Setting up the game

Hoyle Casino is a one to four player game. Purchase additional Sega Dreamcast Controllers (sold separately) to play with two or more people.

Before turning the Sega Dreamcast power ON, connect the Sega Dreamcast Controllers into the control ports of the Sega Dreamcast. You must always connect a controller to Port A, but may connect other controllers to any available Port.

If you have a memory card, it's recommended that you insert it before turning the power ON; see page 4 for details.

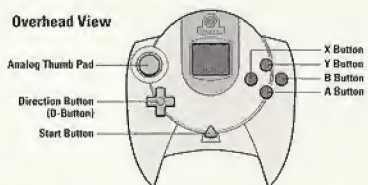
Controls

General controls within this game are described below. For help on specific controls within a game, see the section for that game in this Instruction Manual.

To return to the title screen at any point during game play, simultaneously press and hold the A, B, X, Y and Start Buttons. This will cause the Sega Dreamcast to soft-reset the software.

Analog Thumb Pad*

What it does

Moves around the casino floor. In Craps and Roulette, moves around the table.

D-Button

Moves around menus and windows. In Slots, Video Poker, and Video Slots, selects machine buttons. In Pai Gow Poker, selects cards for your two-card hand. In Five Card Draw Poker games, selects cards to discard. In Craps and Roulette, allows precise movement on the table.

Start Button

Brings up the menu where you can start games, pause games, change options, and get help.

X Button

Brings up a tutorial. Tutorials provide strategy for games and give you hints on gameplay.

Y Button

Brings up the bet window to let you change your bet amount. In Slots and Video Poker, displays a larger version of the payout tables.

A Button

In a menu, closes the menu and makes any changes you specified. In a game, places a bet. In Pai Gow Poker, sets your two-card hand. In Craps, shoots the dice. In Five Card Draw Poker games, discards cards.

B Button

On the casino floor, goes back to the casino entrance. In a menu, closes the current menu without making any changes. In Craps and Roulette, removes the current bet.

L/R Trigger*

In Craps and Roulette, finishes betting (this is an alternative to moving to the Done area and pressing the A Button). In other games, does nothing.

* Never touch the Analog Thumb Pad or L/R Trigger when turning the Sega Dreamcast power ON. Doing so may disrupt the controller initialization procedure and result in malfunction. If the Analog Thumb Pad or L/R Trigger are accidentally moved while turning the Sega Dreamcast power ON, immediately turn the power OFF and then ON again making sure not to touch the controller.

Using a memory card

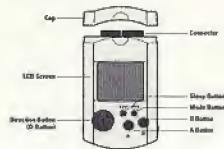
With a Visual Memory Unit (sold separately), you can save any new players you create, including player bankrolls and statistics. Built-in players can't be saved. To save player files, the memory card must have at least 12 blocks of free space per player.

Insert the memory card into Expansion Socket 1 of the controller in Control Port A; be sure to use Control Port A. Insert the card before turning the power ON, if possible; if you insert it when the Sign In window is open, saved players aren't immediately visible.

Player information is saved whenever you leave a game; before shutting off the Sega Dreamcast, be sure to exit the current game or return to the casino floor, or your player information may not be saved.

Note: While saving a game file, never turn OFF the Sega Dreamcast power, remove the memory card or disconnect the controller.

SEGA DREAMCAST VISUAL MEMORY UNIT (VMU)

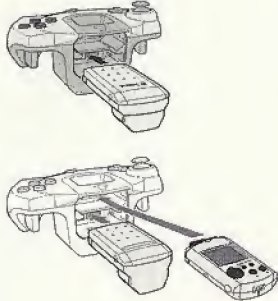


Using a Jump Pack

A Jump Pack (sold separately) can provide a vibration effect that enhances your Hoyle Casino experience. You can turn off the vibration; see "Changing casino options" on page 7. Insert the Jump Pack into Expansion Socket 2 of the controller, as shown at the right.

Note: When the Jump Pack is inserted into Expansion Socket 2 of the Sega Dreamcast Controller, the Jump Pack connects, but does not lock. If the controller is jarred, the Jump Pack may fall out during game play or otherwise inhibit game operation.

