CSNY 43-S, who has furnished reliable information in the past, made available to the New York Office information concerning the above captioned subject, obtained from the building located at 23 West 26th Street, New York City. This building is occupied by the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born, Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, and Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade, all of which have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450. In addition, other Communist Party front groups and individual CP members or sympathizers occupy offices at this address. Prior to 2/1/53 the State and National Offices of the Civil Rights Congress, which has been designated by the Attorney General of the US pursuant to Executive Order 10450 were located at this address. Subsequent to that date space in the building has been occupied by SRT Publications, Inc., publishers of "New World Review" formerly known as "Soviet Russia Today" which has been cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, 6/25/42 and 3/29/44.

Strict care must be exercised so that the existence of this important source of evidence will not become known to any outside agency. It is also to be noted that because of the nature of this source of information it will be impossible to recontact the source regarding information furnished.

CANADIAN CONTROVERSY DEVELOPS IN SOBELL CASE
AS PREMIER OF SASKATCHEWAN DEFENDS RIGHT OF
GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS TO SUGGEST NEW SOBELL TRIAL

Defends Right of Mrs. Sobell to Speak

NEW YORK, Dec. 23—Mrs. Morton Sobell today expressed satisfaction that prominent Canadians have upheld her right and that of interested Canadians to appeal for a new trial for her husband, Morton Sobell, imprisoned in Alcatraz on a 30 year sentence for "conspiracy to commit espionage."

Premier T. C. Douglas of Saskatchewan was among those who defended the right of government officials to suggest a new Sobell trial as a controversy developed between political parties following an appearance by Mrs. Sobell in Regina, Canada. "There will be no McCarthyism in Saskatchewan as long as I am able to prevent it," Premier Douglas asserted.

The controversy started when Alex Cameron, an opposition member of the legislative assembly of the province of Saskatchewan, demanded the firing of H. S. Kilkin, deputy minister of labor, and Dr. Murray S. Acker, assistant deputy minister of health, for participating in the Sobell meeting. The gathering sent a resolution to the U. S. Consulate in Ottawa and to the Canadian Ambassador in Washington urging that steps be taken to give Sobell a new trial and to remove him from Alcatraz. Sobell was convicted in 1951 in the trial with Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.

Premier Douglas, stating that Mr. Cameron's demands were based on McCarthyism, said: "I am not familiar with the merits of the plea of Mrs. Sobell (who is said to have spoken at the Regina meeting) on behalf of her husband, but it seems to me she has a perfect right to ask for a retrial if she feels conscientiously that her husband was unjustly imprisoned."

Those who agree with Mrs. Sobell also have a right to take such steps as are legal and proper to see that the case is given a retrial. I notice an American Senator, Bill Langer, Republican from North Dakota, is going to raise the case of Mr. Sobell in the U.S. Senate on the grounds that he feels the man was condemned unjustly. Senator Langer could hardly be classified as a Communist. However, apparently in Mr. Cameron's opinion anyone who doesn't agree with him and the Liberal Party should be dismissed forthwith.

"It would be a sad day for Saskatchewan," Premier Douglas continued, "if government employees or any other citizens are to be punished merely because they ask for a retrial of a person who has been convicted, which is, after all, the democratic right of any citizen."

Statements by Dr. Acker, assistant deputy minister of health, and Mr. Elkin, deputy minister of labor, also refuting the charge against them, were published in the Regina Leader. Dr. Acker said:

"Thousands of people in Canada, Great Britain, France and the United States have serious doubts as to whether justice was done in the Sobell trial. Among persons who have publicly expressed grave doubts about this case are Dr. Harold C. Urey, noted atom scientist in the United States; Republican Senator William Langer of the

Senate Judiciary Committee; Waldo Frank, well-known author; Judge Patrick O'Brien of Detroit, Elmer Davis, radio commentator, and Carey McWilliams, editor of the Nation...

