THUMBNAIL SKETCH.

DEADLINE MAY 7, 1956

Per instructions set forth in Section 87D, paragraph 4, Manual of Instructions, the NYO must submit each year a letter advising the Bureau that a review of the thumbnail sketches being used by the NYO has been conducted and that all sketches are accurate and up to date.

The above captioned organization is among those organizations on which a thumbnail sketch has previously been submitted to the Bureau or is one on which it might be desirable to submit a sketch to the Bureau.

SA *Sheldon* is assigned to review the existing thumbnail sketch on the captioned organization to determine if it is accurate and up to date or to review the case file and prepare an original sketch in cases where this has not been done.

AIDS:

1. Review Section 87D, paragraph 4, Manual of Instructions and SAC Letter 55-33.
2. Be sure sketch conforms with report writing requirements:
 - a. When T symbol is used, date information was received and period to which it pertains must be shown.
 - b. Use of T symbols should be reduced to a minimum. Check to see if T symbols previously used can now be eliminated and the source set out by name.

c. Whenever possible similar information from a source that can be disclosed should be substituted for information from a source which must be concealed.

d. Information regarding the formation or dissolution of an organization should be attributed to corporation, tax or other official records rather than from informants or individuals where possible.

e. If an organization is defunct or has changed its "line", this should be included with the pertinent dates.

f. Current existence of organization should be shown. This usually can be done by stating the current location or organization's headquarters. The source for an organization's headquarters should not be a part of the thumbnail sketch, but should be shown at the end of the letter along with the identity of any sources which may have been concealed in the sketch.

On completion of his review, the agent will prepare a letter to the Bureau in duplicate with a copy to NY file 100-90311 (Thumbnail Sketch) (7-2) with the caption and character of the organization involved. Below the character the words THUMBNAIL SKETCH should be added. This letter should contain an accurate, current, complete thumbnail sketch on the captioned organization. The letter should open with a statement identifying the sketch as either an amended or an original sketch and should close with the statement that careful consideration has been given to the sources concealed and T symbols were used only where absolutely necessary. At the time this sketch is dictated the stenographer should be directed to prepare a 5 x 8 card setting forth the complete thumbnail sketch. This card should also reflect the name of the organization in upper left corner, name of preparing agent, and date of preparation in top center and NY file number in upper right corner.

In cases where the present thumbnail sketch is current and no changes are made, the letter need only state this fact. However, the paragraph, "Careful consideration has been given to the sources concealed and T symbols used only where absolutely necessary" must also be set out in every instance.

In cases where the previously submitted thumbnail sketch is discontinued or no longer useful the letter submitted need only state that thumbnail sketch is being cancelled.

These letters should not be dated and should be submitted to the supervisor whose squad normally handles this type of organization (in this case _____) for signing and forwarding to Section 7-2.

All letters must reach Section 7-2 by May 7, 1956. Section 7-2 will date all letters and forward them to Bureau by cover memo.

According to the informant, PAULIA MacLENNI commented on a letter sent from Washington to JOE BARNES in answer to a letter they sent to the President and Senators on 2/17/56. She said the letter assured that everything possible would be done to see that the civil rights for the people of Alabama and other states would be carried out.

JOE BARNES showed a film entitled "The Masses of Larkin" and then a discussion was entered into concerning the boycott in Montgomery, Ala. and REV. MARTIN KING. ISAAC GRANT related some of the experiences he has had in southern states. GIL STRUNK said the Negro does not only

his struggles in the South, he also has them right here in Conn. He said in West Hartford a Negro could not stay there over 24 hours and could not buy property there, although there was one Negro family that has lived there and owned their property for a long time.

Informant related that PAULA MacLEECH is having a dinner at her home on 4/7/56 to raise money for KORTON SOBELL.

CARL BENTLEY had some papers for everyone to sign to send to Congressmen, Senators, and the Attorney General calling for steps to be taken in the boycotting in Alabama.

FRANK TAYLOR took up a collection which is supposed to be sent to Rev. KING in Ala. and the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP).

The guests were a young couple (around 30) introduced as SARAH and DAVID. SARAH was the speaker and represented the COMMITTEE TO SECURE JUSTICE FOR MORTON SOBELL in New York City.

