It is small enough to feel pain, failure, anxiety, fear.

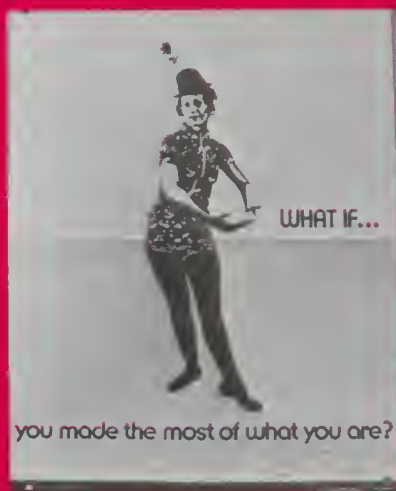
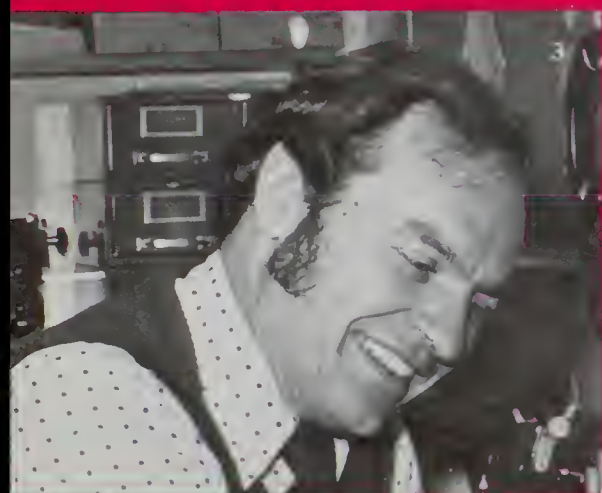

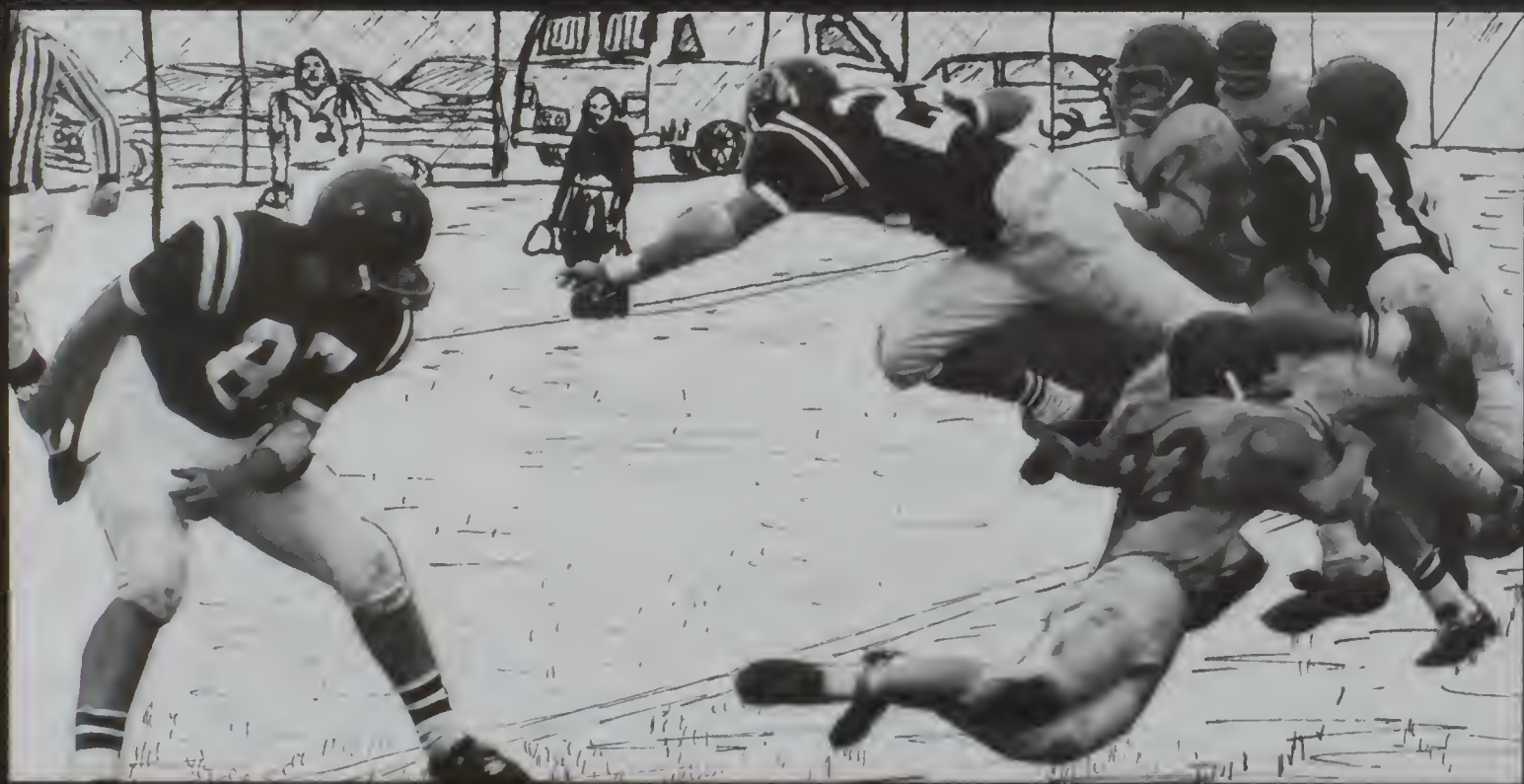
Not only has she been invaluable as an advisor, but also