavers; Metal Workers Union; Barbers Union; Auto Workers; Laundry Workers; Furniture Workers; Hospital Workers; Liquor Workers; Transport Workers; Telephone Workers; and Graphic Arts Workers.

An appeal to Eisenhower was also sent by the Havana section of the Democratic Federation of Women.

In Argentina, those sending cables, messages and petitions to President Eisenhower included: the Argentinian Organization of Women; the Argentinian League for the Rights of Man; Jose Marial, dramatic critic, playwright and leader of the Independent Theater Movement; Horacio Klapenoch, poet; Roberto Canda, journalist of the Institute of Economics; Maria Rosa Oliver, writer; Dr. Hanson Drucaroff, scientist; and Augustin Cuzzani, attorney.

The Young Intellectuals of the Argentinian House of Culture sent the following telegram to Eisenhower:

"We reject the injustice against the Rosenbergs. We believe that such an extreme penalty is contrary to the fundamental rights of man. The lack of evidence in the Rosenberg case moves us to repudiate most strongly this horrible sentence and we express our warmest solidarity with the victims."

SUPPORTS ROSENBERG

CHARGE OF PERJURY

NEW YORK, APRIL 15th—Evidence that supports Julius and Ethel Rosenberg's contention about a vital point in their trial and casts additional doubts upon their conviction has become available, the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case announced today.

Investigation of the console table, which the prosecution claimed was an expensive piece of furniture given to the Rosenbergs by the Russians and hollowed out for secret microfilm work, shows conclusively that the table was just an ordinary piece bought on sale at Macy's as the Rosenbergs had testified under oath.

An affidavit obtained from a staff member of R. H. Macy after an examination of photographs of the table states that the markings found on the table are those of Macy's.

The markings, "N N 4046-760-F4-1997" were explained in the affidavit as follows: "N N" means Macy's occasional furniture department.

"4046" is the pattern number assigned by the Brandt Manufacturing Company to the style table in the year 1944.

"760" means the Brandt Manufacturing Company Cabinet Works of Hagerstown, Md. "F4" is a symbol of a Macy season; "F4" was last used as a symbol in the fall season of 1936. The photographs show this symbol could be read either as "F4" or "E4". The latter was last used as a symbol in the early part of 1944. The use of "E4" would be consistent with the manufacturer's pattern number. "1997" is Macy's retail selling price of \$19.97.

During the trial Julius Rosenberg said he bought the table in 1944 or 1945 and paid about \$21 for it. Add the 2% sales tax to the \$19.97 marked on the table and the

total comes to \$20.37. This flatly contradicts the statement of U.S. Attorney General Irving Saypol to the effect that "you couldn't buy a console table in Macy's if they had it, in 1944 and 1945, for less than \$85."

Both David Greenglass, without whose testimony the Rosenbergs could not have been convicted, and Ruth Greenglass, his wife, testified under oath that the Rosenbergs reported getting the table from the Russians.

The Justice Department never offered the table as evidence to support the charges. Photographs of other tables which were admitted by the prosecution never to have been in the Rosenberg home were introduced and the witness was asked to state which one most closely resembled the Rosenberg table.

EXCERPTS FROM AFFIDAVIT OF A STAFF MEMBER OF R. H. MACY

On March 14, 1953, there was submitted to me for observation and examination, certain photographs of a console table, depicting various views of the same and parts of the same. I have marked each of these photographs with my signature; there are a total of six photographs and I have marked them "A" to "F", both inclusive.

I make the following statement voluntarily and based upon what I observed from the said photographs. I am assuming that the photographs and the markings as shown on the console table, are genuine:

(a) The table is a type and style which was handled and sold by Macy's in the furniture and occasional furniture department. It is possible that Macy's handled and sold the particular table shown in these photographs during the years 1944 and 1945.

(b) The markings on the table are not in sufficient detail for me to state that Macy's handled or sold this particular table or this type or style of table during any particular year.