"Obviously Mr. Cameron's statement is a crude attempt to smear individuals who are concerned with injustice anywhere in the world. This is a typical McCarthy technique and the people of this city and province have shown that they will have no truck with it."

Mr. Elkin said in his comment: "I joined with other interested citizens to arrange for a meeting to hear what Mrs. Sobell had to say. After hearing her story it was much clearer to me that a new trial for her husband would serve the best interests of everyone in both the U. S. and Canada..."

"It would appear to me that he (Cameron), at least, and undoubtedly others, were prepared to drag the red herring around in the interests of party politics. If our civil liberties go down the drain in the process, it appears to be no concern to him, as indeed it was

no concern to McCarthy and his crowd in the U.S. Even if these were not intentions, certainly they are the results."

Mrs. Sobell, in her statement issued in New York today, commented: "It is gladdening to me, particularly at this season, that my right as a wife and mother to speak for my innocent husband's freedom should be upheld by so many eminent citizens of Canada. Neither distances nor differences can for long obscure the fact of my husband's innocence. People, both humble and eminent, from every part of the world have reached out to help--from Japan, Great Britain, France, Italy, Denmark, Sweden, South Africa, Australia, and most naturally, of course, from our own United States in ever-growing numbers.

"All attempts by our Attorney General's office to silence the truth notwithstanding, people throughout the entire world are beginning to see in the imprisonment of my husband at Alcatraz an act that defies all principles of justice, fairness, and decency. Our country is fast leaving the days when the words of false witnesses and unscrupulous prosecutors could send men and women to prison and even death. We are moving toward that rightful place of ours, as a country that offers all its citizens true liberty and justice. My husband's freedom is necessary to the unfolding of these times. Through me and with me, my husband gives thanks to those who are working for justice for him and for all."

The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case was formed on January 2, 1953, according to information furnished by [redacted] who has furnished reliable information in the past. [redacted] advised on January 2, 1953 that this Committee was formed on this date for the purpose of securing a new trial or clemency for Ethel and Julius Rosenberg who were convicted of conspiracy to commit espionage and were executed on June 19, 1953. HORTON SOBELL was convicted with the Rosenbergs and received a 30-year sentence. b7D

[redacted] who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised in December, 1953 that the Rosenberg-Sobell Committee, during December, 1953, took the name of the National Committee to Secure Justice for HORTON SOBELL in the Rosenberg Case.

[redacted] who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised in June, 1954 that the above Committee is basically composed of Communist Party members and sympathizers. b7D

I. SCOPE AND GENERAL ACTIVITY

Transcripts of public testimony taken by the House Committee on Un-American Activities in Washington, D. C., on August 2, 1955, show that on that date HERMAN TAMSKY and PHILIP KORITZ appeared before that Committee under subpoena as witnesses. Both TAMSKY and KORITZ pled the Fifth Amendment of the Constitution of the United States in refusing to answer questions concerning their membership in the Communist Party or questions concerning Communist associations.

[redacted] former member of the Communist Party, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised [redacted] that HERMAN TAMSKY was a Communist Party member. b7D

Miss ANNE PATHEWS, in testimony before the House Committee on Un-American Activities in 1947 concerning Communist activities in the Winston-Salem, North Carolina area, stated that PHILIP KORITZ was active in Communist Party activities in the Winston-Salem area in 1947.

On August 30, 1955, Mr. JAMES A. SHAWTON, Attorney at Law, with offices at 27 Temple Street, Quincy, Mass., furnished the Boston Division with a mimeographed letter and a pamphlet which he received in the mails. The mimeographed letter is dated August 18, 1955 at Boston, Mass., and bears the signature of HERMAN

TAMSKY for the "Boston Committee to Secure a New Trial for MORTON SOBELL." The letter refers to the fact that approximately 30 persons were subpoenaed by the House Committee on Un-American Activities in Washington, D. C., during August, 1955 in connection with that Committee's inquiry into the activities of persons seeking clemency and justice in the Rosenberg-Sobell Case. The letter points out that it would appear that the subpoenas were issued in reaction to a request made to the Judiciary Committee of the United States Senate to investigate the conduct of the Attorney General's Office in the Rosenberg-Sobell Case since such a petition was submitted to the Committee on July 18, 1955, the precise date on which the subpoenas mentioned before were issued.

