The Tiger offense featured the breakaway running of All-City Bob Denham who gained 770 yards and honorable mention AI Harkey who gained 508 yards. They were greatly aided by the offensive line. Both Denham and Harkey averaged over five yards a carry. The offensive line was anchored by All-City selections Mark Guthrie and Mike Loft and defensively by linemen Steve Sly and Bill Putney.
