Half a Century . . .

A doorway to the future . . . to new aspirations, to dreams come true—to further education, business opportunities, marriage, fame and fortune? Who could know what lay beyond the doors of this, their beloved school . . . North Central!

Could those 287 freshmen and sophomores who first enrolled at North Central in September, 1908, possibly have known what the name "North Central" would mean to future generations?

☆ ☆ ☆ ☆ ☆

J. Herman Beare was principal of North Central in 1908. The incomplete, U-shaped structure had 12 rooms and 12 teachers that fall. Students were enrolled in one of five courses—classical, scientific, literary, commercial or manual arts. Lunches were packed at home, and cocoa, coffee or milk purchased at school for 3 cents a cup.

A second wing, including a lunchroom in the basement where lunches were sold for 10 cents, was completed in February, 1909.

Invasion by the Lewis and Clark Tigers occurred in 1910 after a fire destroyed much of their school—the South Central. For three semesters the two schools existed in the same building and claimed the same colors—blue and white.

☆ ☆ ☆ ☆ ☆

Thanksgiving day, 1912, marked the beginning of a lasting rivalry clash, the traditional North Central-Lewis and Clark football game, played annually at the fairgrounds. Everyone in town would turn out, and North Central won two out of every three games.

In 1912 Vox Puellarum (Voice of the Girls) was organized as the first club at

North Central; and North Central graduated its first class of 87.

L. C. Bradford (Brad), debate coach, and Miss Jessie Gibson, girls' adviser who arrived at North Central in 1913, were the founders of the Boys' Federation and the Girls' League, respectively.

☆ ☆ ☆ ☆ ☆

The Federation was started with the purpose of permitting boys in school to meet obligations of the nation in time of war. The boys participated in Red Cross, YMCA, relief and thrift drives. After the war, the Federation was reorganized to meet peacetime requirements.

Girls' League originally had four departments—social service, patriotic, personal efficiency and entertainment. Each girl was a member of one department.

Federation and League executive councils joined in March of 1922 to form the Associated Student Council. A new constitution in 1951 brought about the present Associated Student Body.

☆ ☆ ☆ ☆ ☆

Under the direction of Ernest E. (Dad) Green, the presses rolled out the first copy of The North Central News on September 25, 1917. Until that time, the Tamarack was an all-school magazine, published every six weeks. It had many names from 1916 to 1924 when it became the traditional Tamarack upon a suggestion of Richard Hargreaves, principal from 1909 to 1918 when A. H. Benefiel took his place.

Although now the library and the cafeteria are taken for granted, in 1918, the year they were completed, they were a "special treat." With seating space for 185

persons, the library included a consultation room and librarian's workroom.

In 1920, the Federation originated the Red and Black Carnival to stir up enthusiasm for the Thanksgiving game. The Associated Student Council, the League, the Federation and each club conducted a concession at the carnival. Ruled by a queen and her court, the carnival was an event not only for the students and their families, but for their neighbors and everyone.

Projects were undertaken by the student body during the years 1924-26 to raise funds for a much-needed playfield. Leveling the field and getting it in shape was done by the students. Bleachers were built in the manual training shop, and it was a big day when the first event was played on the new field in April, 1927.

☆ ☆ ☆ ☆ ☆

C. Olin Rice, the conductor of the first operetta in 1924, staged the show annually until Mr. Taft took his place in 1947. Each year, work was started on October 1 for this December production. The music festivals today replace the operettas of yesterday.

Last year, the gala talent show, the Doll Shop, was presented for the fourteenth and final time. Each girl or boy who ever danced as a clown, a penguin, a Raggedy Ann or Andy, has wonderful memories of his part in the biennial show of which Miss Pinkham has always said, "There are no small parts, just small people."

Graduates of 1925 no doubt recall that they were the first to wear caps and gowns. Standard navy blue, wool dress for each girl was adopted in 1925 and worn from November to April. Semester tests were discarded in 1927 and replaced by topic tests every six weeks.

☆ ☆ ☆ ☆ ☆

First invited to Wenatchee in 1926, the band once again attended the celebration this spring. The Red Feathers made their

first "Apple Blossom" trip in 1951 on the band's twenty-fifth anniversary.