to many of us she has been a dear friend, who many a times doubled as a counselor.

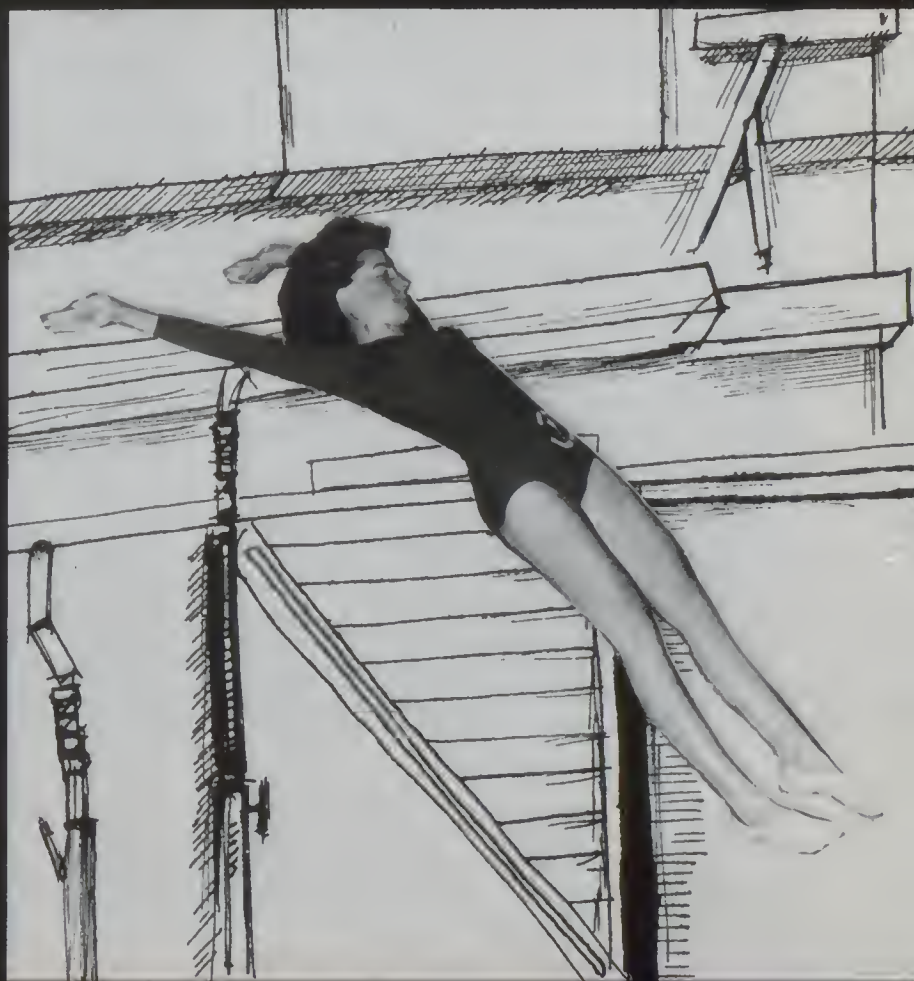
