On June 17, 1953, Confidential Informant NY 822-S* advised that "TOM" contacted SIDNEY REITER inquiring about the "clemency" train to Washington in connection with the ROSENBERGS. SIDNEY REITER, according to the informant, only knew that some people were leaving and MARIAN BREITBART knew more about it. "TOM" also inquired of ROSE REITER as to what was being done in connection with the "clemency" train and told ROSE to indicate to "our friend," (a woman) that anything that could be done would help.

ROSE REITER complained that it was a bit late to do anything. "TOM" related he felt helpless and added "We can't live this way."

The above informant advised on June 21, 1953, that SIDNEY REITER had cursed WALTER WINCHELL for announcing that the police at the ROSENBERG funeral at Farmingdale, New York, had to draw their pistols to restrain the procession. Further that SIDNEY REITER had been there and had stated that he had not seen anything.

CCNY 426 has indicated that SIDNEY REITER as of April, 1950, was the New York County Communist Party Railroad Coordinator.

On 6/10/53 ROSE REITER, according to NY 822-S, contacted ZELDA APPEL at which time they discussed going to Washington in connection with the ROSENBERG case. ROSE REITER indicated that she and her husband SIDNEY REITER were going in their car. ROSE suggested that ZELDA take the APPEL car to Washington as a lot of people would go but had no way of getting there.

On 6/11/53, NY 822-S related that ROSE REITER arranged to have her child stay at the residence of CLAIRE and LESTER RODNEY over that week-end as ROSE was to drive to Washington. Also on that date ROSE and ZELDA APPEL discussed plans for the trip to Washington on 6/14/53. ROSE advised that she and SIDNEY planned to leave at 6 am from 138th St. and Broadway, NYC and that five people were scheduled to go in the car which the APPELS would use.

According to NY822-S, on 6/11/53, MARIAN BREITEART and ROSE REITER discussed the securing of a sufficient number of cars for Sunday's delegation to Washington. The informant added that on 6/13/53 final preparations for the trip to Washington had been made by ZELDA APPEL and SIDNEY REITER and that there would be three additional people in the REITER car besides SID and ROSE.

NY 822-S advised that BETTY GARNETT was desirous of seeing ROSE and SIDNEY REITER late on the evening of 6/14/53, no matter how late it was. The informant related that ROSE and SIDNEY REITER had not returned home early in the evening of 6/14/53.

According to the informant, JANE SOMERS stated that the Rosenberg Committee was stepping up its activities since the Supreme Court had ruled against them and mass activities would be conducted through the Committee for the entire period until the execution. She indicated it was to be a world wide program designed to bring pressure upon the United States Government to commute the death sentence of the ROSENBERGS.

On June 17th, 1953 a mobilization was called for leaflet distribution. It was ordered that LYLers hit Ebbets Field in Brooklyn with leaflets urging clemency for the Rosenbergs, even though Justice Douglas had granted the Rosenbergs a stay of execution.

Confidential Informant NY-603-S* advised that on 6/19/53, the following incidents took place at UE National Headquarters, 11 East 51 Street, NYC, reflecting interest of the persons involved regarding the ROSENBERG case:

Informant advised that THELMA SLAPPY, secretary to JOSEPH DERMODY, UE international representative, had been in Washington, Thursday, 6/18/53, apparently taking part in the ROSENBERG rally at the White House. According to informant, she did not return to New York until 5 a.m. that morning. Informant said she was very upset over the ROSENBERG case.

BILL CAHN, UE Publicity Director, received a message from one JANE SOMERS to the effect that the Supreme Court had vacated the ROSENBERGS' stay of execution. JANE told BILL that there would be a mass action in Union Square that evening.

BESSIE KEMP, UE switchboard operator, received a message from a woman named ESTHER (LNU), who advised that the Supreme Court had vacated the stay of execution. ESTHER requested BESSIE to call her friends and prevail on them to send telegrams to Washington. ESTHER said that the telegrams would cost only \$1.05 for ten words, and it would be the last dollar they would have to spend on the ROSENBERGS.

