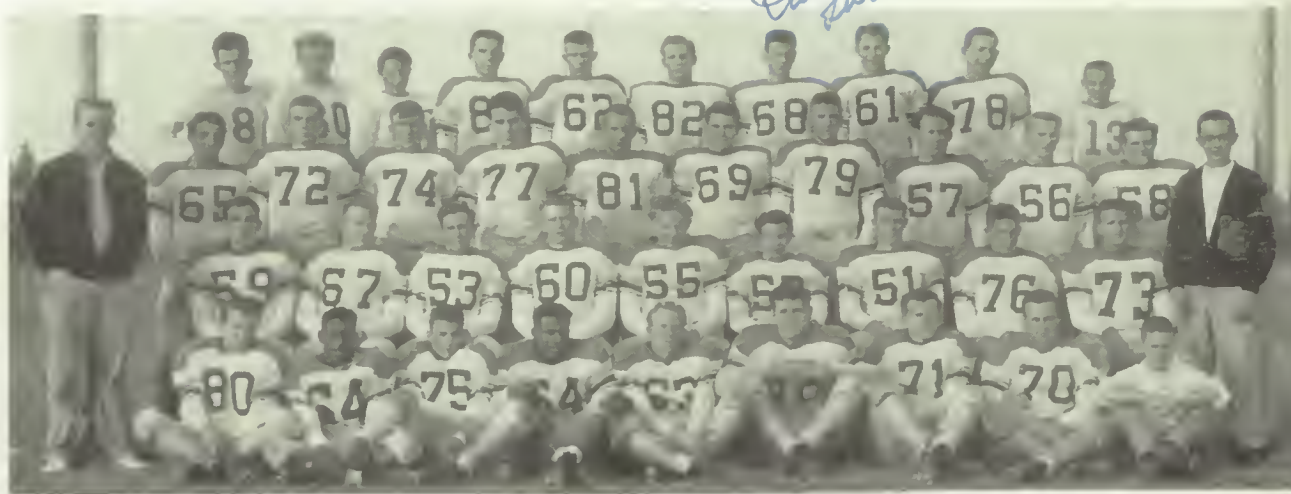

## Greenies Grab City Championship



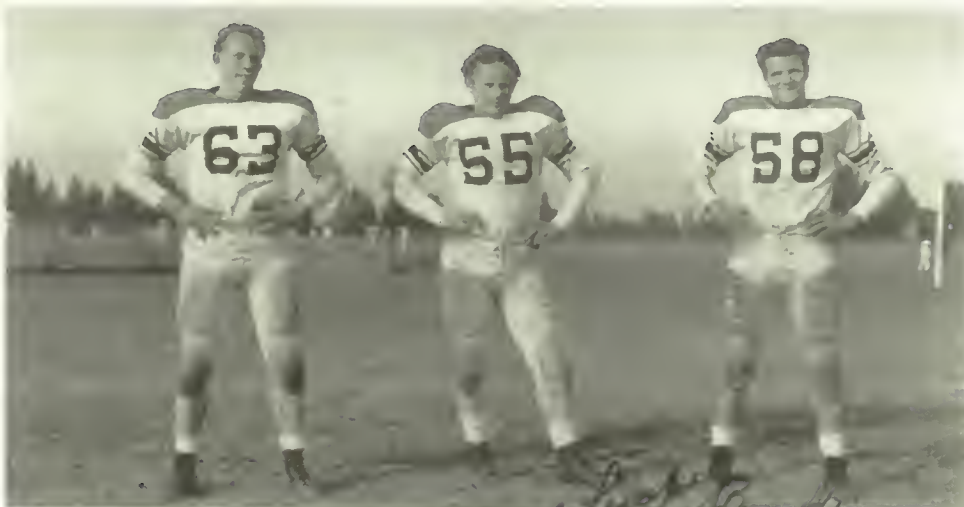

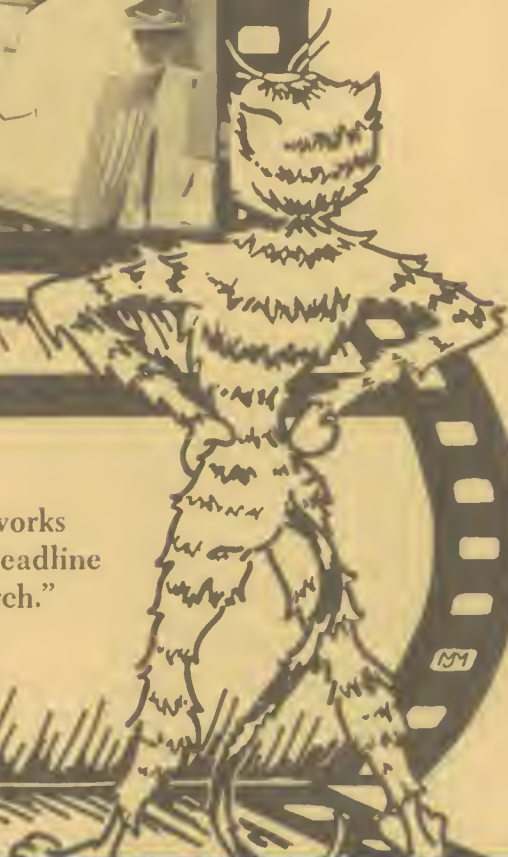
