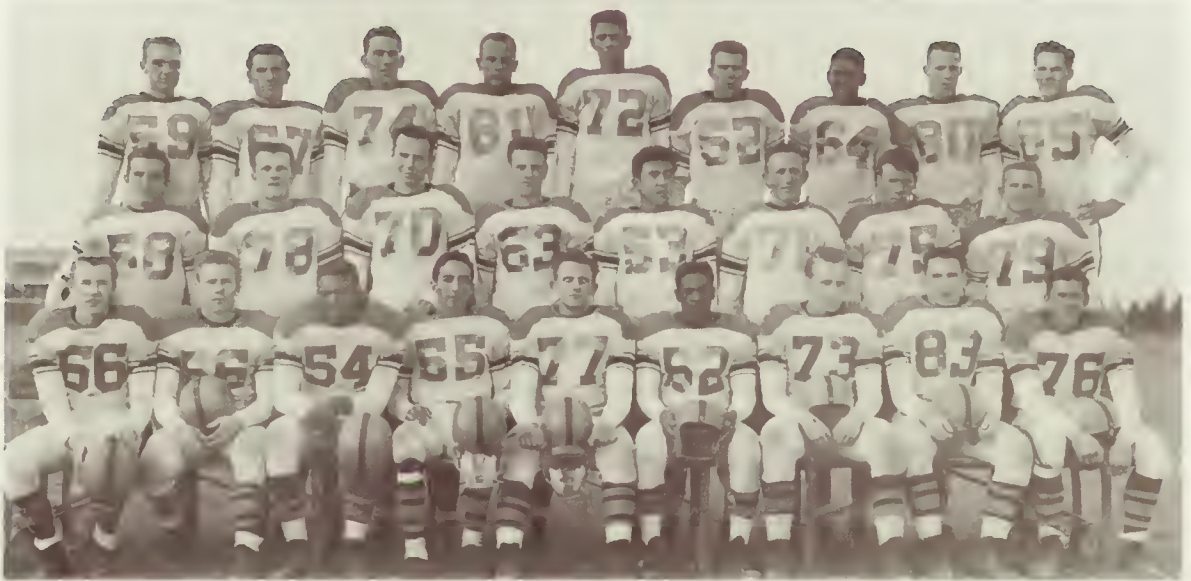

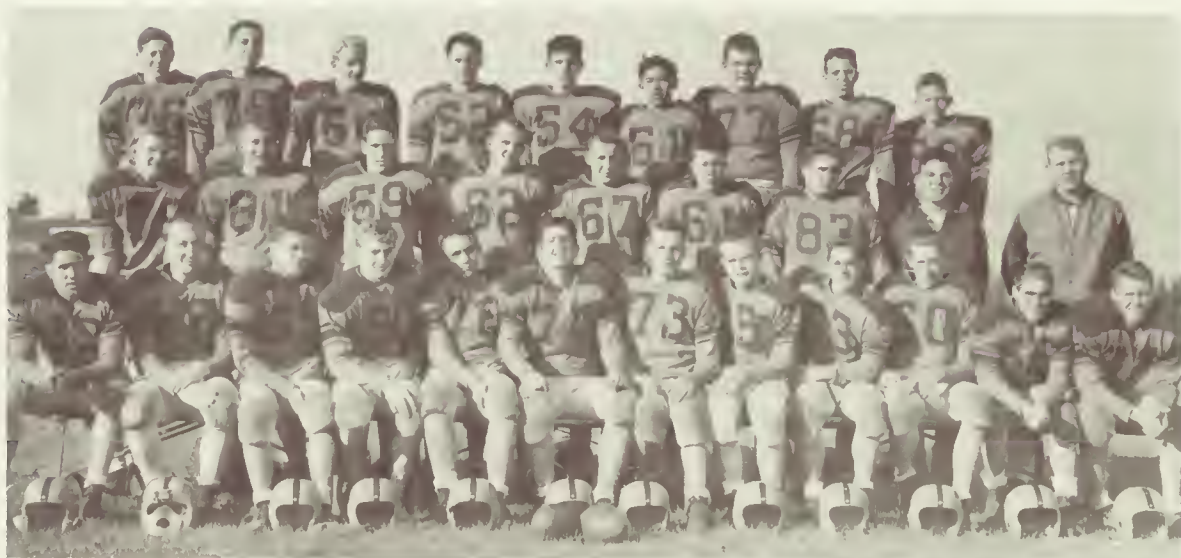

