All-State Mike Clarke (also his second All-City year), and All-City seniors Steve Conley and Bill Oaksford, and juniors John Etter and Rick Maras provided the core for this year's Tiger team.

Mike Clarke was chosen as a linebacker on the 1968 AllState team. For All-City he was chosen for line backer and center and was honorary captain of the Chronicle team. As the captain of LC's team he played both offense and defense. A sure tackler and fine blocker, he was the leader and kept the team together during the toughest games.

Steve Conley, another two-way player, was picked for both a running back and defensive back. Steve had the most net yards rushing for LC and was the most consistent defensive back on the squad.

Quarterback John Etter had a good year at that position but was selected as a running back. He carried a good part of the offensive load, finishing first in the league in rushing carries (153), touchdowns (9), and scoring (65 pts.). He was second in total offense ( 1,037 yds.) and total offense average ( 115.1 yds. per game). He also handled the punting, finishing second in punting average (32.6 yds. per kick).

Rick Maras played both ways and was picked for offensive guard. He led a great many of the running plays and was solid at his linebacking spot. Rick injured his knee in the Shadle game, but was back soon to play well the rest of the season.

Bill Oaksford, an honorable mention guard, was another two-way player. A good offensive blocker, he was a truly tough defensive nose guard.