The first girls' marching unit in Spokane, the Red Feathers, organized by Miss Pinkham to encourage mass participation and give every girl a chance, appeared at school in 1938. The name was chosen through a school contest, the uniform was designed by the art department and the pattern was cut by the home economics department.

☆ ☆ ☆ ☆ ☆

Swimming was again a part of the physical education program when, after being floored over for 11 years, the pool was re-dedicated in 1943. A new filtration and chlorination system were added.

Joseph M. Tewinkel, a 1919 graduate of North Central, became its principal in 1946, replacing Frederic G. Kennedy, principal since 1922.

Formerly the Baxter Hospital gymnasium, the new combination gym and music department was dedicated February 26, 1948, after having been remodeled by the school district. New auto mechanics and electronics shops were installed in 1951 and 1953 respectively.

☆ ☆ ☆ ☆ ☆

Now it is 1959 and North Central is 50 years old. Thousands are proud that they have walked in her halls, studied in her classrooms, learned from her teachers and made friends among her students.

This spring over 600 young men and women, who have completed their high school studies, will walk through the doors of North Central into the future. Leaving us also are five beloved faculty members who have given unselfishly of their time and talent to North Central students through the years. We salute Miss Pinkham, Miss Rawlings, Mr. Bradford, Mr. Chandler and Mr. Randall, "Honor for honor due, all hail to North Central High!"

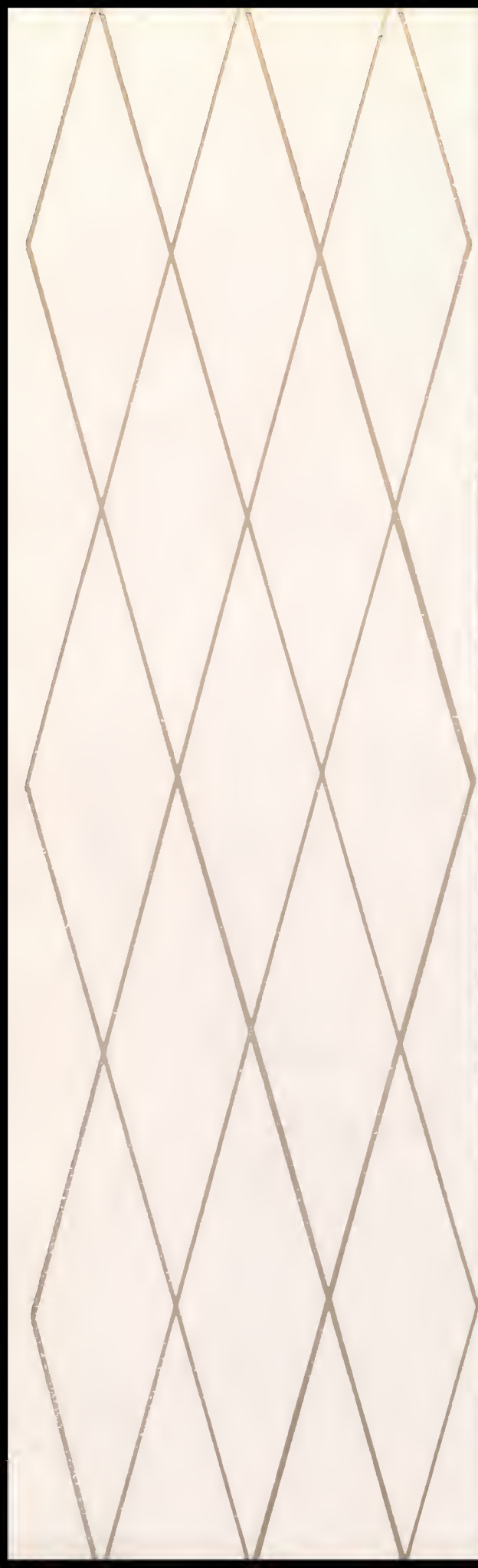

Many duties fall on the shoulders of Vice-Principal Lowry Bennett. Presiding at convocations, directing football practices as head line coach and advising the newly formed boys' cheering section are some of his more pleasant assignments. All disciplinary problems are also handled by Mr. Bennett.

Room 227 plays an important part in every student's academic life. Schedule changes, class adjustments and requisitions are obtained from Edward Gill, office assistant, and George Theodorson, school treasurer.