In addition, the letter points out that these subpoenas followed the recent acquittal of one STIG, a defendant in a trial in Dayton, Ohio. According to the letter, STIG was acquitted because the testimony of one HARRY GOLD, whom the letter identifies as a chief prosecution witness against the Rosenbergs, was proved incredible to the Jury through reference to JOHN WESLEY's book, "Judgment of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg."

The letter suggests that it is possible to effect a new trial for MORTON SOBELL and, in working toward that end, the Boston Committee to Secure a New Trial for Morton Sobell believes that two things would be an aid:

1. An investigation of the role of the Attorney General's Office in the Rosenberg Case and in "an effort to obtain such an investigation" the reader is requested to write to Senator JENNINGS, Senate Sub-Committee on Constitutional Liberties, Washington, D. C., and urge him to consider the petition presented on July 18, 1955.
2. The second suggestion is to purchase and circulate WESLEY's book "Judgment of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg." The letter concluded by requesting contributions from the reader to aid the above work.

The pamphlet furnished by Mr. SHANNON is entitled "Judgment of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg" and described the work briefly. The pamphlet was published by the Sobell Committee, Room 2, 1050, Sixth Avenue, New York, New York.

On the same date, an identical letter and pamphlet were received by the Boston Office of Attorney HENRY H. CHMIELINSKI, JR., 1359 Hancock Street, Quincy, Mass. In furnishing the Boston Division with the letter and pamphlet, Mr. CHMIELINSKI, JR., advised that he had received them through the mails.

[REDACTED] advised on November 13, 1955 that on that date ROSE SOBELL, the mother of MORTON SOBELL, spoke to approximately 60 persons at the Morton Plaza, Dorchester, Mass. According to [REDACTED] ROSE SOBELL urged that communications be sent to P. BENNETT, Federal Bureau of Prisons, Department of Justice and also to the Evaluation Committee, Alcatraz Prison, San Francisco, California, agitating for Morton Sobell's transfer from Alcatraz to a Federal Penitentiary in the Eastern United States. b7D

According to [REDACTED] Mrs. SOBELL collected \$105 on a personal plea to the audience and, in doing so, stated that this appeal was not made by the National Committee to Free Morton Sobell. ROSE SOBELL stated that the above statement was "for the benefit of FBI agents present." She also requested that petitions be sent to the Jennings Committee, Sub-Committee on Civil Liberties of the U. S. Senate Judiciary Committee. These petitions were to seek an investigation into the arrest and trial of MORTON SOBELL. Mrs. SOBELL claimed that MORTON SOBELL had been illegally ejected from Mexico into the "hands of arresting officers." b7D

CARL HUNTLEY reported on the planned campaign of the Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL.

In the month of December 1955, the first of a series of full page ads in the Nation magazine made its appearance.

The Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL wanted to take similar ads in a number of other papers over a period of six months so that they could bring the cause into the open - into the area of public discussion. They want to distribute free of charge another thousand of the Huxley books (Judgment of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg). These books are to be judiciously distributed to all Senators, Congressmen, Federal Judges, top newspaper men and other national leaders.

Attorneys for MORTON SOBELL are planning to file a motion for a new trial in the coming weeks. The motion will be based on new documentary evidence proving knowing the use of perjured testimony by the prosecution. A lot of money is required to keep the campaign going. The money collected at the Guardian meeting of 1-27-56 will be forwarded to the Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell, Room D, 910 Broadway, New York 10, New York.