RACHEL KLAUSNER, confidential secretary at UE, received a message from one CLARA MULLEN, asking RAE to meet her at the Stuyvesant Casino that evening at 7:30 p.m. RAE declined, explaining that she had been in Washington on the previous day, presumably at the ROSENBERG rally, and desired to get home despite having heard the news of the stay of execution. CLARA pointed out that the meeting at Stuyvesant Casino was very important and RAE agreed to do her best to make it.

FRED WRIGHT, "UE News" cartoonist, received a message from an unidentified woman advising him that the rally at Union Square for the ROSENBERGS had been set for 5 p.m.

June 25th, 1953

On June 19th, 1953 there was an open air meeting at Union Square (17th Street), sponsored by the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case.

The crowd was tense; the men weeping, the women weeping. A few religious people crossed themselves and prayed, some said the rosary. And the youth were dazed. A few children were crying because their parents were crying, they did not know what was happening.

The crowd knew the Rosenbergs were going to die. 8PM was the time set for the execution.

When Emily Alnan said the "rosenbergs are now entering the execution room, the crowd ached, and there were shouts NO NO.

After the execution some youth and adults walked to the East Side, singing.

Although there were cries of anger and sobbing that the Rosenbergs were murdered, the demonstration was as orderly as could be expected. One adult said: "this is the beginning of fascism--who knows who'll be next. Hitler started with the Jews."

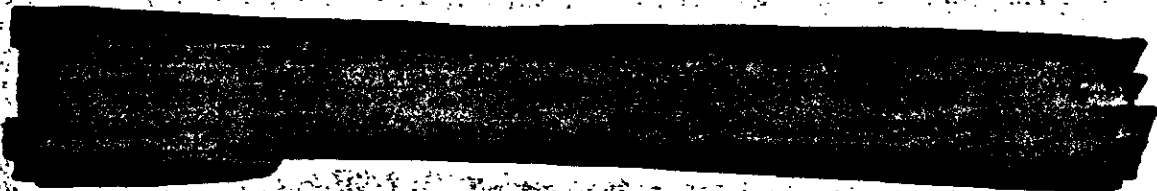

The train arrived in Washington about 1:15 PM. As the passengers left the train, signs were forced upon them, and they were obliged to form a line and march out of Union Station in twos.

The passengers were cheered by delegations from the mid-West states, shouting--Long live New York, the Rosenbergs shall not die, etc.

Some were put in chartered buses, the others had to walk or take taxis. Destination: The White House.

There was a picket line in front of the White House when the buses arrived. The police did not allow anyone to join it, claiming it was too large.

The people were given signs and Clemency arm bands and were led to the old Treasury building to the left of the White House; this created a line-- 3 to 4 abreast--round the entire block. Another line was formed around the State building (not quite sure of the building) to the right of the White House.

These lines lasted until 4 PM. Then the picket lines were led to the Mall across the street from the Department of Justice, at Ninth and Constitution Avenues. There--the lines were told--would a mass prayer meeting for the Rosenbergs.

The speakers were numerous; the names forgotten--but Martha Schlam (the family name is not spelled correctly) sang a few songs, including My Loved One, a song by Edith Siegel, for the Rosenbergs.

The meeting ended at 5:30 PM and the crowd departed for the trains at Union Station; the trains would leave at 6:30 PM.

Many people were urged to stay until 7 PM (those who had cars that is) for that was the time the President would return to the White House.

The demonstrations were quiet and the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case complimented the people for it.

Some 75 members of branch 138 of the Jewish Peoples Fraternal Order, IWO came to a special meeting of the branch held on June 12, 1953 at the headq. of Shulo #9, at 3451 Galles Place, Bronx, NY.