SARAH spoke for about twenty-five minutes outlining the case against MORTON SOBELL, during which time she cited the following facts:

MORTON SOBELL had been kidnapped by FBI men from Mexico, and the immigration officer who testified at the trial that SOBELL had been deported by Mexican authorities had perjured himself. The whole case against SOBELL was based on the testimony of MATTHEW ELETCHER, a former classmate of SOBELL's at New York University. ELETCHER's testimony was forced out of him by the government, who could threaten him with perjury prosecution for taking a false non-communist oath in 1947. Judge KAUFMAN even said in his charge to the jury, "If you do not believe ELETCHER's testimony, you must acquit SOBELL." SARAH outlined other incidents on the case, including ELIZABETH BENTLEY's testimony, all of which is included in a book on the case by JOHN WEXLEY. SARAH said the Committee is working for two objectives: (1) to secure a new trial and acquittal for SOBELL based on new evidence, and (2) to press the White House for commutation of sentence to time already served, pardon, or amnesty. The second goal is to be achieved by mass circulation of the Wexley Book and the favorable reviews and comments being made in reference to it.

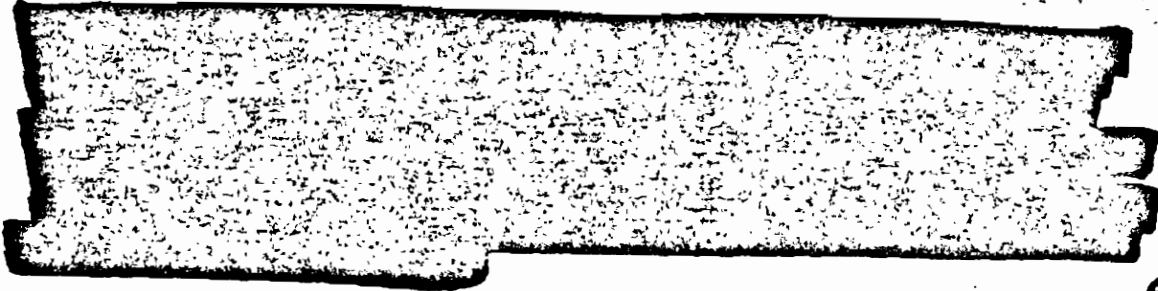

for the "Committee To Secure Justice For MORTON SOBELL". She told the group that attorneys for SOBELL are prepared to proceed in court in April to demand a new trial for SOBELL. FRANK TAYLOR read the latest bulletin he received from the Committee To Secure Justice For MORTON SOBELL.

CARL BENTLEY gave a report on the proposals of the Action Committee which were decided at their last meeting. All members of the National Guardian Readers Club were notified on their invitations that they were to bring donations of canned goods for the strikers at Bryant Electric Company in Bridgeport. All members were urged to write letters to the Bridgeport newspapers protesting the "terror in the South" and also to write to the Bridgeport Chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) suggesting some form of action the NAACP should take against this "terror" in the South. All individuals present were asked to sign letters to be sent to Senators BUSH and PURTELL and Representative MORANO.

ISAC BARNES showed a film on "Races of Mankind"; this film pointed out how different nationalities could live and work together in peace. This film further pointed out that there are four types of blood and that color doesn't have anything to do with the various blood types. The film revealed that there are three races of people, Caucasian, Negroid and Mongoloid, but there are no differences biologically, but that all races are equal in strength and mental capacity.

At the conclusion of the showing of the film, ISAAC GRANT made a few comments saying that all races should be able to live together in peace and harmony and the Negroes will have to continue their struggle for equality. GRANT cited as an example the bus strike that has been in existence in Alabama.

PAUL MacLEACH told the group that all money received in the collection would be sent to Montgomery, Alabama, to help the Negroes participating in the boycott.

