# Physical Education Adds To Learning

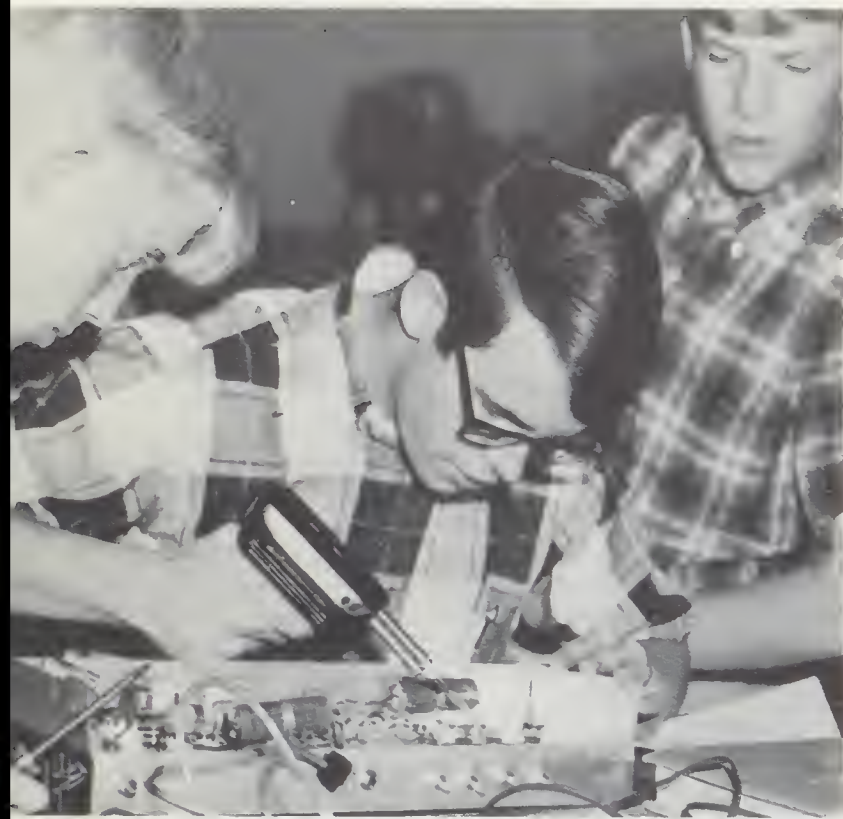

The girls learned team cooperation in playing soccer, basketball, volleyball, and softball. Individual achievement was emphasized in bowling, golf, and archery; paise, body control, and caardination were attained by the gymnastics and madern dance program. The girls' Physical Education classes this year actively pursued the goal of a healthy mind in a healthy body.

The physical education department is quite similar ta ather departments found at Rogers. As the boys progress in their activities, they may chaae ta specialize in one sport, such as: Tennis, crass country or track. This can replace the regular P.E. curriculum scheduled by the teachers. # Industrial Arts: Background For Employment

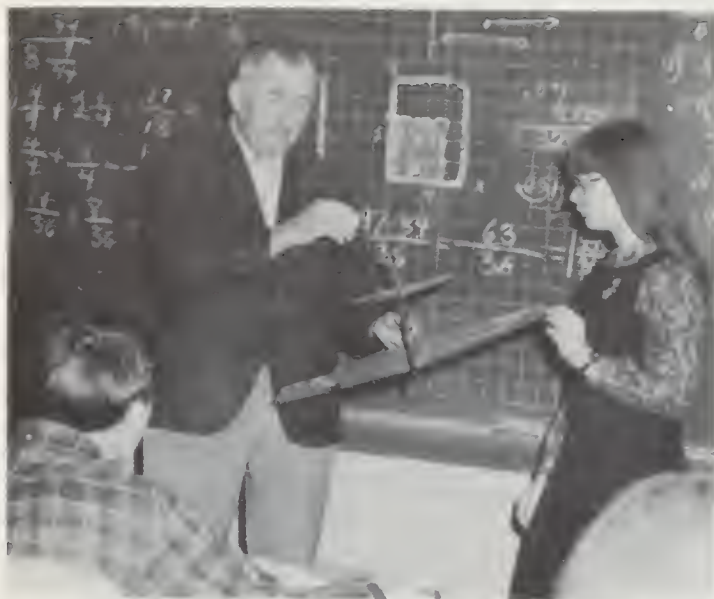

Many students have not made up their minds about what they wish to do as their life's work. In the shops, they have an opportunity to explore various aspects of industry.

