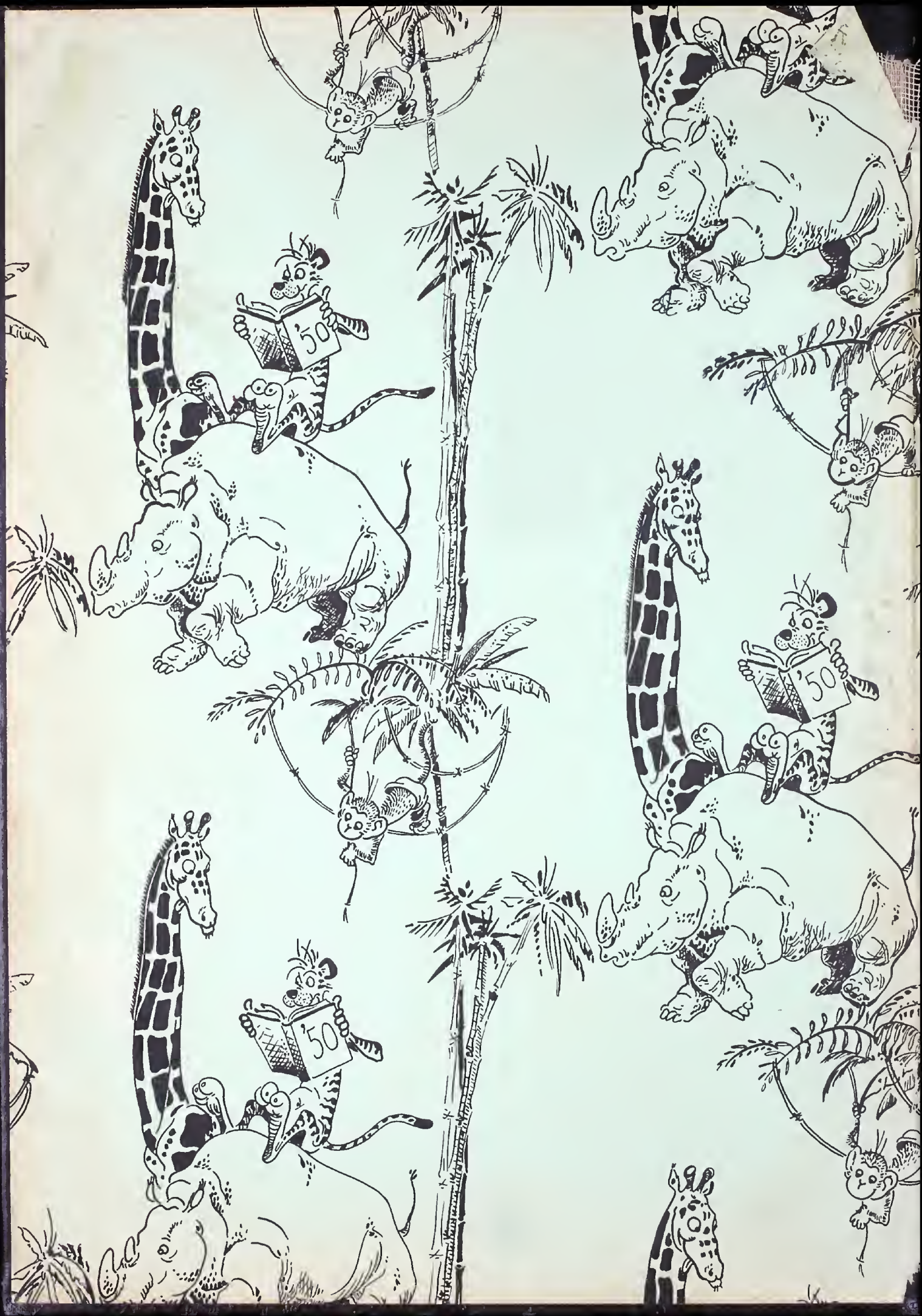

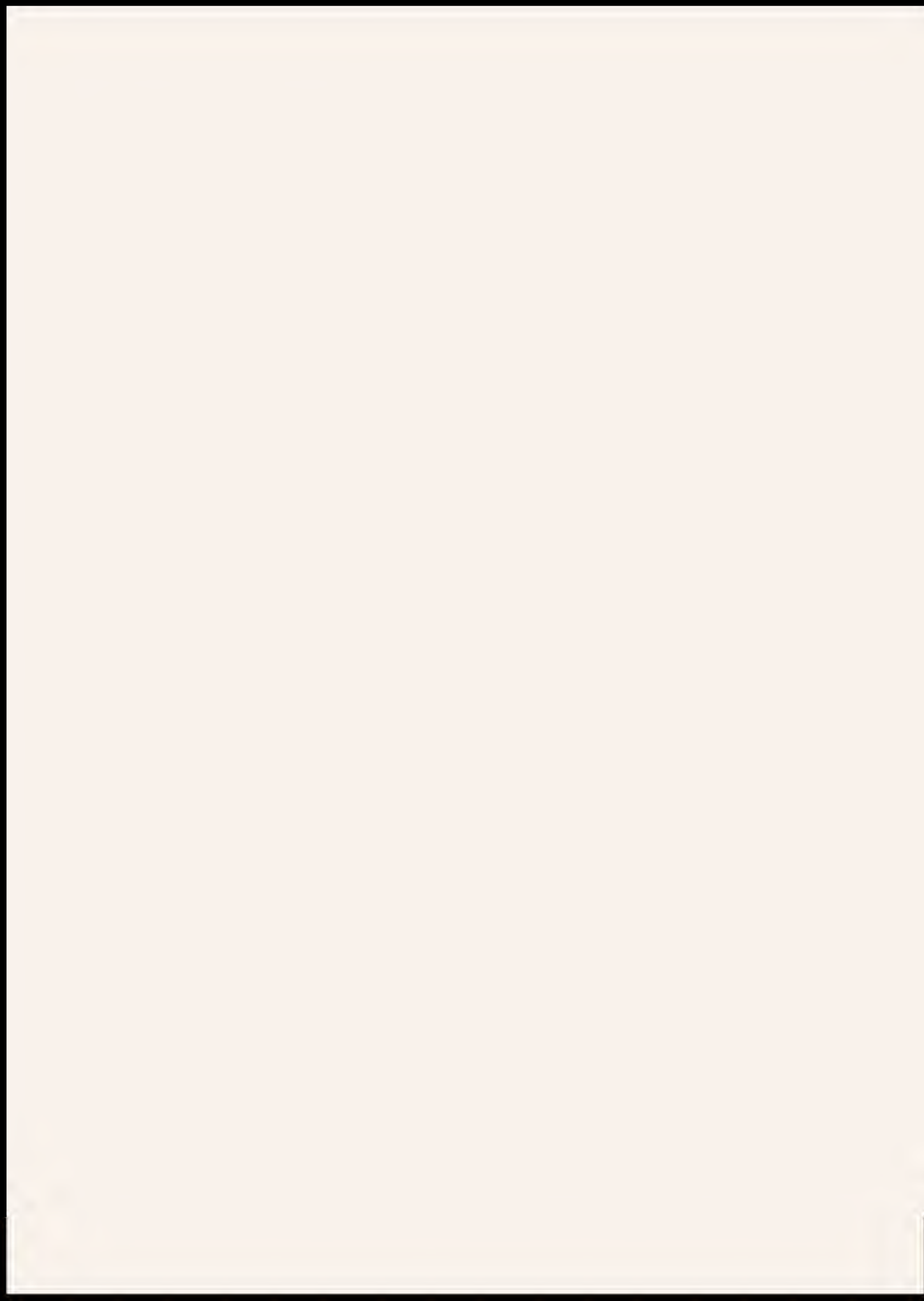

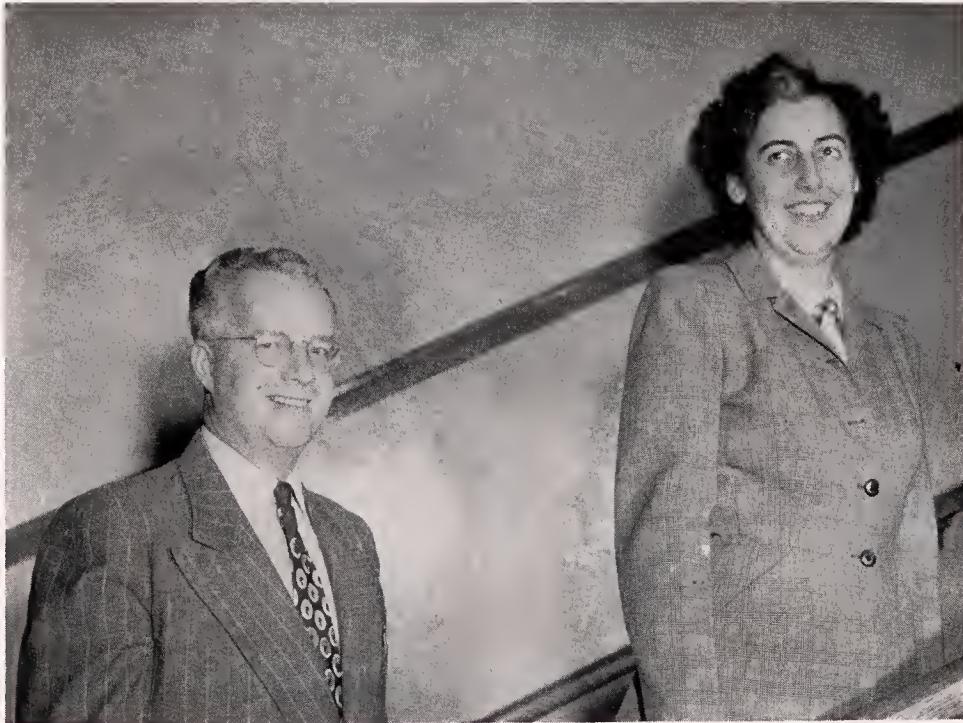