CITY AND A.A.U. CHAMPIONS



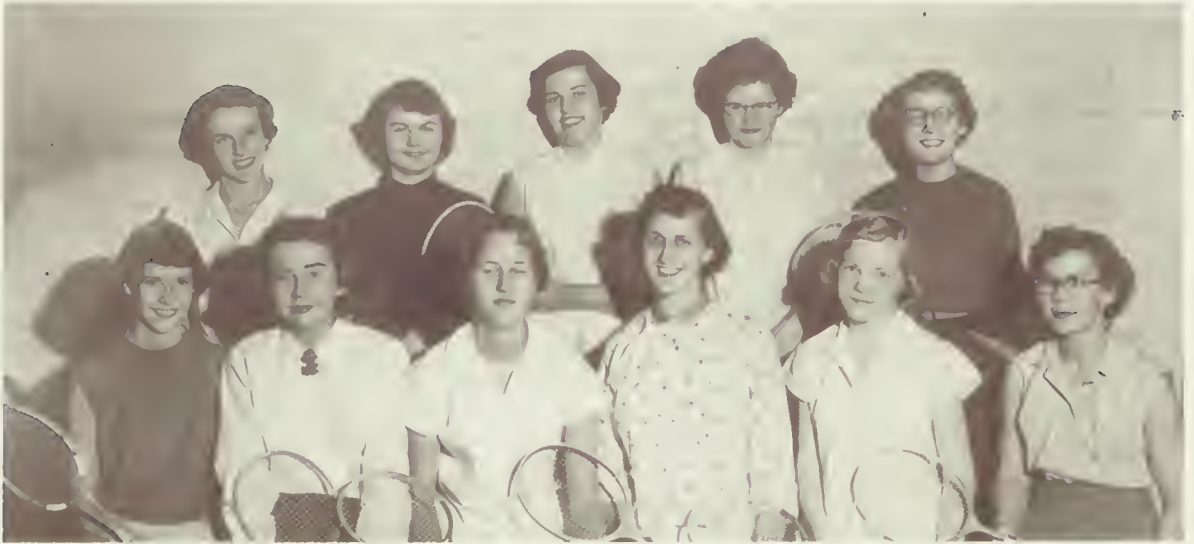