FRANK BROWN suggested that the National Guardian readers have an educational program along with other subjects. He said all members should join the Liberty Book Club of New York. He also said that all members should buy the book "Judgment of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg" by HUXLEY. PAULA MAC LEBON said that she now has several of the HUXLEY books on hand but that she will order more.

ALMAN began his talk by giving a brief and facetious view of the Rosenberg Case intimating that the Greenglass testimony was fabricated by the Attorney General's Office and that it was impossible for Greenglass to transmit secret data because of the limitations of his intelligence and the unimportance of his position. He accused witness ELITCHER of being a willing tool of the government and sending SOBELL to prison.

The Government was then taken to task for removing SOBELL to Alcatraz. This was allegedly done to remove SOBELL from his friends and attorneys. He charged that Government agents were constantly trying to get SOBELL to confess so that they could start another series of espionage trials. He intimated that SOBELL was now being offered all kinds of deals to confess that at least the Rosenbergs were guilty because the Attorney General's Office had made an error and was trying desperately to cover it up.

He called for a turn to justice and law in this country and spoke of "phony" evidence and guilt by insinuation. He cited examples of where the Government had lied to the Supreme Court and to members of Congress. He accused the Government of a nine months propaganda campaign before the trial began so that it was impossible to secure an impartial jury; especially since the country was involved in the Korean conflict.

At 9:47 A.M., 3/9/56, I spoke with Inspector Carl E. Hennrich, Bureau, and read to him portions of the column by VICTOR RIESEL, p. 4, Daily Mirror, 3/9/56. This data refers to activities of AARON SCHNEIDER in connection with his travels throughout the South, trying to set up headquarters for "National Committee to Secure Justice For Morton Sobell." The news article states headquarters have been set up in Miami, Orlando, New Orleans, Houston, Austin, Dallas, Atlanta, and Winston Salem.

It was agreed with Mr. Hennrich that NYO would send out a teletype to the Bureau; Newark, which covers AARON SCHNEIDER; and to the offices covering the above-mentioned headquarters, giving them the full background of this matter, starting with the data secured from an informant of the Dallas Office in connection with [REDACTED]

The article continued that despite the announced purpose of Mrs. SOBELL's appearing in Miami, neither she nor the tracts handed out offered any new evidence on behalf of her husband.

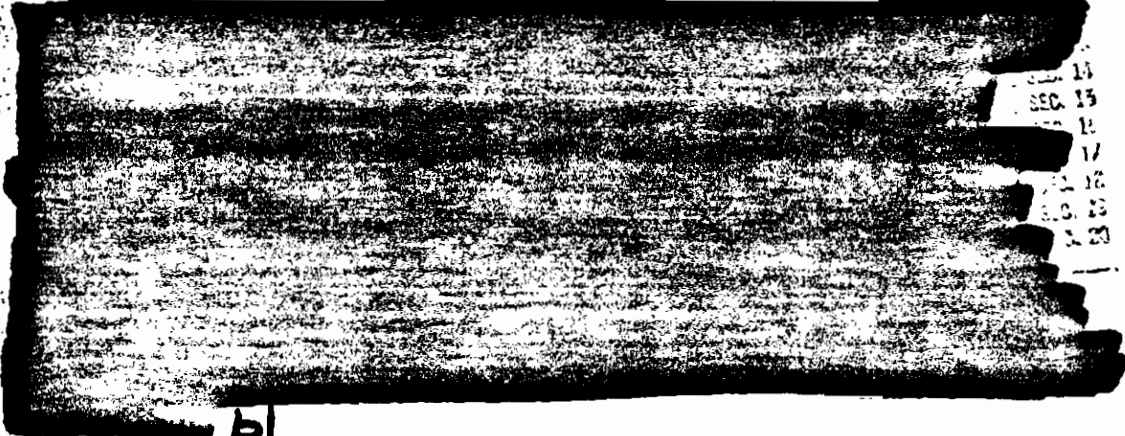

This Newsletter contained an article captioned "Retraction." The article states that paintings were collected in NYC for an exhibition at Barbizon Plaza Hotel. Subsequently, the "National Guardian" and the "Daily Worker" announced that the exhibition was partly a benefit for the Morton Sobell Defense Committee, and listed the names contributing to and sponsoring the exhibition. The article stated the artists had not authorized the use of their pictures nor had they been informed of the auspices of the exhibition. According to this article, the exhibition was called off largely as a result of Equity's intervention at the request of members whose names were included.