This beautiful etching, "Burgos Cathedral," by Andrew Affleck, is representative of the large Lewis and Clark art collection. The structure is Spanish.

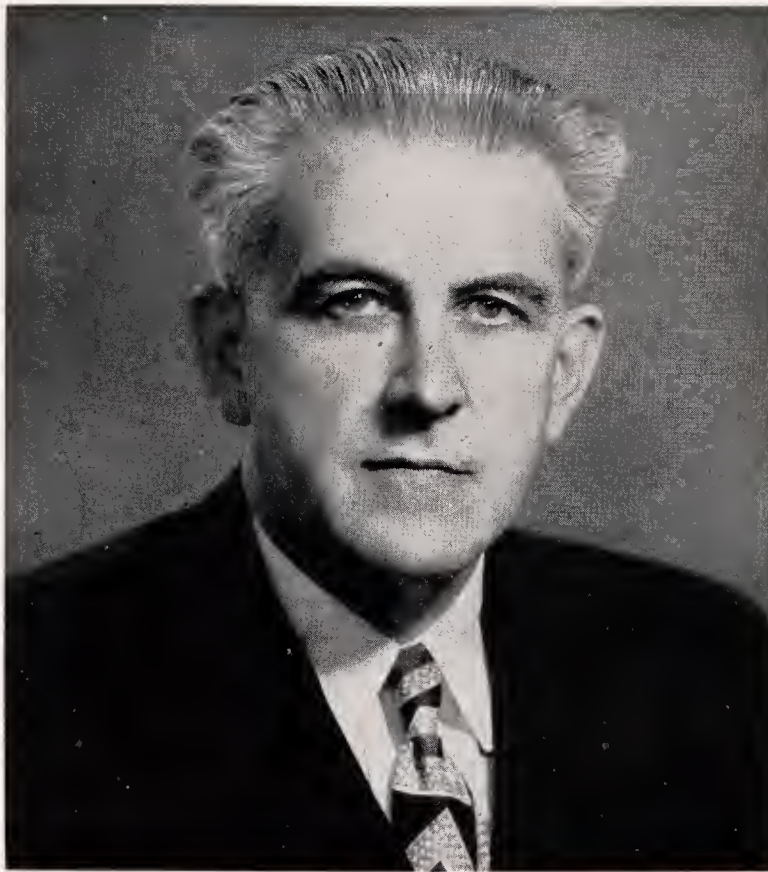
These two views of the school show the front entrance and northeast corner surrounded by trees.

