A-1 Evidence Showing Origin of Organization

The NATIONAL COMMITTEE TO SECURE JUSTICE IN THE ROSENBERG CASE was in existence subsequent to September 23, 1950, and has failed to register with the Attorney General as provided in Section 7 (6) of the Internal Security Act of 1950.

I. DIRECTION, DOMINATION AND CONTROL BY COMMUNIST PARTY - USA1. Origin and Development

On March 29, 1951, JULIUS ROSENBERG and his wife ETHEL were convicted in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York for conspiracy to commit espionage for the Soviet Union. On April 5, 1951, they were sentenced to death and were executed on June 19, 1953, at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York. During the ROSENBERG trial, MORTON SOBELL was convicted of conspiracy to commit espionage and sentenced to thirty years in prison. SOBELL is confined to Alcatraz Prison.

The NATIONAL COMMITTEE TO SECURE JUSTICE IN THE ROSENBERG CASE is substantially directed, dominated, or controlled by the COMMUNIST PARTY - USA, a Communist action organization so designated by the Subversive Activities Control Board on and is primarily operated for the purpose of giving aid and support to the COMMUNIST PARTY - USA.

The NATIONAL COMMITTEE TO SECURE JUSTICE IN THE ROSENBERG CASE was in existence subsequent to September 23, 1950, and has failed to register with the Attorney General as provided in Section 7 (b) of the Internal Security Act of 1950.

I. DIRECTION, DOMINATION AND CONTROL BY COMMUNIST PARTY - USA1. Origin and Development

On March 29, 1951, JULIUS ROSENBERG and his wife ETHEL were convicted in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York for conspiracy to commit espionage for the Soviet Union. On April 5, 1951, they were sentenced to death and were executed on June 19, 1953, at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York. During the ROSENBERG trial, MORTON SOBELL was convicted of conspiracy to commit espionage and sentenced to thirty years in prison. SOBELL is confined to Alcatraz Prison.
