tary techniques through the labaratary approach. Physics is a course designed ta give the student a gaad comprehension af some of the majar concepts af physics such as light, matian, farce, electricity, heat, magnetism and atamic theary.

Integrated Math-Science cambines the math and science in a ane year caurse cancerning tapics in physics, chemistry and mathematics that are felt to be important to an understanding of the natural world in which the student lives. A credit may be earned in either math ar science.



Once again Rogers ASB has had the privilege of exchanging students with another school.