The chairman of the meeting was M. KENIAK, vice president of branch 138, J.P.F.O. He opened the meeting with a few remarks in which he stated that "in spite of all the efforts of the reactionaries to intimidate the people into silence one could hear the rumbling of the American people... In spite of the efforts of the Federal and the NY State Governments to destroy the IWO we will win our fight for the life of our organization which is gaining streight from the loyalty of the tens of thousands of its members... Just as reaction was compelled to give in to the will of the people on the war in Korea we will force reaction to give in in our fight for the freedom of our people and our organizations..."

E. GROSSMAN, president of branch 138 J.P.F.O. made a report to the meeting on the convention of the "IWO policyholders Protective Co-mittee" which was held on June 7th, 1953, at the Capitol Hotel (NY) and on the mass meeting which took place on the evening of the same day (June 7th) at the St. Nicholas Arena (in NY).

According to GROSSMAN'S report:

The convention of the NY State IWO Policyholders Protective Committee was opened by JACK HOLMSTOCK, member of the NY State IWO Policyholders Protective Comm. who urged the members of the IWO form a solid front in the fight for the life of the IWO.

The chairman of the convention was HARRY SELICSON, chairman of the IWO Policyholders P.C.

Over 600 delegates, representing all of the IWO organizations of NY State, were participating in the convention. SELICSON, JERRY TRAUBER, (a leader of the Policyholders Committee) and the lawyers

WILTON GREENMAN and TOM JONES told the convention about the struggle of the IWO against the reactionary forces attempting to liquidate the organization; that the Policyholders Committee is determined to continue its struggle for the life of the IWO and that this struggle will continue until "victory will be won"

To strengthen the fight against the liquidation of the IWO the convention adopted a resolution calling upon all members of the IWO to become members of the Policyholder Committee. The IWO organizations were instructed to see to it that their members should become members of the Policyholders Committee. GREENMAN at this point made an appeal to the members of branch 138 to join the above mentioned Committee.

The convention adopted resolutions:

To send telegrams to Gov. DEWEY and to the NY State Superintendent of the Ins. Dep. protesting against the attempts being made by them to liquidate the IWO.

That the members of the IWO will fight for their organization and that they will protect the organization from the attempts being made to liquidate it.

To make all profitable efforts to re-instate all former members of the IWO.

GREENMAN said that "the convention was carried out in a spirit of determination to fight for the life of the IWO and to fight reaction on every point, on every front. The convention served a warning to the domestic fascists that over 100,000 members of the IWO will not submit meekly to the Mc CARRANS and Mc CARTHY'S. We will fight for the life of the International Workers Order and we will continue and strengthen our fight for peace and freedom."

On the mass meetings at the St. Nicholas Arena GREENMAN reported:

Over 3,000 IWO members came to this meeting.

The chairman of the meeting was JERRY TRAMER,
Secretary of the IWO Policyholders Protective Committee.

The speakers at the meeting were Rev. CHARLES HILL
of Detroit; PETER SHIFKA, general secretary of the IWO; GERALD SANDLER,
national Executive Secretary of the Jewish People's Fraternal Order and
ALBERT PEZZATTI, of the Mine, Mill and Smelter Workers Union.

Rev. HILL called upon the members of the IWO to work
for unity between the negro and white people. He underlined that "a
united struggle of negro and white will be able to shake all of the
attempts of reaction to destroy the Bill of Rights."

All of the speakers called upon the members of the
IWO "to form a ring of steel around the organization" and to fight "the
crooked politicians who are out to steal all IWO funds, all insurance
of the IWO members and their benefits and turn over all funds to private
insurance companies."

The meeting adopted a resolution protesting the attempts
to liquidate the IWO and expressing the loyalty of the IWO members towards
the organization and pledging "to mobilize the entire membership of the IWO
and of all other Americans whose freedom is in danger to fight together
for justice."

