## School Board Decides Policy



Efficient operation of Spokane's educational system was the result of frequent meetings of the principals and administrators of the city's schools.

Decisions on widely ranging school problems concerning policy, rules and enforcement is up to the School Board. Approval of staff and improvements in relation to particular schools are also the duty of our directors.

Appointment of a city superintendent is made by the School Board. Dr. Albert Ayars has served three vears.

It is also the duty of the School Board to employ assistants, supervisors, teachers, janitorial help, cooks and other personnel for the functioning of schools. Details such as provisions for textbooks, audio-visual aids and essential supplies to aid teachers are directed by the Board.

In the recent fall election, Orville L. Barnes and John R. Warn were elected to the School Board of District No. 81. They have contributed to the decisions and policy-making of the Board since assuming the position.
