Dubois's talk was a toring one. It was general and more like a review of events from World War I to the present. His talk was read from a prepared paper and its

theme was the trimuph of the Soviet over Capitalistic opposition. He mentioned the program instigated by capitalism to overthrow the Communists from the early twenties until the depression years. This depression gave rise to fascism under Hilter and Mussolini and lead to World Wer II. He ended his remark by a few statement on the negro people's struggle. He thought that negro newspapers do not present socialism to the negro people and thus they have a more difficult time understanding it than most whites.

The question and answer period was mainly conserned with asking Dubois his opinion on this or that aspect of negro life in the U. S. and in other areas of the world. Dubois stated that he thinks only Socialism has the answer. It is the only way to solve the world's problem. All the premitive countries must adopt socialism if they hope to begin to modernize themselves. He spoke about Ghana and Libya in this regard Dubois thinks that the negro people will make little galn by following the programs or policies of the two major political parties in the U. S. He thinks a third party is necessary and essential if the negro is to make substantial gains.

The lecture began at 8: 35 and was over by 9:30. Collins added a few remarks and asked anyone to stay who wants to discuss further. Collins made mention of the literature in the back of the room. In addition, NY 2122-S\* on 2/24/58, furnished information indicating that the Kings County CF Committee would be held on 3/24/58, at an unspecified place.

A physical surveillance was conducted on the evening of 3/24/58, at the Towers Hotel by agents of the NYO, the logs of which are located in 100-26603-C43 B.

No photographs were obtained on 3/24/58.

NY 2256-S\* furnished the following information on 3/24/58:

DANIEL RUEEL stated that they had held a Section Organizers.: meeting two weeks ago Saturday from 12 noon to 4:00 p.m. and another last Saturday.

RUBEL stated that SAMMY (SEFF) would not be there that night.

RUBEL opened the meeting which he characterized as a meeting of the Brocklyn CP County Committee.

HARRY ONCHER was elected chairman.

ONCHER announced that the agenda for the meeting would include: (1) A Report by Comrade JAMES JACKSON, (2) A Discussion on this report, and (3) Good and Welfare.

JAMES JACKSON spoke on the recent meeting of the National Committee, CP, USA,

JACKSON stated that the result was the advent of greater things to come in the CP in the way of bringing the Party closer to the masses and democratizing the Party inasmuch as it had brought to an end the power struggle among the leaders of the Party.

JACKSON denounced the Right- revisionists in the CP under the leadership of JOHN GATES and pointed out that they had attempted to gain control of the CP at a recent National Administrative Committee meeting, but had failed.

JACKSON stated that the Right-revisionists had misconstrued the intent of the Resolutions of the 16th

National Convention of the CP, USA, and were confused in their thinking concerning (1) The right of the minority in the CP to disagree, and (2) The right of the CP, USA, to exercise independence of the Soviet Union by dissenting from policy set for intermational communism.

JACKSON stated that the current issue of "Political Affairs" contained an authoritative and official definition of the objectives of the resolutions passed by the 16th Mational Convention.

JACKSON pointed out that the main danger was the one which most and immediately threatened the life of the CP - which is the Right-revisionist danger.

JACKSON stated that the CP was a permanent organization, with a single ideology based on Marxist-Leninist principles and Maving a vanguard role - to furnish leadership to the masses.

JACKSON stated that the National Committee had eliminated the Right-revisionist threat to the CP and had elected new leadership.

JACKSON pointed out that a new Mational Executive Committee was created to composed of fifteen members. He added that nine members had been elected at the National Committee meeting, from which mumber various positions of leadership were chosen.

JACKSON concluded by stating that as a result, the party was already showing signs of revitalizing itself in Illinois, Michigan, Minnesotta, Texas and California.

An unsub female spoke but was inaudible.

LENNIE RUBINSTEIN spoke and stated that he was happy to hear of the developments in the National Committee, but urged more positive political activity both in Party activity and mass activity.

EMIL SHAW spoke. He stated that now the haggling was over and that it was time to start fighting for civil rights, a cessation to H and A-bomb testing, etc.

