The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of January 2, 1957, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case:

"1. Following the execution of atomic spies ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG in June 1953, the 'Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon MORTON SOBELL, the ROSENBERGS! codefendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case -- a Communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States -- was reconstituted as the -National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee at a . conference in Chicago in October 1953 and then as the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case. National headquarters remained at 1050 6th Avenue, New York City. Co-chairmen of the newest organization were DANIEL MARSHALL and JOSEPH BRAININ.

# APPENDIX PAGE "NATIONAL GGARDIAN"

The Committee on Un-American Activities, on page 12 of its report dated August 25, 1956, stated the "National Guardian" was established by the American Labor Party in 1947 as a "progressive" weekly. The report continued by stating that although the "National Guardian" denies having any affiliation with the Communist Party, it has manifested itself. from the beginning, as a virtual official propaganda arm of Soviet Russia.

The Special Committee on Un-American Activities, in their report of March 29, 1944, stated that "for years the Communists have put forth the greatest efforts to capture the entire American Labor Party throughout New York State. They succeeded in capturing the Manhattan and Brooklyn sections of the American Labor Party but outside of New York City they have been unable to win control."

The Internal Security Subcommittee of the Senate Judiciary Committee, in its report dated April 23, 1956, states that "Communist dissimulation extends into the field of political parties forming political front organizations such as the American Labor Party. The Communists are thus able to present their candidates for elective office under other than a straight Communist label."

On October 7, 1956, PETER HAWLEY, New York State Chairman, American Labor Party, publicly announced the American Labor state committee unanimously approved a resolution dissolving the organization and ordering the liquidation of its assets.



"I attended an open Civil Rights Meeting Friday evening, June 19, 1959 at 831 Main St., sponsored by the Buffalo Labor Forum (WORKERS WORLD PARTY). The main speaker was Dr. Annette Rubinstein who spoke on the fight to free from jail Morton Sobell, a young American scientist who was accused of being in a conspiracy to commit espionage and brought to trial with Ethel and Julius Rosenberg.



"Lew Griswold was Chairman of the meeting and introduced Vera Spruill as the first speaker. She reported the recent activities of the Mothers Alliance. She stated that the Mothers Alliance had won a victory from the W.T. Grant Company, which will result in the hiring of negro sales girls at the Main Street store. She spoke of the picket line at the Grant down-town store. She also stated that they formed a picket line at the Grant store on Jefferson Ave., Saturday, June 13. She stated that the Grant Company agreed to meet the Mothers Alliance on Tuesday, June 16 and a delegation called on the Manager, Mr. Mazuca. The appointment was made by Vincent Suitt. industrial secretary of the Buffalo Urban League, after the group had picketed the Grant Store on Jefferson Ave. Those present at the conference were Vera Spruill, DeirCre Griswold, Ruth Stone, Vincent Suitt, Robert Mazuca and Mr. Smitherman, editor of the EMPIRE STAR. The manager explained that he was from Philadelphia, having been in Buffalo only a short time and had been too busy to look into the policies of the store. The manager agreed to give -Negro girls equal opportunity and they would begin screening sales girls for the Grant Store. They also distributed leaflets at the

Saturday picket at the Grant Jefferson Ave., store.

"Lew Griswold then introduced Dr. Annette Rubinstein, the main speaker of the evening. She started by giving a brief history of the Ethel and Julius Rosenberg case. She stated that in 1950 Morton Sobell, wife and family were touring in Mexico. That the F.B.I. went down to Mexico and literally kidnapped the Sobell family. Sobell was accused of being in conspiracy to commit espionage and brought to trial with Ethel and Julius Rosenberg and the verdict at the time was guilty with 30 years imprisonment penalty. She stated the charges against Sobell were supported mainly by the testimeny of a man named Max Elitcher. She stated Sobell was never implicated with atomic espionage for which the Rosenbergs are convicted, but the fact that he was tried with the Rosenbergs made it difficult to separate the two cases and recognize the different, character of the two charges. She said that Sobell has now served nearly 8 years in prison, 6 of them in Alcatraz.

\*Dr. Rubinstein stated that the prison chaplain at Alcatraz, Rev. McCormack, a Presbyterian minister, fully believes that Morton Sobell is innocent. Shortly after Rev. McCormack made public his belief that Sobell was innocent he was let out of Alcatraz. He is now working in his behalf and giving talks throughout the country. She stated that many clergymen have signed up asking for the release of Morton Sobell. Dr. Rubinstein asked the Buffalo people to try to get signatures of clergymen in Buffalo. Also to form a committee and work for the release of Morton Sobell and third to help financially. There was a collection taken up

of sentence.

