AT NEW YORK CITY, NEW YORK;

A spot surveillance on the National Headquarters of the above captioned organization was instituted by the writer on 10/28/55 at which time the organization was listed in the building directory at 1050 Sixth Avenue (Avenue of the Americas) as having maintaining office space on the Third Floor of the building. A spot check of the third floor failed to indicate that captioned organization had its name listed upon any of the doors on the floor and there was no indication as to the tenant who had furnished the organization the partial use of their office.

A spot surveillance on the National Headquarters of the captioned organization on 11/2/55 reflected that a large sign (hand printed) had been placed beneath the building directory at 1050 Sixth Avenue which sign read as follows: " SOBEL COMMITTEE moved to 940 Broadway Room D (between 22nd and 23rd Streets) Tel: AL 4 9983 " .

A spot check of the building at 940 Broadway, New York City, reflected the following: An office directory which listed the following firms as occupying Room D Second Floor - A) Art Attachment Company, MEYER BRODY, BERNARD KRELL ; B) EMBE Sewing Machine Company MORRIS BRODY ; C) Sobel Committee.

A review of the Indices of the New York Office failed to reflect any references to : Art Attachment Company ; BERNARD KRELL ; and, Embe Sewing Machine Company.

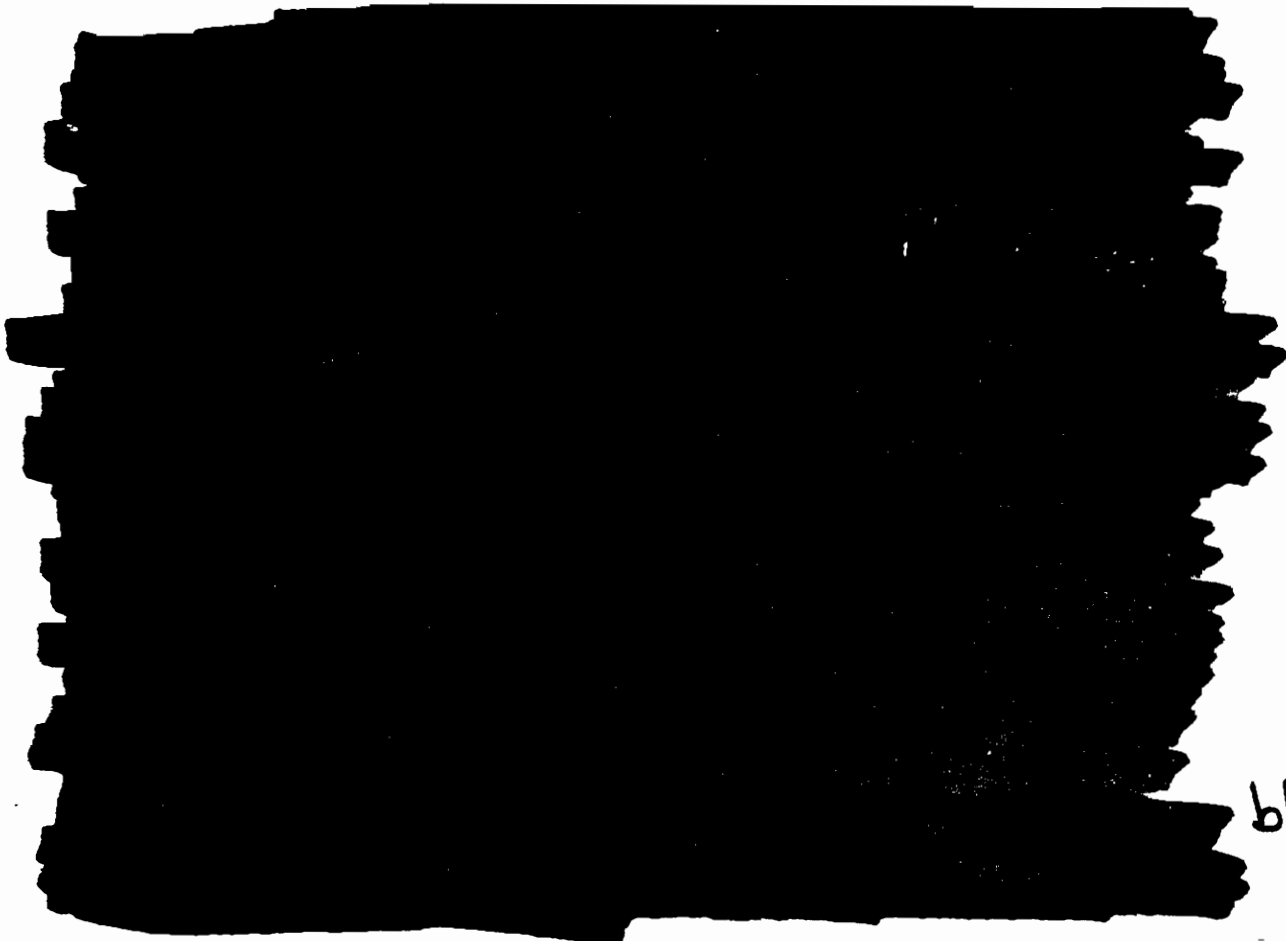

DETAILS

ORIGIN - SCOPE - ACTIVITIES

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York on March 29, 1951, of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. 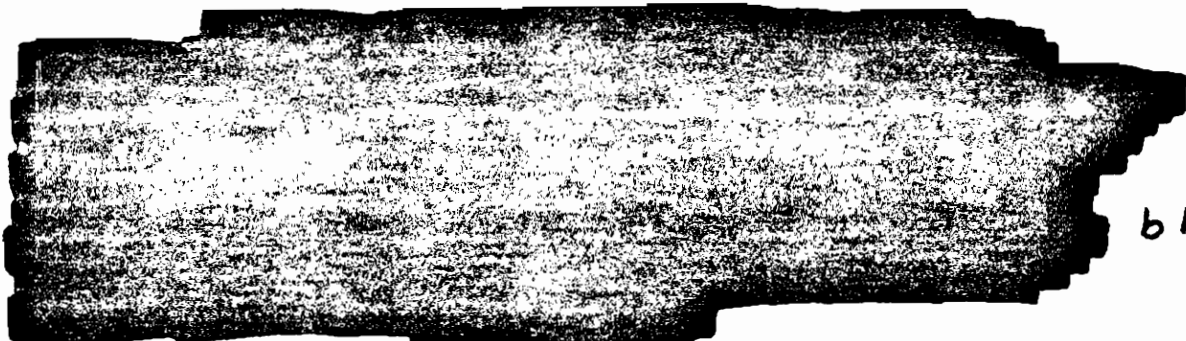

The June 19, 1955, edition of the San Francisco Chronicle, page 23, column 5, contained an advertisement which stated that MORTON SOBELL had been sentenced to 30 years imprisonment on the uncorroborated testimony of an unreliable witness. The article went on "we ask you to join with us to help us secure the transfer of MORTON SOBELL from Alcatraz as a minimum first step, and to work with us for a new trial in the hopeful months ahead." The article further requested the reader to send a letter to JAMES V. BENNETT, Director of Prisons, Washington, D. C., requesting that MORTON SOBELL be transferred to a regular Federal penitentiary pending a new trial.

The following is set forth verbatim as it appeared in the advertisement:

"WAS HE GUILTY? DID HE HAVE A FAIR TRIAL?"