To help students to use good English effectively in oral and written communication is the goal of the English department. The English courses I-VI provide instruction in techniques of reading and interpretation, in fundamentals of correct speech and written composition, and hope to instill in each student an appreciation of his American literary heritage. Senior literature and composition provide experience in studying world literature and in writing the longer research-type theme.

The English courses have been expanded to include every phase of language usage. Journalism offers the talented student the opportunity to express himself through weekly publications and the yearbook. Work in drama classes gives the student a study of the history, background and terminology of the theater as well as an opportunity to participate in acting or in producing one-act and longer plays. Debate teaches the student how to do research, to analyze his information and to present his conclusions forcefully.

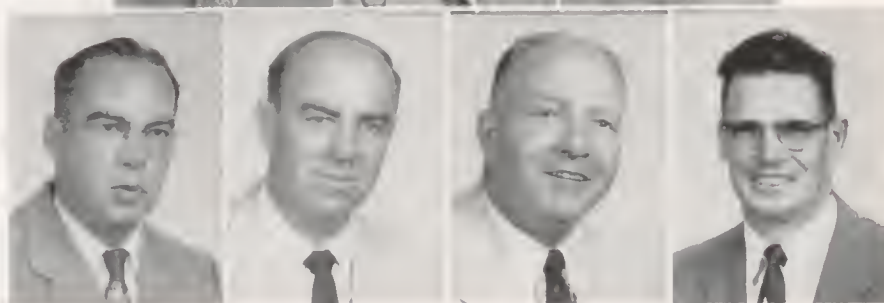

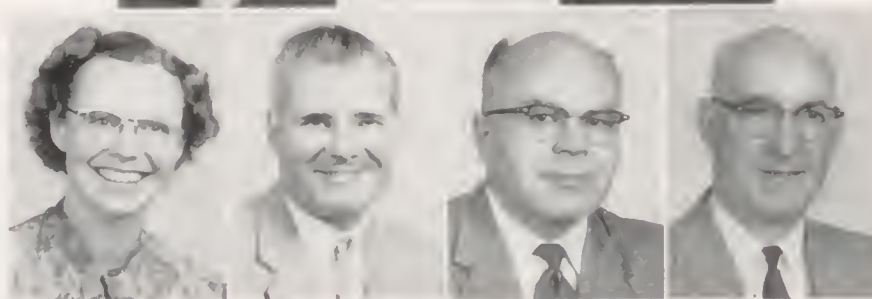

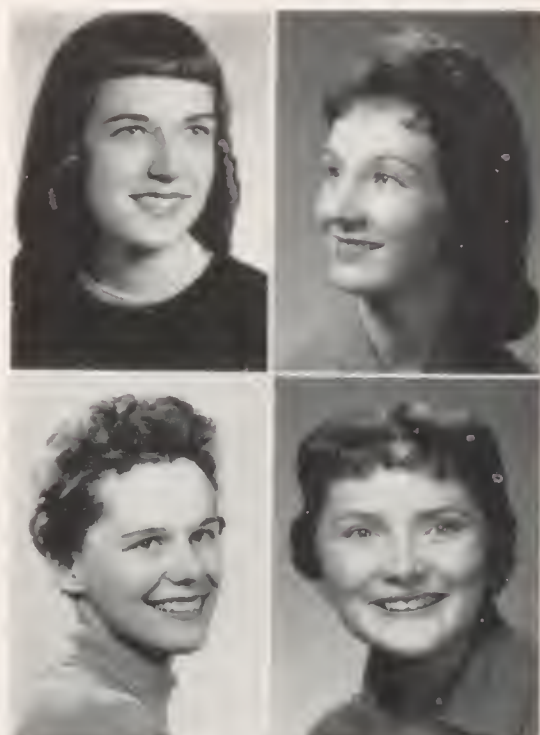
Spring Girls' League

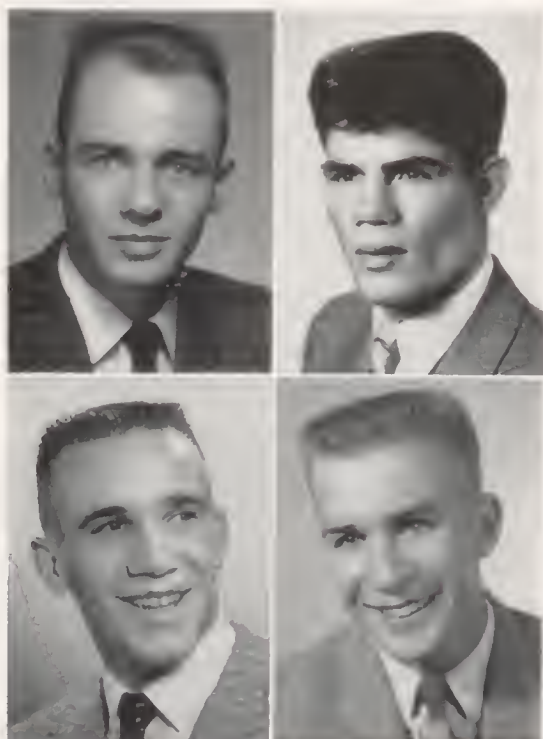

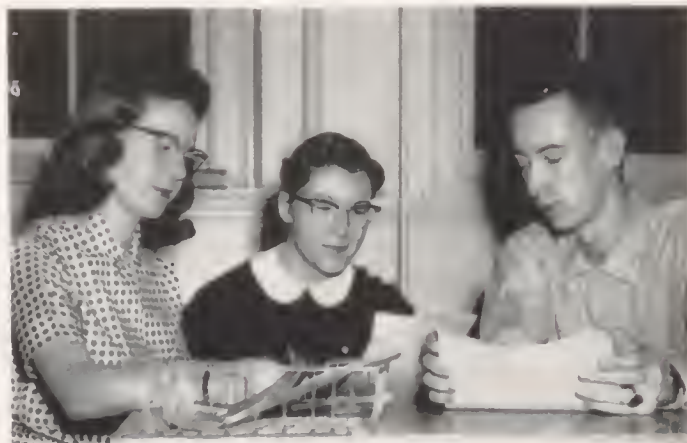

Without a doubt, "Brad" and his "musical red coats" have gained a reputation unexcelled in the Northwest.

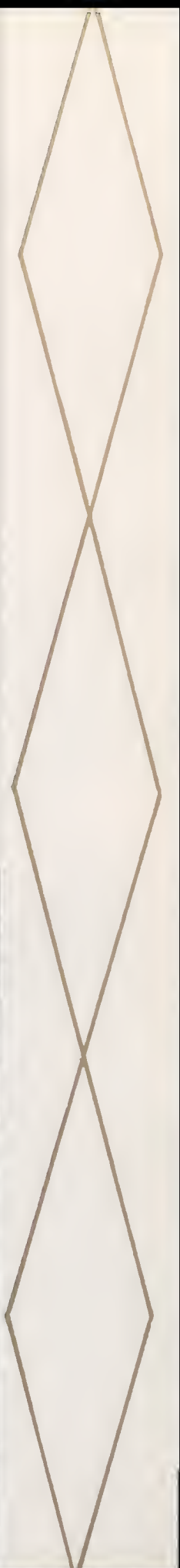

Football

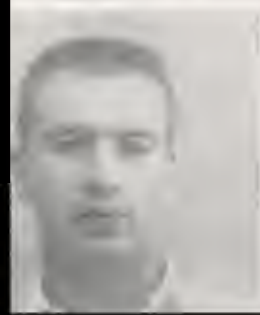
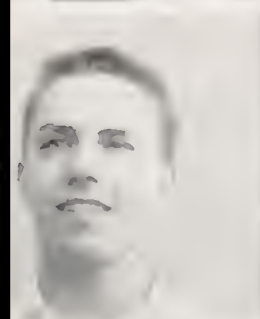
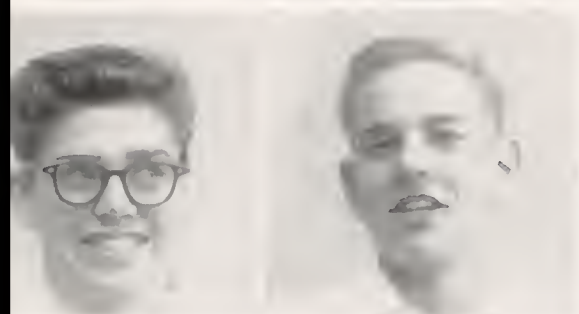
Displaying a strong defense, the squad rolled over Gonzaga 25-6. The Zags penetrated inside the Indian 35, five times, once getting to the one-foot line.