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DETAILS:

NATIONAL COMMITTEE TO SECURE JUSTICE FOR MORTON SOBELL IN THE ROSENBERG CASE

The "Guide To Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of January 2, 1957, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D. C., contains the following concerning the National Committee to Secure Justice For Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case:

"1. Following the execution of atomic spies Ethel and Julius Rosenberg in June 1953, the 'Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon Morton Sobell,' the Rosenbergs' codefendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case-a Communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States-- was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee at a conference in Glacago in October 1953 and "then as the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case." National headquarters remained at 1050 6th Avenue, New York City. Co-chairmen of the newest organization were Daniel Marshall and Joseph Brainin.

(Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, 'Trial by Treason: The National Committee to Secure Justice for the Rosenbergs and Morton Sobell, August 25, 1956, pp. 118 and 120; also cited in Annual Report for 1955, House Report 1648, January 17, 1956, originally released January 11, 1956, p. 30)"

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The National Committee to Secure Justice for MORION SOBELL, the Committee to Secure Justice for MORION SOBELL and the SOBELL Committee will be referred to in this report by the initials NCSJMS, CSJMS and SC where appropriate.

The Communist Party (CP), USA, and the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

#### A. NATIONAL COMMITTEE

#### 1. Location and Purpose

A physical surveillance by a Special Agent (SA) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on July 23, 1959, reflected that the headquarters of the CSJMS are at 940 Broadway, New York City, that the mailbox in the lobby of this building is labelled "SOBELL Committee" and the building directory contains the listing "Room D - SOBELL Committee" and "--Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL".

New York T-1 advised on June 25,1959, that the President of the SC was HELEN L. SOBELL and the Secretary-Treasurer was JENNIE RATNER.

The information furnished by New York T-1 is not to be made public except in the usual proceedings following the issuance of a subpoena duces tecum.

on February 2, 1944, HELEN GUREWITZ (HELEN SOBELL, Mrs. MORTON SOBELL), as a member of the Education and Literature Committee of the CP in Washington, D.C. as of February 1, 1944.

RATUER had stated publicly on various occasions that she (RATNER) was a member of the CP.

advised on May 28, 1959, that HELEN SOBELL, wife of MORTON SOBELL, stated on May 22, 1959, that the primary motive of the SC at present was to obtain the release or parole of MORTON SOBELL and that the Committee would then try to obtain a pardon for him.

#### 2. Activities

Curnished the following summary of the activities and personnel of the CSJMS on February 11, 1959:

The National Headquarters of the CSJMS and the New York City Headquarters are in Room D, 940 Broadway, New York City; The Committee was formed after the execution of the ROSENBERGS for the purpose of securing the freedom of MORTON SOBELL; There are SOBELL Committee branches in most larger cities such as San Francisco, Los Angeles, Milwaukee, Chicago, Philadelphia, Minneapolis and Syracuse; The National Committee forms and coordinates the policies but each local committee is autonomous, self-supporting and implements the national policy in any way they see fit; The motivating force in the National Committee is the New York Committee with TED JACOBS, LEAH SCHNEIDER, JUDY SWETSKY and AARON KATZ being the nucleus of the New York Committee; The major workload is handled by the New York Office and all printing material comes from the New York Office; Local Committees collect funds and send to the National Office funds over and above expenses but most of the money raised is by the New York Committee which supplies approximately 75 per cent of the money needed; The Committee is in dire need of funds and printing and mailings have been postponed because of lack of funds;

made available on March 20, 1959, memorandum number 40 dated February 13, 1959, on the letterhead 670 of the CSJMS which states that BEN RATNER has been elected chairman of the New York SC.



advised on December 18, 1956, that WILLIAM WOLF was an "old party hack" who was active in the youth movement in the CP. Idvised that she had not heard WOLF referred to as TED JACOBS.




advised that SWETSKY had never admitted CP membership but had mentioned interest in the activities of the Young Communist League (YCL).

The YCL has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

New York T-8 advised on April 27, 1944, that AARON KATZ was a member of the CP for six years and had been transferred into the Waterfront Section of the CP on December 23, 1943.

According to New York T-8, KATZ, in 1944, held CP membership book number 31250.



New York T-12 advised on February 1 1948, that WARREN BILLINGS had been expelled from the CP on a prior date not known to the informant.