"HAROLD C. UREY, Nobel prize winner: 'The integrity of justice is at stake...If proper trials cannot be secured for unpopular people...then it will become

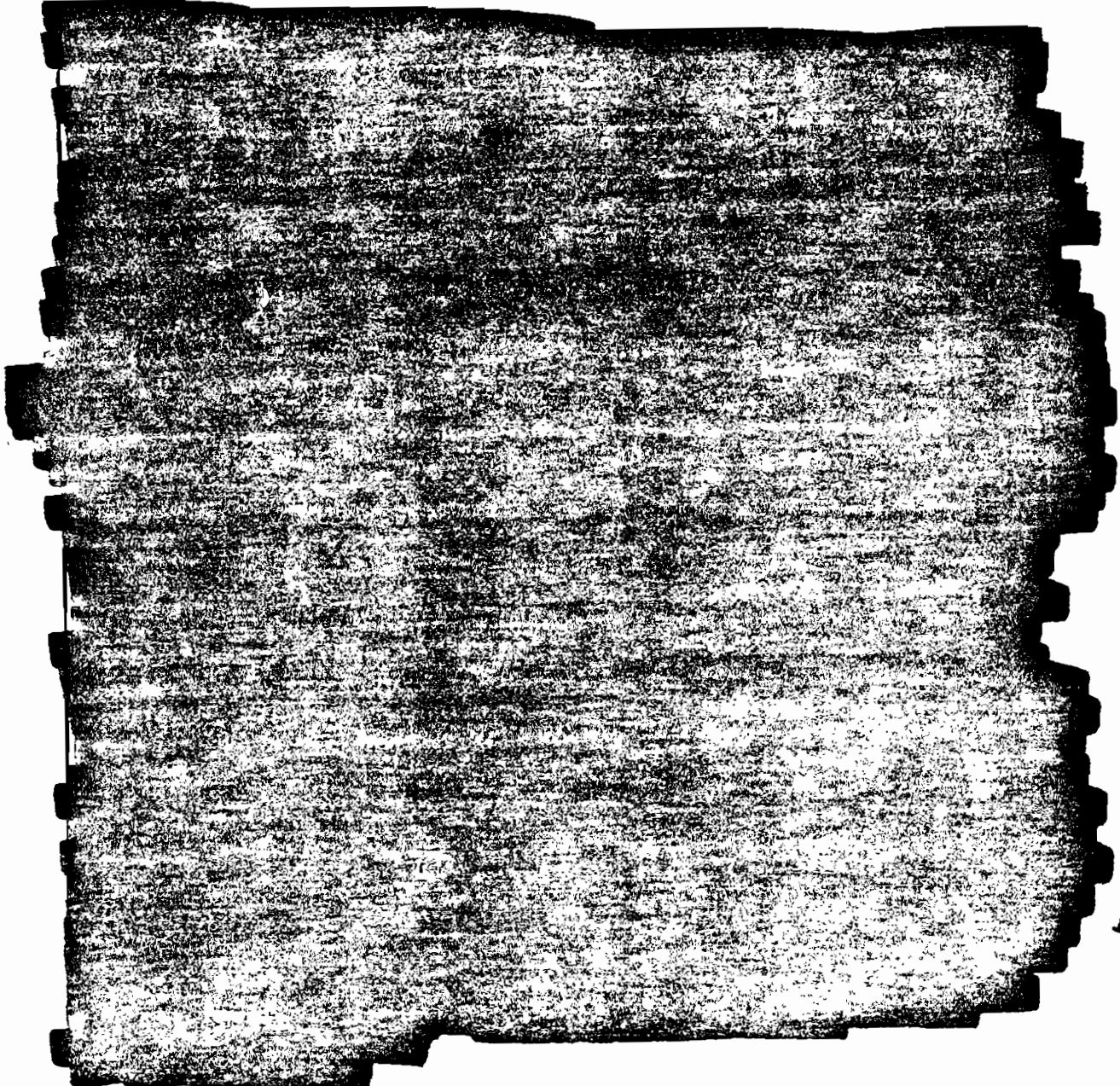

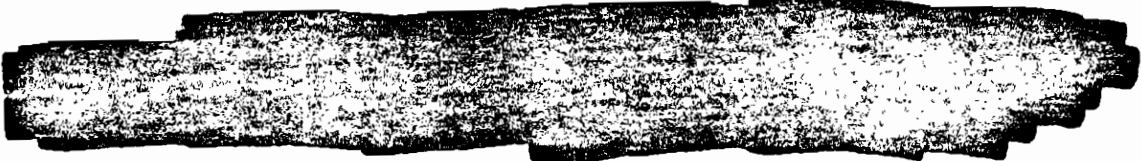

This letter stated that under separate cover a book, "The Judgment Of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg," by JOHN WEXLEY, was being sent to the recipient and that this book uncovers facts about the witnesses in the trial of MORTON SOBELL, which facts, had they been available to the jury during the trial, would have made his conviction impossible. The letter also asked for the recipient's comments as to what can be done for SOBELL and states "we" would be glad to discuss the matter personally at "your" convenience. This letter is signed with the mechanical reproduced signatures of ROSE SOBELL, mother, and HELEN SOBELL, wife of MORTON SOBELL.

On 10/31/55, EVANS received, in the mail at his home, the book described in the preceding paragraph.

EVANS advised he has never had any contact, personal or by correspondence, with any persons or organizations interested in the trial or subsequent clemency appeals of the ROSENBERGS or MORTON SOBELL prior to these communications and had no knowledge as to why the above-described material was sent to him.

EVANS stated that he has, since 1930, been employed by the United States Department of Justice and is currently an Assistant Director in the Bureau of Prisons in charge of fiscal, administrative, and personnel matters. He has also served in the Armed Forces, holds a commission in the U. S. Air Force as a Lieutenant Colonel, Serial Number AO-913751, and is on two weeks' temporary duty at the Pentagon.

He desired that the above information be made a matter of record with the Department of Justice and the Office of Special Investigations, Department of the Air Force, in view of his employment and Air Force commission.

EVANS made available to SA OGREN the letter and book described above, the letter being maintained in WF 100-25754-1A file and the book is being maintained in the Washington Field Office library.

On 11/21/55, Mrs. MARY STEVENS, 2500 Q Street, N.W., Washington, D. C., was interviewed by SA CARROLL M. GARNETT at which time she supplied the following information: Mrs. STEVENS had previously telephonically contacted the Washington Field Office.

Mrs. STEVENS stated that on 11/10/55, she received, through the mail at her home, a book entitled "Judgment of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg," by JOHN WEXLEY, which had been mailed from Room D, 940 Broadway, New York City. She stated that a few days prior to the receipt of this book she had received, also through the mail, a form letter from New York City relative to the release of MORTON SOBELL from Alcatraz and indicating that the above-described book was being sent to her gratis.

Mrs. STEVENS advised that she has an unlisted telephone number in Washington, D. C., and wondered how her address was obtained. She stated that presumably she had been selected as the recipient of this material because of her husband's former position on President EISENHOWER's staff. She stated she destroyed the previously-referred-to material.

Mrs. STEVENS advised that she and her husband, THOMAS E. 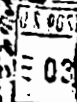

Bureau instructions direct that the office covering the residence of the witness should thoroughly review the transcripts immediately upon receipt and advise the Bureau of the identities of each person mentioned as having been active in CP affairs. Such data should be submitted under the caption of the various individuals identified as Communists.

The memo must contain a statement as to whether or not the individual has been the subject of Bureau investigation and what action is being taken on any information. In those cases where an investigation has been conducted, you should advise the Bureau whether the individual is a Security Index subject.

