Opening the newly formed Columbia Basin league the Gonzaga Bullpups won a $20-13$ thriller from Rogers. The game also counted as a city-league contest and the 18 th annual Shrine gane.

Rogers got back in the win column when they beat Lewis and Clark, 27-7. The game was played in a heavy layer of fog.

Yakima's Pirates were next to fall before the mighty Purple and Gold of Rogers. The game was marked with rough-and-tough defensive play by both teams. Rogers again won, 26-13.

Rogers was out-fought and ended up on the short end of a $46-13$ score when they met North Central the second time. Fumbles in critical spots again proved disastrous for the Pirates.

A fast Walla Walla team ran over the Pirates, 39-0, in the season's final game at Borleske field in Walla W'alla. Wa-Hi began strong with a touchdown in five plays from scrimmage. Fumbles and intercepted passes again proved disastrous For the Pirates. Walla Walla was later ranked second in the state.

## Review of the 1952 Basketball Season

As a curtain-raiser for the 1952 Pirate basketball season, the Purple and Gold Bucs took a jaumt up to Onak where they lost their first game, 35-25. This was only the beginning of what turned out to be a thrilling season.

Cracking the win column in their next outing, Rogers rolled to an impressive 54-41 win over Cashmere. They led throughout the contest after taking an early lead.

Chelan stopped the Pirates the following night by a 38-32 margin.

Walla Walla outscored but didn't outfight the Pirates in Walla Walla. WaHi , who later became the state champions, took the road-weary Bucs, 48-28.

Getting back into the win column again, Rogers downed Milton-Freewater 43-39. This was their only trip of the season to Oregon.

It seemed that the Pirates couldn't get a steady win streak going when they suffered their third setback of the season at the hands of Clarkston. The Bucs couldn't hit the basket in the second quarter while Clarkston ran up a safe lead.

With the preseason games all wound up, the Pirates headed for the annual West Valley invitational games at West Valley. On opening night they played host to Central Valley. The Pirates were off on their shooting and lost, 38-22.

Everyone but the Pirates were surprised when the West Valley Eagles, later to be city champs, fell before the Purple and Gold onslaught. In as thrilling a game as could be hoped for the Pirates tore the Eagles to pieces with knife-like
rallies. The final score was $37-32$ and the Pirates were fast becoming the toughest team to beat.

Rogers lost a heartbreaker as the city league got under way. They went down before North Central's Indians on a lastsecond swisher that is still argued over.

Shaky from their loss to N. C., the Pirates barely got by Gonzaga. The game was tight all the way but Rogers cane out on top with a $29-27$ score.

Lewis and Clark stopped the Pirates next. They won a hadd-fought battle which wasn't over until the closing gun sounded.

West Valley, aware of the Pirates strong rallies held them off to win, 4331. The score was no indication of the battle put on by the Eagles and Pirates.

Rogers opened the second round of play, just waiting for the chance to get back at N. C., and gave the Indians more trouble than they bargained for. After Rogers got rolling it was only a matter of how large the score would be. The final outcome was Rogers 53, North Central, 27.

Rogers was now on the warpath and turned back Cronzaga, 54-31, for their longest victory string of the year.

Lewis and Clark, now fearing the Pirates very much, managed to stop them, 47-39. L. C. was in hot water up to their necks throughout the contest.

West Valley and Rogers met for the third time during the season in Rogers' last game. The Pirates were now noted for their strong comeback and had West Valley on their heels most of the way but West Valley managed to win, 50-41.

Still determined to win, Rogers again encountered North Central with hopes of settling the first defeat. They got off to a $1-0$ lead, then the North Central bats started booming and Rogers went down to defeat 15-5.

Chances of more victories looked hopeful as this publication went to press.

## Review of the 1952 Track Season

A large turnout of men answered Coach James Elsensohn's call to the cinders for the 1952 season. With a nucleus of 12 returning lettermen to build a team on, and bolstered by a strong squad of underclassmen who showed promise of being point winners. Coach Elsensohn brought home top honors from all the meets.

The annual Pullman invitational meet, which was proving to be second only to the state meet, was dominated by the Pirates who grabbed 28 points, followed closely by the Walla Walla Blue Devils who gamered 27. Great Falls earned 20 while Lewis and Clark gained 14. Gravin McMann set a new meet record in the high jump with a leap of 5 feet $101 / 4$ inches. Two hundred and fifty-two athletes from 27 schools attended the meet which is growing in popularity each year. The meet is for individual accomplishment rather than for team scores.

Yakima's invitational meet was held for the benefit of the schools in that area to get more experience and individual competition before the tean's league campaign began. Dean Mock broke the low hurdle record in 13.9 seconds. Ron Green set a new pole vault record at 11 feet $41 / 2$ inches.

In the first city league meet of the year, which was held on Meyer field.
the Pirates dominated the broad jump and 100-yard dash to take the Lewis and Clark Tigers 79-31. Jack Shetter broke the old Rogers shot-put record with a put of 48 feet $103 / 1$ inches. Rogers took all but three first place honors.

The Gonzaga Bullpups came to Rogers and found themselves heading back home with their tails between their legs and on the short end of a $581 / 2$ $451 / 2$ count. It was the third straight year that Rogers had defeated Gonzaga. Bill Geile sparked the Pirates with 11 points. Rogers split with Gonzaga in first place honors but took 6 of the 11 second place honors and 10 of 12 third place honors for the victory.

Rogers handed North Central the worst defeat they have suffered since 1945 when they romped over them 85 19. The Bucs swept the 100 -yard dash, shot-put, broad jump, and the 220-yard dash. They took 11 out of the 12 first place events.

Bill Geile, Gravin McMann, Jim West, ldaho Davis, Dean Mock, Paul Johnson and Ron Green all won or placed high as the Rogers trackmen came out victorious in the All-City track meet May 9 at Hart field. This win gave Rogers their first undisputed track crown since 1946. Ron Green broke the polevault record by his vault of 12 feet $7 / 8$ inches.

In the volleyball competition, the girls played the other Spokane high schools and the two jumior high schools to cop the first-place city title. After the last volleyball game the girls began their basketball tumouts and developed into a very good tean. They began the season by defeating the Havermale squad by a 29 to 14 count and after suffering two defeats already came up against a third when the Curlew team from Canada outscored them 47 to 22 in a night gane at Rogers.

Then when spring invaded the Rogers high school playfields and melted the snow from the black-topped playing surface to the east of the schools, the girls opened their spring softball campaign. They spent their Tuesday and Thursday afternoons practicing and gained five points towards their letters for each turnout they attended.