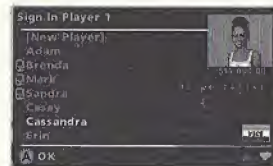

Starting Hoyle Casino

You can bypass the opening screens and movie by pressing the Start Button on your controller as they appear.

The first thing you'll do in Hoyle Casino is sign in your player.



You can either create a new player, or choose a built-in player (such as Erin or Randall). Built-in players' bankrolls are always reset after a game session.

If you create a new player, you'll need a memory card (sold separately) to store players' names, pictures, bankrolls and statistics between game sessions. If you don't have a memory card, any players you create will not be saved. Saved players are shown with a VMU icon next to the player name.

To play with a built-in player:

1. Press **▲** or **▼** to select a player. The player's picture, bankroll, and credit card appear; you can change the player's picture once you're in a game.
2. Press the A Button to play with this player.

To create a new player:

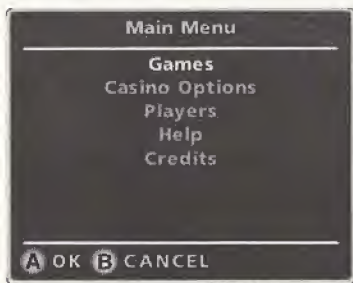
1. Press **▲** or **▼** to select **[New Player]**, and press the A Button.
2. Type your name as described below, and press the A Button when you're done.

Press **▲** to cycle forward in the alphabet, or **▼** to cycle backward. When you've selected a letter, press **▶** to move to the next letter. Press **◀** to move back one letter. Your name is capitalized for you. Names can include spaces.

- Press ◀ or ▶ to choose a picture for your player, and press the A Button.
If you have more than one controller connected, you can sign in additional players. To skip additional player sign in, press the B Button on the appropriate controller to close any additional Sign In windows.
- Select the game variation and/or the table stakes.

Starting a game

It's easy to get around in Hoyle Casino. You can use the menu to select a game to play, or you can walk around the casino floor. The casino floor is more useful for browsing; to quickly select a particular game, use the menu.



Menu



Casino Floor

To select a game using the Menu:

- Press the Start Button.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Games**, and press the A Button.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select the game you want to play, and press the A Button.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select the game variation and table stakes, if necessary, and press the A Button.

To move around the casino:

- Use the Analog Thumb Pad to move the chip pointer around the casino floor. Labels pop up to show you where games are located.
- Press the A Button to move to the area you're pointing to. To move back to the casino entrance, press the B Button.
- When you see a table or machine you like, point to it and press the A Button to start playing.

Changing casino options

You can change casino options such as sounds, animations, computer character settings, and game speed.

To change an option:

- Press the Start Button.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Casino Options**, and press the A Button.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select an option. To change that option, press ◀ or ▶.
Note: Press ▼ to scroll to see additional menu options.
- Press the A Button to make your changes, or press the B Button to close the window without making any changes. The casino options are described below.

Background Audio Sets whether you hear background sounds such as crowd noise and music while you play the games.

Animations Sets whether computer characters and game elements (such as dealer hands) move while you play.

Sound Effects Sets whether you hear sound effects such as dealing cards while you play.

Play Alone Specifies whether computer characters play games with you.

Speech	Sets whether computer characters talk while you play.
Characters	Sets how talkative and animated the computer characters are during the game. Select Serious to have characters talk and animate less often, or Talkative to have characters talk and animate frequently.
Game Speed	Sets the overall speed for the games, such as how fast cards are dealt. Select Slow, Medium, or Fast.
Practice Mode	Turns practice mode on or off. See "Getting help" on page 10 for more information on practice mode.
Vibration	Turns the vibration on or off. You must have a Jump Pack to use this feature; see page 4 for more information.
Audio	Sets the audio to Stereo or Monaural. If your television does not have stereo sound input, change this setting to Monaural to get better sound quality.

Adding, removing, and changing players

You can change the players in a game, if you like. You can't change players when a hand or game is in progress, but you can change players when you're about to make a bet. You can also change the picture for any human player.

