On Page 1, Column 1 of the September 12, 1957 issue of the "Daily Worker" is an article entitled, "Sobell Plea to High Court Cites New Evidence," which reports that MORTON SOBELL asked the Supreme Court to set aside his trial as unfair, citing the fact that the judge and the prosecution had prejudiced the case by attacking ETHEL ROSENBERG's use of the Fifth Amendment before a grand jury in order to discredit her testimony.

On 10/25/57, SAS RONALD E. YOUNG and PAUL R. TONRA attended the above described function which lasted from approximately 8:30 p.m. to 10:45 p.m. Entrance to the above affair was obtained by paying an admission contribution of \$.50 per person. There were approximately 190 persons present of whom no more than five or six were Negroes. There was a literature table set up at the back of the hall which contained numerous publications, including "The Militant".

The moderator (white, male, age approximately 45, dark, slightly ~~heavy~~ hair receding from the temples, 5'9", 150 lbs., medium build) introduced the speakers in the following order:

TIM WOHLFORTH:

WOHLFORTH stressed the importance of the various socialist elements making a solid vote against the capitalist candidates in the forthcoming elections. He stated that this would be the first step towards the eventual formation of a labor party. He quoted portions of a satirical article against the forces of capitalism from a pamphlet he had received in the mail a few days previously. He stated that although this article was written in 1901 in the small town of Quality, Pennsylvania, there was little he (WOHLFORTH) could say at the present time that had not been said back in 1901. WOHLFORTH inferred that this showed the fundamental strength of the socialist idea.

VINCENT HALLINAN:

(HALLINAN was moved up to an early place in the program because he stated that he had a later

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engagement that evening to talk before the Lawyers Guild.)

HALLINAN stated that with approximately 62 million workers in the nation, the Government could be controlled by the workers but was not. He cited the contrast between our Governmental representatives and England's Parliament. He said that the people of this country are represented in Government by lawyers, big businessmen, etc., but that in England's Parliament there were bonafide representatives of the laboring class such as "dockers" and "miners".

He stated that it is fallacious to believe that while the Republican Party is the party of "big business", the Democratic Party is a friend of labor. He gave an example of a man named MURPHY who, through the assistance of Tammany Hall, was to obtain a magistracy in New York but was to have been required to pay \$15,000, which represented one year's salary, in order to receive the appointment.

He stated that the "Colony" of Hawaii has always been dominated by the Republican Party and pointed out that the Governor is appointed by the President. HALLINAN said that a year or two ago the ILWU, which is much beloved in Hawaii, helped the Democratic Party there to win a two-thirds majority in the Lower House and two less than a two-thirds majority in the Upper House. However, their legislative efforts were so stymied that at the end of the year none of their legislation had been passed. He stated that advocates of a Labor Party must sit and grit their teeth and wait until statehood comes to Hawaii. Then, HALLINAN predicted, a strong labor party will be formed there.

HALLINAN concluded his talk by asking the people present to vote for JOYCE COWLEY and the other Socialist candidates and also, to vote for his friend, ELIZABETH GURLEY FLYNN.

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Mrs. CLIFFORD T. McAVOY:

Mrs. McAVOY spoke very briefly and in a weak voice. She told how her late husband had worked to further his convictions and that he, until the very end, had hoped to be strong enough to campaign in the elections.

MODERATOR:

He asked how many in the audience would like to invest \$20 in a "sure thing" which was bound to come about. The ushers then collected two \$20 bills, one from each side of the hall. The chairman then made the same request for \$10 bills, \$5 bills, and finally \$1 bills. Many \$1 bills were contributed. The ushers then passed the collection boxes throughout the audience.

The moderator then introduced the following ^{SWP} candidates in the forthcoming election:

LILLIAN KIEZEL

ALVIN BERMAN, candidate for Brooklyn Borough president.

MURRAY ZUCKOFF, candidate for comptroller.