In those instances where an individual has been investigated by the Bureau and new information obtained in hearings does not warrant additional investigation, you should consider requesting authority for interview. Further, you should submit your recommendation regarding interviews of any "friendly witnesses".

In those instances where a person testifies about an individual who does not reside within the office covering the residence of the witness, it is a responsibility of that office to advise the appropriate office of the nature of the testimony and of Bureau instructions.

For your information and guidance, upon receipt of transcripts of testimony from the Washington Field Office, you are directed to advise the Bureau of the status of your review within one week after receipt of the individual transcript. Thereafter, you will be required to submit weekly letters advising of the status of your review until the project is completed and the necessary action has been taken in accordance with Bureau instructions.

In those instances where you are unable to readily determine the present residence of the person identified as a Communist from a review of your files, you may desire to request a review of Bureau files or an interview with the "friendly witness" for additional data to assist you.

Your final letter advising of the completion of your review should contain a statement regarding the number of witnesses testifying, the number of persons identified as Communists, the fact that the Bureau has been advised under the caption of each individual's name and the information furnished by the "friendly witnesses, that recommendations have been forwarded to the Bureau

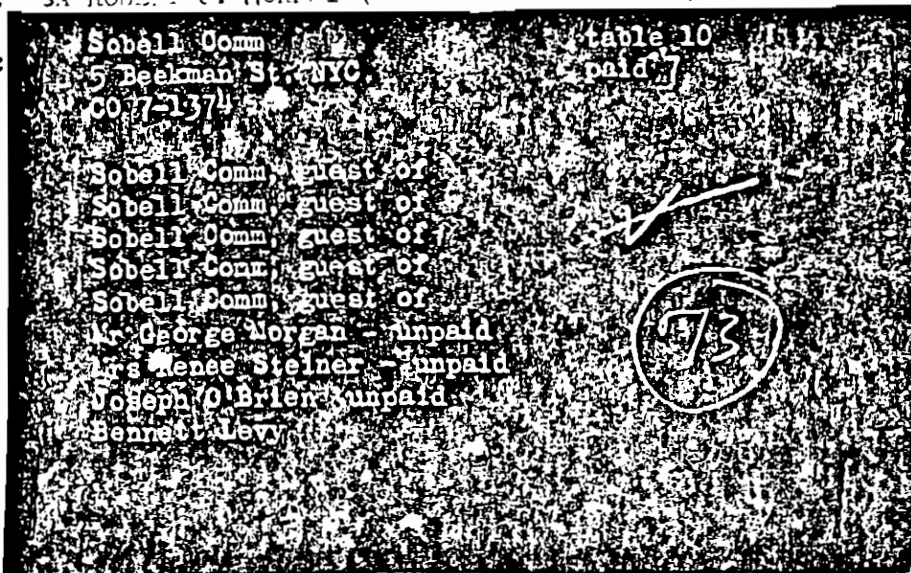

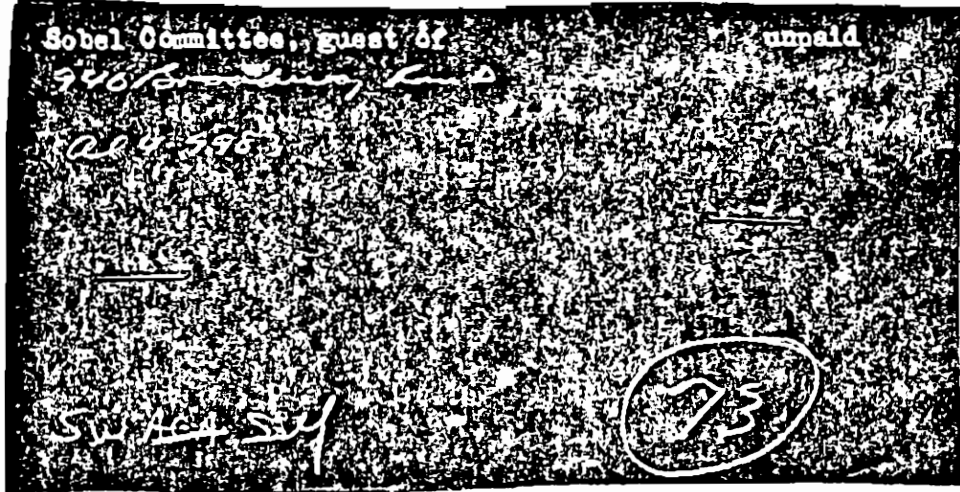

GEORGE, according to the Informant, discussed the plight of the strikers and made an appeal for food, clothing and money for the strikers.

As a result of the appeal, a collection of \$78.45 was made and this money turned over to GEORGE.

The Bureau's attention is directed to a comment made by GEORGE regarding the U.S. Attorney General HERBERT BROWNELL. GEORGE stated BROWNELL was a Westinghouse lawyer and, therefore, the union did not stand much chance of winning the strike from the company.

According to the Informant, a leaflet issued by the MARTHA STONE DEFENSE COMMITTEE, of 516 Clinton Ave., Newark, was distributed at the meeting. 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I. ORGANIZATION

A. BACKGROUND OF THE NATIONAL COMMITTEE  
TO SECURE JUSTICE IN THE ROSENBERG  
CASE (NCSJRC)

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL were convicted in the U. S. District Court, Southern District of New York, on March 29, 1951 of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. The ROSENBERGS were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951, and MORTON SOBELL to thirty years imprisonment on the same date. JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were legally executed at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953, and MORTON SOBELL is currently serving his sentence at the U. S. Penitentiary, Alcatraz, California.

[REDACTED] advised in January, 1952 that the NCSJRC was formed on January 2, 1952 for the purpose of obtaining a new trial for the ROSENBERGS. b7D

Confidential Informant T-1, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on June 7, 1954 that the NCSJRC was attempting to keep alive the ROSENBERG case and fight for the release of MORTON SOBELL. He stated that the Communist Party takes an extremely active part in assisting the Committee.

Confidential Informant T-2, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on June 15, 1954 that the Communist Party directs the activities of the NCSJRC. On June 30, 1955, T-2 advised that the NCSJRC continues to maintain a national office at 1050 Sixth Avenue, New York City, and continues to be fairly active in major cities throughout the United States. According to T-2, the Committee objectives are to free SOBELL and to continue protesting the innocence of the ROSENBERGS.

Confidential Informant T-1, on August 4, 1955, advised that the Communist Party continued active interest in the NCSJRC and was attempting to secure the transfer of MORTON SOBELL from the U. S. Penitentiary, Alcatraz, California, to the East Coast.

B. BACKGROUND OF PHILADELPHIA COMMITTEE  
TO SECURE JUSTICE IN THE ROSENBERG  
CASE (PCSJRC)

On January 23, 1953, Mr. LEO BUSCH, secretary to the Commissioner of Police, Philadelphia Police Department, made available to SA WILLIAM G. CURRALL a photostat of a notification of a meeting which was dated October 10, 1952. This notification was on the stationery of the "Committee to Secure Justice in the ROSENBERG Case" and advised that a meeting was to be held on October 14, 1952 at Town Hall, Philadelphia, under the auspices of the PCSJRC.

On April 14, 1953, Mrs. TELETHA LONG, supervisor, Division of Solicitations, Department of Public Instruction, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, 812 Blackstone Building, Harrisburg, Pa., advised SA MORGAN L. MIDTHUN that by letter dated February 17, 1953, JEAN D. FRANTJIS, as Executive Secretary of the PCSJRC, Post Office Box 805, Philadelphia, had advised her division of the Department of Public Instruction that the Committee in Philadelphia was an affiliate of the NCSJRC, 1050 Sixth Avenue, New York City.