CSNY 48-S, who has furnished reliable information in the past, made available to the New York Office information concerning the above captioned subject, obtained from the building located at 23 West 26th Street, New York City. This building is occupied by the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born, Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, and Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade, all of which have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450. In addition, other Communist Party front groups and individual CP members or sympathizers occupy offices at this address. Prior to 2/1/53 the State and National Offices of the Civil Rights Congress, which has been designated by the Attorney General of the US pursuant to Executive Order 10450 were located at this address. Subsequent to that date space in the building has been occupied by SHQ Publications, Inc., publishers of "New World Review" formerly known as "Soviet Russia Today" which has been cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, 6/25/42 and 3/29/44.

Strict care must be exercised so that the existence of this important source of evidence will not become known to any outside agency. It is also to be noted that because of the nature of this source of information it will be impossible to recontact the source regarding information furnished.

She commenced her talk by saying that SOBELL was tried and convicted then sent to Alcatraz instead of one of the other Federal prisons. She said that Alcatraz is where they send prisoners with lengthy criminal records or ones who cause trouble in other Federal prisons. Continuing, she told the group that SOBELL and his family were living in Mexico when JULIUS ROSENBERG was arrested for espionage. She said that one night while SOBELL was sleeping in his home a sheriff and several deputies dragged him out of his home and beat him, telling him that he had robbed a bank. They carried him to the border where he was turned over to the FBI. One of the immigration officers at the border wrote "deported" on his immigration papers. At the trial when the immigration officer was asked how he knew that SOBELL was being deported, he answered "just from observation." When the trial was complete Judge KAUFFMAN when charging the jury told them that if you do not believe the testimony of MAX ELITCHER, you must acquit SOBELL. SOBELL was found guilty and sentenced to thirty years in prison.

Continuing, Mrs. HARMOND told the group that by the last of this month, SOBELL's lawyers are planning on trying to free him. She said that the COMMITTEE TO SECURE JUSTICE FOR MORRIS SOBELL were doing all in their power to assist SOBELL.

were Dr. HERBERT APPELKER and DAVID ALMAN. Both speakers recommended JOHN WEXLEY's book on the ROSENBERGS and ALMAN stated that 10,000 copies of this book had been sold. According to APPELKER and ALMAN, WEXLEY's book proved conclusively that JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were innocent of the charge of conspiracy to commit espionage for which they were convicted and executed. ALMAN discussed the present operation of the captioned committee. According to ALMAN, there are local committees in approximately 20 cities throughout the United States which cities he did not identify by name. ALMAN said that the SOBELL Committee at the present time needs \$140,000.00 for its operation and that the Committee has two full-time workers on the East Coast, one of whom is ALMAN; two full-time workers on the West Coast, and one full-time worker in Chicago. ALMAN did not identify any of his fellow workers. ALMAN stated that he works primarily in New York, except for making speeches to groups similar to the one which met on 4/20/56. ALMAN then pointed out the need for a revival of the local Committee in PH. He told how JEAN FRANTJIS had done so much work by herself and urged those present to assist FRANTJIS in reviving the Committee.

FRANTJIS then spoke, asking for volunteers to assist her. FRANTJIS was very emotional during her speech and was almost in tears when only one individual volunteered to assist her. APPELKER then remarked that perhaps it was too much to expect a large number of volunteers after only one meeting and requested the individuals in attendance at the meeting to think the matter over and that if anyone was willing to help FRANTJIS to contact her in the future.

Numerous meetings held in 1955 and 1956 of the LASC, as well as meetings of youth committee of LASC 1955, to further aims and objectives of the LASC. Aims and objectives of LASC continue to be a new trial and ultimate release of MORTON SOBELL from Alcatraz Prison. [REDACTED] b1
 In February, 1956, it was reported that Sobell committees were being formed all over the nation to raise \$55,500.00 to obtain new trial for MORTON SOBELL. Support of LASC indicated at various Communist Party (CP) meetings. Implementation of CP line indicated in April, 1956 copy of "The LA Sobell Announcer". In October, 1955 a "Daily People's World" subscription maintained in name of LASC.

For purposes of brevity, the Los Angeles Sobell Committee will be hereinafter referred to as LASC. The Communist Party and the Los Angeles County Communist Party will be hereinafter referred to as the CP and LACCP, respectively.

All informants designated by T symbols in this report have furnished reliable information in the past unless otherwise indicated.