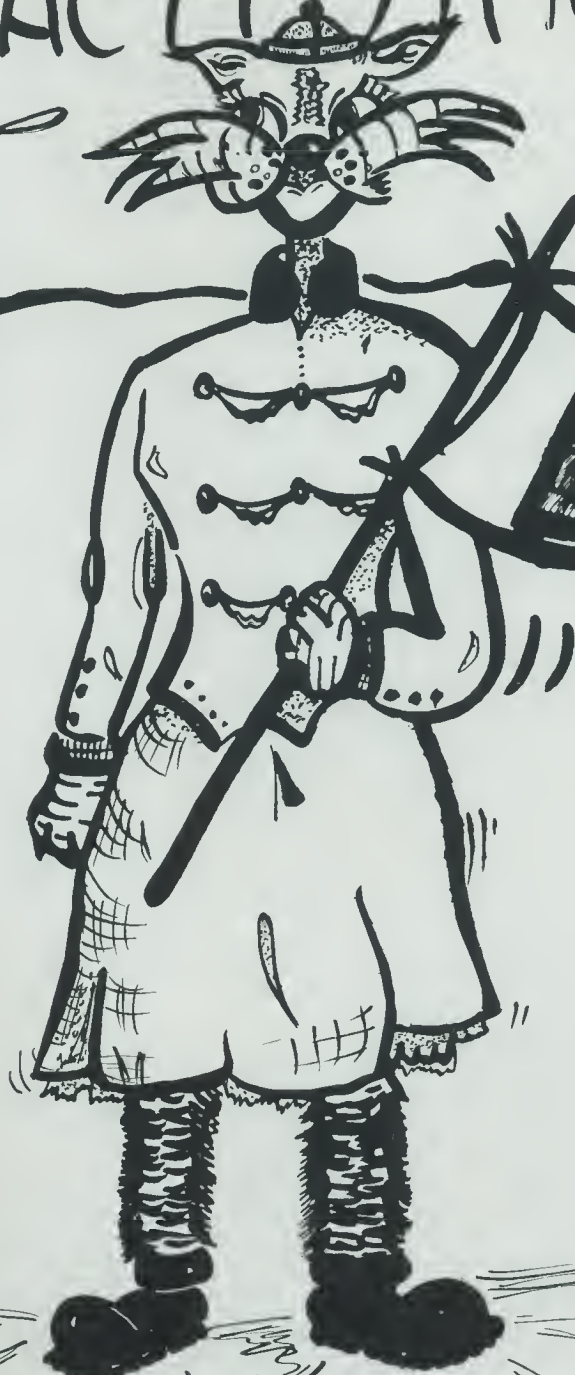

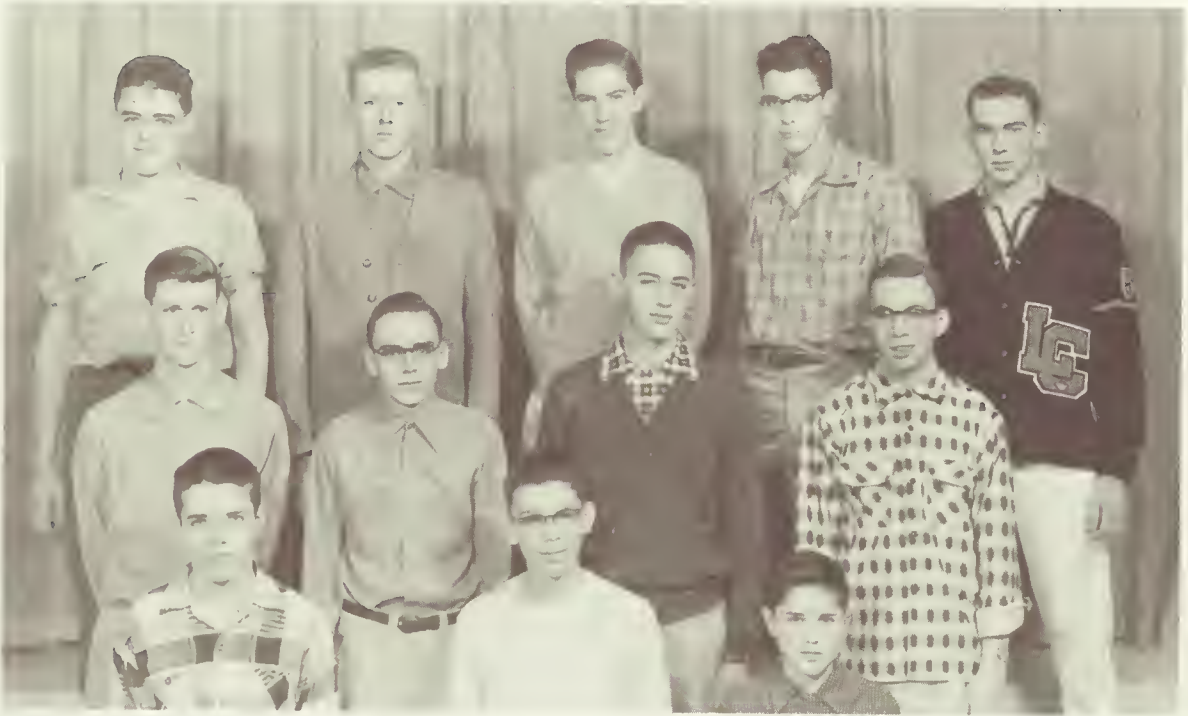