To change a player:

1. Press the Start Button.
2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Players**, and press the A Button.
3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Replace Player**, and press the A Button.
4. Press ▲ or ▼ to choose the player you want to replace, and press the A Button.

You can then do one of the following:

- Select a computer character.

- Select **Real Person** to change to a human player (using another controller).
- Select **[Empty Seat]** to remove the player completely.

To change a player's picture:

1. Press the Start Button on the controller of the player whose picture you want to change.
2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Players**, and press the A Button.
3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Change Picture**, and press the A Button.
4. Press ◀ or ▶ to choose a new picture for that player, and press the A Button.

Viewing statistics

If you have a memory card, you can see statistics for any saved player, including the player's *Bankroll*, *Total Net* (all winnings so far), *Game Play Net* (all winnings minus any tournament winnings), and *Tournament Net* (all tournament winnings).

To view player statistics:

1. Press **Start**.
2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Players**, and press the A Button.
3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Player Statistics**, and press the A Button.
4. Press ▲ or ▼ to choose the player you want to see statistics for, and press the A Button.
5. Press ▲ or ▼ to view statistics for the given player for each casino game.
6. Press the A Button when you are done, or press the B Button to see statistics for another player.

Getting help

Hoyle Casino includes several types of help:

- **Help** includes instructions and rules for each game.
- **Tutorials** tell you how to play the current turn, and offer you advice on the best plays you can make. Tutorials are available in all games except Video Slots. Most tutorials also provide a Hint feature that highlights your best play on the screen; for example, in Pai Gow Poker, the Hint will show you which cards to use in your two-card hand.
- **Practice Mode** is available for all games except Poker, Slots, and Video Slots. When this option is turned on, Hoyle Casino watches your plays and, when you make a play that is not advisable, automatically pops up the relevant strategic information, and shows you the Hint for the best play.

To get help:

1. Press **Start**.
2. Press **▲** or **▼** to select **Help**, and press the A Button. The help window appears.
3. Press **▶** to view the next page of help, and press **◀** to go back to the previous page.
4. To close the help, press the A Button.

To view a tutorial:

1. In a game, press the X Button on your controller. The tutorial window appears.
2. Press **▶** to view the next page of the tutorial, and press **◀** to go back to the previous page.
3. Press the X Button to view the Hint (if desired). This closes the tutorial.
4. To close the tutorial, press the A Button.

To turn practice mode on or off:

1. Press **Start**.
2. Press **▲** and **▼** to select **Casino Options**, and press the A Button.
3. Press **▲** and **▼** to select **Practice Mode**. Press **◀** to select ON or **▶** to select OFF.
4. Press the A Button to close the options menu, then press the A Button again.

Betting

Betting works the same way in most games. In table games (Blackjack, Craps, Pai Gow Poker, Poker, and Roulette), you can make the minimum table bet by pressing the A Button. For machines (Slots, Video Poker, and Video Slots), you can bet one credit at a time using the **Bet One** button, or use **Bet Max** or **Play Max** (for Slots and Video Slots) to bet the maximum number of credits.

For table games, you can change your bet amount before you bet. That bet amount is used as your bet until you leave the game or change it again.

To change your bet:

1. Press the Y Button to bring up the bet window.



2. Press **▲** and **▼** to select the amount to add to or subtract from your current bet, which is shown at the top of the bet window.

3. Press **▶** to add the selected amount to your bet, or press **◀** to subtract the selected amount from your bet. Your bet is updated automatically.
4. Press the A Button to exit the bet window with the new bet amount.
5. Press the A Button again to bet the new bet amount.

Sitting down in a game

In table games (Blackjack, Craps, Pai Gow Poker, Poker, and Roulette), the controller you use dictates which seat you sit in. If you are the only player (you use the controller in Port A), you sit at the rightmost seat and play first. If a player is using the controller in Port B, that player is seated to your immediate left, and so on.

Changing game options

In several games, you can change options for how the game is played, such as the house rules for that game. Game options are available for Blackjack, Craps, and Pai Gow Poker. For information on specific game options, see the section for that game in "Playing the games" beginning on the next page.

Options can be changed at any time and affect the next hand or turn.