I HEADQUARTERS OF LASC

As the result of a [REDACTED] by a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on April 10, 1956, it was ascertained that the headquarters of the LASC, as of that date, was located at 468 North Western Avenue, Los Angeles, California. b7E

II ORIGIN

Informant advised on April 19, 1955 that the Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell, which was formerly known as the Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case and was sometimes referred to as the Los Angeles Rosenberg-Sobell Committee, adopted its present name Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell, also known as the LASC, about August, 1954. The avowed purpose of this Committee is to have MORTON SOBELL transferred from Alcatraz Prison, to secure him a new trial, and to eventually secure his complete release.

Both the Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case and the Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell were, from their inception, dominated and controlled by the LACCP [REDACTED]

In 1955, 1956, critical discussions by CP members was that the Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell should be reactivated and revitalized in a more aggressive way than it was in the past, and that its activities should be expanded in terms of securing maximum mobilization of forces to secure SOBELL's transfer from Alcatraz Prison and a new trial for him.

There is an active youth committee organized by forces from the Labor Youth League (LYL) working on the SOBELL issue which is known as the Youth Committee for Morton Sobell or slight variations thereof and which is sponsored by the parent committee.

The LYL has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

III SCOPE

[REDACTED] Informant advised on February 23, 1956 that at a meeting [REDACTED] it was announced that Sobell committees were being formed all over the nation to obtain a new trial for MORTON SOBELL. b7D

[REDACTED] Informant advised on October 13, 1955 that the Downtown Club is a former Independent Progressive Party (IPP) club which became an autonomous organization during the spring of 1955 after the IPP had lost its place on the ballot. Its principal activity is to sponsor a weekly forum, which frequently features CP members, and it follows the program set up by the IPP. b7D

The California Committee on Un-American Activities, in its report dated 1948, pages 40 and 41, cites the IPP as "Among typical mass organizations that are victims of Communist domination".

ULMAN spent part of the evening answering questions concerning the SOBELL case. The main point of discussion was on the fact that the Sobell committees had not been classified as un-American. b7D

The group also discussed a new Senate subcommittee headed by Senator THOMAS B. HENNING, and how the Sobell group could get the committee to investigate the SOBELL case. It was agreed that a letter writing campaign should be started by the youth committee of the LASC in an effort to get the Senate committee to investigate the SOBELL case.

Informant advised [REDACTED] that the LASC held a meeting [REDACTED] The meeting consisted of a talk by JOHN WEXLEY on his book "The Judgment of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg". The talk by WEXLEY was followed by a collection to raise funds from the sale of WEXLEY'S book and donations to obtain the release of MORTON SOBELL from Alcatraz Prison. b7D

WEXLEY commented on an article written to a Connecticut newspaper by one BRETT HALLIDAY, in which HALLIDAY deplored the present state of justice in the United States of America. According to WEXLEY, HALLIDAY cited WEXLEY'S book in the letter and thought that, upon evidence submitted in this book, either J. EDGAR HOOVER, RAY COHN, et al, should sue the author for libel, or they should be indicted for murder. b7D

Informant advised on December 8, 1955, that on November 27, 1955 a breakfast sponsored by the LASC was held for Mrs. MORTON SOBELL at 1257 Van Pelt Avenue, Los Angeles. At this breakfast, Mrs. SOBELL spoke of her visits to MORTON SOBELL at Alcatraz once a month and urged everybody to work hard for funds in order to get MORTON out of Alcatraz.

On December 29, 1955, informant made available a circular of the LASC addressed to "Dear Friend" and signed by "RIDGE NEWMAN, "for the committee". This circular contains a review of JOHN WEXLEY'S book "The Judgment of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg" by BRETT HALLIDAY, a mystery writer who had originally written the review for the "Fairfield County Fair", a Connecticut newspaper. The review, attributed to BRETT HALLIDAY, was set out as follows: b7D

"This is being written at 2 a.m. . . . just after I have finished reading 'The Judgment of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg' by JOHN WEXLEY. This (review) is solely and wholly the work of BRETT HALLIDAY.

". . . In order that you may have some basis for assessing and evaluating the opinions I am going to express, I think it will be well to also put the following facts on record:

"I am not a 'bleeding heart' social reformer.