The article sets forth a letter sent from the National Office, over the signature of EMLEN ETTING, President to the two publications. The letter states that AEA wants the record straight; discusses the case involved; and that the artists were not appraised of the exhibition purposes nor had they granted permission to use their works or names in connection with MORTON SOBELL. The letter concludes that the artists caused cancellation of the exhibition.

Witty, leader of the Negro community', Austin, Texas; 'Rev. Bertram A. Miller, executive secretary of the Council of Churches' (presumably Austin, Texas), and also had been in contact with J. P. HART, described as ex-Supreme Court judge and ex-university chancellor (presumably at Austin, Texas), described as 'the liberals' candidate for governor', and commented that 'He found Hart open minded, wishing more information on the Sobell case.'

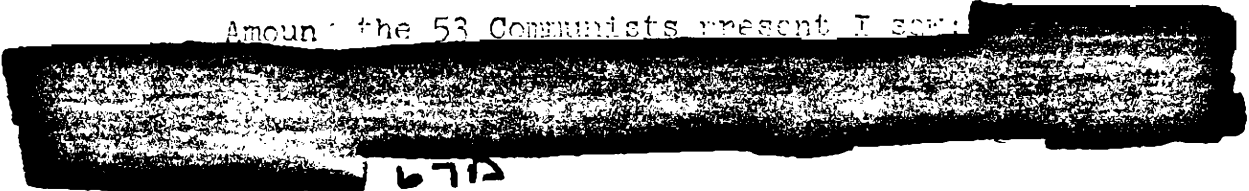

A meeting of Bronx County Communist Party functionaries took place on Feb. 13th, 1956 at the Hungarian Hall, Southern Blvd. & 181 St., Bronx, NY.

Amount: the 53 Communists present I saw:



Don Lester, organizer of the Bronx County CP opened the meeting. He introduced the speaker: "Leon Nelson, secretary of the Jewish Commission of the NY State Committee of the Communist Party."

Leon Nelson's subject was the "Arab-Israel crisis." Before going into his talk he urged everyone to read "the highly important Marxist monthly, Jewish Life. Jewish Life reflects the Communist party's view point on Jewish questions, in general and on the present burning issue of the Arab-Israel Crisis. Jewish Life will be of special interest to those comrades who work in the Jewish mass organizations."

Leon Nelson's one hour talk on the "Arab-Israel crisis" consisted of the adopted Communist (National and international) line on this question.

He spoke of "American imperialism which is trying to establish military bases in the Middle East. Dulles is protecting the oil interest of American oil companies... Dulles is ready to sacrifice not only the 1½ million Jews of Israel, but also the 40 million Arabs for the oil of the middle East.. Ben Gurion is a flunky of American-English imperialism... The Israeli government is following the dictates of the American Zionists demanding a pact with Washington, -a pact aimed against the Soviet Union. There is no reason for the Soviet Union and the countries of the people's democracies to be friendly to Israel... Is there? But Israel, as any other nation, has a right to exist and to build its economy, its culture, Israel, as any other non socialist nation, has

its capitalist class and its working class, Israel has its reactionaries and progressives. It is up to us, to the progressives to take away Israel from the reactionary-imperialist forces and lead the country into the camp of the peace-loving socialist world... The Soviet Union sees Israel as Israel is today, but the Soviet Union is seeking peace in the Middle East... This is the policy of the Soviet Union. Peace in the Middle East... The sale of arms to Egypt by Czechoslovakia can not be interpreted as an act aimed at the disturbing of peace in the Middle East... It is not an arms race... It is an act for peace... We must give aid and comfort to Egypt because Egypt is a neutralist country... Egypt is actively engaged in disrupting the Bagdad pact is another device of Dulles aimed against the Soviet Union... Egypt deserves the friendly attitude shown to it by the Soviet Union..."

