#### SUPPLEMENTAL PROSECUTIVE LETTER

Inasmuch as evidence pertaining to the origin of the organization and its original officers was contained in my letter of January 28, 1953, this information is not being re-stated.

The following abbreviations will be utilized in this letter, for purposes of brevity:

Affiliation of Philadelphia Committee with National Committee

Division of Solicitations, Department of Public Instruction, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, 812 Blackstone Building, Harrisburg, Pa., advised SA MORGAN L. MIDTHUN on April 14, 1953, that by letter dated February 17, 1953, JEAN D. FRANTJIS, as Executive Secretary of the Philadelphia Committee, Post Office Box 805, Philadelphia, Pa., informed her that the temporary committee in Philadelphia is an affiliate of the National Committee, 1050 Sixth Avenue, New York City, N. Y.

#### Aims and Purposes

referred to above, advised on the same date that the letter previously referred to stated that money solicited by the Philadelphia Committee was used to meet expenses in carrying on appeals and maintaining the ROSENBERG children. Any excess was used for a dissemination of information to enlist popular support for the commutation of the death sentence for the ROSENBERGs. The entire staff of the Philadelphia Committee volunteered its time, and there were no administrative expenses and no commissions paid to solicitors.

Confidential informant who has furnished reliable information in the past, made available on undated, two-page, mimeographed item of literature issued in late 1953 which contained a "Statement of Policy Adopted by the National Conference of Rosenberg-Sobell Committees in Chicago, October 10-11." This policy is set out, in part, as follows:

"The National Organization of Rosenberg-Sobell Committees will make public the truth in the Rosenberg-Sobell case; it will insure that appeals will be made to the courts to review the case and to order a new trial for MORTON SOBELL; it will press vigorously for a transfer of MORTON SOBELL from Alcatraz, so that his appeals to the court are not injured by absence of consultation with his counsel which Alcatraz imposes upon him.

"We will stand together with any and all who are persuaded in whole or in part, by these objectives."

## II. GENERAL ACTIVITIES OF THE PHILADELPHIA COMMITTEE

nade available a mimeographed letter dated January 7, 1953, issued by the Philadelphia Committee which announced a rally to be held on January 11, 1953, at 2128 Walnut Street, Philadelphia. This letter states that the activities of the Philadelphia Committee must be increased, and it sets out the following activities which must be carried out:

- Write or wire the President and contact other people by phone to do this.
- 2. Arrange delegations to Congressmen.
- Arrange delegations to City Councilmen in Phila.

- "4. Contact every organization in the community to act for clemency.
- 5. Raise funds for advertisements and radio time.

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on made available a mimeographed letter dated February 11, 1953, which was issued by the Philadelphia Committee appealing for contributions to the work of the Philadelphia Committee and participation in its activities. Included with this letter was a one-page printed leaflet issued by the Philadelphia Committee containing an appeal from the sister of BARTOLOMEO VANZETTI in Italy for clemency for the ROSENBERGS. The reverse side of this leaflet contained the same appeal printed in Italian.

On made available a mimeographed letter dated March 10, 1953, issued by the Philadelphia Committee which enclosed an "Amicus Brief in the Rosenberg Case." This letter urged the recipient to gather signatures to this brief and to return it to the Philadelphia Committee no later than

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March 30, 1953. The brief itself states that the trial of the ROSENBERGS was lacking in fairness. The brief contained spaces for ten names and addresses of signers.

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made available a two-page mimeographed letter dated May 26, 1953, issued by the Philadelphia Committee enclosing a mimeographed clemency petition addressed to the President of the United States, containing space for 14 names and addresses. This letter called for a specific program to be followed to implement the program outlined by the National Committee. In regard to the clemency petition, the letter states as follows:

"We are enclosing a draft of the wording of a nation wide petition for clemency. Take this draft - use it as it is, alter it if you wish, but get it circulated and signed. Do not send the signed petition directly to the White House unless it is the express wish of any individuals or groups. Send it to us . . "

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On made available a one-page mimeographed flyer issued by the Philadelphia Committee in June 1953 calling for action on the following activities:


- A center city literature distribution on June 17, 1953.
- Participation in the Washington clemency vigil June 18, 1953.
- Person to person telephone calls to the President.
- 4. Person to person telephone calls to Congressmen.

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On made available a mimeographed flyer dated June 25, 1953, announcing a dedication meeting to be held on June 29, 1953, at Paramount Mansion, Broad Street and Girard Avenue, Philadelphia. This flyer pointed out that in the case of MORTON SOBELL the "evidence against him was even flimsier than that against the ROSENBERGS" and that "a new trial for MORTON SOBELL would help to establish the truth in the ROSENBERG case."



This letter noted that the National Committee was currently preparing a brief to be filed in the case of MORTON SOBELL and urged that letters and telegrams be sent protesting the removal of the ROSENBERG children from a school in Toms River, N. J.