"I am not a Jew.

"I am not a Communist.

"I am a native American 51 years old, a registered Democrat who occasionally votes Republican. I am married, the father of one seven-year-old daughter, the owner of a dog, a cat, a canary, and two goldfish. I own my home in Westport (subject to a large mortgage held by the Prudential Insurance Co.) and I manage to eke out a fair living under our system of Capitalism.

"I have a sincere and fervent desire to be proud of my country and my fellow-Americans.

"Reading this book of JOHN WEXLEY'S has been a soul-shattering experience for me. It is a huge book; terrifying and sick-making. I finished the last page of Appendix 22, page 664, about an hour ago, and I have been walking the floor in agony since then.

"As I sit here at my typewriter and lift my head to stare at a window beyond which in the darkness lies America, I am frightened and nauseated.

"What sort of America is my daughter going to grow up in? What sort of heritage am I going to leave her? Can I as a father remain silent tonight after reading this book and feeling as I do about it?

"No, I would be a lousy father if I did that. And I want to be a good father.

"To me there is only one basic and inescapable conclusion that can be reached by any intelligent person who reads this book objectively.

"Either: the facts presented are untrue, and/or the author's interpretation is incorrect;

"Or: the facts are true, and the author's interpretation is correct.

"If the first conclusion is the right one, it seems to me that J. EDGAR HOOVER, IRVING KAUFMAN, IRVING SAYPOL, and RAY COHN (to say nothing of a host of underlings) should immediately start suit against the author and his publishers for malicious and vicious libel.

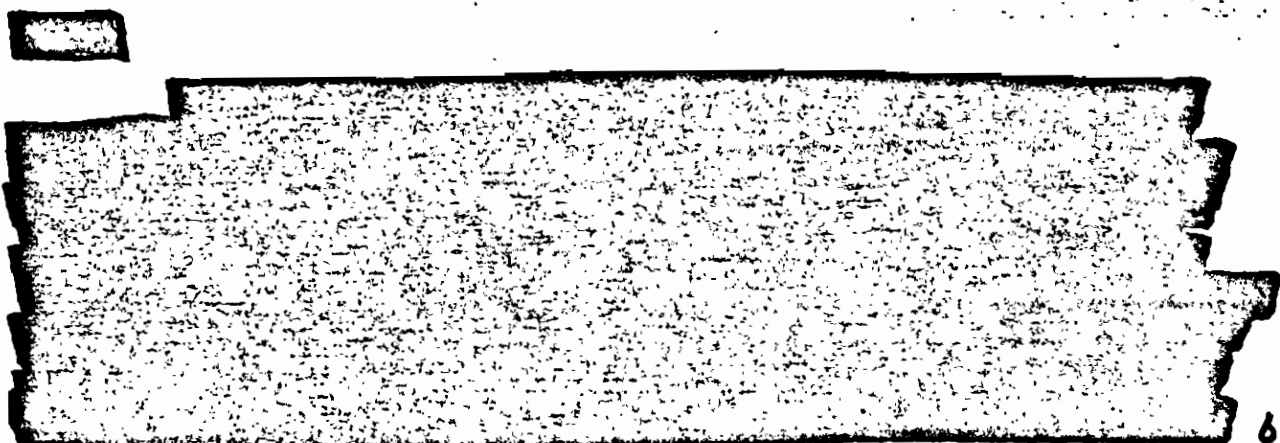
"If the second conclusion is correct, it seems to me that J. EDGAR HOOVER, IRVING KAUFMAN, IRVING SAYPOL, ROY COHN, et al, should be indicted and tried for conspiring to murder the ROSENBERGS.

"I have no way of determining whether the facts and/or the author's interpretation of them are true or false. I only know that this book was published in June, and thus far I have seen no public announcement of any legal action against the author or his publishers; To me this indicates they do not have any grounds for such action.

"... Let's stop and think about this for a moment. What does this mean to you as an American - to my daughter who will grow up in an America that looks the other way in abject fear and completely ignores the most accusative and inflammatory piece of writing since ZOLA took pen in hand to reopen the DREYFUS case? Frankly, I shudder as I contemplate the only logical answer to that question.