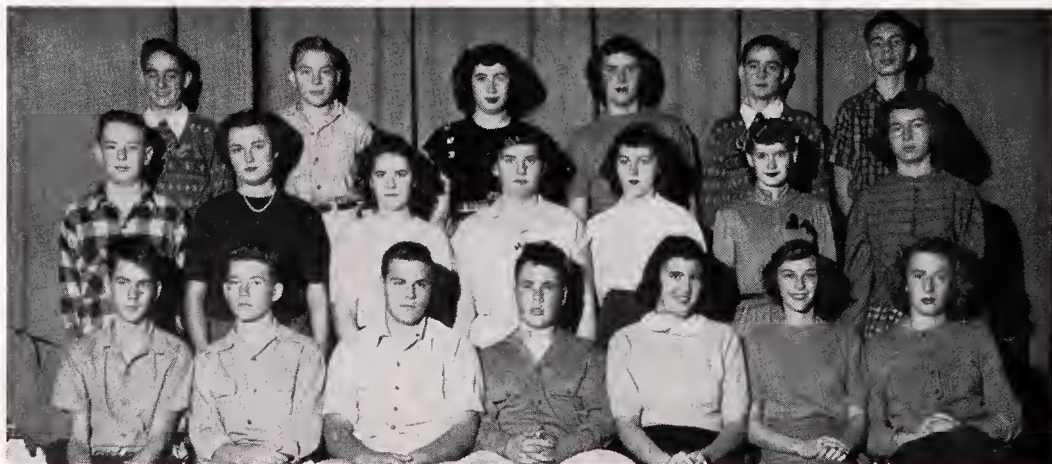

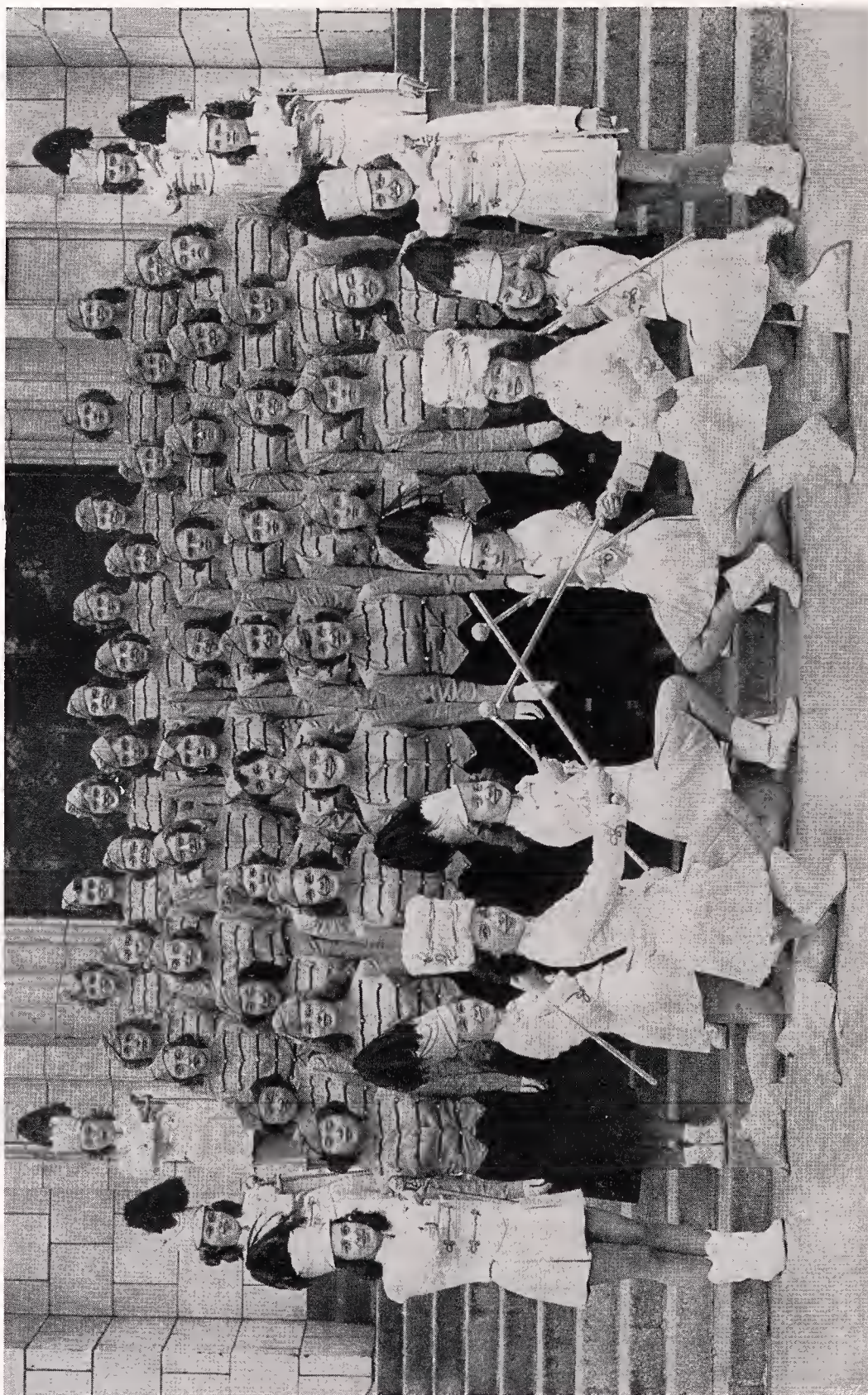

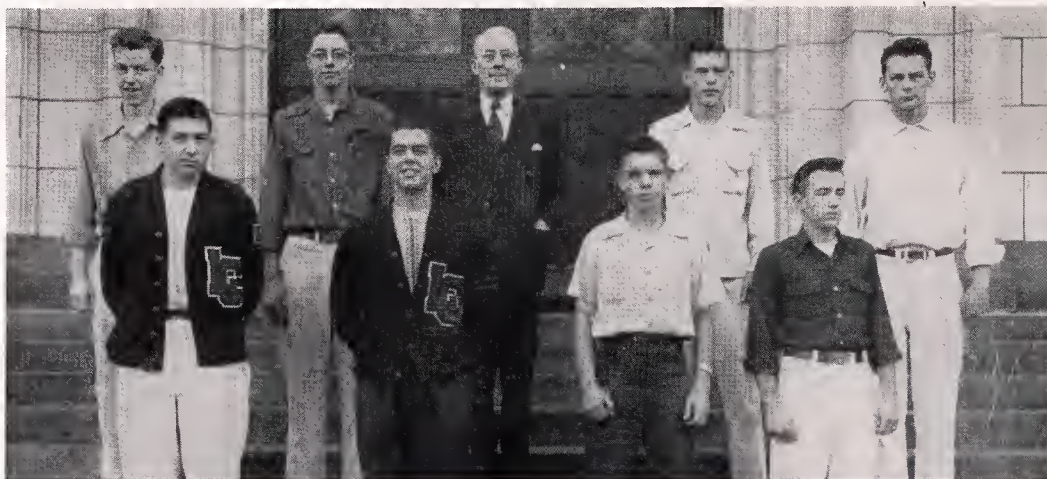