(c) The table would appear to have been manufactured by the Brandt Manufacturing Company and the markings "N N 4046-760-P4-1997" on the under side of the table would indicate the following information:

"N N" means Macy's occasional furniture department

"4046" is the pattern number assigned by Brandt Manufacturing Company to this style in the year 1940

"760" means the Brandt Manufacturing Company Cabinet Works of Hagerstown, Md.

"P4" is a symbol of a Macy season; "P4" was last used as a symbol in the fall season of 1936; however, "E4" was last used as a symbol in the early part of 1944. A view of photographs of "E4" and "P4", which are close-ups, show that the seasonal symbol could be read as either "E4" or "P4". The use of "E4" would be consistent with the manufacturer's pattern number.

"1997" is Macy's retail selling price of \$19.97.

(d) This console table was one of the lower priced tables sold in Macy's furniture department sometime during or subsequent to the year 1944, if the symbol "E4" is correct.

At that time, Circuit Court Justice Jerome N. Frank, declared: "There are substantial questions of law. I would not want to preclude their right to appeal to the Supreme Court. I would not want that on my conscience."

NEW YORK, N.Y., APRIL 19th--A nation-wide

survey made this week indicates that the Randall's Island Rosenberg Rally next SUNDAY afternoon, April 26, will usher in a period of intensive clemency activity throughout the country.

The rally, sponsored by the New York Committee for Clemency for the Rosenbergs, will feature among the speakers, Prof. Stephan Love, noted legal authority of Chicago, Ill., in addition to a dramatic presentation entitled "The Rosenberg Story".

The survey, conducted by the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, showed a heightened public interest in the case as a result of local committees having brought to their communities newly uncovered evidence of perjury and fraud in the Rosenberg trial.

The campaign for clemency in the Los Angeles area was found to be one of the strongest in the country. For example, in the past few weeks the number of chain letters being circulated to ask signatures for clemency reached 85,000.

The Los Angeles Rosenberg activities also include formation of some 157 committees in surrounding towns and cities, tables in a number of union halls at which signatures are being solicited for the friend-of-the-court brief, as well as independent Rosenberg committees of students.

The hundreds of Rosenberg groups formed throughout the country have been bolstered by ten new committees in the last few weeks in the West, the Mid-West, and North East, bringing the number of city-wide Rosenberg committees to more than 40.

One of the groups--in South Bend, Indiana--was organized after a letter was circulated by Circuit Court Judge Norval K. Harris; John T.

Willard B. Ransom, prominent Indiana Negro leader; and Maurice Tulchinsky, a former States Attorney.

In New Jersey organized committees now exist in 13 cities throughout the state. Over 100,000 pieces of literature on the Rosenberg case have been distributed state-wide, while ads urging clemency have appeared in 17 daily and weekly newspapers.

A greater emphasis by the Rosenberg Committee on reaching working people has resulted in the distribution in the past two weeks of over 100,000 leaflets at factory gates. Reports show that the leaflets have been very well received and many requests for more information were made.

Another indication of the growth of the clemency movement has been the demand by attorneys, churchmen, and citizens of all walks of life for the trial transcript of the case.

The first edition of the court record, which sold for \$10 per set was completely sold out. A second edition is now being sold by the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case. Because of the unprecedented large sales, it was possible to reduce the price to \$5.

The desire of millions of Americans for clemency is also reflected in countless "letters to the editor" appearing in daily and weekly newspapers across the country.

A large ad urging clemency appeared this week in the Boston Globe under auspices of the Boston Committee to Secure Clemency in the Rosenberg Case.

A number of committees have also succeeded in getting radio time to bring the facts of the Rosenberg case before the people.

The Clemency Dinner, held recently in New York, has spurred committees in other sections of the country to plan similar dinners in their cities and states.

As you already know, a happy respite has been won for the Rosenbergs. But their devoted and brilliant attorney, Emanuel Bloch, faces a problem which makes it necessary to raise as speedily as possible, through gifts or loans, the sum of \$12,000.

The Rosenbergs are the parents of two little boys. No matter what the fate of their parents -- execution or clemency with incarceration in jail -- these little folks will be economic orphans.