"This is an exceptionally well-documented book. Hardly a page does not carry one or more footnotes citing sources. The appendices are full and well chosen, and the book is carefully indexed.

"I feel certain that many of my readers ... knew the publisher, ANGUS CAMERON, in happier days when he was the respected and beloved chief editor of a major publishing house, and I hope a goodly number of them will order a copy of this book and read it, if for no better reason than because a man like Mr. CAMERON had the basic guts and the essential qualities of Americanism to print this book, and put it on the market".

"Bertrand Russell Spoke for Freedom, Describes Sobell as Innocent Man."

"London, March 27. Bertrand Russell rapped the FBI for its 'atrocities'. He made his charge in the Manchester Guardian hoping to enlist the people's support for Morton Sobell. He described Sobell as an innocent man condemned as a result of political hysteria.

"Russell said that the 'technique' used by the FBI was to find a man whom it could prove guilty of some offense and then promise him immunity if he would manufacture evidence against people who could not otherwise be indicted.

"After a sufficient number of secret interviews the FBI descends upon innocent people with a posse of terrified perjurers and in the hysteria every word uttered by the perjurers is accepted as the Gospel truth", he declared.

Informant advised that the Eastside Committee of the LASC is planning a fund raising affair for the purpose of financing a retrial for SOBELL.

Informant advised on January 9, 1956, that a meeting of the Eastside Committee of the LASC was held on January 4, 1956 at 1257 Van Pelt Avenue, Los Angeles, California. According to the informant, this meeting was an informal gathering and its main purpose was to set up a larger Eastside Committee in behalf of MORTON SOBELL.

Friends who want to join the Committee, or are interested in the campaign to free the young scientist, Sobell, from Alcatraz, where he is incarcerated for 30 years on the testimony of false proof, are asked to apply to the L.A. Sobell Committee, 488 North Western Avenue, Telephone: Hollywood 4-4725."

The Special Committee on Un-American Activities in its report dated March 29, 1944, page 75, cited the "Morning Freiheit" as "The Freiheit has been one of the rankest organs of Communist propaganda in this country for almost a quarter of a century."

"The first part of the evening was spent in visiting, eating and talking. Bruce Miller got a bit inebriated and talked in a loud voice. He damned everything and everybody accusing the Government of being Fascist and even hit out on the various Committees that are working towards a better world. He said that we are just kidding ourselves in thinking that we are making any headway. Everytime we advance an inch we shout how well we are doing. Laura tried to quiet him but he kept shouting about his "Rights" but he said I don't dare declare them where I work. He used very choice language and was disgusting.

[REDACTED] Lisa Hauber joined the conversation to Unions. We then discussed Morris' lecture of last Sunday night. Bruce did not think much of the praise given to Ruthan. Lisa stated that it is not Ruthan but the good resolutions that came out of the CIO AFL merger. She said that we must keep plodding along with the best of anything thing that comes our way. Lisa Hauber then brought out the recent criticism of the Soviet Union for talking supplies from the Russian people and giving it to other countries. She said that the United States had been doing that for years. This brought another tirade from Bruce Miller. He got on the subject of satellites. He claimed that England and other countries are American satellites because they do as the U. S. Fascist Govt. have dictates. That was the last heard from Bruce. He went to sleep and the group relaxed and let him snore.

"Clara Mae Perkins called the group to order and read a few points in a letter from the National office. She said that money is needed for advertising, travel, salaries—the total amount is \$55,000. She stated that the National office wants to know the feeling of the Committee about future activity of the Sobell Committee. Shall we continue along the lines of a new trial, 2. Senate investigation of perjury by stool pidgeons, 3. a direct appeal to President Eisenhower for a pardon for Morton Sobell. Since William Taylor has been cleared Elizabeth Bentley has been discredited and this should be enough evidence to obtain a presidential pardon for Sobell. The Senatorial investigation should be directed at Elizabeth Bentley. Mary Ferguson thought that we should continue along the lines of a new trial. The reason being that a Presidential pardon would not prove anything nor would it clear the Rosenbergs. She thought that Elizabeth Bentley should be put on the witness stand again. [REDACTED] However, Haven thought that we should push all three plans. His reason was that some people

would be interested in one thing and some another. He also stated that from talking to lawyers he is of the opinion that a new trial is almost impossible unless there is iron clad proof of new information.

