Home Economics skills are used and converted into a way to earn a living. Each year, 30 girls who are seniors may be accepted into the class and a job training situation. Two credits a semester are earned, and four work references are acquired as the girls move from training station to station throughout the year.
Girls are hired as they qualify and as a wage earning spot presents itself
Food service, laundry aides, health care, child day care centers are some of the areas of training now offered.

Secretarial science is the second year of office training, which is carried on in a three-hour block of time. The work is presented in an integrated program covering 19 areas.

The block or intergrated approach to the teaching of vocational business subjects does not devote a certain amount of time to the building of any one skill-rather, each problem that is presented to the students includes several skills blended together

In addition to the regularly assigned classroom problems, the students in the class act as a secretarial pool and are on "call" to take dictation, make out reports, make business phone calls, do duplicating, and carry on other business procedures for members of the faculty and administration.

## Mathematics Stimulate the College-Bound Student

The main objectives of the mathematics teachers at John R. Rogers High School are to encourage. stimulate, intrigue, and educate the terminal as well as the college-bound student to such a degree that both groups may find themsclves with sufficient mathomatics for daily living in a changing and highly geared society.

Everystudent at Rogers is given the opportunity to achieve the mastery of the mathematics commensurate with his own ability. One can take modern algebra. general mathematics, modern geometry; intermediate algebra and advanced mathematics.

A graduate of high school may be admitted to certain universities and colleges with two years of mathematics, excluding general mathematics, but it is better to take three years of mathematics to insure cntrance.

## Science Offers Varíety of Courses

Biology, one of several laboratory courses offered at Rogers, is usually taken in the sophomore year. It supplies basic knowledge of plants and animals, using current, new exploratory techniques, through the laboratory approach.

Chemistry is the study of elements, their reactions, and how they react to the world around us.

Integratcd Math-Science combines the math and science in a one year course concerning topics in physics, chemistry and mathemat ics that arefelt to be important to an understanding of the natural world in which the student lives.

Physics is a course designed to give the student a good comprehension of some of the major concepts of physics, such as: light, motion. force, electricity, heat, magnetism and atomic theory.

Through the use of textbook and laboratory experiences the student learns about the properties of substances and encrgy of change in the substance.

The age of unskilled and low income jobs is almost over. In order to exist in today's world we must know how to work accurately and how to figure carefully.

Industrial arts at Rogers is doing a two-fold job for the boys who are enrolled in shop classes. They are given a chance to explore various fields and find out for themselves whether they have likes for a particular job or field of work. Secondly, they are taught the use of tools, how to apply the mathematics involved, and something about the materials in the particular field, and the job opportunities in this occupational choice.

In addition to finding occupational choices, industrial arts points to leisure time activities and hobbies. Today thousands of people are putting together their own hi-fi and stereo sets. Drafting has helped many former students to plan their own homes.