JEAN BRUST was a current member of the SWP.

On January 19, 1959, Advised that PEARL CHERTOV was currently a member of the Philadelphia Branch of the SVP.

GILMAN was at that time a current member of the CP.



advised on January 17, 1955, that IRMA (WIDGE) NEWMAN was a member of the American Youth For Democracy (AYD) while attending New York University, New York City from 1943 to 1945.

The AYD has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.



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advised that on June 24, 1959, in Washington, D. C., a MISS MILNOR ALEXANDER of Bryn Mawr Collège, Bryn Mawr, Pennsylvania, gave a lecture to a group of approximately 15 individuals, representing local organizations in the area, and added that Miss ALEXANDER stated that she was currently traveling around the United States speaking to groups interested in obtaining the release of MORTON SOBELL from prison.

Stated that Miss ALEXANDER emphasized the sentence SOBELL received and compared it with the relatively light sentence that KLAUS FUCHS of England received for the same 670 crime.

Conference of the CSJMS was tentatively scheduled for September, 1959, presumably to be held in New York City.

Moreover, Morton Sobell, maintaining his innocence, remains imprisoned under a 30-year sentence, thus giving an urgency in human terms as well as in historical necessity.

"We propose that a Commission of Inquiry be established that would meet the requirements for the kind of scholarly, independent and objective investigation necessary.

"It is not without an awareness of the sacrifice in time and energy which must be expanded that we address this request to you. Yet in other vital issues of the past, citizens have traditionally come forward in this manner. It is a strong sense of responsibility which impels us to take this initial step in helping to establish such a Commission of Inquiry.

"We therefore respectfully ask you to consider serving on this proposed inquiry commission. Kindly address your comment to Reverend Peter Mc Cormack, 2801 Turk Street, San Francisco, California.

The chiracterization of the "National Guardian" is found in the appendix section hereto.

On page 10 of the May 25, 1959, issue of the "National Guardian" is an advertisement entitled "Wanted Door Openers - Volunteers needed..... Meeting for Morton Sobell, Friday, June 19, 8:00 p.m., Webster Hall, NYC..... Sobell Committee, 940 Broadway....."


On page 9 of the June 8, 1959, issue of the "National Guardica" is a newspaper article entitled "Sobell Meetings in NY and LA" which reports that a New York meeting would be held June 19, 1959, at Webster Hall, New York City, under the auspices of the New York SC, 940 Broadway, New York City, and that delegates from SOBELL Committees on the West Coast would meet in los Angeles during June 26-28 and would attend a banquet on June 27 to support the campaign for freedom of MORTON SOBELL.

On page 10 of the June 8, 1959 and June 15, 1959, issues of the "National Guardian" are box advertisements of a meeting under the auspices of the New York SC to be held June 19, 1959, at Webster Hall, New York City.

On page 6 of the June 29, 1959, issue of the "National Guardian" in a newstype article entitled "1,000 at Rally for Sobell in New York" which reports that more than 1,000 persons attended a meeting at Webster Hall, New York City, on June 19, 1959, six years after the execution of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, to help Professor THOMAS I. EMERSON of Yale Law School, HCRACE KALLEN of the New School for Social Research, and MURRAY ERANCH of Atlanta's

Morehouse College, win freedom for MORTON SOBELL. According to this article, talks were also given by HELEN SOBELL, wife, and ROSE SOBELL, mother. The article reports that Professor BRANCH-said that SOBELL did not receive a fair trial and called for reopening the case or clemency for SOBELL; Doctor KALLEN called the case against SOBELL weak and urged Presidential commutation of sentence; ROSE and HELEN SOBELL discussed life with SOBELL and the events of June 19, 1953, the night that the ROSENBERGS were executed. According to the article close to \$2,000.00 was contributed to the committee by the audience.



idvised on June 29, 1959, that the CSJMS held a meeting at Webster Hall, New York City, on June 19, 1959, at which an admission charge of 100 was requested to the discount of that the speakers, who included Professor EMERSON of Yale, Murray Branch of Atlanta, Georgia, HELEN and ROSE SOBELL, and HORACE KALLEN of New York City, protested the conviction and imprisonment of SOBELL, appealed for funds to fight for reversal of his conviction and pleaded for Presidential commutation of sentence.


that government witnesses lied during the trial in return for not being prosecuted themselves.

public meeting of the CSJMS was held June 19,1959, in New York City, which was attended by approximately 900 person advised that the speakers claimed that SOBELL and the ROSENBERGS were innocent, the victims of mass hysteria due to an unfair press, and demanded reopening of the case or clemency for SOBELL.

