## summing up

The Shadle Park Highlanders opened their season by taking third place in the Merry-Go-Round. The following week they played the West Valley Eagles. After W. V. scored first, Steve Sullivan took the kickoff and romped 79 yards for the touchdown. $\mathrm{W} . \mathrm{V}$. was held on downs, and Jim Paton, showing some of the power that was to make him an All-city selection, took the handoff and went off tackle for 49 yards and the second Shadle T.D. The Highlanders were behind at the half $19-18$ but came back strong and the Shadle pass defense held W. V. to few completions as the Highlanders did all the scoring. The score was a $36-19$ victory for S. P. In the second league game the Highlanders were beaten only in score, after out-playing the Rogers Pirates for three and one half quarters and scoring first in the final period. The Highlanders let down and were beaten 14-7. The next week the Highlanders defeated Central Valley 13-0. Shadle's defense was the bright spot as it held the C. V. offense to a net 7 yards. After one of the roughest week's practices during the season the Highlanders rolled over the Gonzaga Bullpups 18-14. The Shadle attack was as sharp as the defense had been, as Tom Conlon seemed to regain the form that made him an All-city honorable mention as a junior. Tom had a terrific day as he sparked the Highlander attack with bootlegs and passes that were near perfect calls. This defeat was the only one the Bullpups were to receive all year, as they finished high in the state rankings. The following week the Highlanders traveled to Pasco and downed the Pasco team 27-7. The defense again looked sharp but Ken Brown stole the spotlight and ran wild for over 100 yards rushing. Jim Paton had another great night on defense making half of the S.P. stops. The next week the Highlanders lost a bitter game to North Central 28-7. Jim Paton was the spark for the Laddies as he recovered an N.C. punt fumble and on the next play roared 23 yards for the touchdown. The score at the third quarter was 14-7, but Shadle couldn't hold the offense down. The last league game was played against the Lewis and Clark Tigers. The game started to be a Shadle runaway but the attack bogged down and the game ended in a 13-13 tie. Jack Whichterman stood out as he caught a pass for the touchdown. Jim Paton ran off guard for the other Shadle T.D. In the final game of the season the Highlanders downed the Pullman Greyhounds 12-0. Shadle finished fourth in the eity with a 3-2-1 record, overall the record was 5-2-1.

On opening day at Seattle Shadle downed a strong Mt. Vernon five 60-53. Barry Livengood led the S.P. attack with 16 while Vic Johnson had 15 and John McFarland 11. In the second game Shadle was caught ice-cold by red hot Kent-Meridian as the Royals shot 57 per cent in the first half and won, going away, 74-45. Jim Halte scored 29 points. Kent had the tallest player in the tourney; 6-11 Steve Roberts. McFarland made 14 rebounds for Shadle compared to only 18 by Skyscraper Roberts. In the next game. Shadle took revenge on Sealth 51-43. Johnson led Shadle with 19, Livengood had 15. Shadle made it three-in-a-row over Wapato by downing the Wolves 67-45. This gave the Highlanders fourth place in the state tournament. McFarland led the Highlanders with 18 points. Livengood scored 14, Vic Johnson 12, Ed Bennett and Frank Vokacek, 8 cach. Shadle closed the tournament race with a season record of 21 wins and three losses.

The Shadle Park Highlanders opened their city league basketball season with an easy $51-33$ victory over Gonzaga Prep. The Highlanders turned aside the Bullpups with little trouble as John McFarland pumped home 19 points. The score at the half was 20-13 for S.P. and the difference was never less than 6 points after that. The next game the Highlanders ignored the pregame dope favoring Central Valley and beat the Bears soundly 48-36. Shadle never trailed against CV, leading 23-15 at the half. Barry Livengood led the highlanders with 20 points. Livengood and McFarland received the "Prepster of the Week" awards for the first two weeks of city league action. Shadle next rolled over North Central 51-40. The sportswriters began to take notice and one commented: "With every game, the Highlanders continue to be more impressive with their solid, balanced attack." Against NC, Shadle, now boasting an 8 -game winning streak, zipped away to a $10-0$ lead and the margin was never less than 8 points. John McFarland led the winners with 14 points. Also this week, the Highlanders were rated first in the state by the AP poll. Shadle Park continued to roll on as they defeated West Valley $49-41$ and pulled into first alone with a 4-0 league record. Another newspaper comment: Shadle Park, rated No. 1 class AA team in the state, made believers out of most of the Coliscum crowd last night by dumping WV." Shadke moved the winning streak to 10 by beating Lewis and Clark 56-32. Vic Johnson scored 17 and Frank Vokacek 14 points. Out of the league Shadle won its 11th, 69-62 over Kellogg. The next game the Coliseum roof fell in as Shadle lost to Rogers $60-59$ in a second over-time. The loss threw the league into a three-way tie. Barry Livengood moved up to second in the city scoring race with 21 points. The loss stunned the Scotsmen as Shadle went down to its first, and only, defeat in league play.

## summary

At the beginning of the second half of play Shadle met a much improved Gonzaga team and rallied to beat them 50-47. Gonzaga led most of the way but didn't have it when the pressure was on. John MeFarland led S.P. with 16 points as the balanced atack of the Highlanders was too much for the Prep in the final minutes. Vic Johnson had 11 and Frank Vokacek had 10 and Barry Livengood had 8. Shadle again showed its mastery of Central Valley as they downed them 53-46, the final score hardly told the story as Shadle was never in trouble and had a lead of 50-35 in the fourth quarter. Vic Johnson led the attack with 15 and MeFarland had 13 with Livengood scoring 12. This proved to be the most balanced scoring in the city. The trio always seemed to stay close to each other in the double figures. Shadle next took on North Central and routed the Indians 71-39. The only way to describe the game is "it was a slaughter." S.P. took off in the first period and led by as much as $51-24$ and $58-27$. Shadle coach Paul Henley played 13 men with ninc scoring. John McFarland led Shadle with 18 and Barry Livengood had 16. Other high scorers were Bob Stephan with 13 and Frank Vokacek with cight. Shadle in the next game played West Valley and beat them 57-48, Barry Livengood answered the ceall when the pressure was on as he did all season by coming out after the half and made two straight field goals and Shadle went on a scoring spree that saw the score climb to $38-34$ for Shadle from $24-18$ for W.V. Johnson led Shadle with 19 points and Livengood was close behind at 18. When Bob Stephan fouled out with the score at 44-36, Ed Bennett came through with three quiek points. Livengood hit a driving shot to push S.P. in front, 50-40. Shadle's record now stood at $9-1$ with the Highlanders ranked fourth in the state. Shadle won the city league title in its next to last game by trouncing L.C., 49-34. Vie Johnson led Shadle with 21 points for which he received the "Prepster of the Week" award. Most of Vic's shots came from the free throw line as he hit 13 of 19 gift tosses. This was the first major sports title won by Shadle in its three years as a school. In the final game Shadle got sweet revenge by slugging Rogers, 58-53. John MeFarland came off the bench with a had throat and poured in 21 points to lead S.P. Vic Johnson got 18; Bob Stephan got 9. Barry live ngood again shined under pressure by getting all five of his points in the closing minute to break the ball game wide open. John MeFarland grabbed first place in the rebounding department with Vic Johnson getting third. For the first time in more than 5 years a team placed three men on the All-City first team. Barry Livengood. John McFarland and Vic Johnson all landed first team berths in both of the city papers. Shadle also finished third in the state poll.
