



## 1954 TIGER NINE CAPTURES CHAMPIONSHIP



The Tiger baseballers captured their thirteenth city championship in the spring of "54," their first since 1951. Lightly regarded in pre-season predictions, the Tigers "backed" into the championship when N.C. downed the Bengals in the season finale 4-2, but Rogers upset Gonzaga 6-2 to hand the Tigers the title. 