But what Leon Nelson and the Communist Party is worried about is:

"The arming of Israel is an important issue, as far as the masses are concerned... It is not the central issue... From one point of view it is the least important issue... But we must have an answer to it for the masses... Communists who work with the Jewish masses should lead in the demand of restricted arms for Israel... We are joining in demanding the sale of arms for Israel by the American government. This demand must be supplemented with the following 4 points:

1. Big 4 or UN negotiations on the Middle East crisis.
2. Long-range economic aid to Arabs and Jews.
3. Defensive arms for Israel and to make every effort for disarmament.
4. Arab-Israeli negotiations on the refugee and other questions but no dismemberment of Israel."

Don Lester, Chorover, Gene Pearlstein, Bernard Addis and a few others participated in the discussion on "the report of Comrade Nelson." All of the participants in the discussion agreed that "We badly needed a definite program...most of us, who work among the Jewish masses, just didn't have the answer to the many questions which are troubling the Jewish masses... Comrade Nelson's talk clarifies this important issue..." Only one - a woman-Communist expressed a doubt: "I work in a Haddasa organization and I doubt very much if my explanation to Haddasa members that the sale of arms to Egypt by Chechoslovakia was meant to bring peace in that area will make an impression. I still don't know the right answer to the question why did Shekoslovakia sell arms to Egypt?"

At 2:01 PM, the subject left the building and met an unidentified woman at the corner of 36th St. and 5th Ave. The woman was approximately 5' 9" tall (with heels), 40 - 45 years of age, 185 pounds, large build, medium complexion, coarse facial features, large straight nose and wore black horn rim glasses. The woman, after a brief conversation with the subject, entered the building at 392 5th Ave., and was observed entering the elevator. The subject returned, on foot, to 940-8 Broadway.

At 4:29 PM, the subject and an unidentified male left the 22nd St. entrance to 940-8 Broadway and entered a luncheonette located on the corner of 22nd and Broadway.

The unidentified male is described as follows: white, 35 - 40 years old, 160 pounds, 5' 9" to 5' 10" tall, olive complexion, heavy beard, black, bushy, short (not crew cut) hair combed straight up, large hook nose, dark eyes, medium-heavy eyebrows, wore dark brown tweed sport coat.