Fresh Football

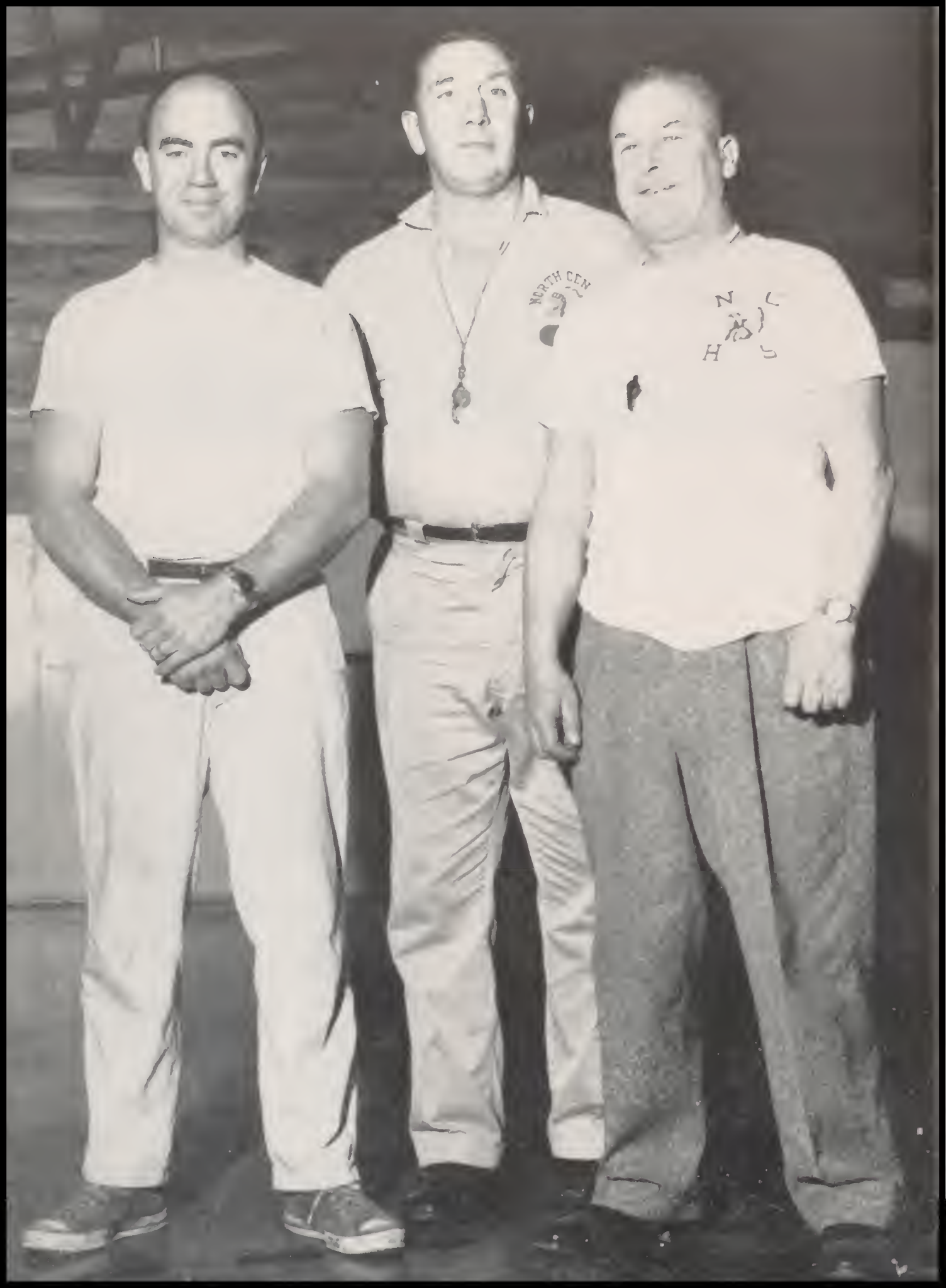

A league bye set the stage for a return



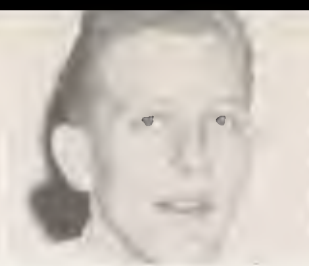

Upstart Shadle Park upset the Redmen 42-38 in an error-filled contest resulting in the first NC league loss.