Telegrams were sent from the meeting to President
EISENHOWER and to Attorney General BROWNELL "condemning the Walter-McCarran
Act which is a danger to the traditional right and freedom of all Americans
and especially to the foreign-born; demanding that the Walter-McCarran Act
be scrapped."

In the "cultural program" participated:

The dance group of the "Puerto-Rican children Caravan"
and a group of singers of the "Jewish Young People's Singers." "The
meeting, as did the convention, closed with the expression of a strong
determination to continue the fight for the life of the IWO, at this
point I again appeal to everyone of our members to join the IWO Policy-
holders Protective Committee and let everyone of us work for the re-
instating of all the former members of our branch."

Civil Rights Congress Activities

A special "morning meeting", called by the Civil Rights Congress, was held on June 3rd, 1953, at Adelphi Hall in New York City.

The aim of this meeting was "to map out activities in regard to Ben Davis' participation in the Pittsburgh trial of Steve Nelson and his co-defenders,

The chairman of the meeting was a leader of the Brooklyn Civil Rights Congress. (I could'nt learn his name but I believe his name is Bernstein. He is a heavy-built man; about 30 years old; stocky; dark brown hair, round face) 47 people came to this meeting.

The chairman opened the meeting with a statement that this is a morning meeting; that William Patterson will report on the Pittsburgh trial. After Patterson's report a program of action will be adopted after a "floor discussion on Patterson's report."

William Patterson, National Executive Secretary of the Civil Rights Congress, reported. He said that "the 27 year conviction of Steve Nelson and the present trial of Steve, Ben Corrathers and the other victims of Government persecution under the Smith Act must be fought by every decent American. In this trial as in all of the Smith Act trials there is involved the question of the freedom of the American people. The Smith Act trials are a crime of Government designed to silence opposition to its policies of war and fascism. The change in the Washington administration made no difference in this crime of Government against the American people."

He said that this meeting must work out a program of action "in connection with the appearance of Ben Davis at the Pittsburgh Smith Act trial. Ben's appearance in the court will mark a high point not only in the outstanding contribution he will make to the courtroom defense, but will also be a great stimulus to the mass developments in the fight against all thought control trials and imprisonments."

He said that "we must line up the Pittsburgh trial and the appearance of Ben Davis with the fight to save the lives of Ethel and Julius Rosenberg and the fight for amnesty for the political prisoner and the political refugees."

On the fight for the Rosenbergs Patterson asked to mobilize all members of the mass organizations and trade unions for participation in all actions including the participation in the Union Square (N.Y.)

demonstration on June 11th, 1953 and on the "clemency train to Washington, on June 11, 1953. He asked the leaders of the C. R. C. chapters to mobilize for the same purpose the people of the neighborhoods. He stated that "it's our sacred duty as Americans to see that the Rosenbergs shall not die because they are innocent victims of a monstrous frame up."

He asked the meeting which consisted of "leaders of C. R. C. and mass organizations" to organize a wide distribution of a four-page trip "Now It's Against the Law" (sample enclosed). To distribute 20,000 copies of same in Harlem (among the negro population). He asked the leaders of C. R. C. chapters and the leaders of mass organizations to organize groups of volunteers to help in the above mentioned distribution of "Now It's Against the Law" in Harlem. He stated that "our own (C.R.C.) forces in Harlem are too small for such an undertaking but it must be done. The people of Harlem love Ben and a wide distribution of this 4-page publication will help us in the mobilization of the negro people for the fight for amnesty for all political prisoners." He asked for the organization of local indoor and outdoor meetings on community neighborhood scale linking up the fight for the Rosenbergs with the Pittsburgh Trial and the "amnesty month" (June 4th - July 4th).