To the Editor of the Manchester Guardian
 Sir,—I am writing to enlil your support in the case of Morton Sobell, an innocent man condemned as a result of political hysteria to thirty years in goal and an agonist incarceration in Alcatraz, the worst prison in the United States. He was condemned as an accomplice of the Rosenbergs in espionage. I am ashamed to say that at the time of the Rosenbergs' trial I did not look into the evidence. I have now done so. I am almost certain that the Rosenbergs were innocent and that the evidence against them was not have been considered. If prejudice had not been involved, the Rosenbergs are dead and nothing can be done for them now except to hold up their official murderers to obloquy. 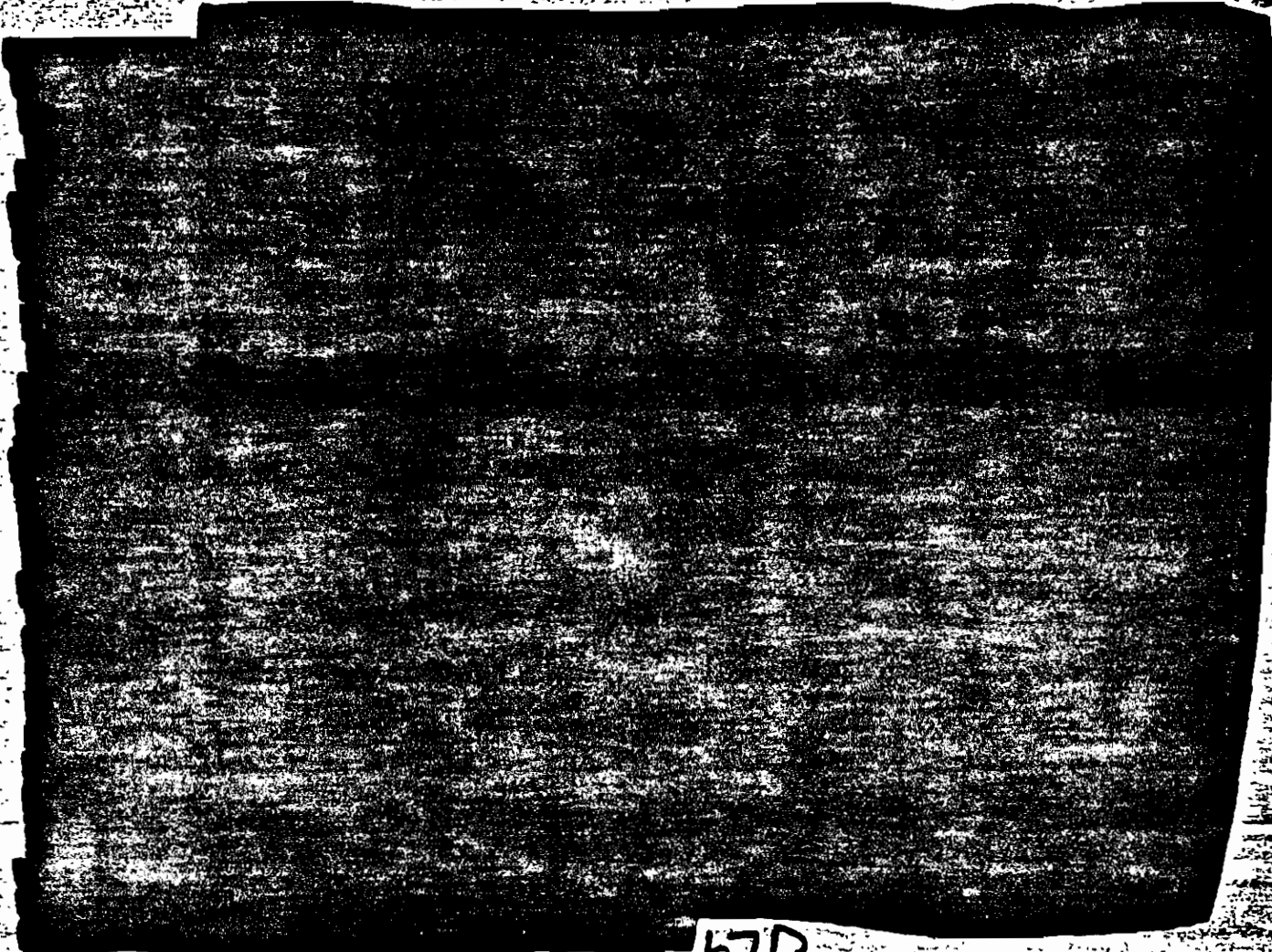

For the information of the New York Office [redacted] a current source, advised SA WILLIAM JOHN NOLAN [redacted] that the Downtown Club is a former Independent Progressive Party Club which became an autonomous organization during the Spring of 1955 after the IPP had lost its place on the ballot. Its principal activity is to sponsor a weekly forum which frequently features CP members and it follows the program set up by the IPP. b7D

The California Committee on Un-American Activities report, 1948, pages 40, 41, reflects that the IPP is "among typical mass organizations that are victims of Communist domination".