There has been compiled a selection from the many letters exchanged between Ethel and Julius Rosenberg. The manuscript is all ready to go to the printer, but funds are totally lacking. We know that this project will be self-liquidating, once distribution and sale are achieved; the first money accruing will be used to reimburse those who have not found it possible to lend their support with gifts, but with loans.

These matters are not merely moving -- they magnificently reveal the quality of this couple. Regardless of any a priori conclusions reached, no perceptive person could read them without being convinced that it would be a **PSYCHOLOGICAL IMPOSSIBILITY** for two persons of such high quality as these letters reveal, to have been guilty of the crime with which they are charged.

Therefore, the printing and circulation of this correspondence will accomplish three things: it will raise desperately needed funds for the support of two helpless children; it will open the eyes of many people who hitherto have been unmoved or hostile and inspire them to open heart and pocketbook on behalf of these fellow Americans; while for two anxious, devoted parents it will be immeasurable comfort to know that those they love share our concern.

We wait in the dimness of gathering doom. We wait and we hope and we do not lose faith that the sun still shines in the land of our birth -- this sweet land of liberty -- this America. (Ethel)

NEW YORK, N.Y., APRIL 17 -- A couple in Holland have named their new-born daughter after Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, learned today.

Amidst widespread demands for clemency throughout Holland, Mr. and Mrs. Van Haaren of the Hague named their daughter, born on March 6th, "Ethel Julia", combining the names of the couple condemned to death for "conspiracy to commit espionage."

The Hague Committee for the Defense of the Rosenbergs reported that the couple decided upon the name after reading one of the letters that Julius Rosenberg wrote to his wife in the death cell. The letter, written after the last visit of the Rosenberg children to their parents in the Death House at Sing Sing, read in part:

"Oh, dearest, it was wonderful, despite the anxious atmosphere to live together again as one happy family and this is worth any sacrifice for it is true love of family....."

"The boys are making such progress, Michael is doing much better and I am convinced our little baby needs a great deal of help.. I got the feeling there is too much of a burden on their young minds. The sweet memory of the smile, the kiss, the gay laughter and the young voices still pleasures the hours of my loneliness."

The Hague committee reports that delegations have visited Dutch Premier William Drees with demands for clemency from thousands of organizations and outstanding individuals of Holland.

The action of the Hague couple and the visits to Premier Drees were only a few of the many recent expressions for clemency abroad. Many more will be made public at the Rosenberg Clemency Rally to be held in New York at Randall's Island Stadium on Sunday, April 26th, at 2:00 P.M.

NEW YORK, N.Y., APRIL 20th -- More than 20,000

Americans have petitioned the U.S. Supreme Court to order a new trial for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.

The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case announced today that a brief, accompanied by amicus briefs bearing more than 20,000 signatures gathered during the last three weeks, has been submitted to the High Court.

The Committee expects two to three times this number of signatures, but it was felt necessary to submit those already on hand so they would be called to the immediate attention of the Supreme Court, which is now considering the Rosenberg case.

The government, in its reply to the Rosenberg appeal to the High Court, had claimed it was "too late" to grant the Rosenbergs a new trial.

"In support of this petition", the amicus brief argued, "we present the uncertainty and doubt which would afflict millions and would persist for the years to come if Ethel and Julius Rosenberg should go to their deaths on the basis of a legal technicality, when the Court of Appeals of the Second Circuit has expressed the opinion that had defendant's counsel moved for a mistrial during the course of the trial it should or might have been granted."

The brief was submitted by Royal W. France, attorney, signing in behalf of the 20,000 petitioners were Joseph Brainin, chairman of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case; Emily Alman, executive secretary of the New York Clemency Committee; and Dr. Leonard Tushnet of New Jersey.

The accompanying amicus briefs, signed by persons petitioning as friends of the court because they believe an important principle is at stake, declared:

"We believe that the trial of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg and Morton Sobell on a charge of conspiring to commit espionage which resulted in death sentences for the Rosenbergs and a 30 year sentence for their co-defendant, lacked guarantees of fairness which all Americans have a right to expect under the Constitution.

"The U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals has called the Prosecutor's conduct "reprehensible." Justice Jerome N. Frank stated, there are substantial questions of law. I would certainly not want to preclude their appeal to the Supreme Court. - I would not want that to be on my conscience.