On August 11, 1955, Mr. WILLIAM L. RAFSKY, Housing Coordinator, City of Philadelphia, who resides at the Carl Mackley Apartments "M" and Bristol Streets, Philadelphia, furnished the Philadelphia Office by mail a mimeographed leaflet dated August 1, 1955, which bore the typewritten signature of the Philadelphia Sobell Committee. This leaflet indicated that the PCSJRC was now being called the Philadelphia SOBELL Committee.

Confidential Informant T-4, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on April 10, 1951 that JEAN D. FRANTJIS was a member of the Communist Party, Eastern Pennsylvania and Delaware (CP EPD) as of that date.

C. HEADQUARTERS

Confidential Informant T-3, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on August 2, 1955 that as of that date the Philadelphia Sobell Committee continued to utilize Room 30, 932 Chestnut Street, Philadelphia, as a local headquarters.

The leaflet dated August 1, 1955 issued by the Philadelphia Sobell Committee, previously mentioned, indicates that the Philadelphia Sobell Committee continues to utilize Post Office Box 805,

Philadelphia 5, Pa. as a return address.

On January 12, 1956, the premises located at 932 Chestnut Street, Philadelphia, were observed by SA MARION B. HUMMEL. It was noted that Room 30 at this address bore no notation to the effect that it was occupied by the Philadelphia Sobell Committee; however, the address directory located at the entrance to the building indicated that Room 30 was occupied by JEAN D. FRANTJIS.

D. OFFICERS

The pamphlet issued by the Philadelphia Sobell Committee which was furnished by Mr. WILLIAM L. RAFSKY, previously mentioned, on August 11, 1955, states "JEAN D. FRANTJIS, the former Executive Secretary of the Philadelphia Committee to Secure Justice in the ROSENBERG Case, now holds the same position for the Philadelphia Sobell Committee."

No information has been received which reflects that there are any additional officers of the Philadelphia Sobell Committee.

II. GENERAL ACTIVITIES

[REDACTED], Confidential Informant T-3 advised that [REDACTED] letters were mailed by the Philadelphia Sobell Committee in the Philadelphia area. These letters contained a mimeographed leaflet entitled "In Memory of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG - Removal from Alcatraz - A New Trial for MORTON SOBELL." This leaflet stated that June 19 was the second anniversary of the death of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG and that while the death of the ROSENBERGS, in itself, was final, the fight for justice continues for the third defendant in the case, MORTON SOBELL. It urges that people in Philadelphia should appeal to JAMES BENNETT, Director of Prisons, Washington, D. C., for the transfer of SOBELL from Alcatraz. The leaflet also announces that the book "The Judgment of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG" by JOHN WEXLEY is now on sale, and urges that at least 500 copies of this book be sold in Philadelphia and vicinity. It states that this book may be ordered through the Philadelphia Sobell Committee, Post Office Box 805, Philadelphia, Pa., and that the price is \$6.00, plus twenty-five cents postage. The letters

also contained a throwaway on the book "The Judgment of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG" which purports to be a book review of this book. This throwaway was issued by the "SOBELL Committee," Room 2, 1050 Sixth Avenue, New York City.


On June 28, 1955, Confidential Informant T-5, who has furnished reliable information in the past, also made available the contents of one of the above-mentioned letters.

On September 11, 1953, JUDITH RAYMOND, Los Angeles, California, testified under oath before the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA) in executive session. In her testimony, which was subsequently released by the Committee, Miss RAYMOND stated that she had been a member of the Communist Party from the late Spring of 1945 until 1949. She testified that in January 1946, she was transferred within the Communist Party to a group composed mostly of writers and of which she was the Treasurer and Financial Director. One of the members of this group whom she identified as a Communist Party member was JOHN WEXLEY.

The June 17, 1955 issue of the "Pennsylvania Edition of The Worker," on page 16, column 4, contained an article captioned "Committee Seeks Removal of SOBELL from Alcatraz." This article stated that the local SOBELL Committee was preparing material detailing recent developments "in the expose of the frame-ups" in the ROSENBERG case and the SOBELL case. Readers were asked to urge Director of Federal Prisons JAMES V. BENNETT to have SOBELL transferred from Alcatraz to some other Federal prison. The article also stated that the local Committee had undertaken to sell 500 copies of the book by JOHN WEXLEY entitled "The Judgment of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG." This article pointed out that "The National SOBELL Committee" was responsible for the publication of this book.

"The Worker" is the Sunday edition of the "Daily Worker," an East Coast, Communist newspaper.

On August 2, 1955, Confidential Informant T-3 advised that



On August 11, 1955, Mr. WILLIAM L. RAFSKY, previously mentioned, made available by mail a mimeographed leaflet dated Aug. 1, 1955 which was issued by the Philadelphia SOBELL Committee. This leaflet noted that on July 27 JEAN D. FRANTJIS, the former Executive Secretary of the Philadelphia Committee to Secure Justice in the ROSENBERG Case, who now holds the same position for the Philadelphia SOBELL Committee, had received a subpoena to appear before the "House Un-American Activities Committee" in Washington on August 3. In part, this leaflet states as follows:

" . . . . Those of us who have interested ourselves in the ROSENBERG-SOBELL case have asked: 'Why this investigation now instead of two years ago when tempers in Congress were so hot that a move was on even to impeach Supreme Court Justice DOUGLAS for granting a stay of execution?' We believe the following facts answer that question:

"1. Publication within the past month of a detailed study of the case by author-dramatist JOHN WEXLEY, called The Judgement of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. This book, which promises a wide circulation and heightened interest in the ROSENBERG-SOBELL Case, discloses some hitherto unknown contradictions and perjuries in the testimony of prosecution witnesses.

"2. The completed discrediting of HARRY GOLD, the 'connecting link' in the ROSENBERG Case, by a jury in Dayton, Ohio on June 18th in the little known SMILG case. The jury, in effect, found that this key ROSENBERG witness was a perjurer.

"3. The intensification of efforts to secure a new trial for SOBELL in the Fall.

"4. The awareness, growing out of the LAMB case and out of admissions by HARVEY MATUSOW and other professional informers, that there has been collusion between unscrupulous government prosecutors and certain witnesses in fabricating testimony. (ROY COHN was assistant prosecutor in the ROSENBERG Case)

"The Nation magazine, in an editorial on July 23rd, charged that the Attorney General currently is attempting:

"(a) to defend against subsequent reversal or other legal modification the various convictions it has obtained in the courts, as well as the findings and orders of administrative agencies, against political dissenters based on the use of professional witnesses and political informers of highly dubious character and veracity. The department has an enormous vested interest in maintaining these convictions and findings.

"(b) to safeguard the system of political informers which has been built up in recent years and which now shows every sign of early disintegration of their veracity as witnesses.

"There is reason to believe the House Un-American Activities Committee is adopting the same technique in respect to the ROSENBERG-SOBELL Case.

"The effort to secure clemency of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG and the present effort to secure a new trial for their co-defendant MORTON SOBELL was beyond doubt the greatest single redress in movement in modern history. Millions of Americans including 2500 Protestant ministers, rabbis such as ABBA HILLEL SILVER, scientists and jurists of the caliber of ALBERT EINSTEIN, Dr. HAROLD C. UREY and Chief Justice JAMES WOLFE of the Utah Supreme Court -- joined hundreds of millions abroad led by Pope Pius XII in pleading that the lives of these two parents be spared. We, in Phila. played an important role in this campaign.