Other informants advised on various dates that they had attended a public meeting of the CSJMS on June 19, 1959, at Webster Hall in New York City, and furnished substantially the same information as above.



advised during early June, 1959, that visits to the headquarters of the CSJMS during May and June, 1959, reflected that most of the office work of the committee in the evenings was being handled by volunteers under the direction of AARON KATZ who was in charge of the office and that the volunteers and KATZ spent most of their time soliciting attendance for the June 19, 1959, Webster Hall meeting.

On page 21 of the "Late City Edition" of the February 22, 1959, issue of the "New York Times", daily New York City, newspaper, is a newstype article entitled "Plea Made for SOBELL - Seven Urge Commuting of His Sentence in Atom Spy Case" which reports that a plea for commuting the 30 year sentence of MORTON SOBELL was issued by the following clergymen and professors of law:



a publicity release of the CSJMS set forth as follows:

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A STATEMENT OF THE CASE OF MORTON SOBELL

The undersigned are American citizens who believe that the sentence of MORTON SOBELL should now be commuted. SOBELL was convicted of conspiring with others to transmit to the Soviet Union writings and information relating to the national defense of the United States and was sentenced on April 1, 1951 to serve thirty years in Federal Prison.

MORTON SOBELL was tried with JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG who were convicted of espionage in connection with the atomic bomb and who were sentenced to death and later executed. SOBELL, however, was never implicated in any way with involvement in the atomic espionage for which the ROSENBERGS were convicted. This fact was confirmed by the judge who sentenced SOBELL.

This statement is not concerned with the ROSENBERG conviction. The undersigned are and consistently have been convicted anti-Communists. None are associated with any organization, committee, or group of any kind concerned either with the case of the ROSENBERGS or that of SOBELL, nor are any of the undersigned connected—in any way with MORTON SOBELL or any members of his family. After study of the case, we believe that the following considerations warrant a commutation of the very heavy sentence SOBELL is now serving.

1. SOBELL was never implicated with atomic espionage for which the ROSENBERGS were convicted.

2

- 2. The charges against SOBELL, supported mainly by the testimony of one man, MAX ELITCHER, were that he had solicited information, and had on one occasion taken something which looked like a can of film to JULIUS ROSENBERG. No specific item of information supposed to have been secured by him or transmitted by him to anyone else is specified in the record. The case against him, therefore, is vague in content and slender in proof. The possibility that a trip to Mexico which he and his family took should be construed as flight cannot be ignored, though it is subject to various interpretations.
- 3. Whether or not the judge and prosecution made sufficient efforts to provide a fair trial, we ought to recognize that the emotions surrounding the trial of the ROSENBERGS and the fact that SOBELL's case was tried with theirs made it difficult to separate the two cases and to recognize the very different character of the two charges and the evidence introduced to support them respectively.
- 4. SOBELL has already served, with good conduct, nearly eight years in prison, six of them in Alcatraz.

5. As Americans we are fully aware of the threat of communism to our freedom and way of life. Any attack on that freedom from without or within must be resisted. Mevertheless, one of the factors which makes that freedom to precious is its capacity to practice a disciplined and humane administration of justice precisely in those cases where emotions are aroused which make it difficult to remain objective about the merits of a specific case. We believe a commutation of the SOBELL Sentence would demonstrate our national faith in that freedom.



"These dual interests are closely interrelated. At the core of the problem of friendly relations between countries is the mutual respect and observance of territorial sovereignty. We hope to show that the practice of international kidnapping of a person from the territory of a Latin American country so as to effectuate his return to the United States is a naked violation of the principle of territorial sovereignty and a source of suspicion and distrust between nations......

"One of the most significant, if not the single most important guarantee of good relations between the United States and its Latin American neighbors is the scrupulous regard and respect for national sovereignty......

"In this statement we are concerned with a separate but related aspect of the problem of recognition and respect for national sovereignty which we respectfully submit lies at the core of our relations with Latin American countries. This aspect is the unlawful and irregular kidnapping of persons in Latin American countries to obtain their return to the United States. This situation sharply raises the important issues of violation and total disregard of solemn extradition treaty obligations, violation of the internationally recognized right of æylum, and disregard for the established policies governing law enforcement and the administration of justice in the country whose sovereignty is so violated....."