To change game options:

1. Press **Start**.
2. Press **▲** or **▼** to select the Options menu item for the game; this is the game name followed by Options; for example, Blackjack's options menu is called **Blackjack Options**.
3. Press **▲** or **▼** to select an option to change. Press **▼** to scroll to see additional menu options (if any).
4. Press **◀** or **▶** to change settings for the selected option.
5. Press the A Button to make your changes, or press the B Button to close the window without making any changes.

Playing the games

For game rules, see the help in the games. See "Getting help" on page 10 for information.

Playing Blackjack

To play:

1. Place the minimum table bet by pressing the A Button.
To use a different bet amount, press the Y Button, select your new bet, and press the A Button. Then press the A Button again to make your bet.
2. On your turn, you can hit or stand. Depending on your hand and game settings, you may also be able to double down, split, or surrender.
3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select the action you want to take, and press the A Button.

Blackjack options

Number of Decks

Sets how many decks are used in the game.

Double Down

Specifies the hand totals required for doubling down.

Surrender

Specifies whether players have the option of surrendering half their bet and dropping out of the game at the start of their turns.

Splitting

Specifies whether splitting is allowed only once, up to three times, or not at all.

Double Down After Split

Allows doubling down after splitting your hand.

Resplit Aces

Allows multiple splitting when aces are dealt.

Insurance Bet

Allows players to take insurance (bet half the current bet, and get paid 2-1 if the dealer has blackjack. Insurance is offered only when the dealer has an Ace up.

- Dealer Hits on Soft 17** Forces the dealer to hit when dealt a soft 17.
- Shuffle at %** Specifies the percentage of the total deck that must be dealt before the dealer shuffles and deals again.
- Dealer Voice** Sets whether the dealer speaks during the game.
- Show Hand Total** Shows the value of each player's hand.
- Card Counting** Displays card counting information as the game is played. For more on card counting, see the in-game help.

Playing Craps

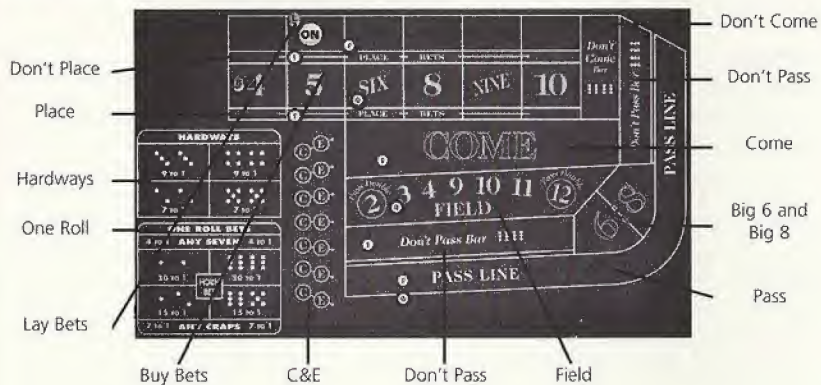
To play:

- Use the chip pointer to move around the Craps table. For precise movements on the table, use the D-Button.
- To place the minimum table bet, press the A Button. You can place as many bets as you like.
 - To use a different bet amount, press the Y Button, select your new bet, and press the A Button. Then press the A Button again to make your bet.
 - To increase a bet already on the table, point to it with the chip pointer and press the A Button to add the same amount again.
 - To remove a bet from the table, point to it with the chip pointer and press the B Button.
- When you're done betting, move the chip pointer to the Done area and press the A Button, or press the L/R Trigger.

Note: When it's your turn, you're asked whether you want to shoot the dice; press the A Button to accept or the B Button to decline. When it's time to shoot, an arm appears; press the A Button to shoot.

Craps bets

The Craps bets, and how to play them, are described in detail in the in-game help. A diagram of Craps bets is shown below:



Craps Bet Types

Craps options

Free Odds

Sets the amount of free odds allowed. For example, 1x lets you wager an amount equal to your Pass Line bet, and 5x lets you wager five times your Pass Line bet.

Take Max Odds

Allows players to take the maximum allowable free odds for Pass Line and Don't Pass bets. If this option is off, you may need to bet several times to take max odds.

Stickman Voice

Sets whether the stickman (dealer) speaks during the game.