JOYCE COWLEY

Mrs. COWLEY stated that CHRISTENBERRY was only taken opposition to Mayor WAGNER. She said that WAGNER is not a Liberal. She stated that the WAGNER administration has been deficient in such matters as adequate housing, schooling and Negro rights, and that "witch hunts" have actively functioned during his term in office.

Mrs. COWLEY stated that she and her fellow candidates should not be considered SWP candidates in the strict sense but that all Socialists should combine to vote for those candidates and thus show a strong segment of opposition to the capitalist candidates. Mrs. COWLEY concluded her talk by pointing out the advantages that would come if a

Socialist Government were in control of NYC. She stated that there would be adequate housing (with grass, sunshine, etc.) for all, no factories near the worker's residences, excellent transportation facilities to take workers from their homes in the city to factories in the suburbs, etc.

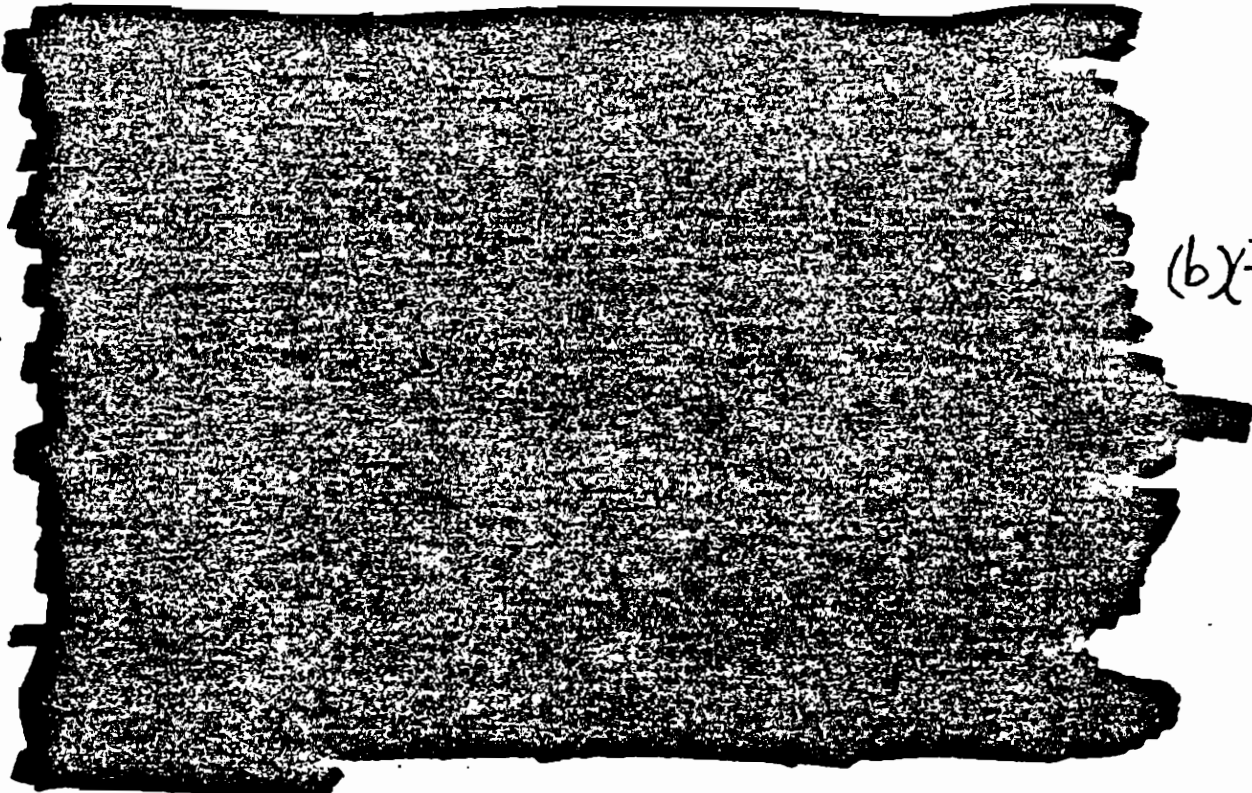

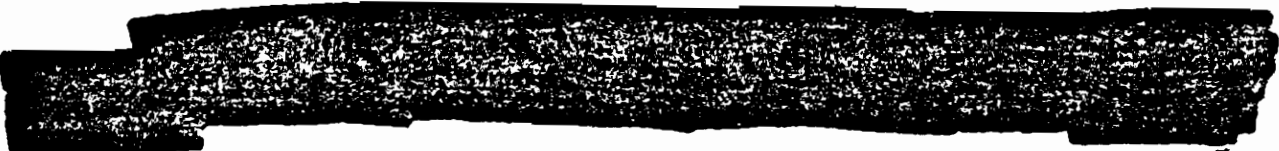

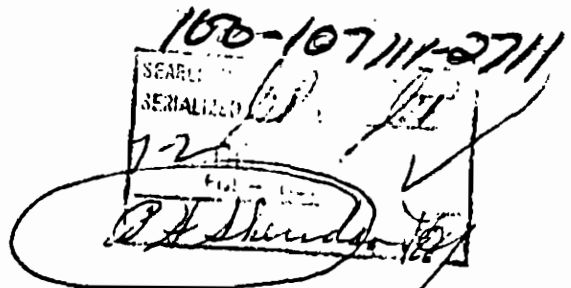

A Desecration Of Justice

At the very time the defense of Morton Sobell is engaged in new efforts to prove his innocence, the magazine "Look" had an article pouring forth poison against this young Jewish scientist. Obviously, such an article, at this time, will only serve to incite public opinion against Sobell, who was sentenced to thirty years on the basis of very doubtful "proof". Millions of people are firmly convinced that Sobell is a victim of a disgracefully false charge which was born in the darkness of the cold war and in the heat of a "spy" hysteria.

Elementary justice demands that the entire Sobell case be reviewed now. The defense lawyers have appealed to the highest court in the land, the Supreme Court, to do so. New Legal Motions Planned To Get Review For Sobell

New York — The United States Supreme Court has declined to decide whether or not Morton Sobell had a fair trial. By not reviewing the case, the Court has in effect left standing the incontrovertible law evidence that the prosecution used fraudulent means to convict Morton Sobell, including illegally kidnaping him from Mexico. This new evidence has never been related by the prosecution.