JEAN FRANTJIS congratulated RICHARD BROWN on the success of the meeting held on May 22, 1959, at the Southampton Friends Meetinghouse. BROWN then told the group that 100 pamphlets on the SOBELL case had been mailed to clergy in the Levittown area. FRANTJIS suggested that this mailing should be followed by personal contacts to increase the effectiveness of the mailings. Plans were made to contact some of the ministers of the Lower Bucks County Council of Churches. MARIAN DOCKHORN agreed to have her husband, WAYNE DOCKHORN, who is acquainted with some of these ministers, brief the Committee on the various members and which ones would be receptive to an approach by the Committee.



The May 25, 1959, issue of the "National Guardian" on page 11 carried an announcement that Mrs. HELEN SOBELL, wife of MORTON SOBELL, would speak on May 22, 1959, at the Southampton Friends Meeting, Street Road at Gravel Hill Road, Southampton, Pa., under the auspices of the LBCCSJMS.



On May 28, 1959, and advised that on May 22, 1959, the LBCCSJMS sponsored a meeting at the Southampton Friends Meetinghouse, Street Road and Gravel Hill Road, Southampton, Pa. Mimeographed announcements had been distributed concerning this meeting

The announcements were mailed with the return address 30 Crystal Road, Levittown, Pa.

On May 28, 1959, and advised that he attended the meeting of the LBCCSJMS on May 22, 1959, at the Southampton Friends Meetinghouse. Approximately 80 people attended this meeting and HELEN SOBELL was the principal speaker. She stated that the primary interest of the

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NCSJMS was to obtain SOBELL's release or pardle from prison. After his release then efforts would be made to obtain a pardon for him. She stated that leading inhividuals have publically expressed their belief in his innocence, among whom were BERTRAM RUSSELL, DR. HAROLD UREY, and PETER MC CORMACK, Former Protestant Chaplain at Alcatraz Prison.

RICHARD BROWN also spoke saying that he first became interested in the SOBELL case approximately two years previously when he attended a public meeting sponsored by the Philadelphia SOBELL Committee. It was announced that there would be no collection taken and no literature distributed in the Southampton Friends Meetinghouse out of deference to the Quakers. WAYNE DOCKHORN then announced that everyone present was invited to his home immediately following adjournment of the meeting and that those who wished could make a financial contribution at his residence. also advised that at the conclusion of the meeting, literature reflecting that it was issued by the LBCCSJMS was distributed outside the meeting house.

At the conclusion of the meeting, most of those present at the Southampton Friends Meetinghouse went to the DOCKHORN residence, Woods Road, Southampton, Pa., where refreshments were served

On May 28, 1959, advised that PETER and MOLLIE SMOLLETT and FRANK and GERTRUDE KINCES attended the meeting sponsored by the LBCCSJMS on May 22, 1959, at the Southampton Friends Meetinghouse.

On May 28, 1959, advised that on May 22, 1959, HELEN SOBELL appeared on the interview program of LOU HAHN, Radio Station WBCP, Levittown, Pa. In this interview, Mrs. SOBELL attacked the Government witnesses HARRY GOLD and MAX ELEITCHER in the SOBELL case. Another source advised on 5/15/59 that the Thiladelphia Sobell Committee continues to be active and has expanded into Lower Ducks County, Pennsylvania. Its activities are concerned primarily with raising funds to be used in an attempt to secure the release of MONTON CORELL from prison.



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
On July 6, 1959, who has furnished reliable information in the past, furnished to SA J. WAYNE PARRISH by 670 mail the following:

The July, 1959, issue of "Today's Verdict", published by the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell and a mimeographed letter dated July, 1959, on the stationery of the Chicago Sobell Committee (CSC), 20 West Jackson Boulevard, Chicago, Illinois.

This letter is addressed to "Dear Friends" and signed by "David L. Soltker for the committee". This letter was utilized to enclose the copy of the tabloid "Today's Verdict", and it states in part:

"As current as this paper is, it was impossible to include the news of the past several weeks. In New York, 1,000 people attended a public meeting on June 19. Chairman of the meeting was Professor Thomas Emerson of Yale Law School and the principal speakers were Professor Horace Kallen of the New School of Social Research in New York and Professor Murray Branch of Morehouse College in Atlanta...."

The letter also states that in Chicago more than twenty ministers and rabbis have agreed to sponsor an appeal to every clergyman in the Chicago area to join in the appeal for MORTON SOBELL.

The letter also stated that the CSC was planning another garden party late in August, 1959, the details of which would be announced later.
