In December, 1949, REGINA FRANKFELD, Organizational Secretary, District 4, CP, stated that the Party, by means of the Baltimore Forum, desired to reach a high quality of people, such as doctors, lawyers, and other professional groups. She added that the CP National Office would send well prepared speakers to the Forums.

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On [REDACTED] advised that an announcement was made at a recent CP meeting that a "vigilance watch" would be maintained in front of the White House, Washington, D.C., from December 24, 1952, to January 12, 1953, the date set for the execution of the ROSENBERGS. [REDACTED] also advised that delegates from all over the United States would meet at Turners Arena, Washington, D.C., on January 3-5, 1953, and that leaflets would be distributed nationally in an effort to stimulate mass demand for executive clemency for the ROSENBERGS. [REDACTED] advised that the National CP Office has instructed that the above activities, planned by the National Committee to Secure Justice in the ROSENBERG Case, be given all-out support by CP members and that all CP members should participate in this activity as much as possible. He stated that at least ten CP members from Baltimore were desired to participate in the White House vigil and that all members who can must attend the conference on January 3-5, 1953. b7D

On [REDACTED] advised that District 4 CP members were instructed at meetings during December, 1952, to prepare for a vigil at the White House, Washington, D.C., from December 24, 1952, to January 12, 1953, and a nationwide conference in Washington, D.C., January 3-5, 1953, in support of the ROSENBERGS. b7D

On [REDACTED] advised that GEORGE MEYERS, Chairman, District 4, CP, stated that only those people who are publicly known as "progressives" should attend the ROSENBERG vigil taking place around the White House, Washington, D.C. MEYERS directed that people from Baltimore should support the vigil but not try to control it. b7D

On April 1, 1952, GEORGE MEYERS was convicted in Baltimore for conspiracy to violate the Smith Act of 1940.

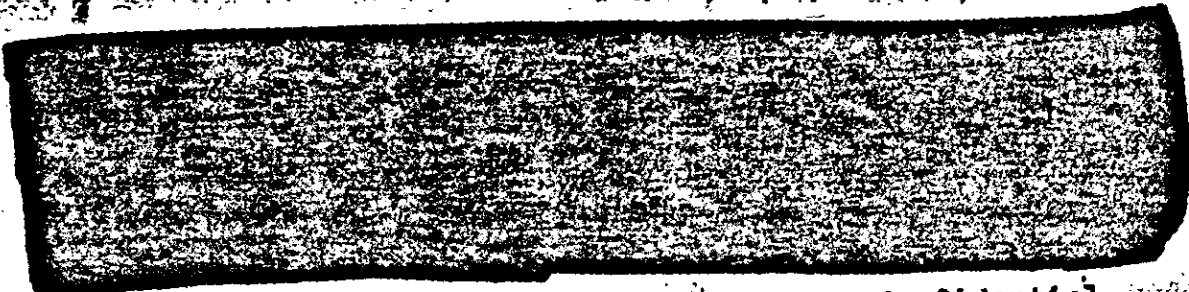

On February 1, 1952, Baltimore Confidential Informant [redacted] advised that the Committee to Uphold the Bill of Rights was organized in the latter part of 1951 in Baltimore, Md., by District 4, CP, with the stated objectives of popularizing the meaning of the Bill of Rights, working for the repeal of the Smith Act of 1940, and assisting the "victims of repressive legislation," namely those District 4, CP, leaders indicated in Baltimore for conspiring to violate the Smith Act. This organization is completely dominated and controlled by District 4, CP.



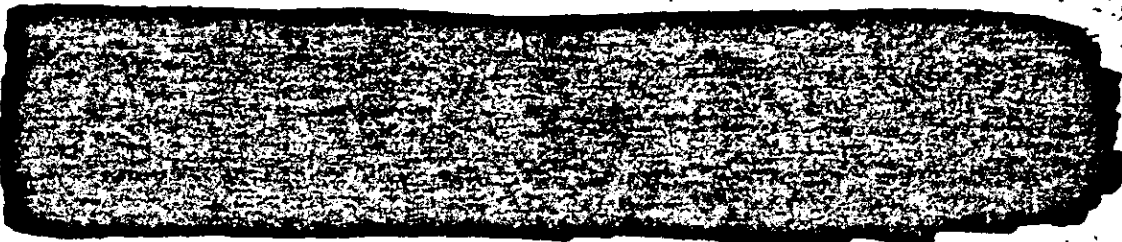

"Their conviction is not backed by a single piece of evidence. In other circumstances, the officials could not get a conviction on such evidence to convict a pick-pocket. There simply does not exist the slightest evidence to confirm the charge of forgery of the Government's name.

"Furthermore, Judge Kaufman had the audacity to claim that the non-existent 'secret' which the Rosenbergs were alleged to have 'stolen' was the cause of the Korean war! There is no 'secret' and they did not 'steal' what did not exist; but the Judge did not hesitate to turn the nation's hatred of Wall Street's profitable war in Korea against two innocent people.

"This horror is arousing the conscience of mankind. Protests and demands for Presidential clemency for the Rosenbergs are

Evidence which Shows the Boston Committee to Secure Clemency in the Rosenberg Case Is Dominated by the Communist Party, USA

A review of the Boston files fails to indicate any information which falls under this classification.

II.