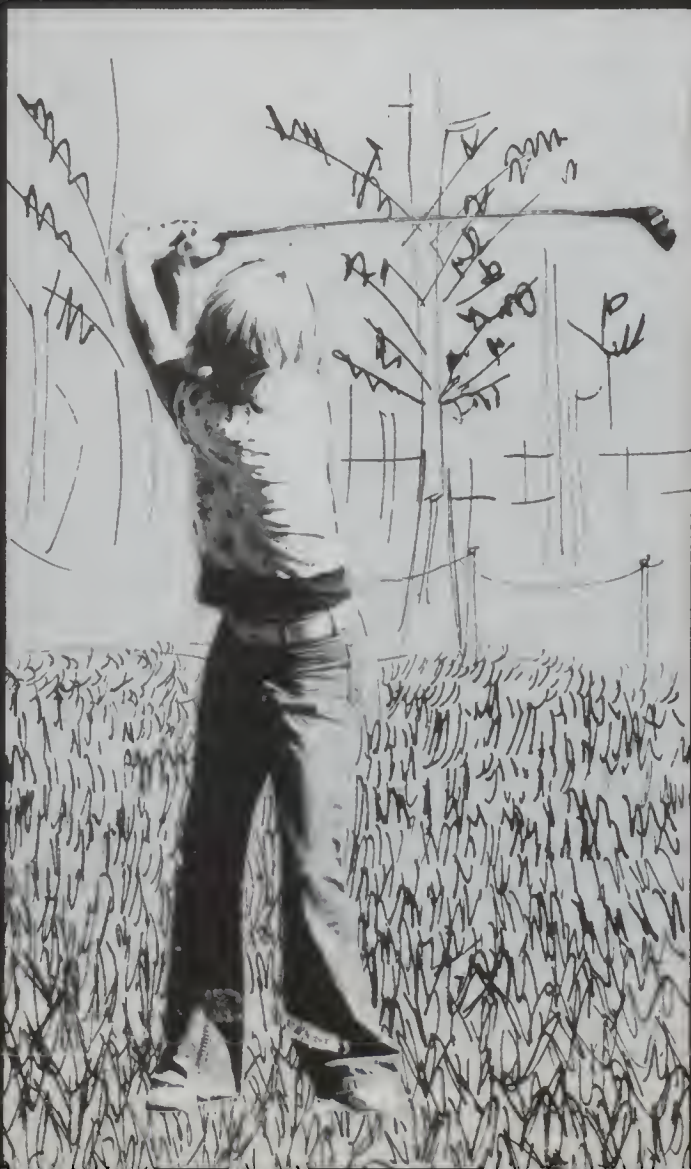
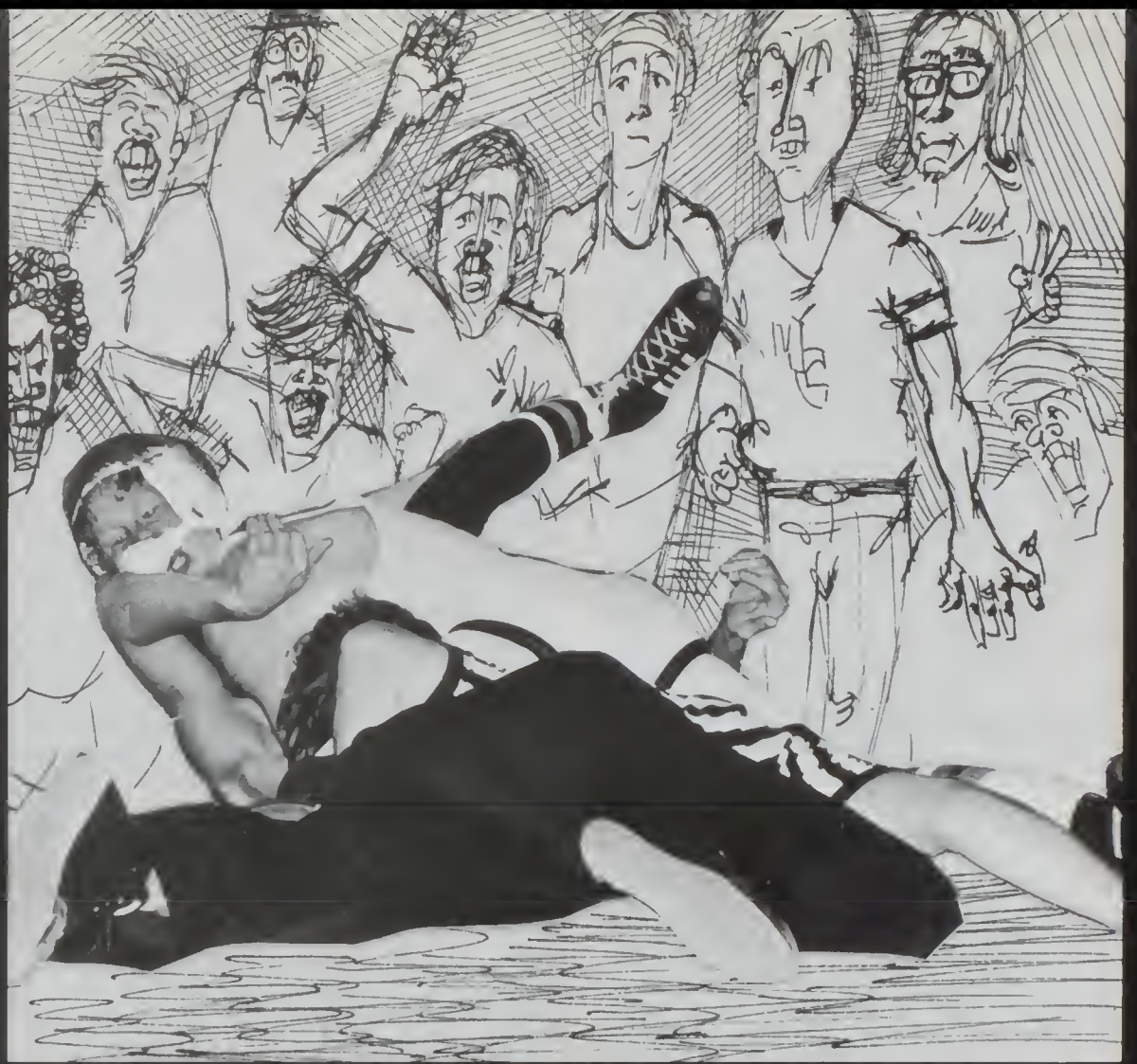

Games Lost; Spirit Prevails