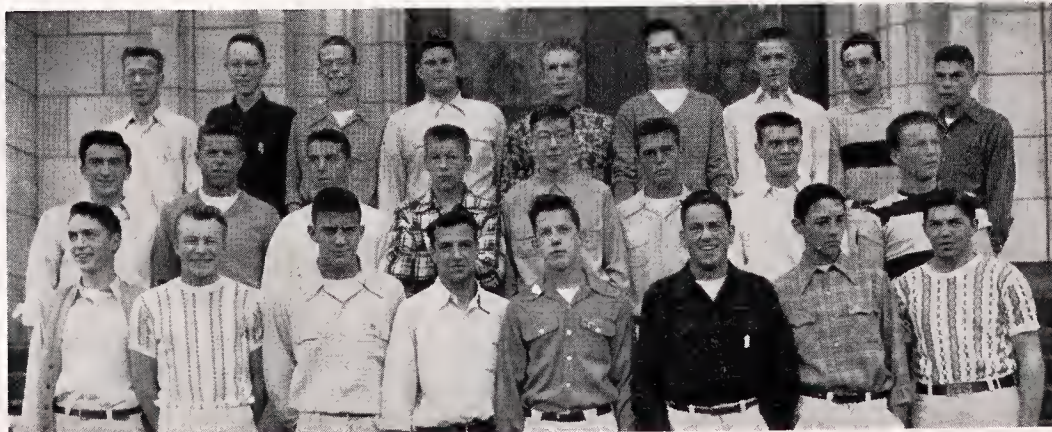

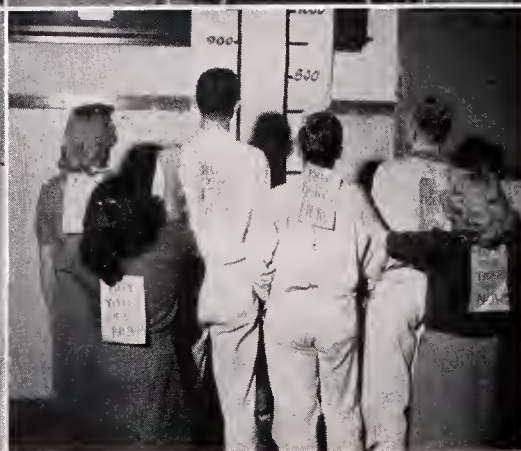