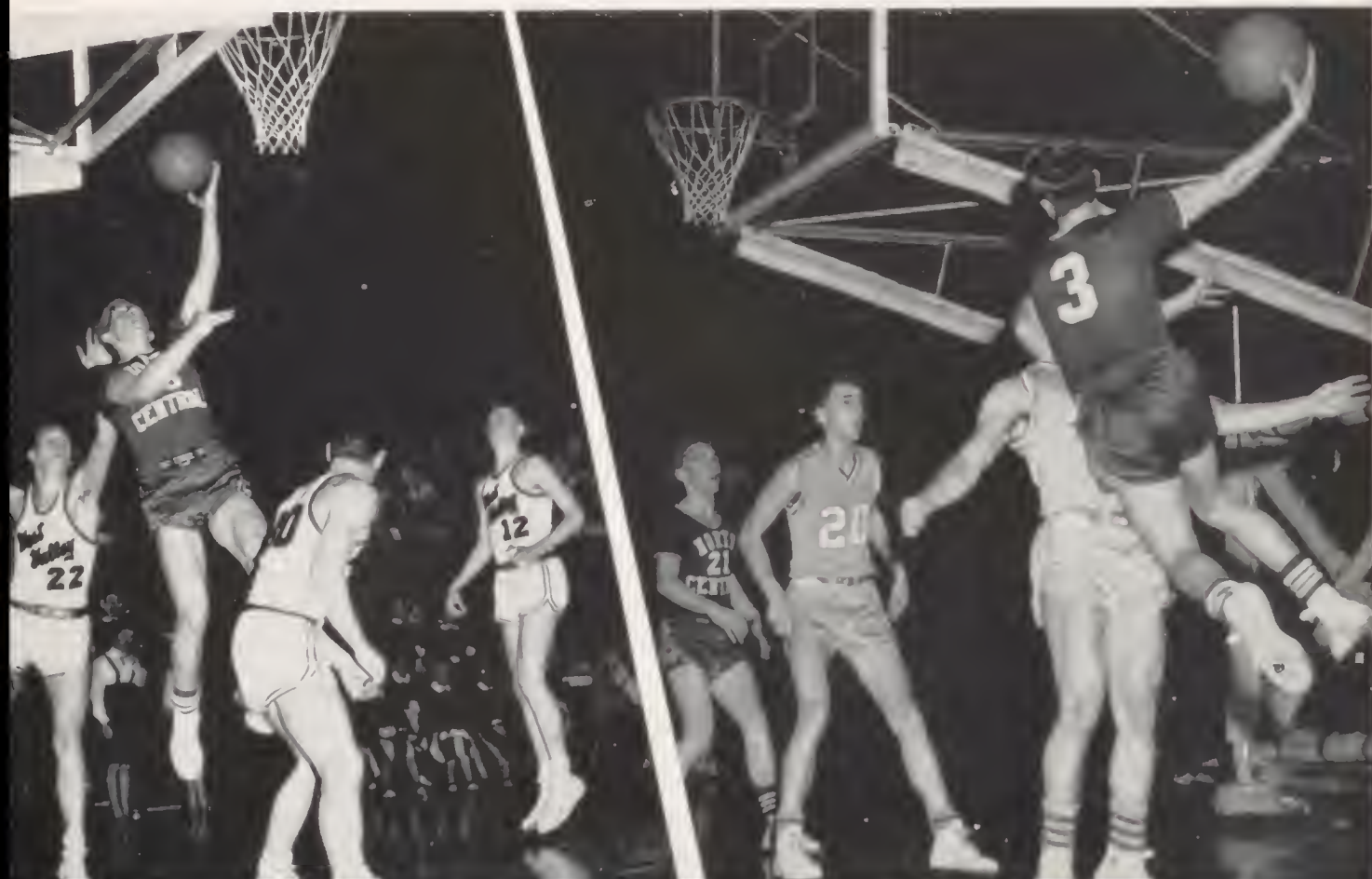
Central Valley downed the Tribe 40-31, January 16, with strong rebounding and good foul shooting.