Skills are important today in every job. In the shops and drafting room students begin to develop skills which will help them to hold good jobs later on. As we grow older, we often find occupational choices change, but certain basic knowledge and skills are necessary to advance in the complex society in which we live. At John Rogers, opportunities are available in a variety of subjects. What one can do, and how well he does it is likely to be a good index to success when one is out of school on the job.

## Variety Found In Science



Biology, one of several laboratory courses offered at Rogers, is usually taken in the sophomore year. It supplies basic knowledge of plants and animals, using current, new exploratory techniques through the laboratory approach.

Physics is a course designed to give the student a good comprehension of some of the major concepts of physics such as light, matter, force, electricity, heat, magnetism and atomic theory.

Integrated Math-Science combines the math and science in a one year course concerning topics in physics, chemistry and mathematics that are felt to be important to an understanding of the natural world in which the student lives. A credit may be earned in either math or science.

Chemistry is the study of elements, their reactions, and how they react to the world around us.

Through the use of textbook and laboratory experiences, the student learns about the properties of substances and energy of change in the substance.

Judy, Tracy, Janine and Ted, all agree that this was one of the most enjoyable and rewarding events of their high school careers.

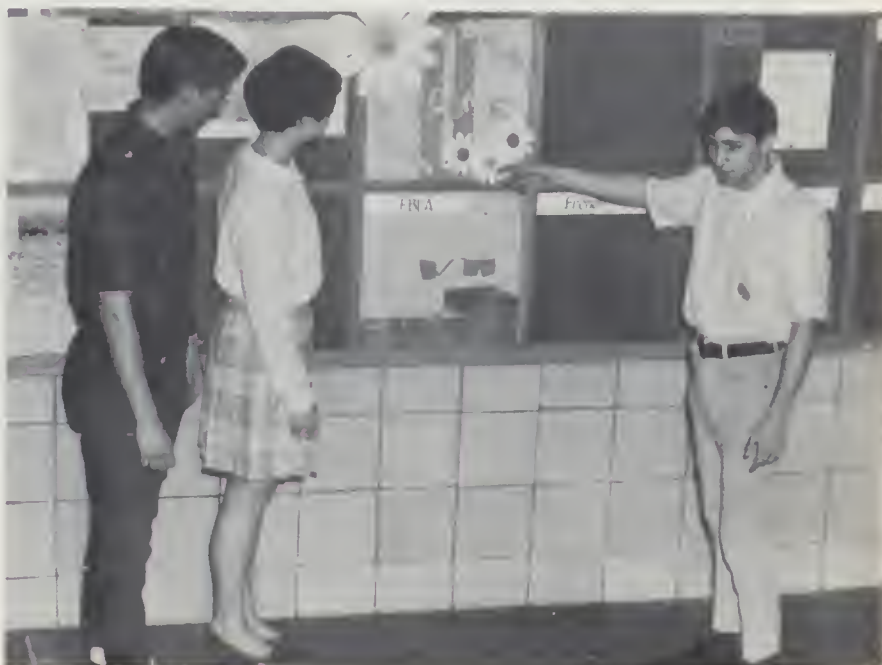

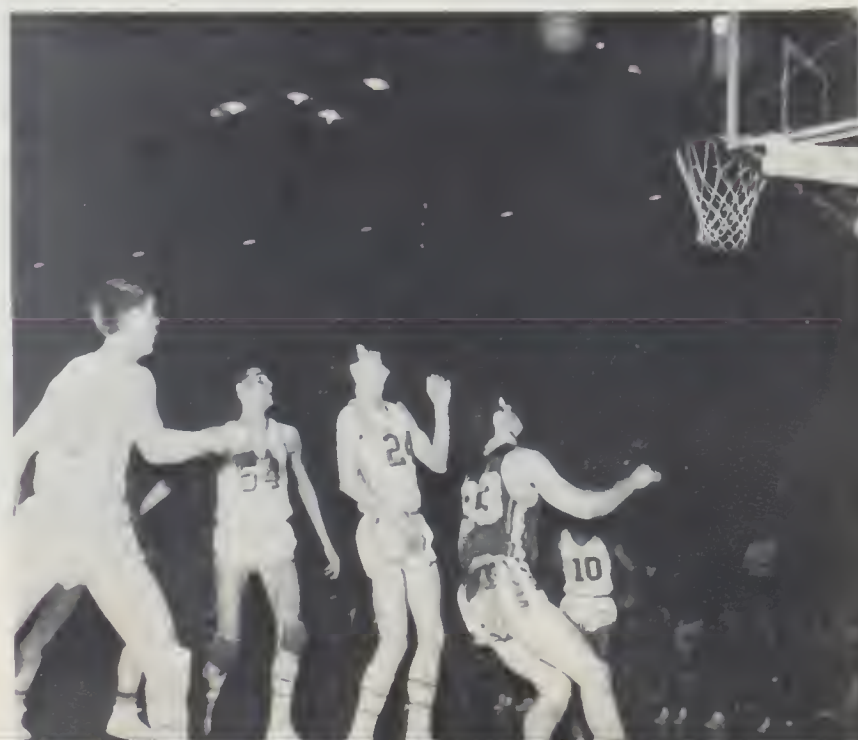

# 1967 City Champions

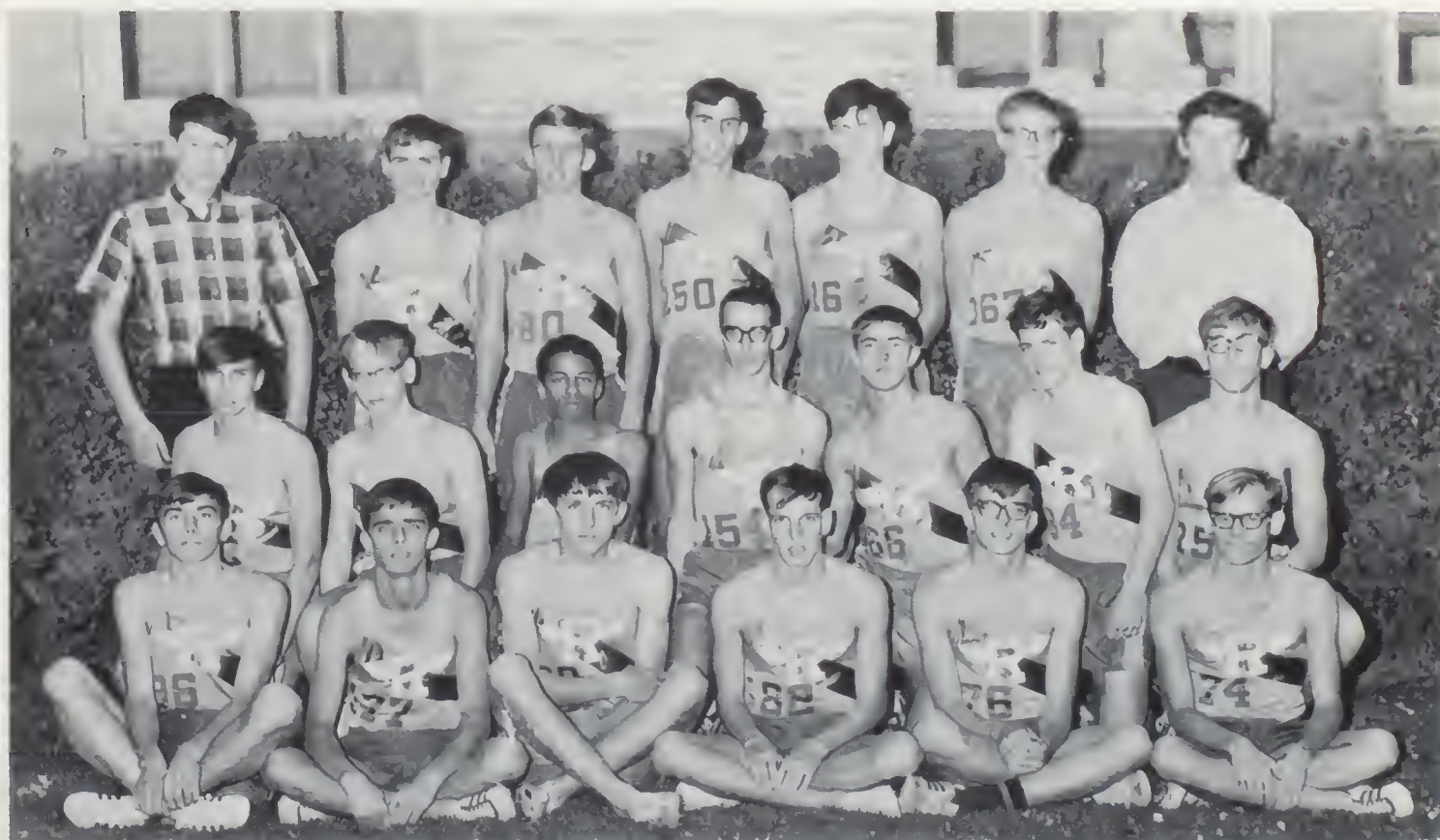
In a season replete with medals, ribbons and trophies, the Ragers' cross-country teams, Varsity and B-Squad, swept through the competition with perfect records in local competition.