"It was decided to use all three plans in our propaganda for Morton Sobell. We were then asked to write letters to Senator Thos. Hennings asking his Committee to investigate the steel pipe case and their perjured testimony, namely that of Elizabeth Bentley. [REDACTED]

She told of different ministers who have asked Helen Sobell to speak in their churches. The Pope was also dragged in for his part in the Rosenberg affair.

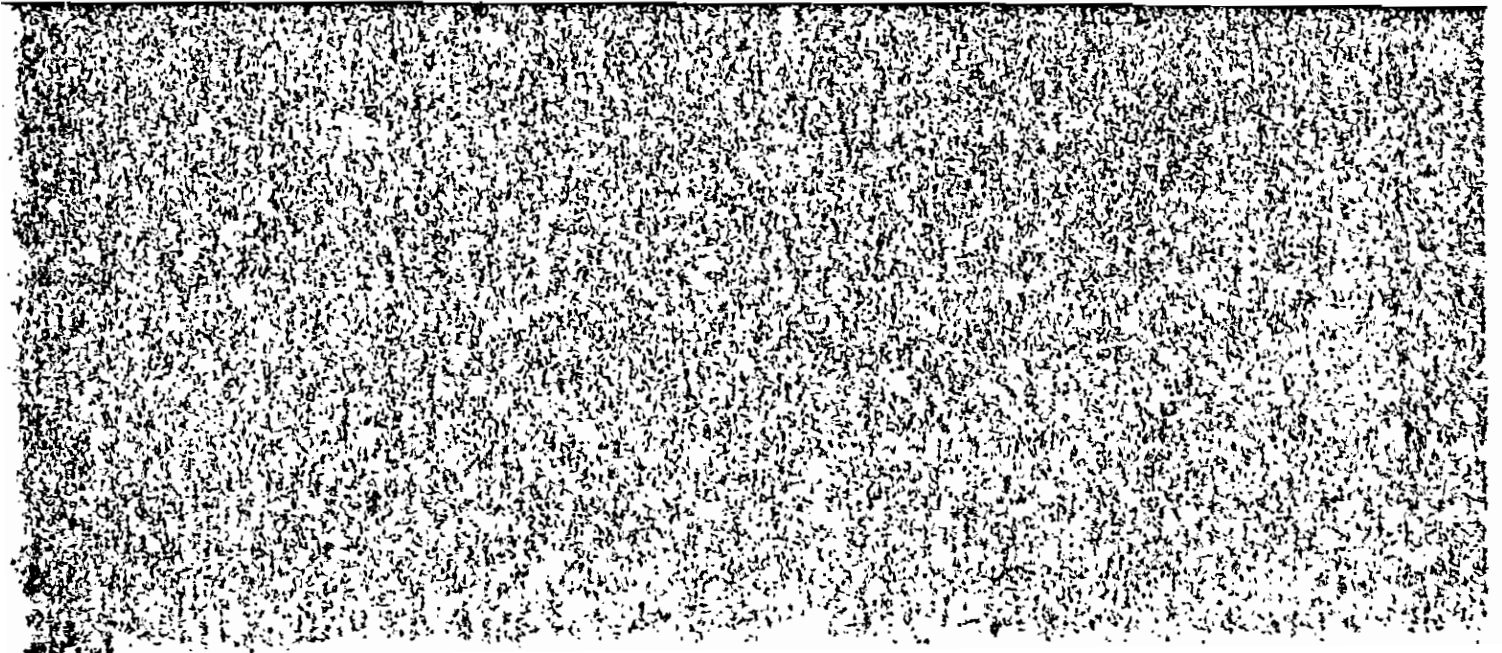

On Friday, 4/20/56, a meeting was held at the home of SUSAN and MORRIS DE CAMP FREEMAN, 144 West Penn Street, Philadelphia, Pa., sponsored by the Philadelphia Sobell Committee. Approximately 40 persons were present at this affair, of whom the informant identified the following:

SOE ROTENBERG acted as Chairman of the meeting and HERBERT APTHEKER from New York was the principal speaker and spoke mostly concerning the book by JOHN WEXLEY concerning the MORTON SOBELL case. APTHEKER said that this book had put more light on the SOBELL case than any other thing and that it was felt that, if this information had been produced earlier, it could have saved the lives of the ROSENBERGS. He said that a number of law professors and other prominent individuals, who had read this book, now expressed doubt as to the guilt of the ROSENBERGS and SOBELL.