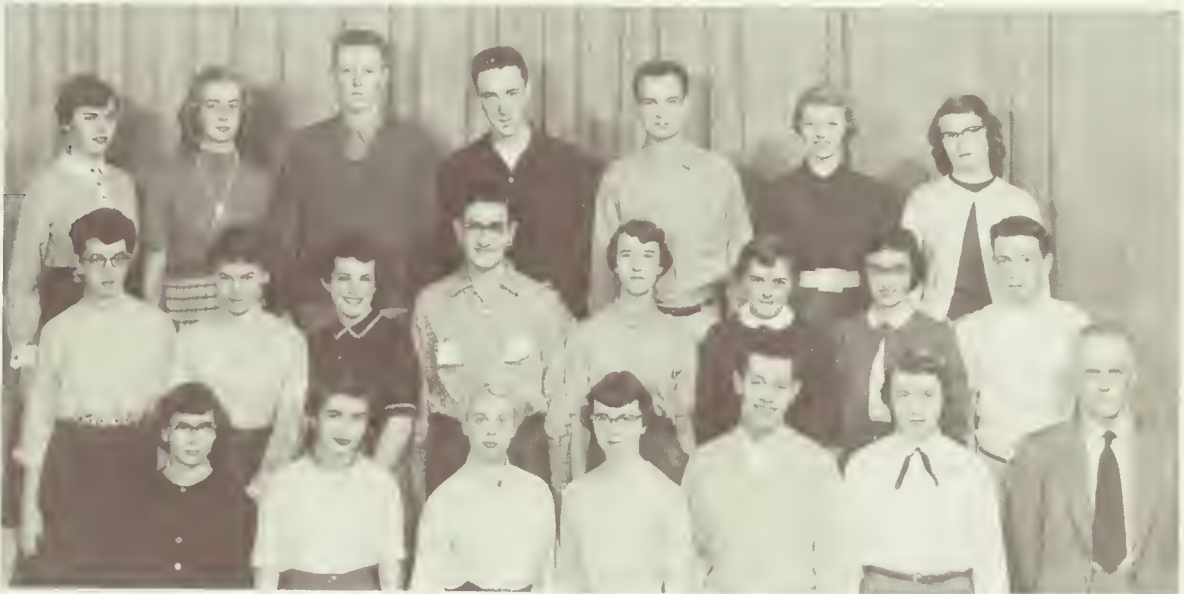

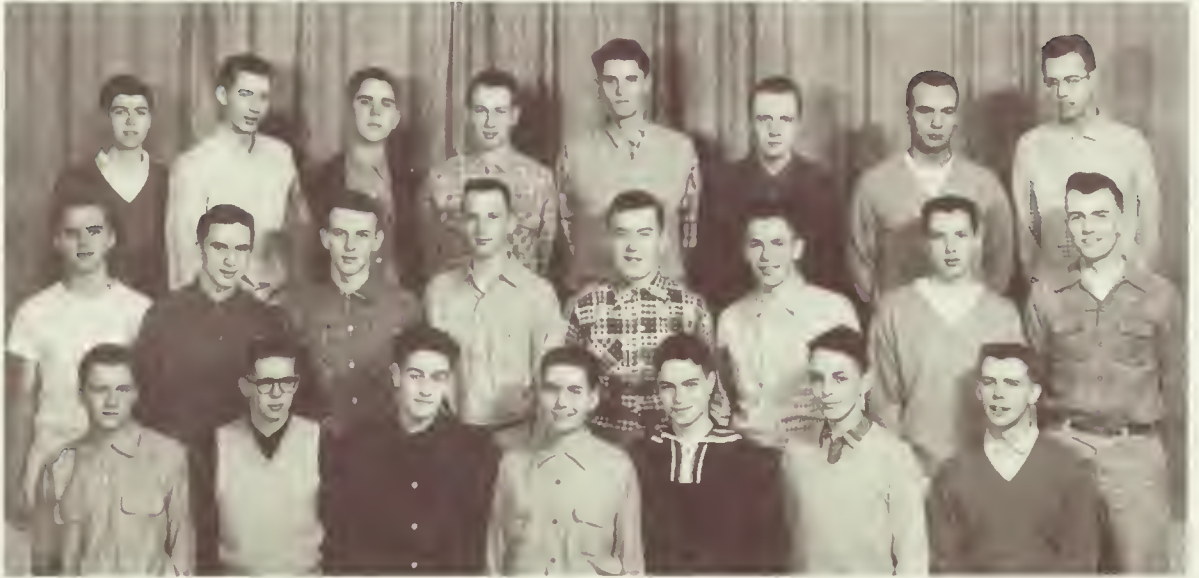