**Bets Work on
Come Out**

Allows Buy/Lay, Place/Don't Place and Free-odds wagers to be active (they can be added or removed and they pay off or lose) on the Come Out roll.

Playing Pai Gow Poker

To play:

1. Place the minimum table bet by pressing the A Button.
To use a different bet amount, press the Y Button, select your new bet, and press the A Button, then press the A Button to make your bet.
2. Choose two cards for your two-card hand. Press ◀ or ▶ to select a card, then press ▼ to move that card to your two-card hand. Repeat this for the second card. To move a card back into your hand, press ▲ with that card selected.
3. When you've selected both cards for your two-card hand, press the A Button.

Pai Gow Poker options

**A-5 2nd Highest
Straight**

Makes the straight or straight flush of A-2-3-4-5 rank just below a straight or straight flush of 10-J-Q-K-A. If this option is off, A-2-3-4-5 is the lowest ranking straight or straight flush.

Allow Player Bankers

Allows players to be banker. To be banker, a player must have enough money to cover the maximum bet for all players at the table. A player has the opportunity to be banker once every five turns.

Dealer Voice

Sets whether the dealer speaks during the game.

Playing Poker

Poker includes seven variations: Texas Hold'em, Omaha Hold'em, Omaha Hold'em Hi-Lo, Seven Card Stud, Seven Card Stud Hi-Lo, Five Card Draw, and Five Card Draw Lowball. For specific game rules, see the help for each game.

To play:

1. Press the A Button to start the deal or ante.
2. Periodically, depending on the game variation, you're prompted to take one or more of these actions: **Raise, Call, Open, Check, or Fold.**
Press ▲ or ▼ to select the action you want, and press the A Button.
3. In Five Card Draw games, each player can discard one or more of his or her cards and draw new cards, if desired. See below.
4. Betting continues until the turn comes around to the player who made the highest bet, and every other player either called the bet or folded. The player with the highest hand wins.

To discard cards in Five Card Draw games:

1. Press ◀ or ▶ to select a card, then press ▲ to mark it as a discard. Repeat this for the each card you want to discard. To move a card back into your hand, press ▼ with that card selected.
2. When you've selected the cards you want to discard, press the A Button to draw new cards.

Playing Roulette

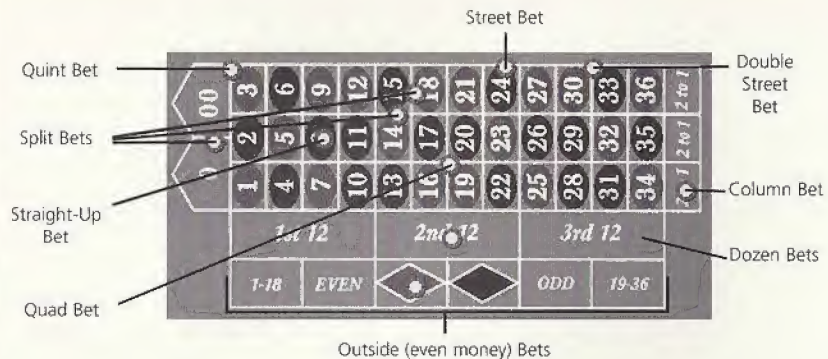
To play:

1. Use the chip pointer to move around the Roulette table. For precise movements on the table, use the D-Button.
2. To place the minimum table bet, press the A Button. You can place as many bets as you like.
 - To use a different bet amount, press the Y Button, select your new bet, and press the A Button. Then press the A Button again to make your bet.
 - To increase a bet already on the table, point to it with the chip pointer and press the A Button to add the same amount again.
 - To remove a bet from the table, point to it with the chip pointer and press the B Button.
3. When you're done betting, move the chip pointer to the Done area and press the A Button, or press the L/R Trigger.

Note: You can automatically repeat the last set of bets by moving the chip pointer to the Place Last Bets area and pressing the A Button. You can change those bets, if you like before finishing the betting as described in step 2, above.

Roulette bets

Roulette bets, and how to play them, are described in detail in the in-game help. A diagram of Roulette bets is shown on the next page.