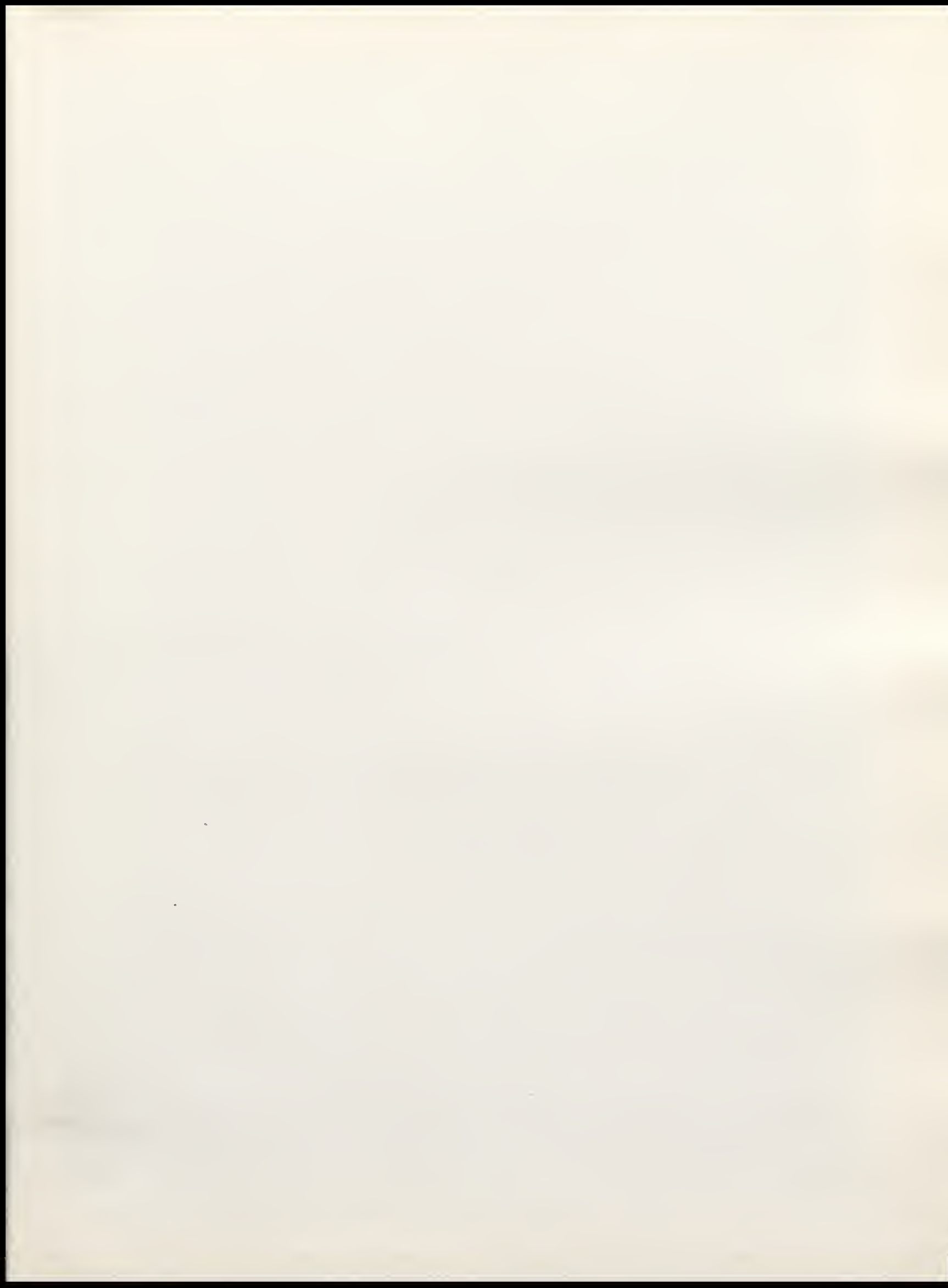
John R. Rogers High School has been, is, and always will greatly influence the lives of its students, so that their "pasts" may always lead to their well-deserved "futures."