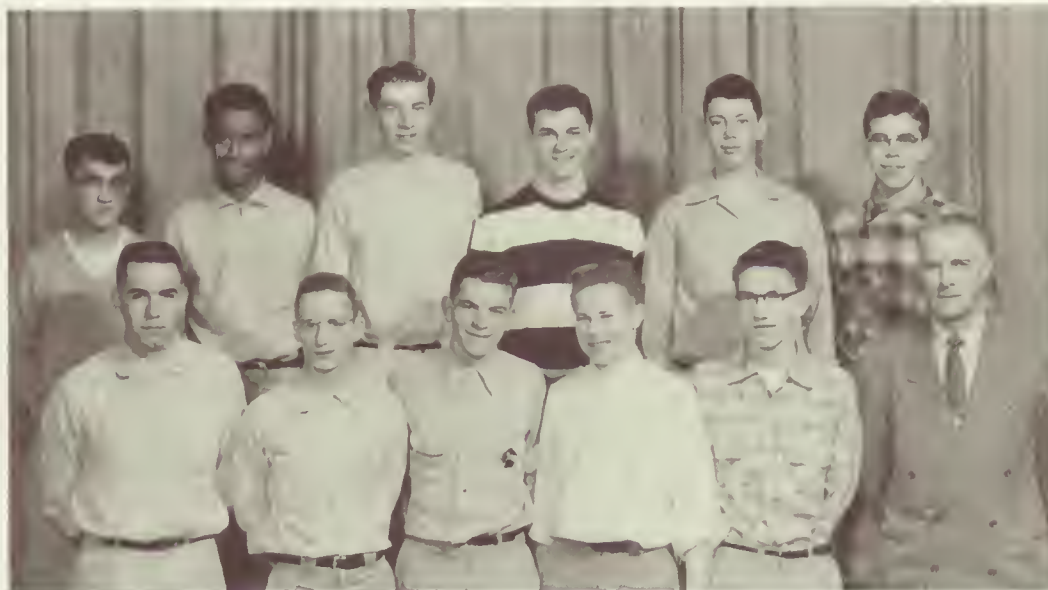

