'The statem is a vacuun steam system in which the stemm is delisered to radiators in the varions rooms and to ventilating units of the very latest type.
These units are so designed and ecpuipped with dampers that when a thermostat in the various rooms indiente a io degree temperature, air is admitted to the outside for ventilation. 'This type of -Ytem takes into consideration the bedy heat given off by the pmpils and therefore during the day where the sun has warmed the buildinge Wightly, it takes all the air from the ontside. without any way courtacting the radiators in the sentilating unit, in this way preventing ower heating which so often occurs in the wder types of wentating system. It is known the llar-Neleo
 main duditorimen and gymasimm have mits of this type.

The main auditorimm has a sebarate large ex-

Datert which can bes operated by the man in the boiler rom by a push button. Whon a large crowd eonvenes here the temperature can be made very comfortable.

The chief difference of the ller-Neleo system and the ordinary ventilating system is that it never admits air from the outside accept whem the room temperature is at no $^{\text {degrese. In this }}$ was there in a tremembum sationg in fucl, becalues in the wher unethods of ventilating the air came from the outside continmously and had to be. beated up to 70 degrees before it was admitted into the clasorom. With this system it never takes air from the outside unless the room is too warm. Therefore, in the nernings and in the afternoons When the elasses are not in session the air is atway, being recireulated as in the ordinary heating A.istem.

The eorridors are lined with cork to deaden moise and are connected with a well regulated rentiat tion system with direct amb imbirect registers. loockers are built into the walls as well as the new type drinking fountaims. Aproximately 3000 pards of battle ship lisolewon hate been used in the corridors. the study hall and the library. Only Spokame made products and home latoor were used in constructing the building. Eitach room is eqnipped with a telephome comeded with the office, an