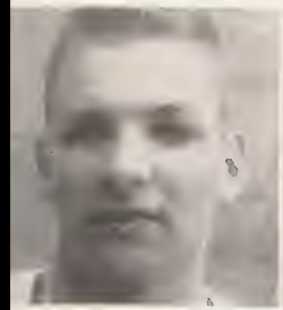

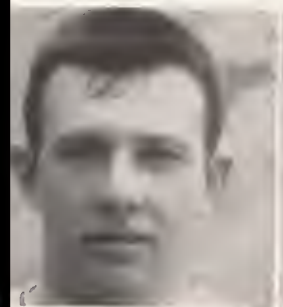

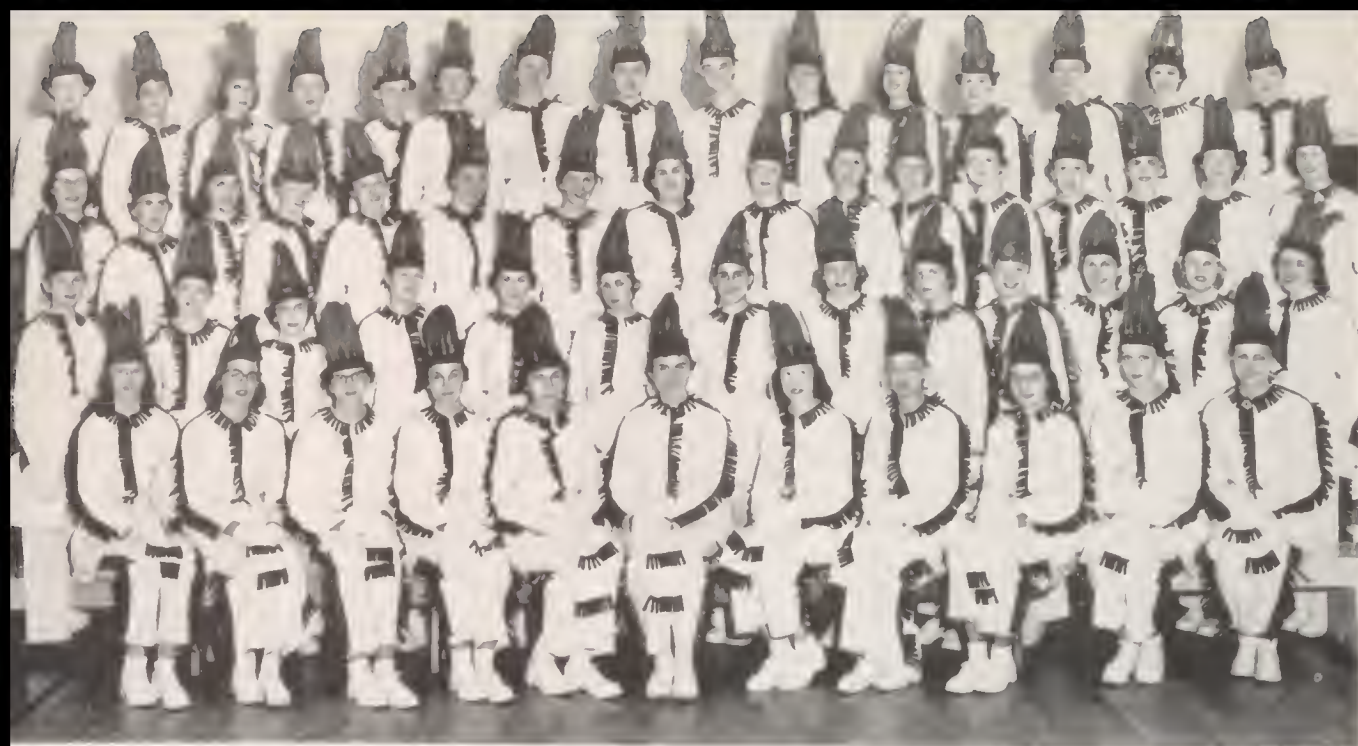
"Come on you Indians . . ."