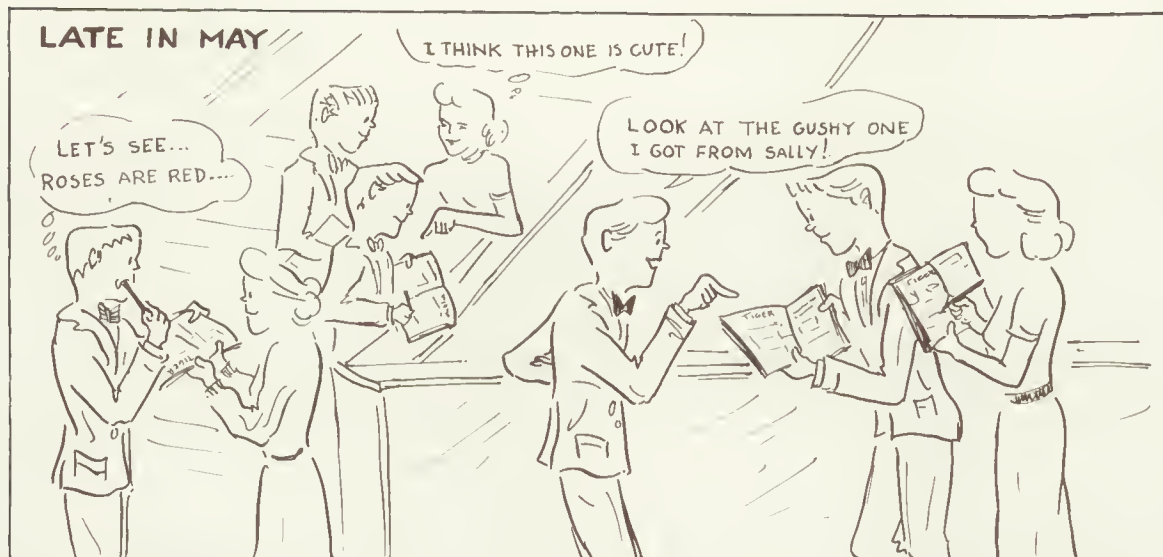

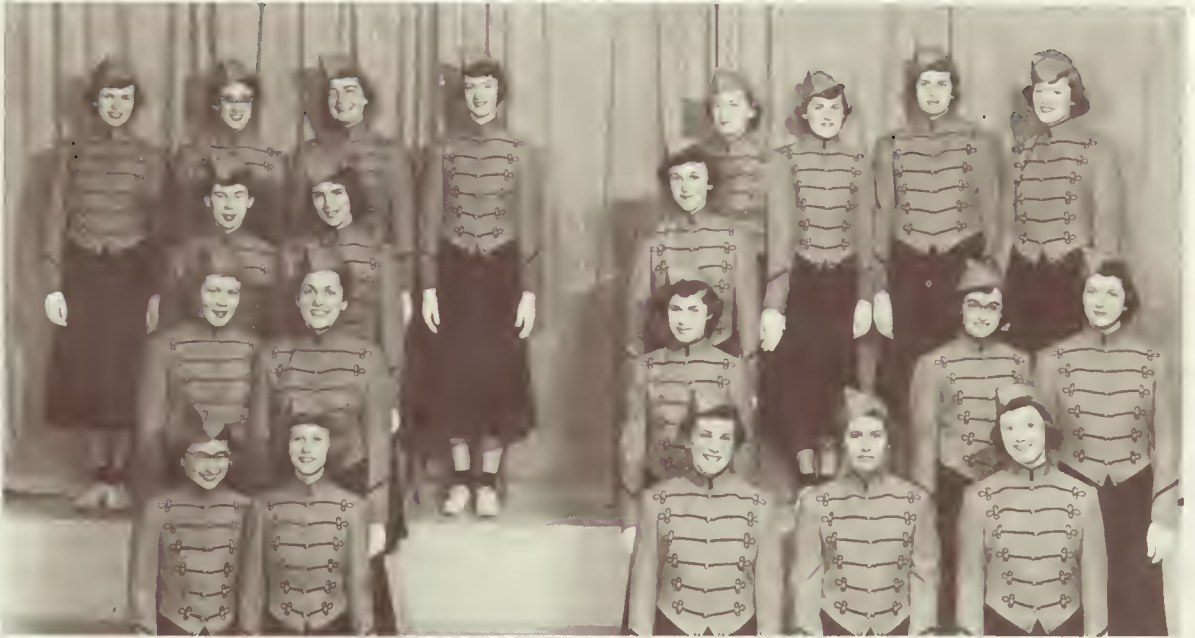

