- Stop playing video games for at least ten to twenty minutes per hour. This will rest your eyes, neck, arms and fingers so that you can continue comfortably playing the game in the future.

To prevent personal injury, property damage or malfunction:

- · Before removing disc, be sure it has stopped spinning.
- The Sega Dreamcast GD-ROM disc is intended for use exclusively on the Sega Dreamcast video game system. Do not use this disc in anything other than a Sega Dreamcast console, especially not in a CD player.
- · Do not allow fingerprints or dirt on either side of the disc.
- · Avoid bending the disc. Do not touch, smudge or scratch its surface.
- Do not modify or enlarge the center hole of the disc or use a disc that is cracked, modified or repaired with adhesive tape.
- Do not write on or apply anything to either side of the disc.
- Store the disc in its original case and do not expose it to high temperature and humidity.
- Do not leave the disc in direct sunlight or near a radiator or other source of heat.
- Use lens cleaner and a soft dry cloth to clean disc, wiping gently from the center to the edge. Never use chemicals such as benzene and paint thinner to clean disc.

Getting Started

The Atari Anniversary Edition Dreamcast game features multiplayer games. Purchase additional controllers (sold separately) to play with two or more people. Before turning the Sega Dreamcast power ON, connect the controller or other peripheral equipment into the control ports of the Sega Dreamcast. To return to the title screen at any point during gameplay, simultaneously press and hold the A, B, X, Y and Start buttons. This will cause the Sega Dreamcast to softreset the software and display the title screen.

SEGA DREAMCAST HARDWARE UNIT




Control Ports


Controlling Gameplay

Analog Thumb Pad

Use this pad to navigate through menu choices.

Directional Button (D-Button)

Like the Analog Thumb Pad, you may also use this button to navigate through menu choices.

Y Button

Use this button as a hot key to access the Atari Archives from the Main Menu screen, or use it to zoom out on a selected archive screen.

Start Button

Use this button to access a game's Options screen from the game's main screen. During play, pressing the **Start** Button will pause the game before taking you to the game's Options screen.

B Button

Use this button to return to the previous screen or to cancel. From a submenu, this button will take you back to the Arcade Menu screen. From the Archive Menu, this button will take you back to the Arcade Menu screen. From a selected archive image, this button will take you back to the Archive Menu screen.

X Button

Use this button to zoom in on an image in the Atari Archives.

A Button

Use this button to select a menu item.

Right Trigger

Use this trigger to fire the tank's weapon in Battlezone®.

Left Trigger

Not used.

Important! Never touch the Analog Thumb Pad or Left or Right Triggers while turn ing the Sega Dreamcast power ON. Doing so may disrupt the controller initialization procedure and result in malfunction.

Once you've chosen a game to play from the Arcade Menu, press the **Start** Button to bring up that game's Options screen. From the Options screen, you can change that game's settings.

Note: If you unplug the controller in **Port B**, the TWO PLAYER START option will be grayed out. Also, if a game is in progress, the GAME SETTINGS option will be grayed out.



HOW TO CHANGE A GAME'S CONTROLLER SETTINGS

- Once you've chosen a game from the Arcade Menu screen, press the Start Button to access that game's Options menu.
- Now use the Analog Thumb Pad or the D-Button to highlight the Controller Settings
 option and then press the A Button. The current assigned controller button will
 flash on screen.
- Press the new controller button you would like to use for that function.
- When done, select the Exit option from the menu and press the A Button.

Note: For games that feature SPEED as one of the controller settings, the setting level ranges from 1 (slower) to 5 (fastest) with 3 being the default.