SHAW stated that in his section (Coney Island) they were mobilizing the Comrades to become active in P.T.A. work and also in other mass organizations.

An unsub male spoke and he also characterized the meeting as a meeting of the CP County Committee in Brooklyn. He urged the Comrades to lead the people in Brooklyn on all local issues in the coming election campaigns as well as distributing newsletters and pamphlets.

TOM MEYERSCOUGH spoke. He expressed his gratification at the results of the resent National Committee meeting. He announced that there would be a peace meeting held at the Livingston Mannor on April 14th (1958), three weeks from that same night, and urged all the comrades to attend and to invite all of their friends and acquaintances.

MEYERSCOUGH stated that the National Committee of the Peace Committee was in New York City and that so far the various peace committees are operating independently and that no attempt has been made to .umify them.

He stated that his peace committee has conducted a forum and that he has made available to the CP a list of names of people who were active in the peace campaign and that they could be contacted and used to advantage.

ANNIE FRIEDLANDER spoke. She stated that in her opinion, in the past several years the rank and file have been confused by the actions of the National Committee. She urged that the National Committee clear the situation by pin-pointing the blame on the Right-revisionists.

HARRY ONCHER spoke. He stated that the period of the danger of the "Big Lie" and the period of the danger of such people as that "political ELVIS PRESLEY".

JOHN GATES, was over.

IRVING APPLEBAUM spoke. He criticized the report of EUGENE DENNIS, because it pointed to the left danger as the main danger to the CP.

GWEN HALL spoke. She vehemently maintained that the anti-party elements in the CP be expelled therefrom right away.

CHARLES LOMAN spoke. He endorsed JACKSON's views.

He stated that he was well aware that all was not as it might be in the CP, but that the Left was making hig gains against the Right-revisionists all over the country.

LOMAN announced that next in order was to start a period of re-education and that meant from top to bottom.

JAMES JACKSON spoke again and stated that the CP currently has a Marxist policy and that the Party would demand unswerving loyalty. He stated that the Party would no longer allow disruption whether it be precipitated by the Right-revisionists or "Leftists vandals."

CHARLES LOMAN spoke again. He urged caution in approaching any harsh criticism of the leftist elements, especially if there was any thought of expulsion from the party for holding onto an extreme leftist line.

DANIEL RUBEL announced the peace committee would meet (n 4/14/58) at the Livingston Mannor, which holds 1100 people. He urged the comrades to help fill this place.

He also announced that lists of people who signed peace petitions are available to all the Section Organizers for their use.

He stated also that a May Day celebration would be held on May 1st (1958) at Carnegie Hall.

RUBEL announced that a meeting of Section Organizers and Organizational Secretaries would be held "a week from this coming Tuesday" (referring either to

April 1st or April 8th, 1958). He added that the Section Organizers should see him after the meeting for the details. He added that the meeting would be from 12 noon to 3:00 p.m.

RUBEL also announced that a meeting of the Brownsville Sobell Committee would be held at the Sunrise Center on April 30th (1958).

ALLAN LAWS spoke. He urged that the comrades and Party go slow in thinking of expelling any of the extreme left-wing omrades.

CHARLES LOMAN stated that the date of the next County Committee meeting would be announced at the Section Organizers meeting.

HARRY ONCHER adjourned the meeting at 11:15 p.m.

has only been a member of the Civil Liberties organization for a few months. She lives in the West Bronx her stop is the 167th Street station of the Woodlawn Express. Jennie, who is presently working with the committee that is attempting to get Benjamin Davis Jr to run for State Senator. She works at the headquarters located at 306 Lenox Avenue. She states that she will be working there this week as well as all of next week except for Monday. She does quite a bit of canvassing for the committee and is also in charge of sending out correspondence for the Bronx Civil Liberties Committee.

Mr. Meyer is in charge of the rinancial committee of this organization and has been so since its inception. He made the statement that the Committee is in the red by a small amount of money, amount not mentioned.

