ACTIVITIES

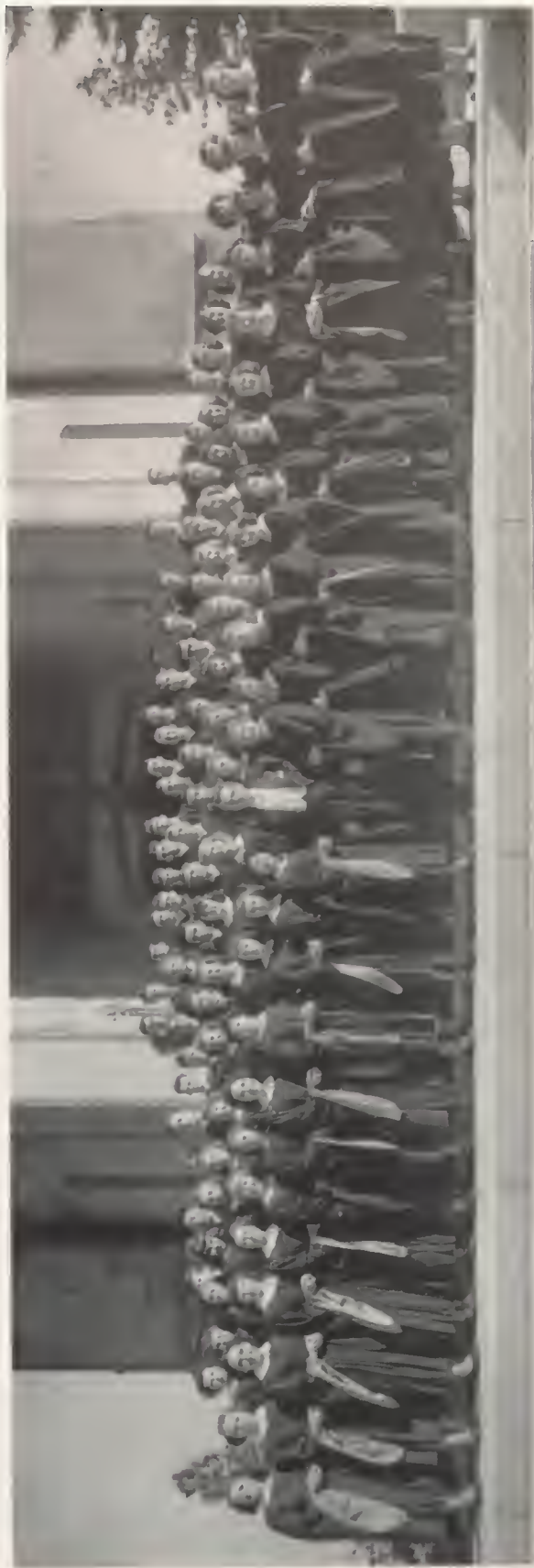

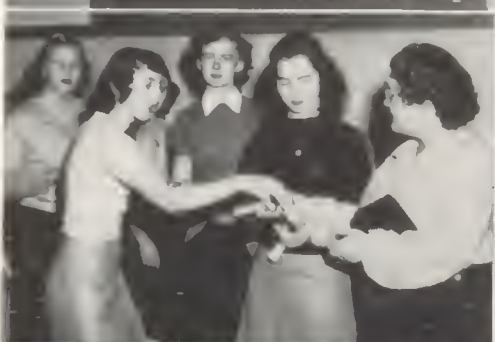

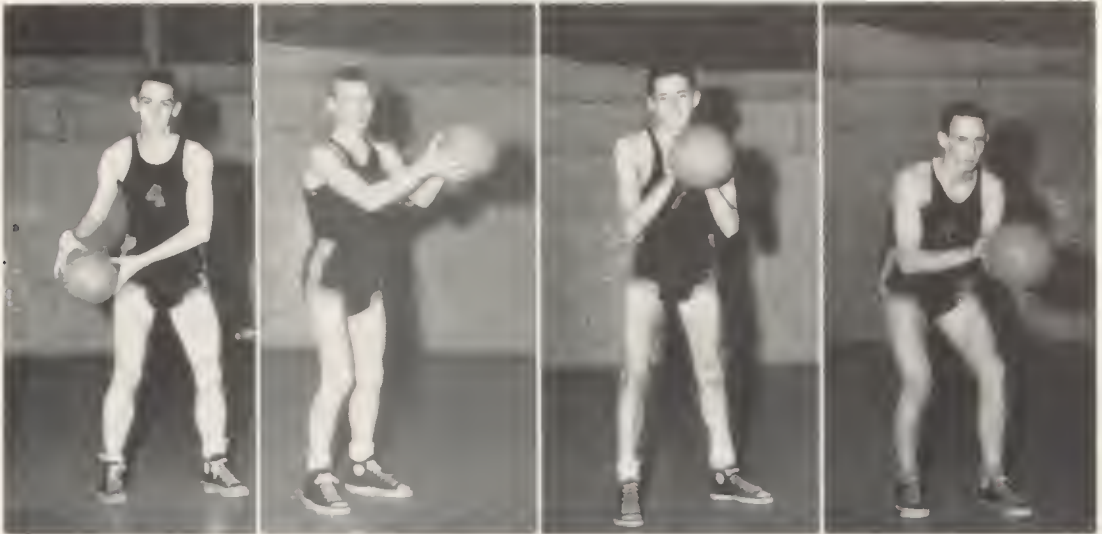