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graphed copy of the "Statement of Policy" adopted by the National Conference of the Rosenberg-Sobell Committees in Chicago, Ill., on October 10-11, 1953. This statement was prepared by the Philadelphia Committee and set forth a sixpoint program adopted by the National Conference, which is as follows:

- "1 A broad educational campaign on the Rosenberg-Sobell case, implemented by the distribution of one million pieces of literature in the next six months, shall be carried cut so that the facts will be brought to all sections of the American people.
  - 2 Circulation of an Amicus Brief, to be signed by prominent persons throughout the country, to be presented to the Courts in behalf of MORTON SOBELL. Other groups should be encouraged to circulate similar briefs.
  - 3 The incarceration of MORTON SOBELL in Alcatraz is cruel and unusual punishment, and makes it impossible for him to consult properly with his legal counsel. Therefore, a demand should be raised that he be transferred from Alcatraz pending outcome of legal appeals.
  - 4.- We direct that the new National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee be charged with the responsibility of working out the best methods of legal support for SOBELL's fight in the courts.
  - 5.- A detailed report of the conduct of the U.S. Attorney General's office in the Rosenberg-Sobell case should be circulated to all committees and interested individuals to the end that, in the near future, a call can be made for an investigation of those responsible for this improper conduct.

> "6 - We who devoted our energies to secure justice for ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG feel it our serious responsibility to bend every effort to secure the well being and protection of MICHAEL and ROBERT ROSENBERG, innocent victims of this great tragedy. We pledge our fullest support to guarantee the necessary funds to achieve this end."



On the contract of made available a letter dated July 8, 1954, issued by the foliadelphia Committee which stated that its first task was a petition drive for the removal of MORTON SOBELL from Alcatraz. Enclosed with the letter was a petition urging such action. This petition reflected that it was issued by the National Committee in New York City and contained space for ten names and addresses.

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On made available a letter dated July 30, 1904, issued by the Philadelphia Committee. This letter enclosed a 31-page pamphlet entitled "The Case of MORTON SOBELL," by D. N. PRITT, which was issued by the National Committee. This pamphlet purported to give a new insight into the legal aspects of the SOBELL case. The pamphlet characterized PRITT as an internationally known British lawyer, a veteran senior

member of the English Bar, and a Queen's Counsel since 1927.

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letter there was a pamphlet entitled "The Facts in the Case of MORTON SOBELL," issued by the National Committee.

on the SOBELL case issued by the Philadelphia Committee in January 1955. This letter requested a contribution of \$1.00 from each recipient of the letter and stated that this would result in \$1,000 for the Philadelphia Committee to apply toward its share in the nation-wide fund-raising campaign. The letter also set forth four steps which would be taken with the money thus raised. Included with this newsletter, as an enclosure, was a reprint of an article from "The Globe and Mail," Toronto, Canada, January 3, 1955, by J. V. McAREE, entitled "Another DREYFUS Case?" This item was issued by the National Committee and is a comparison between the SOBELL case and the DREYFUS case.

Public Rallies Held by the Philadelphia Committee 67d

on advised that the Philadelphia Committee held a mass meeting on the evening of February 19, 1953, at the Paramount Mansion, Broad Street and Girard Avenue, Philadelphia. Professor EPHRAIM CROSS of New York City was the featured speaker and described the ROSENBERG trial as a frame-up because of anti-Semitism at the trial, perjury by witnesses, and for other reasons. JEAN D. FRANTJIS also spoke and stated that she could not ask for contributions. At this point JACK ZUCKER stated that he desired

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to give a contribution to the fight for the ROSENBERGS, and other individuals followed suit. Those present were urged to participate in various activities of the Philadelphia Committee and the National Committee.



In addition, described the attendants at this meeting as being composed almost entirely of Communists.

On advised that JACK ZUCKER, an official of the Pennsylvania CRC, had been a member of the CP

On advised that a street meeting was held by the Philadelphia Committee on the evening of June 19, 1953, at 31st Street and Montgomery Avenue, Philadelphia. A loud speaker was mounted on the roof of an automobile and the meeting collected a crowd of approximately 50 persons. JEAN D. PRANTJIS, Executive Secretary of the Philadelphia Committee, spoke, describing the execution of the ROSENEERGs as a facist move to destroy the democratic way of life. JOHN HOLTON, Executive Director of the Pennsylvania CRC, spoke in the same vein.

On Tune 25, 1953, confidential informant, verified the information as runnished by above. 67d

advised that in June 1954, in preparation for a ROSENBERG memorial period and a mass meeting to be held on June 26, 1954, the Philadelphia Committee issued numerous items of literature. This literature all described the imprisonment of SOBELL in Alcatraz and made reference to the possible innocence of the ROSENBERGS. Included with this literature was a folder entitled "Was There a Rosenberg-Sobell Spy Ring at Fort Monmouth," which urged the transfer of SOBELL from Alcatraz and an investigation of the U. S. Attorney General's office in its handling of the entire ROSENBERG-SOBELL case.
