



COMMITTEE TO FREE MORTON SOBELL

"Following the execution of atomic spies Ethel and Julius Rosenberg in June, 1953, the 'Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon Morton Sobell,' the Rosenbergs' co-defendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case - a communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States - was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg - Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October, 1953, and 'then the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case'..."

14 years ago tomorrow. Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, parents of two small children, died in the electric chair in Sing-Sing.

The charge against them: "conspiring to commit espionage." It was claimed they "stole the secret of the atom-bomb."

From the moment of their arrest, the Rosenbergs and their co-defendant Morton Sobell insisted on their innocence. Millions throughout the world, doubting their guilt or troubled by the harshness of the sentence, pleaded for their lives to be spared.

But the Administration rebuffed all pleas—even intervention by the Pope and the President of France. The Rosenbergs went to their death on June 19, 1953. Sobell was sentenced to 30 years in jail, and is still behind bars today.

Were the doubts stilled by their execution?

Many warned, even then, that death would not quiet the doubts in the Rosenberg-Sobell case.

Today, those doubts are more troubling than ever.

In 1965, a 467-page book, "Invitation to an Inquest", published by Doubleday, subjected the entire case to rigorous examination. Authors Miriam and Walter Schneir, conducting independent investigations, came up with evidence of perjury by a key prosecution witness, and forgery of a critical document by agents of the F.B.I. They concluded there was no case against Ethel and Julius Rosenberg and Morton Sobell.

The Washington Star commented: "...it is difficult to read the hook without coming to the conclusion that, at the least, it is unlikely that the Rosenbergs and Sobell were guilty..."

The Chicago Daily News reviewer wrote: "This book ... troubles my conscience. It should be of concern to all Americans. An inquest is needed."

Last year, the scientific basis of the prosecution's case was sharply undermined. A copy of the atombomb sketch the Rosenbergs were accused of transmitting to the Russians was un-impounded from the original trial testimony. Dr. Henry Linschitz and Dr. Philip Morrison—nuclear physicists who worked on the original atom-bomb—were asked to evaluate it. In sworn affidavits, both scientists pronounced the sketch worthless, charged it was "not factually correct ... confused and imprecise ... incorrect and misleading," and emphasized that there was no simple "secret" of the atom-bomb that could have been stolen and transmitted as claimed.

Yet trial Judge Kaufman was led to justify the death sentence on the grounds that the Rosenbergs had transmitted the A-bomb secret to the Russians,

thereby causing the Korean War "with the resultant casualties exceeding 50,000 ..." (The Rosenbergs denied transmitting anything.)

Said Dr. Linschitz: "The statement made by Judge Kaufman, has no foundation in fact."

Isn't it time the facts were heard?

Ethel and Julius Rosenberg are dead. Nothing can bring them back to life.

But Morton Sobell—imprisoned at 33, now 50 years old—is still in jail.

On the basis of new evidence, attorneys for Sobell have gone into court charging the knowing use of fraud, perjury and forgery to obtain convictions. They have asked for a full and open hearing on the charges.

But the Department of Justice has opposed any re-opening of the case, and a lower court has so far upheld the government's position.

Therefore Sobell's attorneys are carrying the appeal to higher courts. And we are bringing the facts in the case to your attention.

We do not ask you to agree with us that Ethel and Julius Rosenberg and Morton Sobell were innocent.

We ask only that you agree the interests of justice require a hearing to be granted where charges of such gravity are made.

It is as much in the interest of the United States as of Morton Sobell to see to it that justice is done and that injustice is rectified, even when it is committed by the government. The bitter truth is that, despite years of litigation, the Supreme Court has never reviewed the evidence on which the Rosenbergs and Sobell were convicted nor passed on the fairness of the trial.

A full and open hearing can do no harm to the people or the institutions of the United States. But it can do much to dispel the lingering doubts in the case. It may even vindicate the Rosenbergs and end the long agony of Morton Sobell. Most of all, it will redeem the honor of our nation.

If you agree that a hearing should be held, won't you help? One thing you can do is to write to Attorney General Clark, Washington, D.C., asking him to withdraw objection to a hearing and to release Sobell on bail until it is held. The Committee is also in urgent need of funds to press the appeal, and welcomes contributions. Additional information on the case is available at cost (see below.)

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL were convicted in United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on March 29, 1951, on a charge of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet The ROSENBERGs were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951, and MORTON SOBELL was sentenced to thirty years imprisonment JULIUS and ETHEL on the same date. ROSENBERG were legally executed at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953, and MORTON SOBELL is currently serving his sentence at the Federal Penitentiary, Lewisburg, Pennsylvania.



After June 26, 1967, the aim and purpose of the LACFMS was the continuation of fund raising in behalf of MORTON SOBELL.