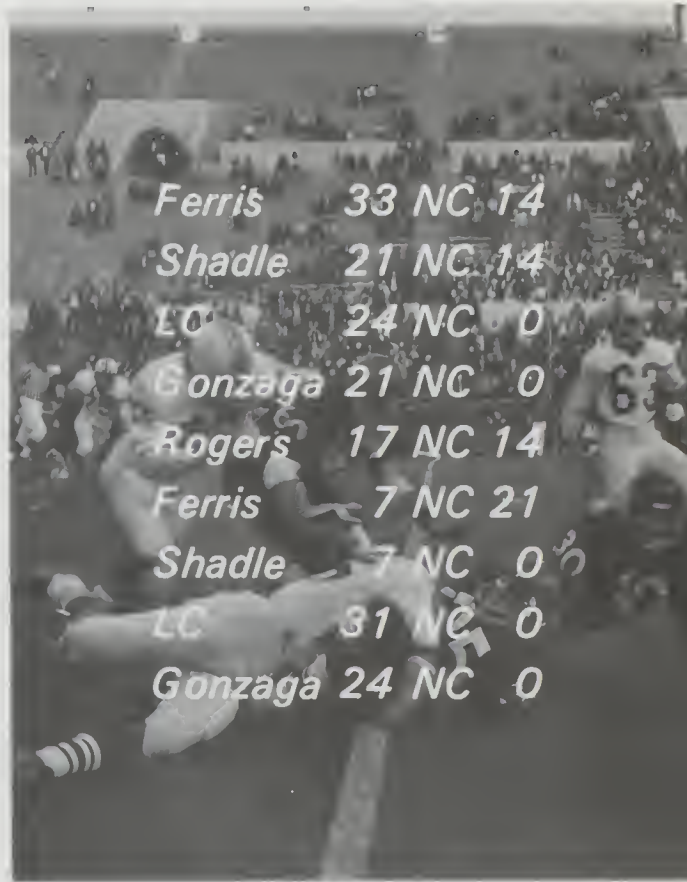

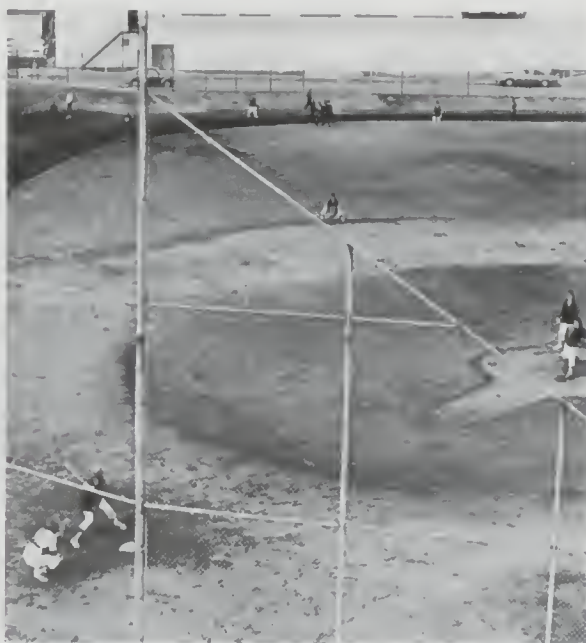
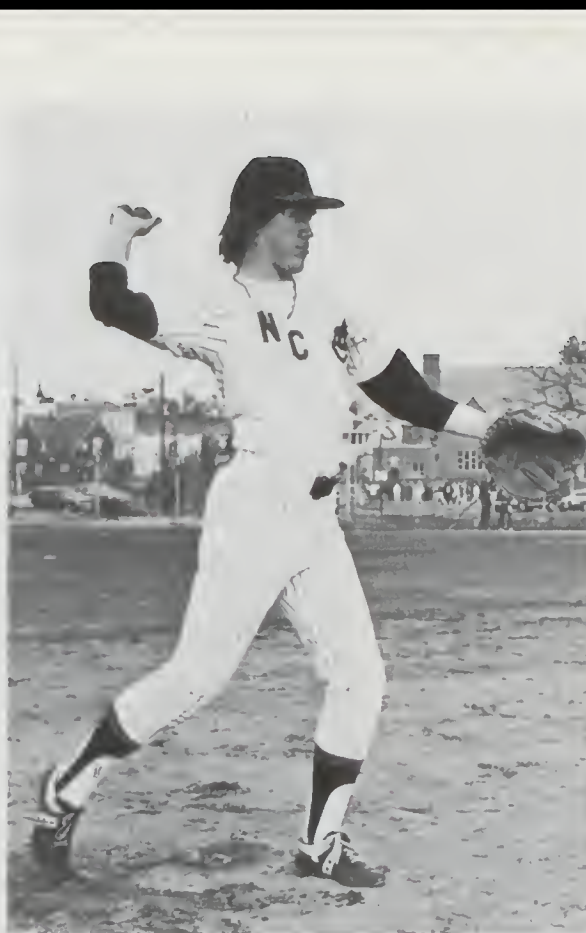