The Supreme Court is ordering a full hearing on this law evidence which could be subjected to judicial review by the Court according to the Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell. The statement continues:

It is particularly disturbing that the present Supreme Court, which has done so much to safeguard our civil liberties, should have refused to examine the case. This statement of Justice Hugo Black made in 1947 still stands. This Court has never reviewed the records and has never affirmed the fairness of the trial.

The Supreme Court has reviewed this case many times and public demand that more be done than have previous denials of review throughout the country have the sentiment American who believe that the very integrity of justice is at stake. Morton Sobell, now serving his 30th year of imprisonment, is determined to press his appeal to prove his innocence to his wife and mother and the thousands of Jewish people who have fought for him in the past and for justice in the future.

New legal motions will be prepared. Public hearings will be made. Thousands of additional copies of the trial record will be distributed. The case will be reviewed by the Supreme Court and the Court will be asked to review the case. (Continued in Page 11)

SYNOPSIS:

The San Diego Sobell Committee (SDSC) is not known to occupy office space or have meeting places of its own. It has held most known functions at Community Unitarian Fellowship (CUF) headquarters, all in San Diego, and these have been in the form of breakfasts or other benefits for the SDSC fund. On August 18, 1957 a benefit breakfast drew about 70 people including 13 of the 14 active members of the San Diego Communist Party. The Sobell-Rosenberg case is referred to at meetings as a "frame-up." Funds are collected and one item of correspondence indicated some of these funds go to the National Office of the Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL (CSJMS) in New York City. A new tabloid printed by CSJMS and reprints from other publications have been available at functions of SDSC. Indications of support by and interest of other organizations and the CP are set out.