Playing Slots

To play:

1. Press ◀ or ▶ to select buttons, the bill slot, and the slot handle.
To view the payout table up close, press the Y Button. Press any button to go back to the machine.
2. To bet, select **Bet One** to bet one credit, or **Bet Max** to bet the maximum credits possible, and press the A Button.
3. To spin, select **Spin** and press the A Button, or select the slot handle and press the A Button.
To bet the maximum credits and spin at the same time, select **Play Max** and press the A Button.

To insert 100 credits, select the bill slot and press the A Button. This is just for fun; your bankroll is always available.

To collect any credits you won, select **Cash Out** and press the A Button. This is also for fun; your winnings are added to your bankroll when you leave the machine.

Playing Video Poker

To play:

1. Press ◀ or ▶ to select buttons and the bill slot. After you deal, press ▲ or ▼ to move between the cards and the buttons.

To view the payout table up close, press the Y Button. Press any button to go back to the machine.

2. To bet one credit at a time, select **Bet One** and press the A Button; when you're done, select **Deal** and press the A Button. To bet the maximum credits and deal, select **Bet Max** and press the A Button.

The hand pointer moves up to the cards on the screen.

3. To hold a card, select it, and press the A Button. To undo holding a card, select that card and press the A Button again. To quickly hold all the cards, select **Hold All** and press the A Button. To quickly undo holding all the cards, select **Discard All** and press the A Button.

4. When you're done selecting cards you want to hold, deal additional cards by selecting **Deal** and pressing the A Button.

To insert 100 credits, select the bill slot and press the A Button. This is just for fun; your bankroll is always available.

To collect any credits you won, select **Cash Out** and press the A Button. This is also for fun; your winnings are added to your bankroll when you leave the machine.

Playing Video Slots

There are three different types of Video Slots machines: Break the Bank, Road Pizza, and Three Wishes. For information on the variations between these machines, see the in-game help.

To play:

1. Use ▲ and ▼ to select buttons and the bill slot.
2. To bet, select **Bet One** to bet one credit, or **Bet Max** to bet the maximum credits possible, and press the A Button.
To bet the maximum credits and spin at the same time, select **Play Max**, and press the A Button.
3. To spin, select **Spin** and press the A Button.

To insert 100 credits, select the bill slot and press the A Button. This is just for fun; your winnings are added to your bankroll when you leave the machine. To collect any credits you won, select **Cash Out** and press the A Button. This is also for fun; your winnings are added to your bankroll when you leave the machine.

Tournament play

You can start a tournament version of any of the following games: Blackjack, Craps, Pai Gow Poker, Poker, or Roulette.

At the start of the tournament, you are asked to choose the tournament stake (what each player must pay to enter the tournament). Note that you can only enter a tournament if you can afford it.

A tournament ends after a preset number of hands, rolls, or spins. The player with the highest tournament bankroll wins the prize money. If all players, or all players but one, run out of money, the tournament ends early. If two or more players are tied for the highest tournament bankroll when the tournament is set to end, the tournament continues until the tie is broken.

The game options are fixed for tournament play; you can see what the options are in the game options window for that game. (Poker and Roulette have no game options). You cannot change players once a tournament has started.

To start a tournament:

1. Press **Start**.
2. Press **▲** or **▼** to select **Games**, and press the A Button.
3. Select the game you want using **▲** or **▼**, and press the A Button.
4. Select **Tournament**, and press the A Button.

Credit cards and loans

Each player in Hoyle Casino has a credit card reflecting that player's status with the casino. New players start with a green credit card and can advance to cards with higher credit levels by winning money. The higher your credit level, the more you can borrow from the casino.

You cannot save credit card information between play sessions unless you have a memory card, and then you can only save it for players you created, not for the built-in players.

Getting and repaying loans

If you run out of money during a game, you're asked if you want to take a loan. You can also visit the Cashier to ask for a loan. The Cashier has two locations on the casino floor; one is at the back right side of the main floor.

There are some situations in which you will not be offered a loan. You can't get a loan if you already have a loan outstanding, if you are playing in a tournament, or if the casino decides you already have enough money and don't need to borrow more.

You can repay a loan at the Cashier at any time.