Varsity Baseball Stresses Defense

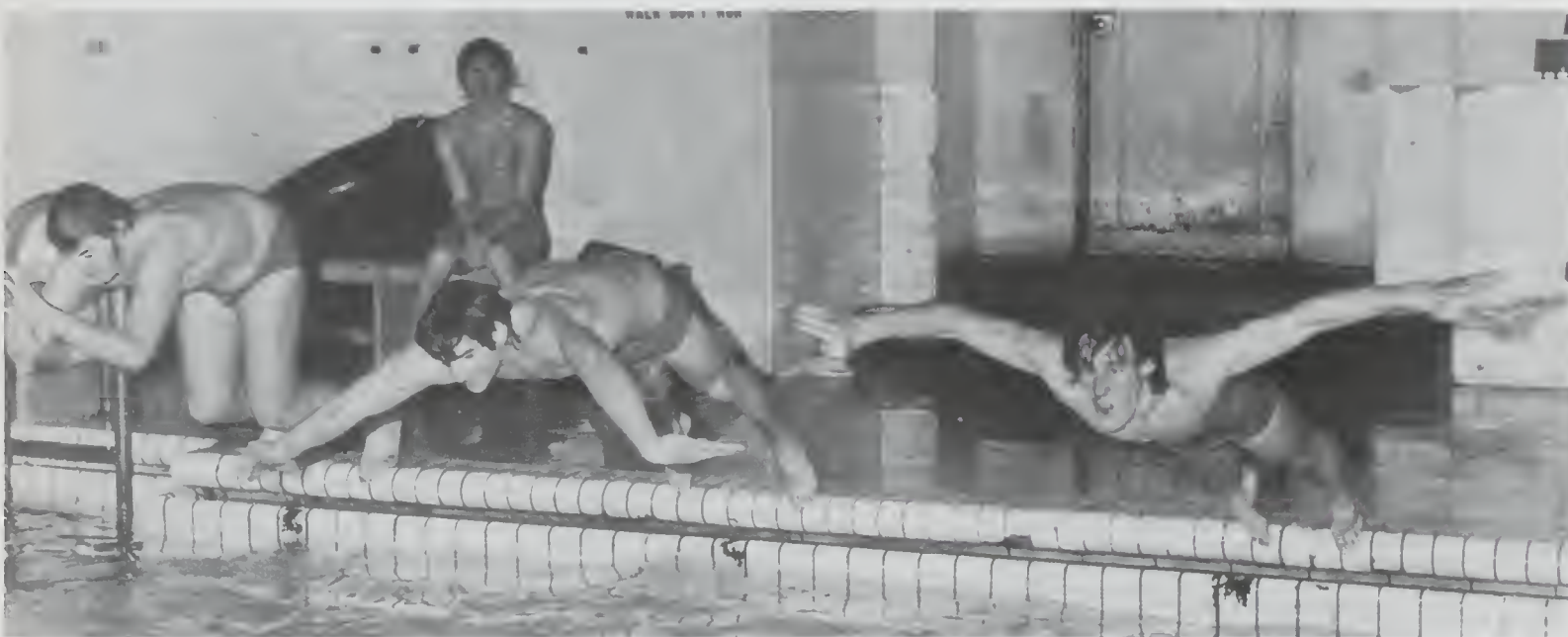

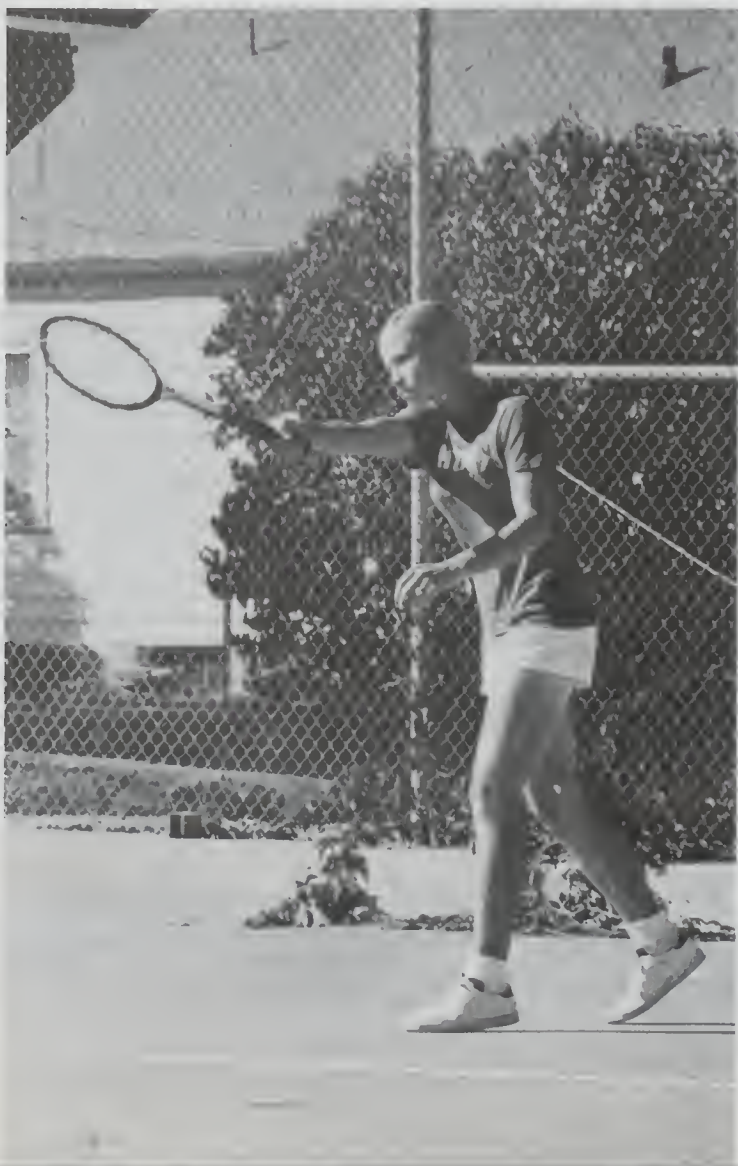