On August 18, 1957 from 8:00 AM to 1:00 PM, Special Agents of the FBI observed about 70 people, including adults and children, entering and leaving CUF Hall, 4561 North Avenue, San Diego, California.

On August 26, 1957 T-2 and T-3 advised of the meeting of the SDSC on August 18, 1957 at CUF Hall for the benefit of that committee's fund. About 75 people were present advised T-2 and T-3. MILTON LESSNER served as chairman and introduced the speaker who made a plea for funds in order to take the SOBELL case to the Supreme Court. He mentioned that the amount needed at the present time was \$10,000.00. T-2 and T-3 also advised that both

GOSTIN and KATZ, separately, called for donations, saying that the audience must realize the significance of the case. LESSNER made an additional plea stating "you know we can't operate without money." A basket was passed through the audience and one was placed at the door for collections.


On December 10, 1957 T-5 made available a written invitation, or announcement, of a dinner meeting of the SDSC to be held at the CUP Hall on December 7, 1957 at 6:00 PM in honor of Mrs. ROSE SOBELL, "mother of the scientist, MORTON SOBELL" and WARREN K. BILLINGS, "co-defendant in the well-known MOONEY-BILLINGS frame-up case, who will speak for the first time in San Diego." The invitation also contained the following statement: "This will be a rare opportunity for concerned San Diegans to hear a first-hand report on the SOBELL case from one who is no stranger to the tragedies that result from a miscarriage of justice."

On December 10, 1957 T-5 advised that the BILLINGS meeting was held as scheduled on December 7, 1957. About 50 people were present. T-5 advised that it was announced at that meeting that Mrs. ROSE SOBELL was unable to attend due to illness. Introductory speeches were made by both LESSNER and GOSTIN.

The speaker, BILLINGS, implied among other things, that the success of the Soviet earth satellite, and the failure of the U. S. satellite, proved that the charges against the ROSENBERGS and SOBELL were false. He also charged that the U. S. Government had released documents in the SOBELL case to Look Magazine and that was the only time the court saw them, making its mind up based on that alone. He also said that the SOBELL case was like his own and MOONEY's, that is, a complete "frame-up."

Also announced at the meeting was the information that a filmed recording of a TV program made by Mrs. HELEN SOBELL, wife of MORTON SOBELL, had been made and it was hoped that it could be shown in San Diego soon.

Although it was not so stated, NORMAN THOMAS is, presumably, the man who was many times the candidate for the President of the United States of the Socialist Party, according to T-5. u

2. A reprint from the November 2, 1957 issue of The Nation, a magazine, of an editorial called "Preview of a White Paper." This editorial criticized the U. S. Department of Justice for allowing the "exclusive preview" of a study made by the Justice Department of its own handling of the ROSENBERG-SOBELL case. The editorial alleges that allowing an exclusive preview permits the inference to be drawn that it is biased. The editorial concludes that the study should be made available for inspection by the press. u

3. A tabloid newspaper published by CSJMS in August 1957. This 4-page newspaper has the following title "...that Justice Shall Be Done" The subheading is "A Newspaper to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL." u

On the last page of the tabloid it is urged that copies of it be distributed by buying additional copies from the CSJMS, 940 Broadway, New York City, at the rate of \$.10 per single copy, \$3.00 per hundred copies, and \$20.00 per 1000 copies.

The tabloid is devoted exclusively to the ROSENBERG-SOBELL case, with comments from different countries and persons. Half of page two is devoted to an "appeal" which it states was "made public by SOBELL's wife." It is addressed to President Eisenhower and requests a new trial for SOBELL or Executive Pardon, and then follows a "partial listing" of signers of this appeal, listed according to their occupations, that is, Lawyers, Ministers, Rabbis, Educators, Writers, and "other eminent signers."

