

It is noted also that EUGENE DENNIS was the general secretary of the CP USA who was tried and convicted in 1949 and 1950 for violating the Smith Act of 1940. During the same period, DENNIS was appealing the 1947 conviction of contempt of Congress.

FRANCE said, according to the article, he had never met or spoken to a Communist until last year when he came out of retirement to defend them in the courtroom. "My life has been made more fruitful and gainful," he stated, according to the article.