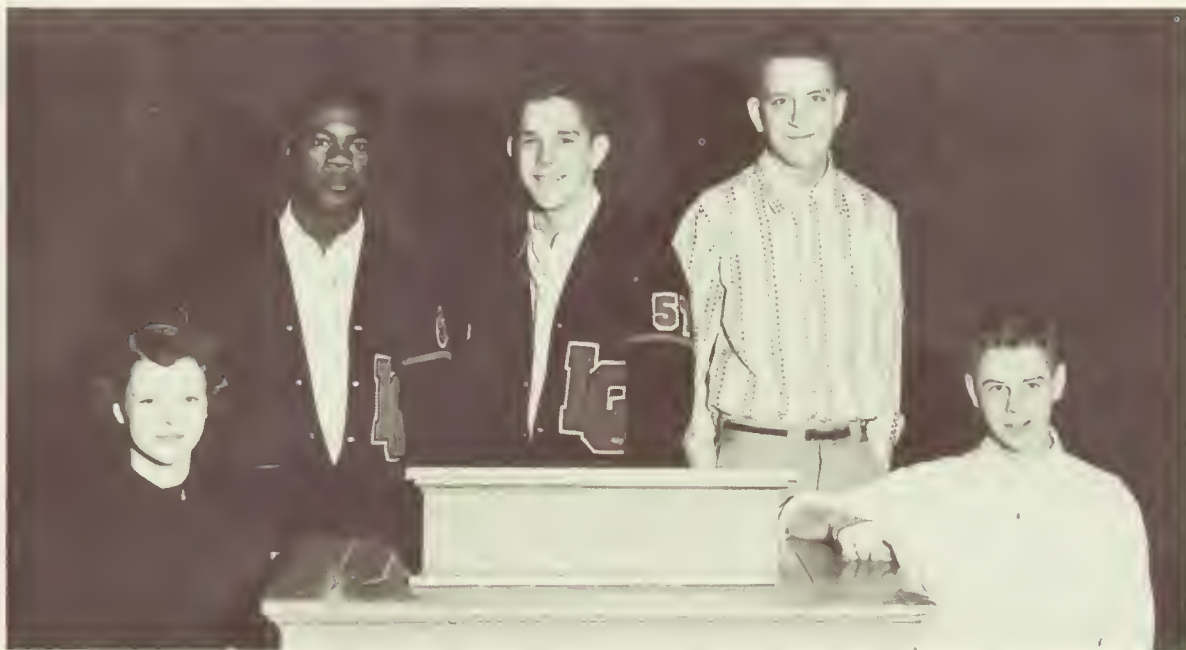

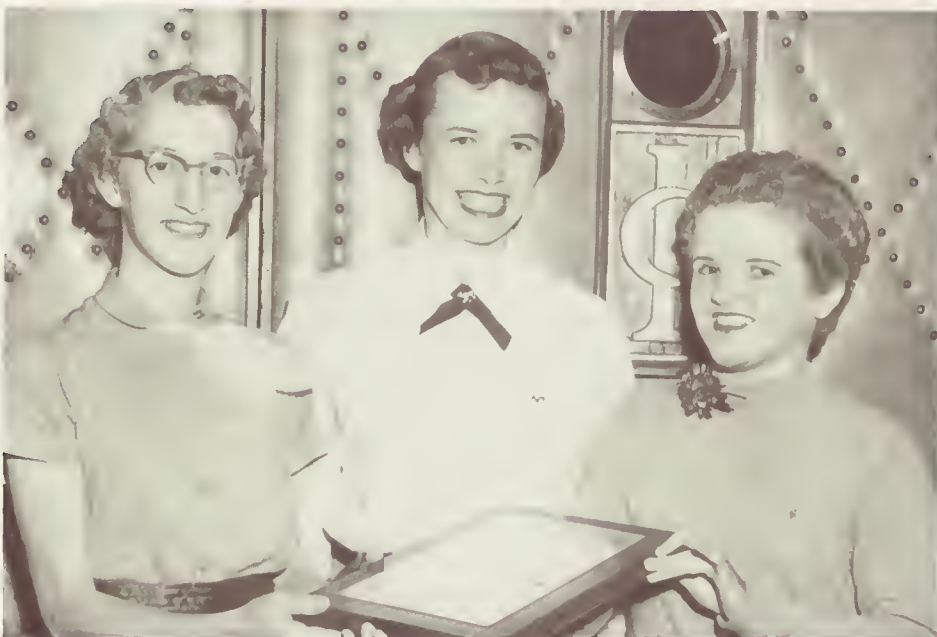
