May 20—Mrs. Collins, supervisor of study hall 107, has said repeatedly that she could not get along without her band of loyal servants—the proctors and roll checkers.


May 22—What's the matter? When the photographer happened around, there weren't as many kids around O.B.C. eorner as usual.