APTHEKER introduced a booklet entitled "Prisoner On Our Conscience" by EMILY and DAVID ALMAN. Most of APTHEKER's talk came directly from this booklet, which he urged those present to purchase. APTHEKER said that at the present time it is felt that there is a good possibility to get MORTON SOBELL out of Alcatraz, and that the Committee for SOBELL is beginning to function again.

PH 100-4899

FNU ALMAN (DAVID), from the National SOBELL Committee, was present and also made a short talk. ALMAN said that he had travelled all over the United States on the SOBELL case and that as a result of talking to various people he felt that the chances to free SOBELL are better than ever before. He urged those present to join the SOBELL Committee and to work with the committee.

SOL ROTENBERG made a collection speech and urged everybody to work with the Philadelphia SOBELL Committee. He said that JEAN FRANTJIS had to do most of the work alone and that it was too much for one person.

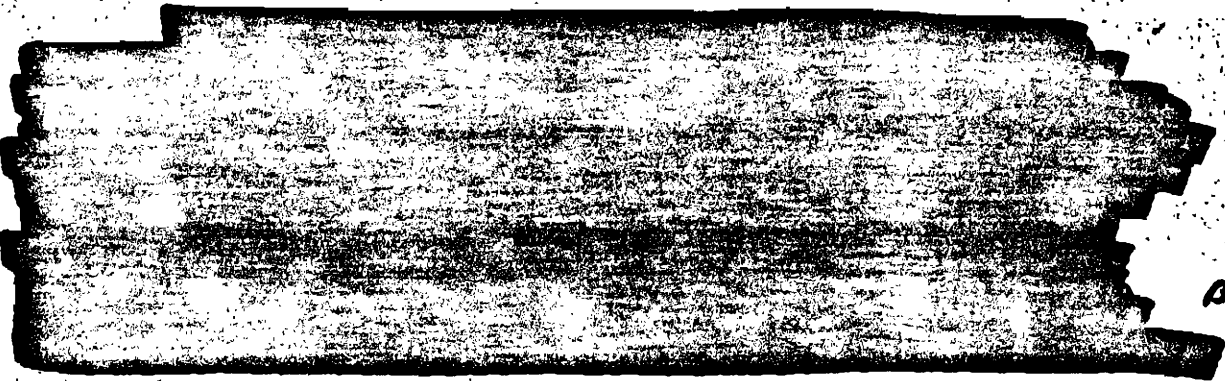

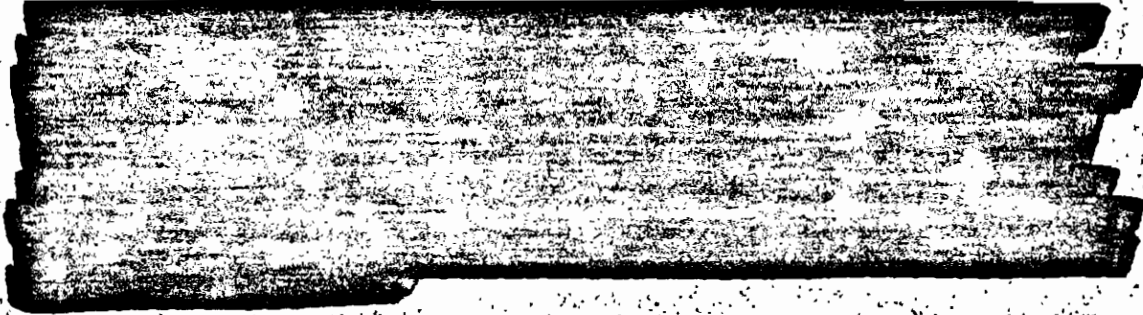