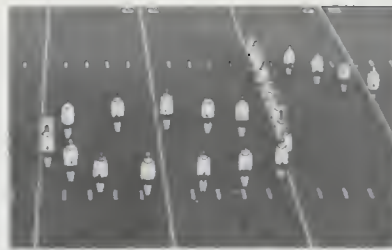
Dedication- Reason for Success

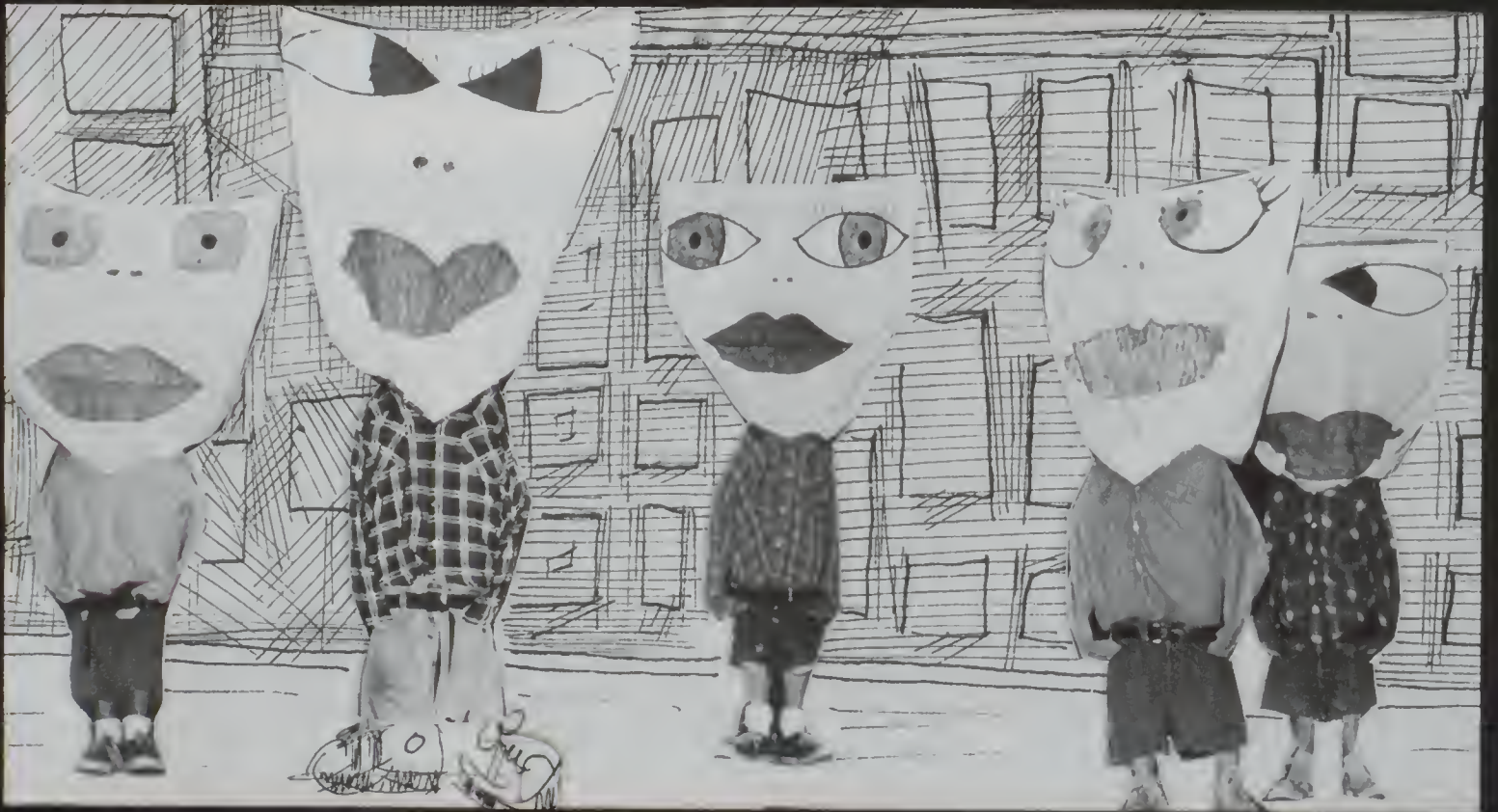