He asked the neighborhoods to organize delegations to visit ministers and community leaders and to get from them statements which would demand a new trial for the Rosenbergs; amnesty for the prisoners of the Smith Act; statements against "McCarthyism in the courts" and against the war in Korea. Each community should select some special community issue and in combination with statements secured from ministers, etc. publish on leaflet or letter for distribution together with "Now It's Against the Law." He told the meeting that the Pittsburgh trial was postponed until June 16th and that "we will try to get a further postponement", but according to arrangements, said Patterson, Ben Davis will come to Pittsburgh 4 days before the start of the trial to prepare questions and answers. "Ben was already instructed by our lawyer on some of the questions and answers." Patterson said that "Ben will be disappointed if he wouldn't see a large delegation from New York." Patterson asked for the organization of 2 delegations from New York to visit Pittsburgh on different days. He asked that each delegation from N.Y. should consist of "at least 50 people and we want to see Harlem well represented."

He asked for the collection of funds for the delegations at the meetings which will be organized in the neighborhoods.

Patterson told the meeting that similar meetings are now taking place in a few states and that similar programs of action are being adopted.

"This is an all out fight against McCarthyism on the American courts. This is an all out fight for the freedom of all Americans."

James Ford spoke in the name of the "National Committee to Defend Negro Leadership."

He told the meeting that "the National Committee to Defend Negro Leadership of which I'm a member" was organized recently because "we reached a state in our country that any negro leader who dares to fight for negro rights is being persecuted by agencies of the National Government. Negro leaders are arrested or beaten by police, persecuted in the courts and hounded by the F.B.I. The aim of our Committee is to organize a strong movement to fight for the right of the negro leader to speak; to write; to sing; to organize and to fight for Civil rights of the Negro people."

He said that the N. C. to D. N. L. is joining in the movement for "amnesty of all political prisoners." He spoke of "the great negro leader Ben Davis who is beloved by all negro people all over the country." He said that "Ben Davis is now imprisoned in a Jim Crow jail not because he is a Communist but because he is a fighter for the negro people." Ford said that his Committee decided to participate in the sending of a delegation "to visit Pittsburgh and to greet Ben who is coming to testify for the defense in the Smith Act trial of Steve, Ben and Irving."

Ford also asked that all organizations and trade union should send delegates to the "First Eastern Seaboard Conference of National Committee to Defend Negro Leadership" which will take place on June 27th, 1953, at the United Mutual Auditorium.

He read from a printed "call to the first Regional Conference" (copy enclosed). After Ford finished his talk he distributed the "Call" to all those who were present at the meeting about the conference being divided in 4 panels: Trade Union, Religion, Cultural and Professional and Political leaders under attack and he concluded: "above all we must not disappoint Ben. We must send the largest possible delegation of Negro and white people to greet Ben. Ben loves people and he will be happy to see familiar faces from New York."

Arnold Johnson (spoke from the floor) underlined the importance of sending large delegations to Pittsburgh. He asked the organizations "especially the C.R.C. chapters to raise funds for the sending to Pittsburgh of people that "don't belong to C.R.C. or other organizations. It's important that in these delegations should be as many people as possible who do not belong to different progressive organizations." He praised the

C.R.C. and William Patterson for taking the lead in the defense of Steve Eelson and on the Smith Act trial of the Communist leaders in Pittsburgh. He also called upon "the leaders of the organizations who are at this meeting to involve their organizations in the National Amnesty Campaign."

Throughout the weeks (June 7th to June 19th) the Labor Youth League was active in the Rosenberg Case, working closely with **[REDACTED]** the National Committee to Secure Justice for the Rosenbergs. b7d

June 7th, 1953: Leaflet distribution in the Brownsville and East New York areas.

June 8th, 1953: The comrades visited clergymen, and asked them to sign petitions, asking for clemency for the Rosenbergs. They also urged the clergymen to arouse their community in the fight for clemency.

June 9th and 10th, 1953: Same activities as the 8th of June.

June 11th, 1953: A rally was held at Union Square (Manhattan) sponsored by the Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case. The speakers outlined the case; insisted the convicted couple were framed; shouted the Rosenbergs would not die; mentioned the Clemency train going to Washington on Sunday, June 14th, 1953 and prayed (the last speaker prayed).

