Bialagy, ane af several labaratary courses offered at Ragers, is usually taken in the saphamare year. It supplies basic knowledge af plants and animals, using current, new exploratary techniques through the labaratary approach.

Physics is a course designed ta give the student a gaad comprehension of some of the majar concepts of physics such as light, matian, farce, electricity, heat, magnetism and atamic theary.
Integrated Math-Science cambines the math and science in a ane year caurse cancerning tapics in physics, chemistry and mathematics that are felt ta be impartant ta an understanding af the natural warld in which the student lives. A credit may be earned in either math ar science.

Chemistry is the study of elements, their reactians, and haw they react to the warld araund us.

Thraugh the use af textboak and laboratary experiences, the student learns abaut the properties of substances and energy of change in the substance.