The accomplishments include a change of name for the organization to Los Angeles Committee for Defense of the Bill of Rights, inasmuch as Defense of the Bill of Rights is all inclusive.

A source advised on 5/16/67 that the Los Angeles Committee for Pefense of the Bill of Rights, still referred to by many individuals as the Los Angeles Committee for Protection of Foreign Born, is currently active in the Los Angeles area.

A source advised on May 12, 1967, that the May Day Celebration in Los Angeles, in recent years, (excepting 1958) has been covertly organized by the leadership of the Southern California District Communist Party (ECDC) using the name May Day Committee, United May Day Committee, "Committee for '75 Years of May Day'", or variations thereof. Source advised that no actual committee is formed for this purpose, but an appropriate name is selected for purposes of advertising and sponsorship of the celebration. The actual arrangements for the celebrations have usually been made by BEN DOBBS, Executive Secretary of the SCDCP, with DOBBS and DOROTHY HEALEY, Chairman, SCDCP, sharing responsibility for chairing the celebration and making the "pitch". Funds raised through the rally are usually used by the SCDCP to offset current deficits. In 1958, the May Day Celebration was openly sponsored by the SCDCP.



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



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Morton Sobell in New Appeal For Hearing by High Court

WASHINGTON — The U.S. Supreme Court now has in its hands a new appeal by Morton Sobell charging that "his conviction had been fraudulently contrived, in that the government knowingly used false, perjured and forged evidence."

Legal papers asking that the Court accept the Sobell case for review also charged that the government had "suppressed evidence-which would have impeached its case, and that the prosecution falsely characterized and exaggerated the evidence adduced against the defendants."

The high court has never reviewed the case of Morton Sobell, now in the 18th year of a 30-year sentence imposed in his trial with Julius and Ethel Rosenberg on a charge of "conspiracy to commit espionage." Sobell has steadfastly sought to prove his innocence. The Rosenbergs insisted on their innocence prior to execution in 1953 which took place despite world-wide protests.

The latest appeal contends that lower court Judge Edward

Weinfeld acted illegally in denying Sobell a hearing to prove the fraud against him, in that he decided issues of fact without permitting the hearing required by law to determine the truth.

At the core of the Sobell appeal are two-key points:

- 1. Evidence that the prosection knowingly presented false testimony and claims to make the court and jury believe that the "secret" of the atomic bomb had been stolen.
- 2. Evidence that a forged hotel registration card and false testimony were used to prove an alleged espionage meeting that never took place.

Sobell is imprisoned in Lewisburg, Pa., and has been eligible for parole since July, 1962.

New Appeal To Supreme Court To Free Morton Sobell

In a press release, from the "Committee To Free Morton Sobell", there was a statement that this body has submitted an appeal to the Supreme Court to receive and revise the jail sentence of Morton Sobell.

The appeal to the Supreme Court states, according to the report, that "the conviction of Sobell was achieved in by means of a swindle. The government, knowingly, used "false proof".

Sobell has been in jail for 18 years of a thirty year sentence. Up to the present time the Supreme Court has never taken up Sobell's conviction, who was sentenced together with Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, who were later burned in the electric chair on the charge of "conspiracy to commit espionage".

The Rosenberg's insisted on their innocence until the last moment when they were executed in 1953.

Famous legal authorities in various countries of the world, after acquainting themselves with the charges, have stated that Ethel and Julius Rosenberg were victims of legal murder and that Morton Sobell has been languishing in jail, although he is innocent.

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Sobell's defense lawyers, who submitted the current appeal to the Supreme Court, are: Marshal Perlin, William M. Kunstler, a member of the American Civil Liberties Union; Arthur China (ph), of the law faculty at Rutgers University, Malcolm Sharp, of the law faculty at the University of New Mexico; and Benjamin O.Dreyfus and Vern Countrymen of the law faculty at Yale University.



Sobell is serving a 30-year prison sentence in Lewisburg, Pa. He was convicted as a "spy" together with Jujus and Ethel Rosenberg in the 1951 atom bomb case. The Rosenbergs were executed in 1953.

In this attempt for a new trial, Sobell centended that the government-had used perjured testimony against him.

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Reject Sobell's. Sixth Appeal

WASHINGTON — The U.S.
Supreme Court has rejected another appeal by Morton Sobell, convicted on a charge of spying, along with Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, in the 1951 atombomb case.

In his sixth appeal, Sobell contended the government used perjured testimony against him.

The appeal was denied in Federal District Court last Feb. 14 and in the Second Circuit of Appeals June 26.

This issue stated that this organization was formed by the nationwide supporter clubs of the publication YS.