On June 23rd, 1953, a State Labor Youth League membership meetin was held at Yugoslav Hall on West 41st Street, NYC. The following were present:

The chairman of the meeting is unknown at present. His given name begins with the letter "S"-- he was formerly a member of the Brownsville LYL club. Perhaps he is on State now.

He has brown hair, 5'9", 160 lbs., wears glasses-- has a round face. That evening he wore a tan pair of slacks, a blue jacket, tan shirt, Blue tie--on the platform he sat extreme left.

The meeting was opened by "S"--

Hope Faye sang My Loved One--I'm Gonna let down my burden (Negro Spiritual)--(She opened with the Star Spangle Banner) Edith Seigel accompanied her on the piano for MY LOVED ONE, with Edith wrote for the Rosenbergs.

The first speaker of the evening was Joe Bucholt-- he told the comrades why this meeting was called--the Rosenbergs. He said the Rosenbergs were murdered by Wall Street. The Rosenbergs were an excuse--a scapegoat for the Korean war.

The next speaker was W. W. (Bill) Weinstone of the Communist Party of the United States. Weinstone is one of the "13" who were found guilty in the recent Foley Square trial.

Weinstone is a very loud speaker. He talks quite long--is repetitious. Here are the highlights of what he said--the sugary crust removed:

He was here in the name of the Communist Party. He was here to pay tribute to the Rosenbergs, who were murdered by Wall Street. The Rosenbergs--son and daughter of the proletariat. Son of an ACWA garment worker...Ethel--from a hardworking family.

And why did they die--because labor was not in on the struggle to save them. Labor was fighting. And without labor victory is impossible.

And our friends were not in on the struggle...we only visit them when we have to send of telegrams--collect money-- need signatures for petitions. We must be in contact with them at ALL TIMES, comrades. NOT only in emergency conditions.

Weinstone said that the comrades also lacked a solid industrial base--that is why labor was not struggling to save the Rosenbergs. And the LYL's mass organization base is weak--and not enough people were in on the struggle.

He said over and over again that the United States government is weak, ruthless, murderous, and that their mouths were filled with gold. The murder of the Rosenbergs showed how weak they were--how degenerate!

Weinstone stated that the Communist Party can only give the masses leadership--correct leadership.

The comrades must struggle on day to day issues and get into industry and mass organizations...

He concluded that the Rosenbergs live on.

Rosie Ward was the next speaker. For ten minutes he said nothing that had not been said earlier in the evening. He concluded that the LYL would fight and clear the name of Julius and Ethel Rosenbergs and their two sons.

Hope Faye sang NO!--a Jewish song, and the chairman of the meeting "S" reminded the comrades to buy New Challenge, the current issue of Jewish Life (exposing Mc Carthyism) and the Death House Letters of the Rosenbergs (proceeds to go into a trust fund for Mike and Robbie Rosenbergs).

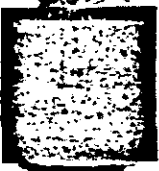

The CP has been taking an extremely active part in assisting this committee in organizing meetings, selling tickets to affairs, and collecting funds. With respect to neighborhood meetings, the informant knows that the CP actually runs the affair if the locale of the meeting is in a strong CP area. In this regard, the informant pointed out that in those areas where the CP is not strong, such neighborhood meetings are run by the ALP or other mass committees. However, the informant advised, you can always be certain that the CP has some connection with the meeting regardless of where it takes place.

The CP's policy with respect to this committee is to keep alive the legend of "The Martyrdom of the Rosenbergs".

Those members of the committee who are not CP members, are for the most part, very close CP sympathizers. Those members of the committee who fall into the category of "innocent dupes" are in a very small minority and joined the committee because of the nationalistic angle.

The position of the CP was to avoid any association of the Party with the ROSENBERGS.