Bella Altschuler made the statement that it was through the efforts of their organization not necessarily their particular committee that six Communists had been released as the result of a State Appeal. Two of the names were Trachtenberg and Fine. Mrs Altschuler invited everyone to attend a Sobel Party at 214 Beach Street Far Rockaway on August 16th. Altschuler also reported on a trip that she Joe "Palatcheko," Charles Henleck, and a woman had taken to Washington where they visited Justice of the Supreme Court Douglas. She stated that they had been ushered into his private chambers where they had presented him with a book which, she stated he was very grateful to receive and placed it in his collection.

NY 100-118525

A member name not known stated that he had been able to collect fifteen dollars which he turned over to Polatcheko. After this a collection was taken which grossed twenty one dollars. The same person who had contributed the fifteen dollars then stated that he was familiar with a case of a person who is presently confined in Alcatraz for about 40 years, in solitary confinement for the passion murder of a woman in Alaska; His name is Robert Stroude and while he spent his time in solitary confinement he became a past master in the research of insect and animal diseases which he had time to experiment with during his 40 years of solitary. The speaker also stated that he has written a book about the American penal institution which has not been brought to the eye of the public because of its sordid revelations. He further stated that the reason this person has not been released is due to the fact that the politicians and judges who were responsible for his incarceration would not permit it. The speaker concluded by saying that the man has a book, a paper back book in the bookstores called "the Dirdman of Alcatraz". He encouraged everyone to buy the book. The audience was very much interested in what he said about Stroude and were very willing to buy the book if the speaker brought the books around himself to be sold.

It seems from what Mrs Altschuler stated that there are not too many of these organizations in the city. This particular committee is located in the East Bronx and a number of members Frieda, Jennie and Hilda who live in the West Bronx commute regularly to attend these meetings. Mrs Altschuler stated that there is no such committee as this in Manhattan but that she is interested in developing a person who lives in Manhattan so that he would eventually begin a committee in Manhattan.

The next meeting of the Bronx Civil Liberties Committee will be on the 22nd of August but notification of the next meeting will be mailed out.

On 12-23-58 a section meeting of the Northeast Bronx Communist Party was held at 683 Allerton Avenue, Bronx, at 9:00 P.M.

At the door a slim Chinese fellow in the early twenties solicited signatures for a petition sponsored by the BCLC to abolish the House Unamerican Committee. It was noticed on this petition the names of Jennie Moreau, Wanda Hartung, and Sarah Weissman. Alberto Moreau was chairman for the evening. While waiting for the speaker of the evening, Joe North, he sold various pamphlets, "Political Affairs", and the Communist Manifesto. He also tried to sell the book by Joe North, "No Men are Strangers. Dora Ziebel sold tickets for The Man Who Died at the Jan Hus Theater.

The addresses of Henry Winston and Gil Green were distributed to those who were interested in sending them Christmas Greetings. This was sponsored by Edna Nesin. Bella Halebksy was selling tickets for New Year's Eve for a party sponsored by the Bronx Committee for Sobel at 683 Allerton Avenue. Earl Robinson was to be one of the guests.


Moreau introduced Joe North Editor of the worker, whose topic was Berlin and the German crisis. He said that although the Western Powers were not unintelligent, they were paving the way for a third world war because they were rearming Western Germany, and allowing them to establish a large army, and also by not denazifying the country. West Germany had been given Permission by NATO to make nuclear weapons.

He said the Russian had made many proposals to bring about a better relationship between East and West Germany.

The most recent one was that Berlin be demilitarized, and that this would pave the way for the demilitarization and federation of all of Germany. But he said that this proposal like the others was not received in good faith.

He continued by saying that the West German Government had a lot of former nazis in it, especially judges. Big businesses that had helped Germany start 2 world wars were still in existence with the help of the capitalistic nations.

He said that although the usual outcome of the Capitalistic search for new markets and profits was war, it did not necessarily have to be because the people all over the world in the past few years have become very peace concious. He said that the American people wanted peace, but that they had not organized themselver for it like in many other countries. However, he mentioned Cyrus Eaton who although he was a big industrialist was very much in favor of peace.