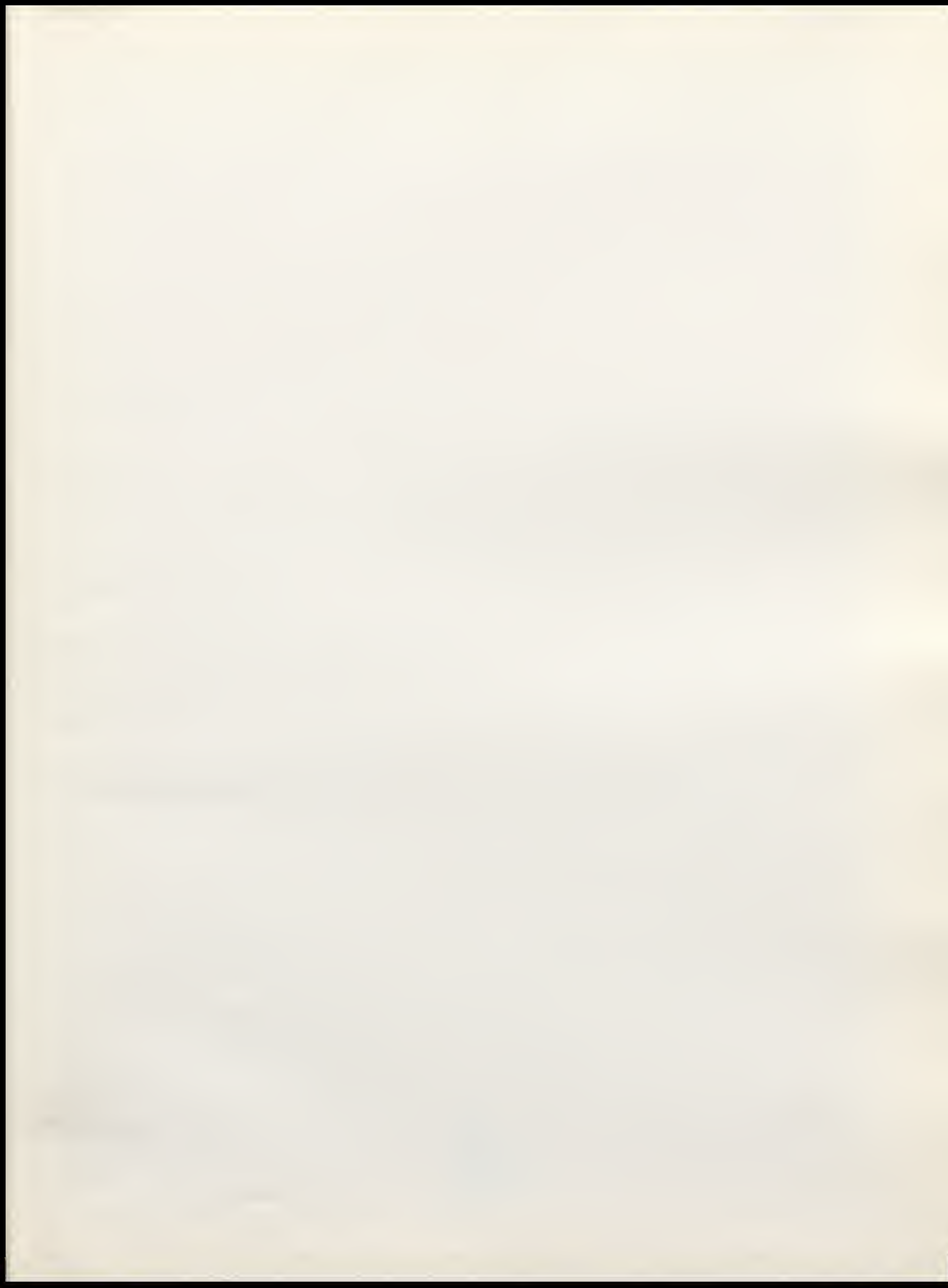