"Inevitably involved in any such investigation by the House Committee is the principle of freedom of speech and association - a principle subscribed to overwhelmingly by the American people regardless of their diverse opinions on any particular issue itself. Because the effort to secure clemency was the largest and most important movement of our times, every attack on it directly affects the rights of millions of Americans to ask for a redress of grievances.

"We believe an investigation of the facts in the ROSENBERG-SOBELL Case is indispensable to a just and humane adjudication of this case. We will bend every effort in the current Un-American Activities Committee hearings to discuss and debate publicly the facts in the case.

"As the Nobel Prize winner, Dr. HAROLD UREY stated it: 'The integrity of Justice as administered in the United States is at stake.'

"As you have done in the past, we are sure you will want to act in this present situation. We, therefore, suggest the following:

"1. Write to Congressman FRANCIS E. WALTER, Chairman of the House Un-American Activities Committee, Washington, D.C., respecting the rights of those who sought review of the ROSENBERG-SOBELL Case to hold their opinions and to act on them. Request an end to such type of witch-hunts and for an honest investigation into the ROSENBERG-SOBELL Case.

"2. Write to the newspapers - including all such newspapers in communities wherein you live.

"3. We urge you to read the WEXLEY book immediately and get it into the hands of many other people. Same may be ordered from the Committee. The price is \$6.00 plus 25¢ postage.

"4. You may help further in this urgent moment by sending any contribution to continue the efforts to secure justice which is long overdue.

### III. MISCELLANEOUS

On August 2, 3, and 4, 1955, the Subcommittee of the House Committee on Un-American Activities held public hearings on the Communist activities of The Committee to Secure Justice in the ROSENBERG Case and affiliates.

On August 3, 1955, HERMAN E. THOMAS, Allentown, Pa., testified that he had been a member of the Communist Party from April 1944 until May 6, 1954, during which period he furnished information to the FBI. Testimony given by THOMAS appears on pages 2101 through 2115 and on page 2124 of the HCUA publication "Investigation of Communist Activities (The Committee to Secure Justice in the ROSENBERG Case and affiliates) Part I," printed by the U. S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C., 1955. This testimony is summarized as follows:

THOMAS testified that in the latter part of 1952, a meeting was held at the home of SYLVIA FREEDLAND, Allentown, Pa. At this meeting, which was attended by approximately twelve or fourteen people, of whom THOMAS knew all but three or four to be Communist Party members, a committee was formed to secure justice for the ROSENBERGS, inasmuch as it would disseminate literature, raise money send telegrams, and be responsible for that kind of work. Prior to this meeting, literature pertaining to the ROSENBERGS was obtained from District Communist Party Headquarters in Philadelphia and was distributed through the Communist Party Clubs in the Lehigh Valley Section, CP EPD. Some of this material was put out by the NCSJRC and the Communist Party in Allentown undertook the responsibility of dissemination of this material. There were no actual officers of the group in Allentown. THOMAS identified as members of the Communist Party who actively participated in the work of the

ROSENBERG Committee in Allentown: IRVING RISKIN, ADELAIDE RISKIN, HARRIET KAROL, SYLVIA FREEDLAND, and THOMAS, himself. TED NORTON, whom THOMAS identified as a Communist Party member, was actively engaged in the same work in Easton, Pa. It is to be noted that THOMAS' testimony pertains to the latter part of 1952.

In addition to HERMAN E. THOMAS, Mrs. SYLVIA FREEDLAND, Allentown, Pa.; Mrs. ADELAIDE RISKIN, Allentown, Pa.; THEODORE E. NORTON, Easton, Pa.; and JEAN D. FRANTJIS, Philadelphia, Pa., were subpoenaed to testify before this hearing. These individuals furnished testimony regarding their own background data; however, they refused to testify concerning Communist Party membership or their connection with the NCSJRC.

The following Confidential Informants, all of whom have furnished reliable information in the past and all of whom have had connections with the PCSJRC and the Philadelphia SOBELL Committee, were contacted on the dates indicated concerning any current activity on the part of the Philadelphia SOBELL Committee. In each instance, the informant advised that, to his knowledge, the Philadelphia SOBELL Committee had not engaged in any local activities subsequent to August 1955. -

But for a layman, it is hard to avoid the feeling that there was something fishy about some of the evidence. "'disbelieve them,' the jury was told in effect, ' you must acquit the accused.'

"After reading Mr. Wexley's 672 pages of analysis and quotation--even if one rejects his special pleading--one is compelled to 'disbelieve' at least some of the evidence on which the defendants were convicted and executed. One can only echo the comment of newsmen Elmer Davis on this book, 'Assuming that the record is here correctly cited (and I have no reason to suppose that it is not) I cannot believe the testimony of Elitcher and the Greenglasses or much, if any, of that of Harry Gold.

"The Rosenbergs are beyond the power of justice, but their alleged accomplice, Morton Sobell is in Alcatraz, serving a 30-year-term. An investigation and a re-trial would seem warranted on the basis of Mr. Wexley's disclosures. A.F."

This building is occupied by the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born, Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, and Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade, all of which have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450. In addition, other Communist Party front groups and individual CP members or sympathizers occupy offices at this address. Prior to 2/1/53 the State and National Offices of the Civil Rights Congress, which has been designated by the Attorney General of the US pursuant to Executive Order 10450 were located at this address. Subsequent to that date space in the building has been occupied by SMT Publications, Inc., publishers of "New World Review" formerly known as "Soviet Russia Today" which has been cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, 6/25/42 and 3/29/44.

Strict care must be exercised so that the existence of this important source of evidence will not become known to any outside agency. It is also to be noted that because of the nature of this source of information it will be impossible to recontact the source regarding information furnished.

# The Sobell Case

So much has been happening that we are starting the New Year with this newsletter to keep you informed on the highlights. If important activities of some committees are omitted, it is only because there is not enough space to report everything. What kind of year will 1956 be? The tremendous upsurge of activity described below provides the answer. We can make 1956 the year of justice for Morton Sobell and for America.

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**LEGAL MOTION**--Attorneys are planning to file a motion for a new trial in the coming weeks. The motion will be based on new documentary evidence proving knowing use of perjured testimony by the prosecution.

**INVESTIGATION**--The Sobell case involved co-defendants, "co-conspirators", over a score of witnesses from the U.S. and Mexico in mentioned cities in at least five states and covered some 13 years of the lives of people--to say nothing of the prosecutors, judge, and jury. Despite limited resources, an investigation of the case is being intensified and continues to bear fruit. Some of the results will be revealed for the first time in the forthcoming legal motion.

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**ELIZABETH BENTLEY DISCREDITED**--The loyalty board of the International Penitentiary Fund has cleared William Henry Taylor of accusations made by Elizabeth Bentley. The board reversed its original finding that Taylor was involved in espionage after a brief proving that Bentley lied was submitted. Former Congressman Byron Scott, attorney for Taylor, said the decision was "a strong blow at the credibility" of Bentley. Scott added: "It also raises some sharp questions for Attorney General Brownell and FBI Director Hoover to answer since they have both indorsed her unequivocally." The expose of Bentley has been called to the attention of the Hennings Committee by the national office. This is the second witness of the Rosenberg-Sobell trial to be discredited in six months. In June a Dayton, Ohio, jury refused to believe Harry Gold. The truth about the perjurers is breaking through. This is a timely occasion for stepping up letters to the Hennings Committee.