On 10/16/57, NK 2105 - S*, a source close to DAVID and EMILY ALMAN, Englishtown, N.J., furnished a roll of 35mm film consisting of approximately 50 photographs, the main portion of which are of pages in a blank looseleaf notebook which the informant advises were among the effects of DAVID ALMAN. The Newark Office by letter dated 11/25/57 forwarded this developed film to the NYO as much as DAVID and EMILY ALMAN have in the past been active in the NCSJMS.

"The Bazaar started about 1 or 2 pm. The dinner started at 5:30pm. After dinner the bazaar began to close down. This annual bazaar was the first time that it was sponsored solely by the FREEDOM OF THE PRESS, in years past that it had other sponsors such as the Minnesota Committee for the Protection of Foreign Born and the Civil Rights Congress.

"The person that chaired the program for the bazaar was ROBERT WYNN.

"The program consisted of a film, one by FRANK SINATRA called THE HOUSE WE LIVE IN, which was a film produced back in 1940. Purpose of the film was against discrimination because of religion or national origin. There was also a cartoon of CHARLIE CHAPLIN which were of real old vintage - no sound to them whatsoever.

"They had the Paloma Singers which sang and put on a program and two sisters, one which played the violin and the other played the piano accordion. I don't know what their names were.

"CLARENCE SHARP gave a short speech telling of THE WORKER - how the WORKER was the one that fought for unemployment insurance, social security, etc., during the depression and that it was such a paper which could lead the fight for freedom and peace in the united states today.

"There were various items for sale at the tables such as food, candies, clothing, and books mostly. The food consisted of bread, honey, and canned stuff, which various people had donated. Various kinds of candies and clothing were also donated. The books were from the North Star Book Shop and they were children's books, books on current events, and current books that are out.

"There was also the announcement that the movie SALT OF THE EARTH would be shown at the YWCA in Mpls. on 12/1 and that MALCOLM SHARP would speak, I believe at the Nicollet Hotel in the Minnesota Room. He will speak on the MORTON SOBELL case and everybody there was invited. Mrs. MORTON SOBELL was there also. She spoke briefly and she invited everybody there to a reception that evening at which she would be. The address of the reception I do not know at the present.