A. Evidence which Shows the Origin of the Boston Committee to Secure Clemency in the Rosenberg Case

(The New York Office is requested to submit as an exhibit Page 3 of the May 5, 1952, issue of the "Daily Worker.")

Page 3 of the May 5, 1952, issue of the "Daily Worker" contained an article captioned "Many Aid Rosenberg Defense, Committees Now in 26 Cities." This article stated the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case announced that Rosenberg Committees had been organized in 25 cities, including Boston, Massachusetts.

The "Daily Worker" is an East Coast Communist newspaper.

This witness can testify that in June, 1952, a meeting concerning the ROSENBERGS was scheduled to be held on June 18, 1952, at the Community Church Center, Boston, Massachusetts.

Can testify that this meeting was held at the Community Church, Boston, Massachusetts, and that approximately 80 persons attended. 

"The ROSENBERGS, a husband and wife spy team, were sentenced to death for transmitting atom bomb secrets to Russia. The Communist leaders were imprisoned for advocating the violent overthrow of the government.

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"The ROSENBERG case is currently the principal propaganda promotion of the Communist party. The drive to free the party leaders has been a continuing activity since they were jailed 18 months ago.

"It is significant that the Communist party ignored the ROSENBERGS during their trial and for nine months after their conviction. (The Daily Worker printed nothing during that period except a three sentence story on the verdict.) It also is significant that the organized propaganda campaign started when the Communists decided to exploit the case for their own purposes.

"The Communists have been notably successful in enlisting the aid of clergymen in support of the ROSENBERGS and the imprisoned party leaders."

This witness can produce the January 22, 1953 issue of the Boston Traveler, a newspaper published in Boston, Massachusetts, which contained an article on page one captioned, "Right-Led' Units Target of Party" by political writer CORNELIUS DALTON, which read in part as follows:

"The ROSENBERG clemency campaign has been promoted on a world-wide basis by the Communists, with protest meetings staged in various countries.

"The 'united front' tactic has been used effectively to gain non-Communist support.

"Locally, the campaign has been led by the Boston Committee to secure Clemency in the ROSENBERG Case, with headquarters at 93 Massachusetts Avenue."



Evidence which Shows the Boston Committee to Secure Clemency in the Rosenberg Case Is Dominated by the Communist Party, USA

A review of the Boston files fails to indicate any information which falls under this classification.

II.

A. Evidence which Shows the Origin of the Boston Committee to Secure Clemency in the Rosenberg Case

(The New York Office is requested to submit as an exhibit Page 3 of the May 5, 1952, issue of the "Daily Worker.")

Page 3 of the May 5, 1952, issue of the "Daily Worker" contained an article captioned "Many Aid Rosenberg Defense, Committees Now in 25 Cities." This article stated the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case announced that Rosenberg Committees had been organized in 25 cities, including Boston, Massachusetts.

"The ROSENBERGS, a husband and wife spy team, were sentenced to death for transmitting atom bomb secrets to Russia. The Communist leaders were imprisoned for advocating the violent overthrow of the government.

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"The ROSENBERG case is currently the principal propaganda promotion of the Communist party. The drive to free the party leaders has been a continuing activity since they were jailed 18 months ago.

"It is significant that the Communist party ignored the ROSENBERGS during their trial and for nine months after their conviction. (The Daily Worker printed nothing during that period except a three sentence story on the verdict.) It also is significant that the organized propaganda campaign started when the Communists decided to exploit the case for their own purposes.

"The Communists have been notably successful in enlisting the aid of clergymen in support of the ROSENBERGS and the imprisoned party leaders."

This witness can produce the January 22, 1953 issue of the Boston Traveler, a newspaper published in Boston, Massachusetts, which contained an article on page one captioned, "Right-Led' Units Target of Party" by political writer CORNELIUS DALTON, which read in part as follows:

"It is significant that the Communist party ignored the ROSENBERGS during their trial and for nine months after their conviction. (The Daily Worker printed nothing during that period except a three sentence story on the verdict.) It also is significant that the organized propaganda campaign started when the Communists decided to exploit the case for their own purposes.

"The Communists have been notably successful in enlisting the aid of clergymen in support of the ROSENBERGS and the imprisoned party leaders."

This witness can produce the January 22, 1953 issue of the Boston Traveler, a newspaper published in Boston, Massachusetts, which contained an article on page one captioned, "Right-Led' Units Target of Party" by political writer CORNELIUS DALTON, which read in part as follows:

A discussion was had concerning the proposed picket line to be held at the White House in an effort to cause the President to take some action in favor of the ROSENBERGS. The National Office in New York, desired that this vigil should commence on 12/21/52, and to continue until such action was taken by the President or until the ROSENBERGS were executed. The vigil was planned to continue twenty-four hours per day. It was not the desire of the National Office to have a large number of people in the picket line, but it was their desire that at least twenty persons be in the line at all times. It was announced at this meeting that individuals would come from everywhere to take part in the picket line. Some of the Washington members agreed with the National Office that the picket line should begin on Christmas Eve, while others disagreed and felt that it should not be started until after Christmas. An effort was to be made to obtain office space in Washington for the committee, and a hotel suite was preferred. This office space was to be obtained by 12/15/52, and the expenses were no object. At least one individual was to be present in the office twenty-four hours a day, and it was decided that MARTHA MALKIN would be there each day and she would be relieved by other committee members who would volunteer their time.