**FREE DISCUSSION**--The facts in the Sobell case were brought to a campus meeting at the University of Rochester by author Yuri Suhl, who also was interviewed on a leading Rochester radio program. When some criticism of Suhl's appearance was raised, students backed up the right to air the Sobell case. Commented the Campus Times, student newspaper: "Whether or not we agree with Suhl's opinions is of no importance here. Our interest lies in Suhl being able to freely voice these opinions." The paper said: "The students who were there were willing to listen to Suhl's words, to put what he claimed to be the truth to the test of the open market place." Arrange a campus meeting at the university of your city.

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**CANADIANS ON THE MOVE**--Helen Sobell recently made a heartening trip to Canada. In Vancouver--a meeting of 350 people. In Calgary--a press conference, radio interview, and public meeting in Calgary's leading hotel arranged by prominent citizens. In Winnipeg--a luncheon attended by 200 people. In Regina--a meeting sponsored by important government officials in the province of Saskatchewan and chaired by the Deputy Minister of Labor. Afterward, an opposition member of the legislature called for firing the public officials who attended. But Premier T. C. Douglas of Saskatchewan issued a firm statement saying, "There will be no McCarthyism in Saskatchewan as long as I am able to prevent it." He defended Mrs. Sobell's right to ask for a new trial, and the right of Canadian officials to do the same.

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**COMMITTEES ACROSS THE COUNTRY**--The St. Louis Committee has just sent a \$400.-- contribution to the national office. St. Louis has been doing extensive mailings of its own leaflets, using the tape recording of Sen. Langer's speech, and visiting important people. Recently a successful visit was had with a member of Congress...The Los Angeles Committee, which now takes in a large area, has held meetings with John Wexley and Helen Sobell, attended by hundreds of people. The Committee is publishing its own newsletter called the J.A. Sobell Announcer, and is doing its own reprints of material...San Francisco and Los Angeles have set up a liaison group. San Francisco arranged numerous meetings for Helen Sobell on her recent trip, and is seeing leading scientists, labor leaders, attorneys, and other influential people. A very successful rummage sale was held... In Berkeley, Calif., Helen Sobell was interviewed over radio station KPFA. The interview was listed in the station's program--mailed to subscribers under the heading "JUSTICE--Discussion by Helen Sobell on the case of her husband, convicted of 'conspiracy to commit espionage.'"...There is now a Bay Area Committee embracing San Francisco, Berkeley, Oakland, Mill Valley, Sausalito, Palo Alto, Santa Rosa, and Petaluma...

Chicago is planning a large public meeting for February or March. The Committee is doing considerable mailings, including the Brett Halliday review and its own reprints...New York Committees held 20 house parties and luncheons during the holiday season, and are using the new direct mail kit in extensive mailings. The Brooklyn Heights Committee is distributing 100 complimentary copies of the Wexley book to important persons... People in Allentown, Pa., are encouraged by the fact that one of the "friendly witnesses" in the Un-American Committee hearings against the Sobell Committee was singled out by the voters for a resounding defeat. He placed last in an election for school board...New Orleans is distributing the Langer speech and the Halliday review...New activity is beginning in Akron, Dayton, Cincinnati, and on the campus of Antioch and Oberlin colleges. In Ohio, also in New Haven, Boston, Syracuse, Buffalo, Rochester, Bridgeport, and Providence, F.I....New Jersey is doing a mailing to raise funds for the legal appeal...Reports from various Committees, also from Washington, indicate that many letters are going to the Hennings Committee. Considerable mail has also gone to the Classification Board of Alcatraz on transfer and also to William Winter Bennett.

"SOBELL COMMITTEE IN EVERY CITY"--with this slogan in mind, members of the national staff are embarking upon a rigorous schedule of field trips. Dave Alman is to visit Philadelphia, Chicago, and cities in California. Aaron Schneider is visiting Austin, Dallas, New Orleans, Winston-Salem, Atlanta and cities in Florida. Ted Jacobs is going to New Haven, Hartford, and Bridgeport, Conn. Helen Sobell is to tour Florida. ALL OF THESE TRIPS ARE TO TAKE PLACE IN THE NEXT 30 DAYS. They do not include special trips for speaking engagements.

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NEWSPAPER ADS--A large ad on the case was published in the San Francisco Chronicle. Also in papers in Palo Alto and Santa Rosa, Cal. The Chicago Committee is planning an ad in a major Chicago paper...The National Committee on Dec. 24 took the entire back page of the Nation magazine (reprints available). Responses--funds and requests for information--are still coming. One contribution was for \$100...as fast as money is available, ads will be taken in other national publications and major daily newspapers. Start plans for an ad in your area immediately!

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WEXLEY BOOK--Bulletin from the publisher: Some 10,000 copies of "The Judgment of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg" have been circulated, including the Liberty Book Club edition--an auspicious start for a book of this size and price...Judge Patrick H. O'Brien of Detroit has written a letter asking that newspaper editors review the Wexley book. This letter, together with a return Sobell Committee envelope, is being mailed by the national office to the managing editors of every daily newspaper in the U. S. with circulation over 5,000, with an offer of a free review copy (requests are already being received)...Rabbi Robert Goldberg of a leading New Haven, Conn., synagogue, reviewed Wexley's book from the pulpit, as did Rev. Stephen Fritchman of the Unitarian Church in Los Angeles...A minister in Rhode Island read the book and wrote the Committee asking that Mrs. Sobell come and speak... Yuri Suhl presented a copy of the book to the University of Rochester library...A series of articles based on the book appeared with illustrations in Vie Nuova, one of Italy's leading picture magazines.

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NEW BOOK ON CASE--The book by Yalcoln Sharp, professor of Law at the University of Chicago and co-counsel for the Rosenbergs, is soon to be published by Monthly Review Press. The December issue of Monthly Review carries an article by Prof. Sharp titled "New Light on the Rosenberg Case," an analysis of the Reuben and Wexley books.

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REACHING NEW PEOPLE--We sat down to try to figure out the approximate number of people reached with the facts in the past three months and were elated at the statistics. The ad in the San Francisco Chronicle reached some 200,000 people. Add to this the ads in Palo Alto, Santa Rosa, and the Nation. The national office has distributed 150,000 pieces of literature since October, not including the thousands of pieces of material mailed by individual committees and neighborhood groups. Hundreds of thousands of people were reached through the wire service stories on Senator Langer's statements in papers throughout the country, and additional hundreds of thousands in radio newscasts on Langer. It is conservative to say that well over a million people were reached in the last 90 days. This is only the beginning compared to what we can and must do in the coming months...New literature to reach more people is being prepared, including a sizeable new pamphlet on the Sobell case.

INTERNATIONAL ART EXHIBIT--Works of eminent artists will be exhibited and given to contributors at an art show in New York City at the Great Northern Hotel from Feb. 21 - 26 under sponsorship of the New York Committee. Rockwell Kent, noted artist and designer of the jacket for the "exley" book, has written a letter asking American artists to support the project. Many outstanding U. S. artists, as well as artists from abroad, are contributing their work.

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NEWS IN ALCATRAZ--Horton Sobell writes his wife that he has received many of the holiday cards sent from all parts of the United States and the world. Mrs. Sobell found him well on her recent visit and in good spirits because of the work you are doing, and the pending legal moves. To all who sent cards, he extends his thanks and his best wishes in return.