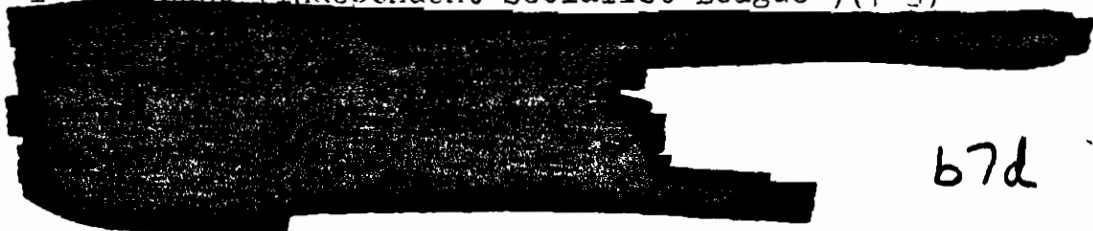

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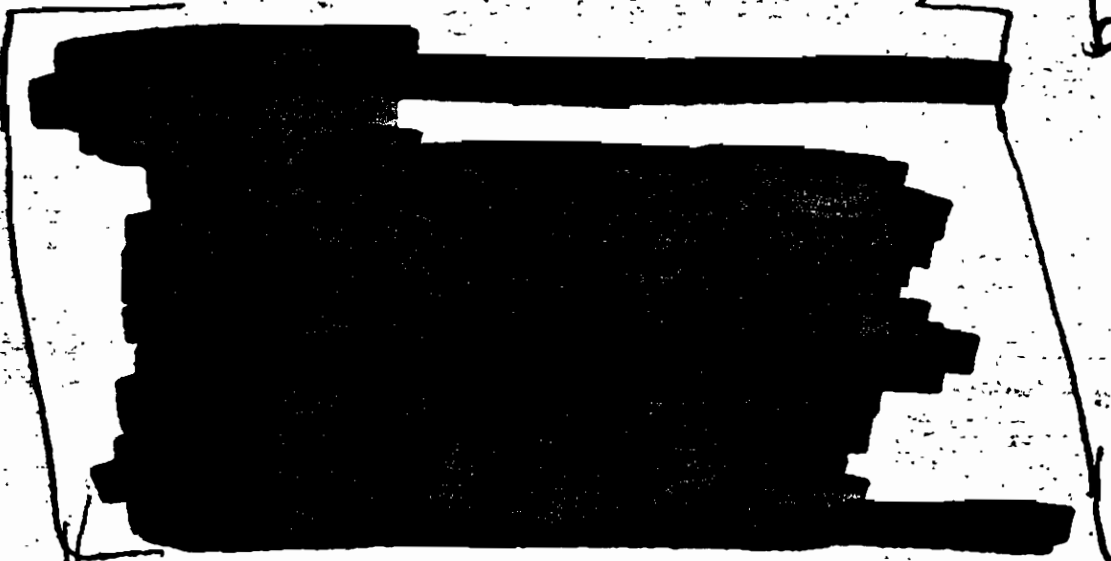
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" Sherry presided. Renee introduced a motion to support the Morton Sobel campaign. This was hotly debated as many of those present did not wish to commit the YSA to too many activities at this point. The motion was finally passed. Gil gave a report of the executive committee which consisted of proposed plans for the future. The executive suggested a series of films on alternate Friday nights. It suggested also a new series of forums under the general heading of Socialism and Ethics. One of the forums proposed was a discussion of Juvenile Delinquency with emphasis on the Santana Case and the negro youth in Philadelphia who has received the death sentence. This was debated at great length and it was finally voted to instruct the executive committee to proceed with the plans for the forum including the question of Juvenile Delinquency.

"Martha gave a report on the American Forum for Socialist Education conference to be held on the following Saturday. She urged everyone to attend and asked for volunteers to serve as ushers and at the doors.

"Marty gave a report on the party for the fund drive for the newspaper. It has been postponed until the following Saturday. He assigned committees to share the work and responsibilities for the evening.

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"Paul Greenberg gave a report on the ECLC abolition campaign of the House Un-American Committee. He said he was representing the ECLC at this meeting (YSA). He told of the country wide campaign which was gaining momentum but that the results anticipated were long range rather than immediate. He said that he himself was engaged in a community drive. He urged the YSA to take part in the campaign and suggested the ECLC program of visiting congressmen in the New York area.

"This created much discussion and debate on the value of dealing with bourgeois congressmen and many opposed it. Dick DeHaan suggested that we confine our activities to printing leaflets and distributing them and urging people to protest the activities of the House committee. Gil was all for the visiting of congressmen while Renee opposed it was futile. Bert suggested that the YSA should try to work with other youth groups such as YSL, SDA and any liberal groups urging them to join in the fight to abolish the committee.

"In the final vote it was decided to set up a legislative committee of the YSA to deal with this campaign and the Sobel case. Paul was elected chairman (Greenberg). Those serving on the committee would decide for themselves what form their activities would take.

"Paul Greenberg said that he once went as a member of a communist youth group to argue with Senator Mundt against the Mundt-Nixon bill.

"Virginia Halstead mentioned that Myra Weiss had flown to California to her ailing husband who has a heart condition, hence there will be no class on Capital on Monday. She said also that Fred Halstead was attending a convention.

"George, mentioned above was previously described in a previous report. He is about 5'10", blonde crew cut hair, fair, slender. He is from New Hampshire and was with the LYL there. He has just returned from the south where he is a trainee organizer for the ILGWU. He is a member of the YSA."