The above issue, page 6, set forth the Founding Declaration of the YSA. This declaration stated that the YSA recognizes the Socialist Workens Party (SWP) as the only existing political leadership on class struggle principles of revolutionary socialism.

On March 10, 1967, a source advised that the YSA was formed during 1957, by youth of various left socialist tendencies, particularly members and followers of the SWP. The source further advised that the YSA has recently become more open about admitting that it is the youth group of the SWP and that an SWP representative has publicly stated that the YSA is the SWP's youth group.

The headquarters of the YSA are located in Rooms 532-536, 41 Union Square West, New York City.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.



CCDBR was formerly organized on October 25, 1960, with RICHARD CRILEY as Executive Secretary after he motivated organizing the meeting of October 26, 1960.

A third source advised on May 15, 1967, that to original stated purposes of the CCDER continue to be adhered to, with CRILEY continuing as the motivating force behind the Committee. The Board of Directors, however, now unclides many individuals in the religious, educational and labor fields who are not known as CP members.

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CHICAGO COMMITTEE TO DEFEND DEMOCRATIC RIGHTS, Formerly known as Chicago Joint Defense Committee to Defeat the Smith Act

A source advised on April 15, 1958, that the Chicago Joint Defense Committee to Defeat the Smith Act (CJDC) was formed by the Communist Party (CP) in March, 1956.

A second source advised

mittee to Defend Democratic Rights (CCDDR). The purpose of the CCDDR, according to its "Statement of Principles and Organization" was to "...defend and extend the human rights embodied in the Bill of Rights...and to put an end to the political and racial persecution which threaten American democracy today".

The second source further advised on May 18, 1960, that as of May, 1960, the CCDDR continued to function within the framework of its stated principles and that in accordance with its "Statement of Principles and Organization" had a number of "Working Committees" which included the Chicago Smith Act Families Committee, South Side Freedom Committee, and Taft-Hartley Working Committee. The source further stated that as of May, 1960, RICHARD CRILEY was serving as the Executive Secretary of the CCDDR.

This same source advised on February 1, 1961, that the CCDDR continued to operate until October 26, 1960, when the Chicago Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights (CCDBR) was formed and the offices and assets of what was formerly the CCDDR were taken over by the CCDBR. At the October 26, 1960, meeting, a referendum for approval of the above described action was called for, and subsequently votes were solicited from "associates" of the old CCDDR. The source further advised that no formal dissolution meeting of the CCDDR was ever held, but for all intents and purposes, the CCDDR ceased to exist on October 26, 1960, and CRILEY, its Executive Secretary, since that time.

On April 5, 1967, 192 North Clark Street, Chicago, illinois, advised that the Chicago Sobell Committee (CSC) rents Room 714, 192 North Clark Street, Chicago:

A second source advised on May 8, 1964, that DAVID L. SOLTKER appeared to be the guiding force behind this Committee and is assisted by GLRTRUDE SOLTKER, his wife.

A third source advised on February 17, 1967, that the CSC maintains a bank account at the Amalgamated Trust and Savings Bank, 111 South Dearborn, Chicago, and that DAVID SOLTKER is listed in this bank account as the Secretary of the CSC.

The above information cannot be made public except in the usual proceedings following issuance of a subpoena duces tecum.

COMMITTEE TO FREE MORTON SOBELL

"Following the execution of atomic spies Fthel and Julius Rosenberg in June, 1953, the 'Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon Morton Sobell,' the Rosenbergs' co-defendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case - a Communist front which had been conducting the tampaign in the United States - was reconstituted as 'he National Rose; berg - Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October, 1953, and 'then the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case'..."

In September, 1954, the name "National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell" appeared on literature issued by the Committee. In March, 1955, the name; "Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell," first appeared on literature issued by the Committee. In August, 1966, the name "Committee to Free Morton Sobell" first appeared on literature issued by the Committee.

The Address Telephone Directory for the Borough of Machattan, New York City, published by the New York Telephone Company on March 20, 1967, lists the above Committee's address at 150 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York.

FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE

The April 6, 1960, edition of "The New York Times" newspaper contained a full-page advertisement captioned "What Is Really Happening in Cuba," placed by the Fair Play for Cuba Committee" (FPCC). This advertisement announced the formation of the FPCC in New York City and declared the FPCC intended to promulgate "the truth about revolutionary Cuba" to neutralize the distorted American press.