*Funds for Truth*

More Funds! More Work! Our chief limitation is enough money to undertake the projects possible. While funds have been coming in, the total is only a token toward the amounts really needed. We could reach millions of people if we had the funds. There would be a thousand times more to report if money were available for more mailings, meetings, field trips, newspaper ads, radio time, legal investigation etc. Let's get the "funds for truth" and keep it coming to the national office for the campaign.

Concerning the Progressive Party, the National Committee, CP-USA, in issuing its final text of the "Resolutions Growing out of the Presidential Elections" in "Political Affairs", issue of July, 1953, stated in substance that in 1948 the CP helped stimulate the formation of the PP and greatly supported the PP through the 1952 elections. .

Concerning "Political Affairs", mentioned above, ELIZABETH GURLEY FLYNN, convicted CP functionary, testified in the case United States vs. ELIZABETH GURLEY FLYNN et al. on October 20, 1952, stating that "Political Affairs" has been the theoretical organ of the CP since the publication's beginning in 1945.

It may be noted that the CP has been designated by the U.S. Attorney General pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

Source [REDACTED] has advised in 1952 that the PP of Ohio was organized, controlled, and dominated by members of the CP of Ohio.

On April 26, 1955, source advised that on April 16, 1955, a meeting was held at 3085 Lincoln Boulevard, the residence of BERTHA TEMENBAUM, to hear a talk by HELEN SOBELL (wife of MORTON SOBELL). HELEN SOBELL spoke on the arrest of her husband by authorities of Mexico; his subsequently being turned over to the Federal Bureau of Investigation at the Mexican border, and his trial and conviction. The purpose of HELEN SOBELL's visit to Cleveland, according to this source, was to raise money for a new trial for MORTON SOBELL and to launch a fight for his removal from Alcatraz Prison. HELEN SOBELL exhibited newspapers from Italy, France, Sweden, and other countries "condemning" the United States of America for the arrest of SOBELL. Twenty-five persons attended this affair, according to source.

The above activity was corroborated by [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] on April 28, 1955.

On April 28, 1955, source advised that on April 16, 1955, a reception for HELEN SOBELL was held at the home of DON POTTS BERG, 1031 East 125th Street. Approximately 27 persons were present. Around \$100 was collected at this affair and HELEN SOBELL again made a speech on MORTON SOBELL's arrest and conviction.

The above affair was corroborated by [REDACTED] on April 28, 1955.

On [REDACTED] source furnished a copy of a two page typewritten mimeographed unsigned letter dated August 1, 1955, bearing the typed letterhead "Cleveland Sobell Committee,

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"Cleveland, Ohio." The leaflet questioned the reasons for investigations by Congressmen of "those who have interested themselves in the ROSENBERG - SOBELL case" and answered that their (this committee's) belief is that the recent interest of Congress was due to the new book, "The Judgment of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG" by JOHN WEXLER, which discusses hitherto unknown contradictions and perjury in the testimony of prosecution's witnesses; the complete discrediting of HARRY GOLD, "the connecting link" in the ROSENBERG case, by a jury in Dayton, Ohio, on June 18; and "the awareness growing out of admissions" by HARVEY MATUSOFF and other professional informers; that there has been collusion by the unscrupulous Government prosecutors and certain witnesses in fabricating testimony.

The leaflet continued by urging the recipient to write Congressman FRANCIS E. WALTER of the House Committee on Un-American Activities on behalf of those who sought review of the ROSENBERG-SOBELL case by the Senate Judiciary Committee, insisting on their right to form their own opinions without becoming subject to the undemocratic pressures of the HCUA or any other "witchhunting agency"; and to send contributions to the National SOBELL Committee.

On June 15, 1955, Dr. GOLD personally called at the Cleveland Office of the FBI and turned over to SA MICHAEL H. FARIN a one page mimeographed leaflet he received through the mail announcing an affair sponsored by the Cleveland Sobell Committee "On the Second Anniversary of the Death of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG" to be held at Hotel Sterling at East 30th Street, Cleveland, Ohio, on June 18, 1955, at 8:30 PM. The leaflet indicated that guests at the affair would be JOHN WEXLER and AUGUS CAMERON of Cameron and Kahn, publishers of "The Judgment of ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG". The leaflet indicated also that the admission for the affair would be one dollar.

The Cleveland Police Department report of Policewoman CECILIA L. ROGERS dated June 19, 1955, was furnished SE PATRICK J. COLLINS, Jr., on June 21, 1955. This report reflects that on June 18, 1955, the Cleveland Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL sponsored an affair at Hotel Sterling featuring JOHN WEXLER and ANGUS CAMERON as speakers. CAMERON, the first speaker, spoke on the ROSENBERG and SOBELL trials and how WEXLER's new book had been used in a recent hearing at Dayton, which resulted in the acquittal of the defendants. CAMERON then introduced WEXLER, who spoke at length of the ROSENBERG and SOBELL trials and convictions. WEXLER asked those present to fight for the release of MORTON SOBELL. This affair was chaired by BETTA [REDACTED] (observed at two CP meetings in Cleveland in 1949 and 1950, according to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] b 7d  
[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] Cleveland Police Department, and active in numerous front organizations in Cleveland, according to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], who made the collection speech. Approximately \$330.50 was collected and around 64 persons attended the affair.

The above affair was corroborated by [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] b 7d  
on June 23, 1955, and [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] on June 20, 1955.

The June 19, 1955, issue of the "Cleveland Plain Dealer" (daily newspaper published in Cleveland) carried an article entitled, "Writer Declares Spies Vindicated by 'New Evidence'". The article was a report of the meeting sponsored by the Cleveland Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL held at the Hotel Sterling on the evening of June 18, 1955. The article stated that the meeting featured JOHN WEXLER as speaker and that all the "new evidence" is revealed in WEXLER's book, "The Judgment of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG". The article stated also that among those present at this meeting were DAVID and FRIDA KATZ. It is noted that DAVID KATZ was acquitted in January, 1956, by a direct verdict for conspiracy to violate the Smith Act of 1940. FRIDA KATZ, indicted under the same charge as DAVID KATZ, is still on trial in Cleveland for this violation.

On July 7, 1955, this source advised that DON ROTHENBERG handled the sale of tickets in Cleveland to the ROSENBERG-SOBELL meeting held at the Hotel Sterling on June 18, 1955.

II. TESTIMONY OF DON ROTHENBERG AND MILDRED ROTHENBERG BEFORE THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON UN-AMERICAN ACTIVITIES (HCUA)

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On August 9, 1955, Mr. THOMAS BEALE, Chief Clerk, House Committee on Un-American Activities, made available to SA JOSEPH A. CONNORS, Jr., transcripts of public testimony taken by HCUA on August 2-5, 1955.

These transcripts revealed that on August 2, 1955, subject was subpoenaed to testify before a sub-committee of the HCUA, which hearings were conducted to ascertain whether or not organizations established throughout the United States known by various names such as "The Committee to Secure Justice in the ROSENBERG Case", "to Secure Clemency for the ROSENBERGS", and "to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL", are exploited by the Communist Party for ideological purposes as distinguished from humane purposes, and inquiring as to the extent of the CP control or influence in the establishment and operation of such organizations.