"The F.B.I. admitted on December 2, 1952, that an important witness committed perjury under oath. Scientists all over the world call into doubt the scientific value of the alleged evidence and its credibility.

"We believe that transient political and social passions have no place in our courts; and to deprive even one American of the right to a fair trial is to injure the rights of all Americans.

"We therefore authorize the inclusion of our names in an Amicus Brief to the Supreme Court of the United States, petitioning that the verdict be set aside, and that new trial be ordered based on Constitutional guarantees of impartiality and fairness in accordance with the best traditions of American justice."

You will also find it extremely helpful to make full use of the Panel Program as set forth in SAC Letter No. 71-52.

In connection with any of the above-listed organizations which are now defunct, you should immediately advise the Bureau of the identity of these organizations together with the date when they went out of existence.

Einstein and Urey Voice Doubt In Rosenberg Case

N. Y. Times, Jan. 13, 1953

Prof. Albert Einstein, the venerable mathematician who lives in Princeton, N. J., announced that he had written the President Monday asking for mercy. His note said:

"Dear Mr. President:

"My conscience compels me to urge you to commute the death sentence of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg.

"This appeal to you is prompted by the same reasons which were set forth so convincingly by my distinguished colleague, Harold C. Urey, in his letter of Jan. 6, 1953, to THE NEW YORK TIMES.

TO THE EDITOR OF THE NEW YORK TIMES:
After reading the testimony of the Rosenberg case I find that I cannot put to rest my doubts about the verdict and wish to cite the following points:

- (1) Max Elitcher's testimony is of doubtful value. He says that he and Julius talked about espionage but never transferred any information for some five years. This doesn't seem probable to me.
- (2) No certain conspiracy between Sobell and Rosenberg is established.
- (3) The connections to others than Ruth and David Greenglass are not established. Miss Bentley was unable to identify the telephone voice that said, "This is Julius" with the voice of Julius Rosenberg. If "Julius" did not refer to him in this case, it probably did not when Harry Gold said, "I come from Julius" when he met Greenglass in New Mexico. From Gold's testimony it seems that he knew nothing of Rosenberg at all. It seems unbelievable to me that the name of an arch conspirator would be used in such identification phrases.
- (4) No contact between the Rosenbergs and Anatoli A. Yakovlev is established.
- (5) The Government's case rests on the testimony of Ruth and David Greenglass. He had pleaded guilty, but had not been sentenced and hoped for clemency. She has never been charged and tried, obviously it seems as a reward for her testimony. A family feud between the Greenglasses and Rosenbergs existed because of a business altercation. The Rosenbergs' testimony flatly contradicted that of the Greenglasses.

not had the jurors' advantage of hearing and seeing the witnesses. Is it customary for spies to be paid in wrist watches and console tables? Greenglass and Fuchs were paid in cash. The Rosenbergs appear to have been as poor as churchmice and the statement that Julius was spend-\$50 or \$75 a night in night clubs seems to me to be a very doubtful one. Had he done this, he would have been obviously and unaccountably rich to all his associates.

However, even if the verdict is correct, I am amazed at the unequal punishment for the same crime. For the very same conspiracy Ruth Greenglass was never brought to trial, though she admitted her guilt on the witness stand; David Greenglass got fifteen years; Morton Sobell and Harry Gold got thirty years, and Ethel and Julius Rosenberg got death. Only the last two took the witness stand and maintained their innocence. If capital punishment is to be given in the future for espionage I should like to have it introduced in a case for which the evidence rests on the testimony of witnesses who did not stand to profit from their testimony. I do not regard self-confessed criminals as reliable witnesses.

We are engaged in a cold war with the tyrannical Government of the U.S.S.R. We wish to win the approval and loyalty of the good people of the world. Would it not be embarrassing if, after the execution of the Rosenbergs, it could be shown that the United States had executed two innocent people and let a guilty one go completely free? And, remember, somewhere there is a representative of the U.S.S.R. who knows what the facts are.

I strongly urge a careful reconsideration.