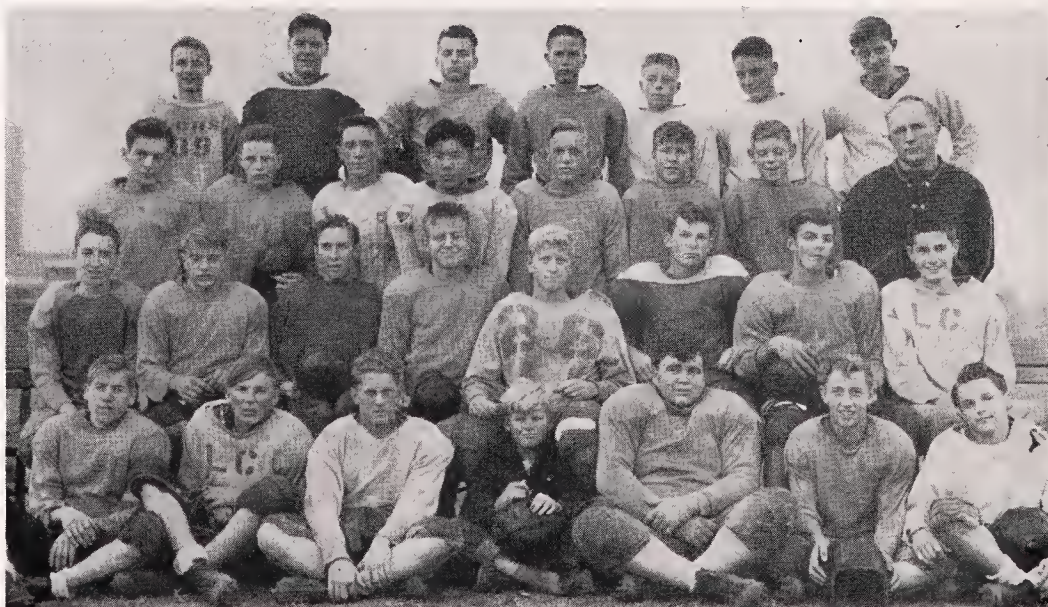

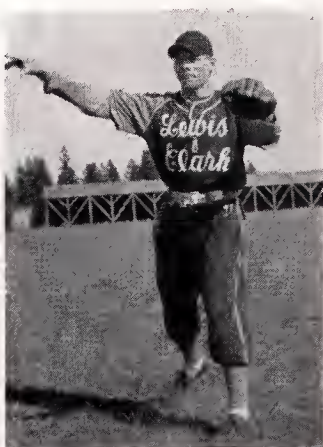

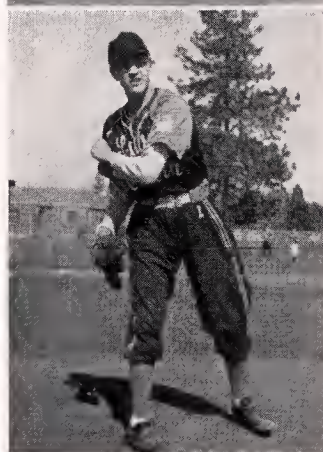
