


Representatives Lead School in City-Wide Red Cross






Go Unrewarded





This is a method to help poor students cut down on study time. The SQ3R practice should result in an increase in speed of reading, in comprehension and in quality of note-taking.

Special recognition should always be given to our honors classes. Students in these classes not only study the required material but they take advanced study in each subject.