ROTHENBERG, under oath, stated to the committee his name, date and place of birth, additional background and that he had lived in Cleveland since May 19, 1948. During this testimony ROTHENBERG, on the bases of the Fifth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States, refused to answer whether he joined the CP during the time he attended George Washington University in 1946-1947; what his present occupation is; and whether or not he is presently State

Director of the Progressive Party of Ohio. when asked if he had any official connection with the Cleveland Committee for Justice in the ROSENBERG Case or a similar committee, ROTHENBERG answered, "I live in Cleveland. I have taken a great personal interest in the ROSENBERG case as has Dr. VREY, His Holiness The Pope, ALBERT EINSTEIN, Chief ARDIVAN of France - - -", but ROTHENBERG invoked the Fifth Amendment when he was again asked if he had any connection with the organization in Cleveland. He also invoked the Fifth Amendment when asked if he attended a convention of the National Organization in the City of Chicago, where he was appointed by the Chairman to a position on the Organization and Finances Committee; when asked if he were an active participant in the National Organization as early as 1953; whether or not he was the Washington representative of the National Organization as stated in the September 18, 1953, issue of the "Daily Worker" (East Coast Communist publication); why the Washington Office expenses of the National Organization were three times the amount given to the ROSENBERG children; how \$3,967.63 was expended for Washington Office expenses; what position ROTHENBERG held with the National Committee during the June 14-19, 1953, ROSENBERG vigil; whether he was in charge of the demonstration or any part of the demonstration; who paid \$57,809 for expenses of the delegates to the vigil; whether he made arrangements for the chartering of fifteen busses to bring people into Washington for the demonstration; whether he personally incurred an expense of \$1,167.75 for the chartering of these buses; who paid for the buses; whether or not the Communist Party had any connection with the vigil; whether ROTHENBERG was connected with any group that raised money for the ROSENBERG defense; whether or not he handled any ROSENBERG funds between 1951 and 1953; whether or not he collected or disbursed any funds; who paid for a transcript of the ROSENBERG trial; whether or not he had any connection with the National Committee for Justice to MORTON SOBELL; whether or not the Communist Party has made any contributions to the National Committee to Secure Justice in the ROSENBERG Case, and finally whether or not he, ROTHENBERG, is now a member of the Communist Party.

These FOIA transcripts also reflect that MILDRED ROTHENBERG, wife of DON ROTHENBERG, was then called to the witness stand at these hearings on August 2, 1955.

MILDRED ROTHENBERG stated that she lives in Cleveland and that her maiden name was CRUM. When asked if she had ever held an official position on the Cleveland Committee for Justice to the ROSENBERGs, she declined to answer on the basis of the privileges of the Fifth Amendment. She was shown an advertisement which appeared in the June 9, 1953, issue of the "Cleveland Plain Dealer", which contained the notation at the bottom of the advertisement, "The advertisement was paid for by popular subscription and sponsored by the Cleveland Committee to Secure Clemency for the ROSENBERGs, Post Office Box 410, Cleveland 21, Ohio, M. S. ROTHENBERG, Executive Secretary". MILDRED ROTHENBERG invoked the Fifth Amendment when asked if the above M. S. ROTHENBERG referred to her. When questioned, she stated that her middle initial is "S".

MILDRED ROTHENBERG was also shown another article from the "Cleveland Plain Dealer" under date of June 14, 1953, entitled "37 En route to Appeal for Spies, Many Left Wingers Board Bus for Washington". In the article was the statement, "Mrs. DON ROTHENBERG, a spokesman for the group, said that the committee had no officers." When questioned if she was correctly reported in stating that the committee had no officers, she declined to answer on the basis of the Fifth Amendment.

On the basis of the Fifth Amendment she also refused to answer if she went to Washington with the group (for the June 14-19, 1953, vigil at the White House). When asked to tell the HCUA Committee whether or not the first meeting in Cleveland held in establishing and promoting the NCSJRC was a joint meeting of the Cleveland Council of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions and the Ohio Committee to Secure Justice for JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, she stated that she had no such recollection. When asked if she were the Executive Secretary of the CCSJRC upon its foundation, she declined to answer on the basis of the Fifth Amendment. MILDRED ROTHENBERG also declined to answer on the basis of the Fifth Amendment when she was asked if she succeeded another person who quit from the latter as Executive Secretary.

When asked if she was a member of the Communist Party at any time during 1953, she invoked the Fifth Amendment. She also invoked the Fifth Amendment when asked if she was presently



a member of the CP and whether or not she had any knowledge of the disposition made for the Cleveland Committee for Justice to the ROSENBERGs of funds raised by that group for the ROSENBERG family.

III. CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE NATIONAL COMMITTEE TO SECURE JUSTICE IN THE ROSENBERG CASE (NCSJRC BY CLEVELAND COMMUNIST PARTY MEMBERS)

This source, who is in a position to furnish reliable information concerning the financial affairs of the CSJRC, advised that this organization received on May 3, 1954, a contribution of \$100 from MILTON D. TENENBAUM of Cleveland, and on June 4, 1954, a contribution of five dollars from SABINA MUNTER of Toledo.

It may be noted that [REDACTED] b2 advised that in 1944 MILTON D. TENENBAUM was a member of the Bath Beach Club of the CP, Sixteenth Assembly District, Kings County, New York.

On June 3, 1953, [REDACTED] b7d advised that SABINA MUNTER was one of the leaders of the CP Underground in Toledo, Ohio.

IV. NCSJRC LITERATURE DISTRIBUTED IN CLEVELAND

On December 3, 1952, source furnished a four page newspaper issued by the Committee to Secure Justice in the ROSENBERG Case, 1050 Sixth Avenue, New York 18, New York. Page one of the newspaper contained large headlines, "ROSENBERGs Must Not Die!". This newspaper contained articles on the nation-wide opposition to the ROSENBERG conviction and asked for contributions to be sent to the NCSJRC, 1050 Sixth Avenue, New York 18, New York.

On December 29, 1952, source furnished a pamphlet published by the NCSJRC, 1050 Sixth Avenue, New York, which was distributed at a CRC meeting in Cleveland. The pamphlet was entitled "The ROSENBERG Case - A Fact Sheet", and contained background data on JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and their trial and conviction. The pamphlet asked the reader to write President TRUMAN and other Government officials asking for a reversal of the ROSENBERG decision. The pamphlet also solicited contributions and requested that they be sent to the NCSJRC, New York, New York.

On July 21, 1955, this source furnished a printed pamphlet which had been circulated in Cleveland entitled "The Facts in the Case of MORTON SOBELL". This printed pamphlet gave a synopsis of SOBELL's background, his arrest in Mexico, his conviction as co-defendant of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, and his sentence. The pamphlet requested the reader to write a letter to the Director of Prisons, Justice Department, Washington, D. C., urging that SOBELL be removed from Alcatraz to a local Federal penitentiary. The leaflet concluded by stating that other facts and the full trial record are available at the National Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL, 1050 Sixth Avenue, New York 16, New York.

On May 4, 1955, Source [REDACTED] also furnished the above described pamphlet. b7d

On June 21, 1955, this source furnished a printed pamphlet by the Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL, 1050 Sixth Avenue, New York, which contained etchings of MORTON SOBELL and JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and quotations from these persons relative to the "wrongs" which had been done them when prosecuted.

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On December 21, 1955, this source furnished a printed letter on letterhead stationery of the Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL, 940 Broadway, New York 10, New York, signed by ROSE SOBELL and which had enclosed a leaflet containing two poems by HELEN SOBELL. The letter thanked those who aided in attempting to gain a new trial for her son, MORTON SOBELL, and appealed for generous contributions payable to her (ROSE SOBELL) or to the SOBELL Committee to continue efforts to obtain a new trial for MORTON SOBELL.