"The New York Times" edition of January 11, 1961, reported that at a hearing conducted before the United States Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on January 10, 1961, Dr. CHARLES A. SANTOS-BUCH identified himself and ROBERT TABER as organizers of the FPCC. He also testified he and TABER obtained funds from the Cuban Government which were applied toward the cost of the aforementioned advertisement.

two years of the FPCC's existence there was a struggle between Communist Party (CP) and Socialist Workers Party (SWP) elements to exert their power within the FPCC, and thereby influence FPCC policy. This source added that during the past year there had been a successful effort by FPCC leadership to minimize the role of these and other organizations in the FPCC so that their influence as of May, 1963, was negligible.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

On May 20, 1963, a second source advised that VINCENT "TED" LEE, FPCC National Office Director, was then formulating FPCC policy and had indicated that he had no intention of permitting FPCC policy to be determined by any other organization. This source stated that LEE believed that the FPCC should advocate resumption of diplomatic relations between Cuba and the United States and should support the right of Cubans to manage their revolution without interference from other nations. LEE did not advocate supporting the Cuban revolution per se.

The December 27, 1963, edition of The New To & World Telegram and Sun" newspaper stated that the promodable PPCC was seeking to go out of business and that its prime and interpolation its lifetime had been sponsorship of pro-CASTRO street railies and mass picket lines, and the direction of an allow propaganda mill highlighting illegal travel-to-Cuba campaigns the comparatively brief span of life was attributed to mounting cati-CASTRO American public opinion, the 1962 Congressional hearings which disclosed PPCC financing by CASTRO's United Nations Delegation, and ultimately, the bad publicity which the PPCC received from disclosures of activities on its behalf by suspected presidential assassin LEE H OSWALD.

On February 6, 1964, the previously meditional second source advised that V. T. LEE had recently remarked that the FPCC was dead and that there were no political to one of the similar organization.

On April 13, 1964, a third source advised, each there had not been any FPCC activity in many months and the first FPCC had been dissolved.

FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE, CHICAGO CHAPTER

A source advised in October, 1860, that the Chicago Chapter of the Pair Play for Cuba Committee (PPCC) was formed during the summer of 1960 at Chicago, illumine, under the direct middles and leadership of RICHARD Fields, a member of the State Committee, Communist Party (CP) of Illinois.

A second scorce in August, 1960, termished a leaflet entitled "What is Rellly Happening in Oubl?" distributed by the FPCC in Chicago. The aims and purposed of the FFTC as set forth in this leaflet include the following: "To disseminate the truth, to combat untruth; to publish and distribute factual information which the United Staves mass, media suppresses. In general, to contribute to foundations for phase, friendship, and understanding between ourselves and the Coman people." The leaflet reflects the FPCC plans to accomplish these aims: "By mailing of information bulletins; organization public meetings and forums, providing speakers, movies, and situate for meetings of interested organizations, placing ads in revenuers; to visit toba and see for themselves what conditions really are."

A third source advised on Raria V, 1964, that there has been no activity of the FPCC in (or sto time late November, 1963, and for all intents and purposes the organization is defunct.

A source on December 17, 1965, advised that the Midwest Committee for Protection of Foreign Born (MCPFB) trom March, 1962, to the latter part of 1965 maintained an office in Room 422, 431 South Dearborn Street, Chicago, 1111/2018

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sivised that the MCPFB was founded at a conformed as the Tillinois, on May 25, 1947, and was to operate as the Tillinois, of the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born (ACPFB).

A second source on May 5, 1955, asvised the second MCPFB in a "Statement of Principles" issued in April, 1955, noted that "The purpose of the Midwest Committee shall be to seek to perpetuate for the foreign born the fundamental concepts of equality, regardless of race, color creed, nationality, political belief or place of birth, and to reaserve the basic ideals of liberty and hospitality which serve as the guarantees of democracy for all Americans."

According to a third source, as of September, 1900 the hePFB was still functioning as the midwest organization of the ACPFB but was considering the possibilities to the test of turning over its work and responsibilities to the test of Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights (CCDBE).

This same source on December 27, 1965, and then the MCPFB had ceased activity and had turned over the ordine and responsibilities to the CCDBR and for all intents and purposes was defunct.



"3. 'To defend the cases of Communist lawbreakers, fronts have been devised making special appeals in behalf of civil liberties and reaching out far beyond the confines of the Communist Party itself. Among these organizations are the * * National Lawyers Guild. When the Communist Party itself is under fire these offer a bulwark of protection.'






MATIONAL LAWYERS GUILD CHICAGO CHAPTER



On May 10, 1967, a second source advised that the headquarters of the BACSC in the San Francisco Bay Area are located at two addresses, 1561 Fillmore Street, San Francisco, and 345 Franklin Street, San Francisco. The BACSC is continuing to function and plan future Sobell affairs.

On December 18, 1959, a third source advised that MARY KRVAR, a member of the Warehouse Club, Communist Party (CP), East Bay Region, Oakland, California, and the paid organizer for the BACSC, has stated that the CP is interested in controlling the BACSC so that the BACSC will continue to follow the line of the National Sobell Committee in attempting to obtain the freedom of MORTON SOBELL.
